[57] CLAIM

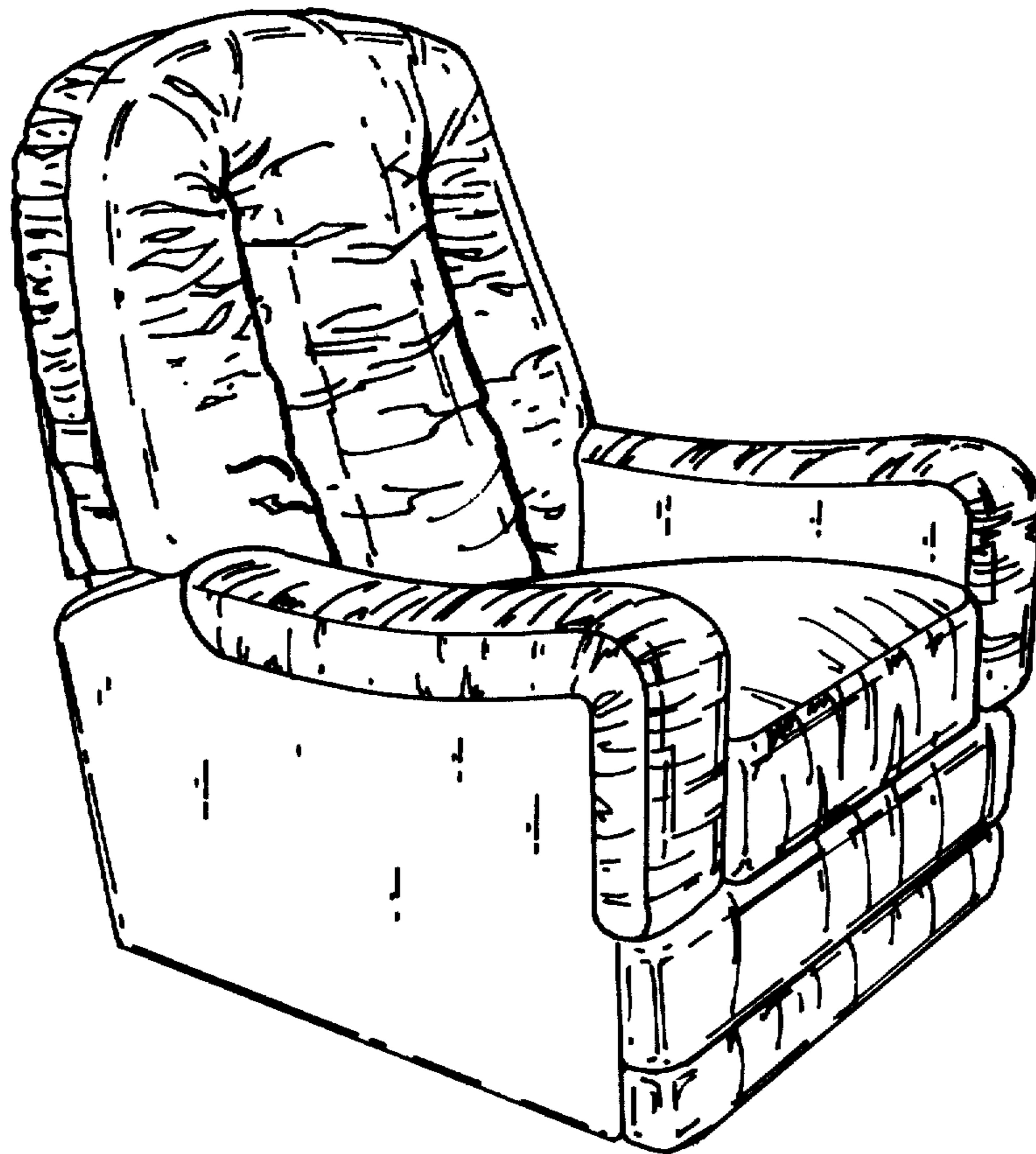
The ornamental design for an armchair or similar article, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

The FIGURE is a three-quarter, front perspective view of an armchair or similar article embodying my new design.

The side of the armchair not shown is a mirror image of the side shown.
