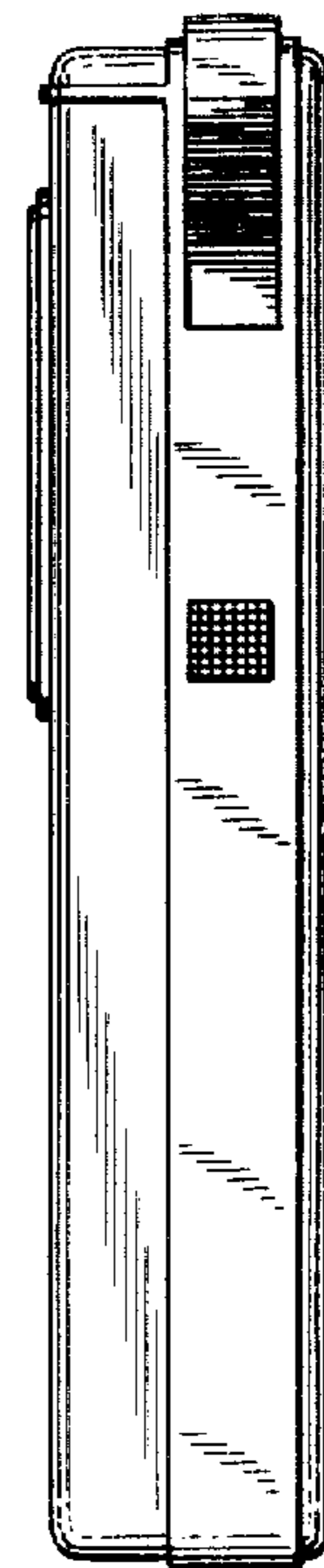
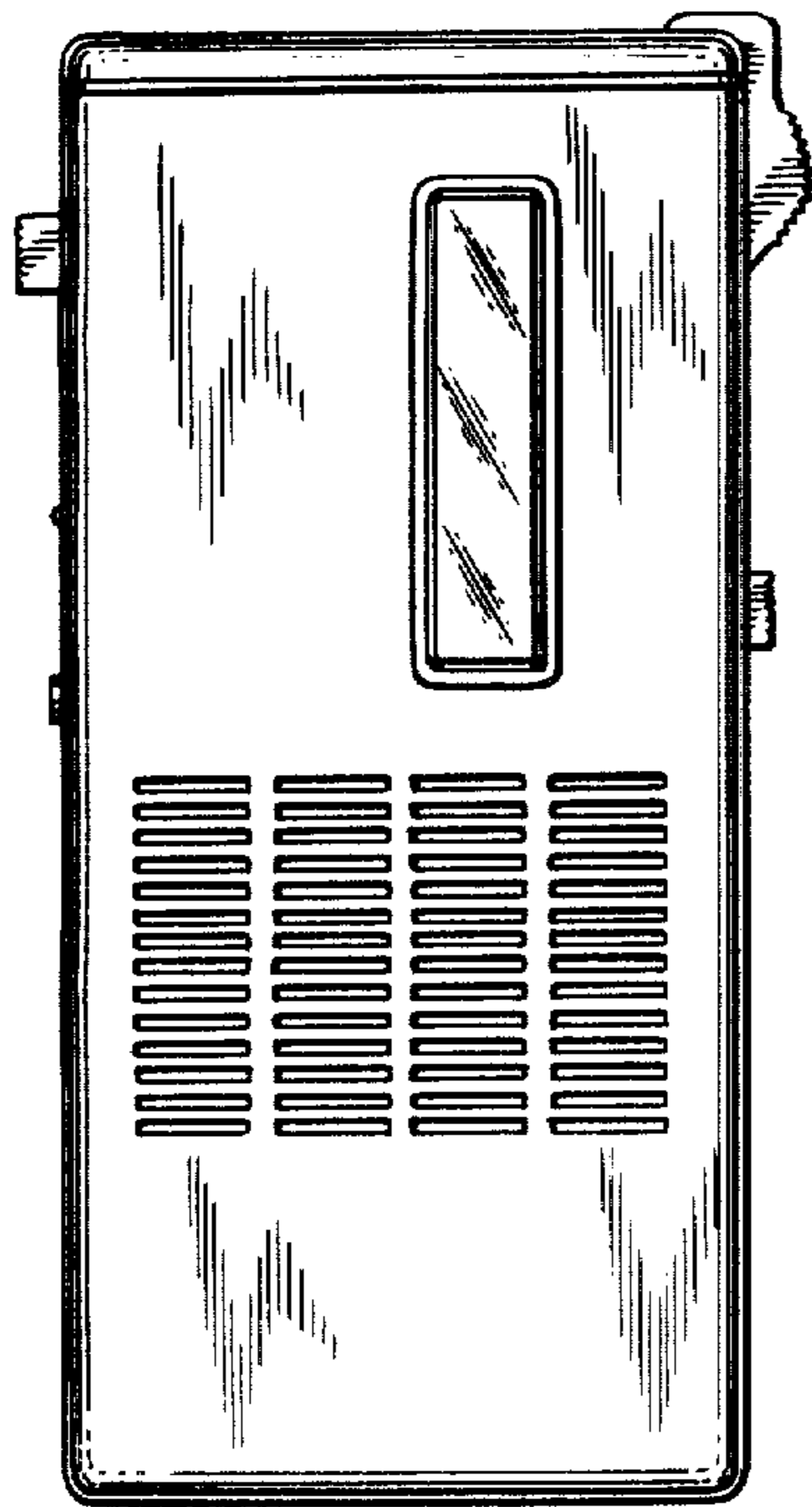

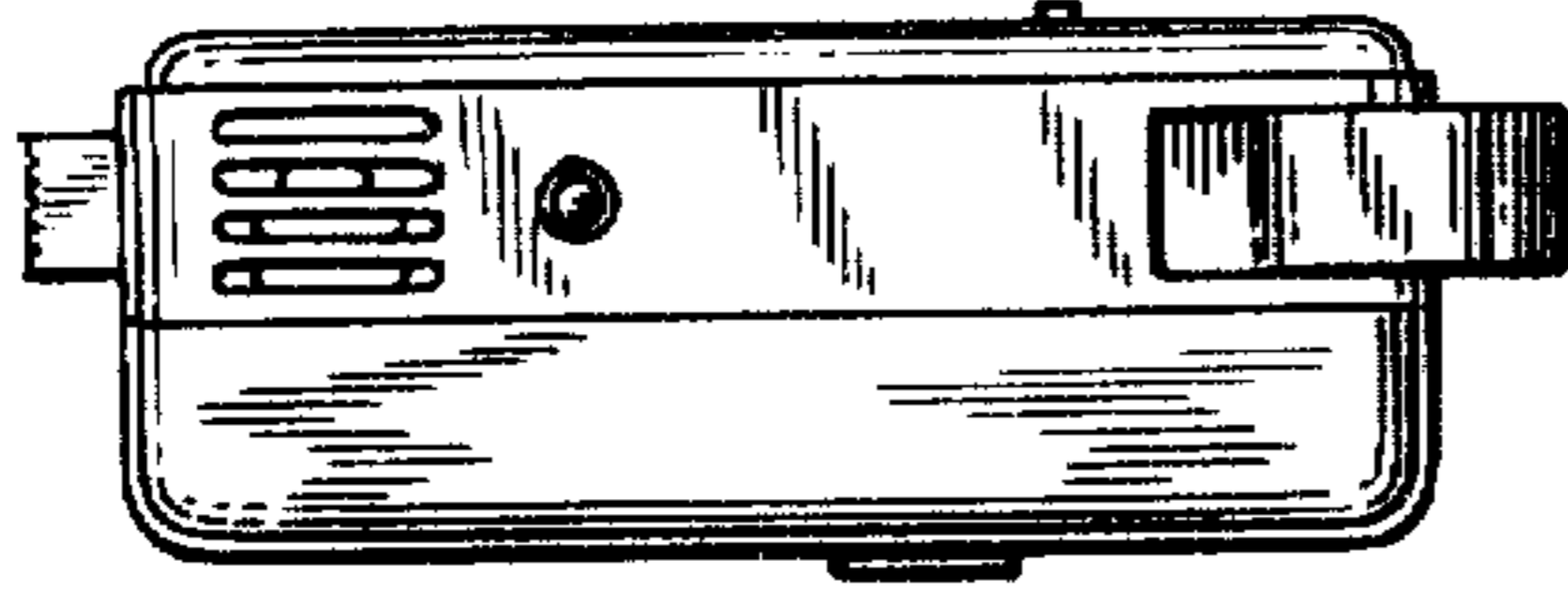
The ornamental design for a tape recording machine, as shown.

DESCRIPTION

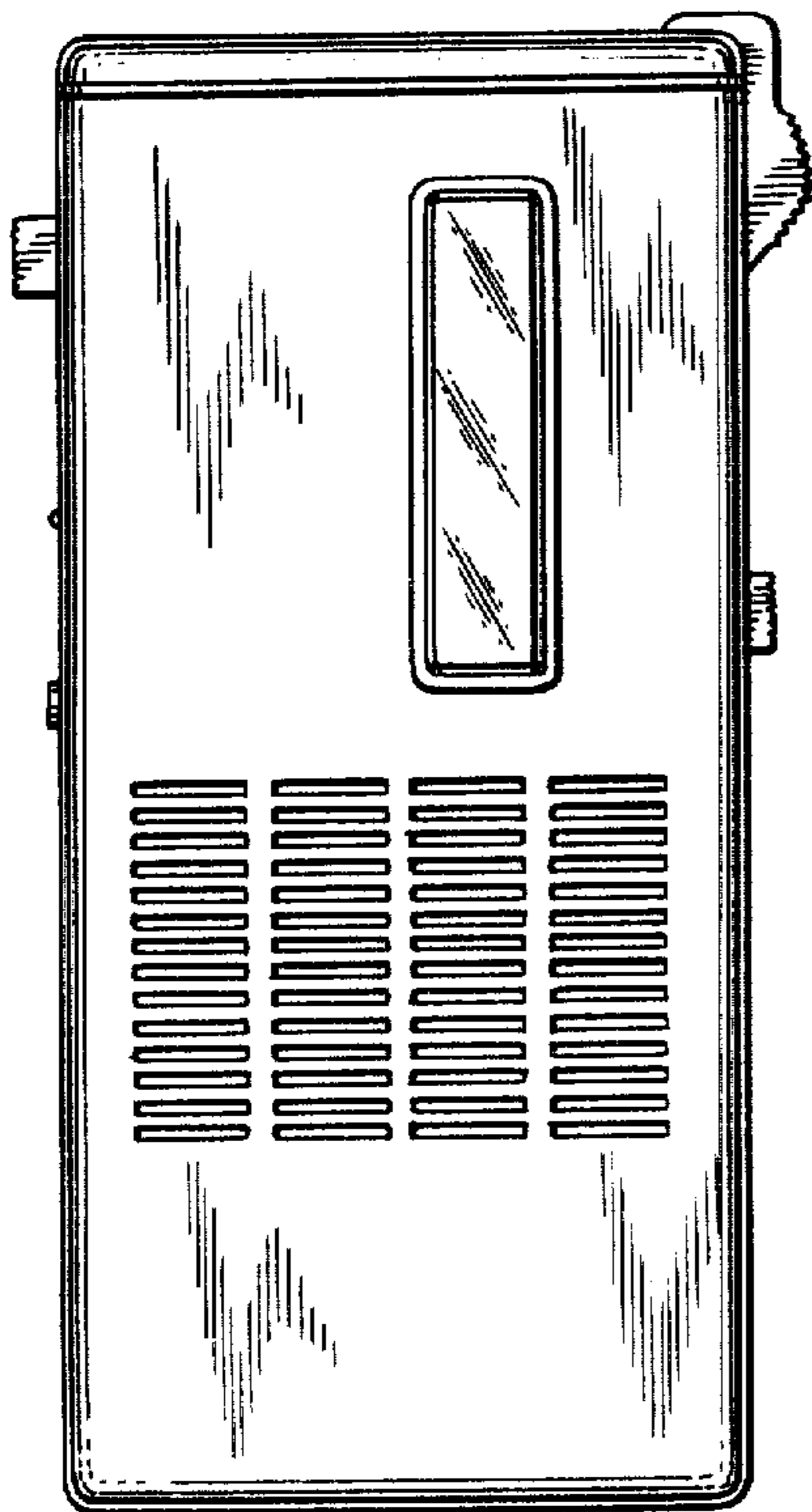
FIG. 1 is a top plan view of a tape recording machine showing our new design;

FIG. 6 is a bottom view thereof.



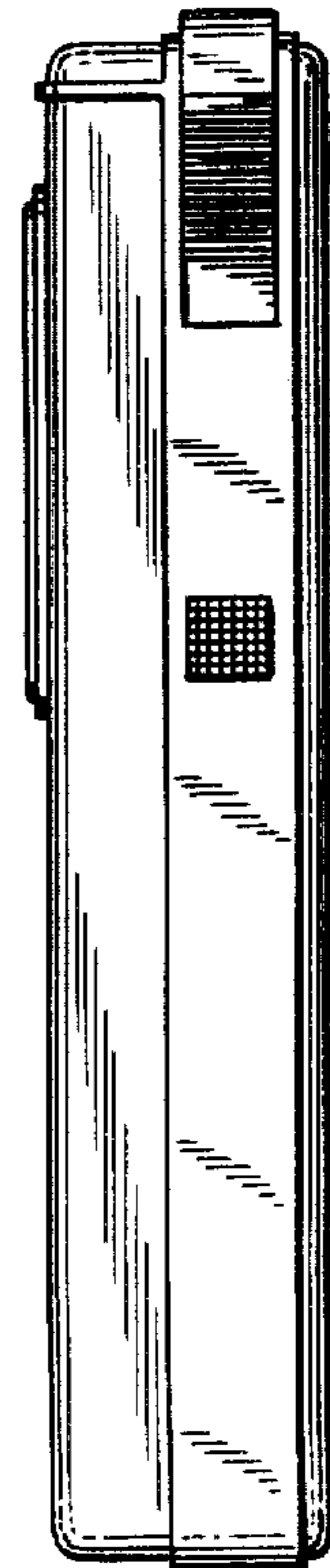

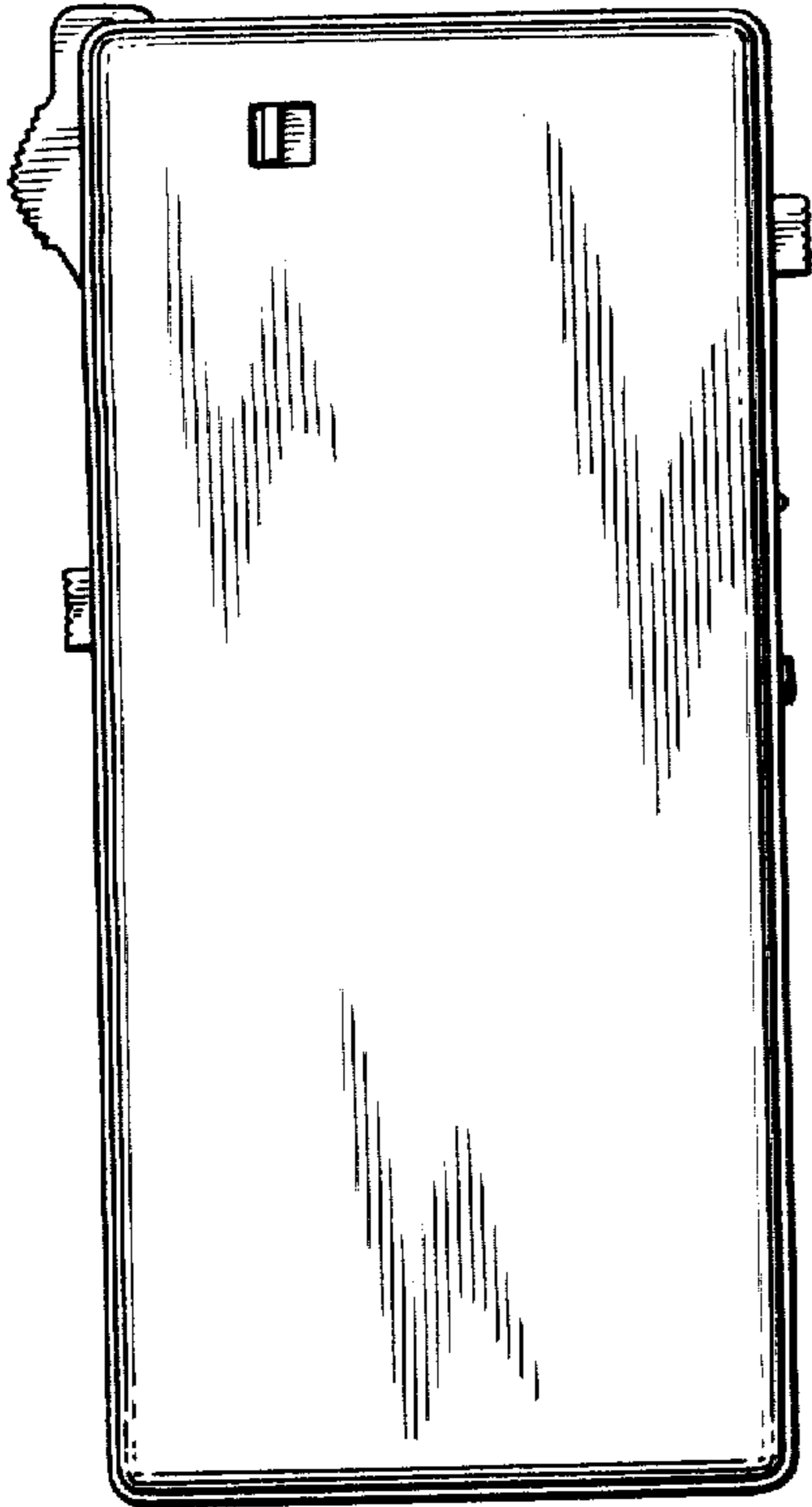

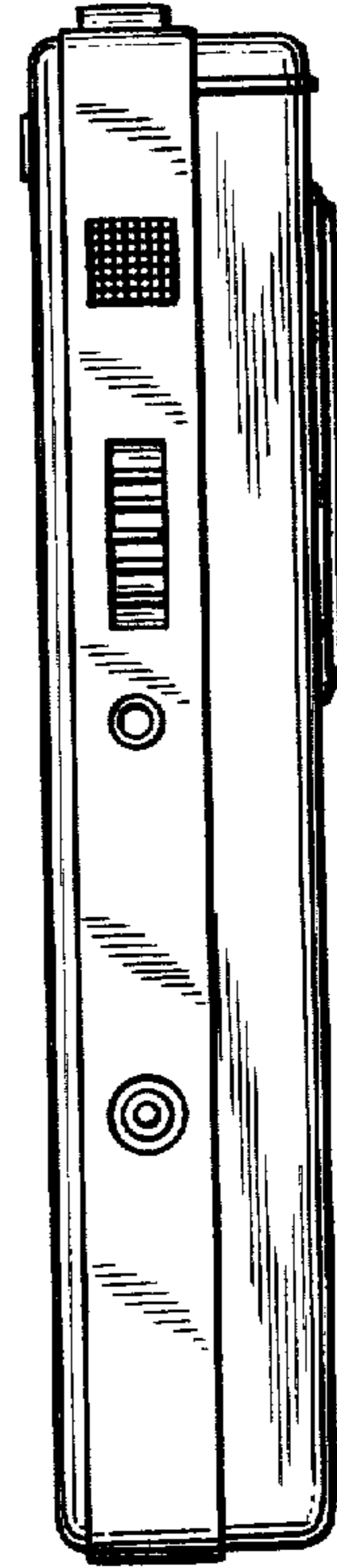
