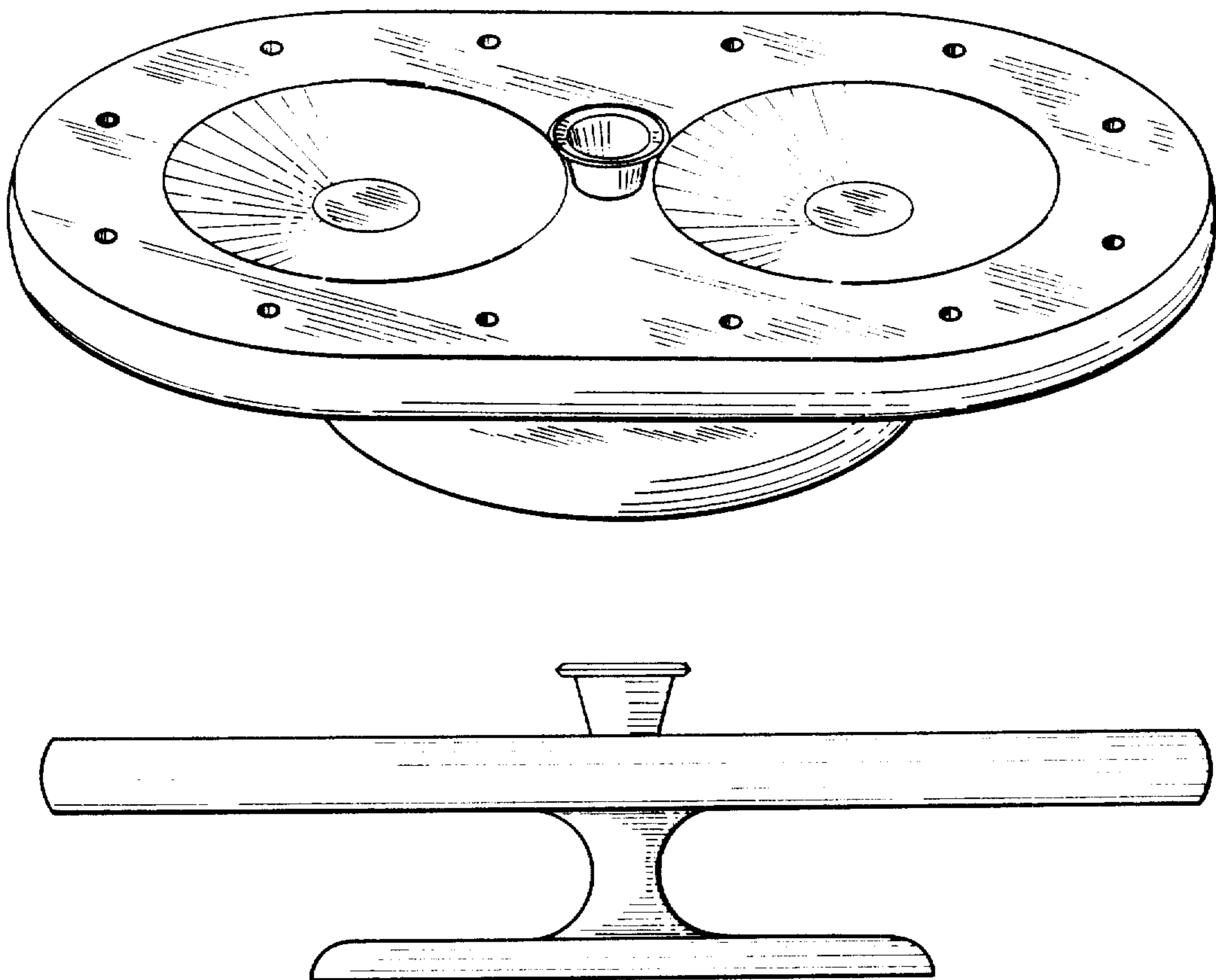

FIG. 4 is an end elevational view, the opposite end being a mirror image of the end shown therein.



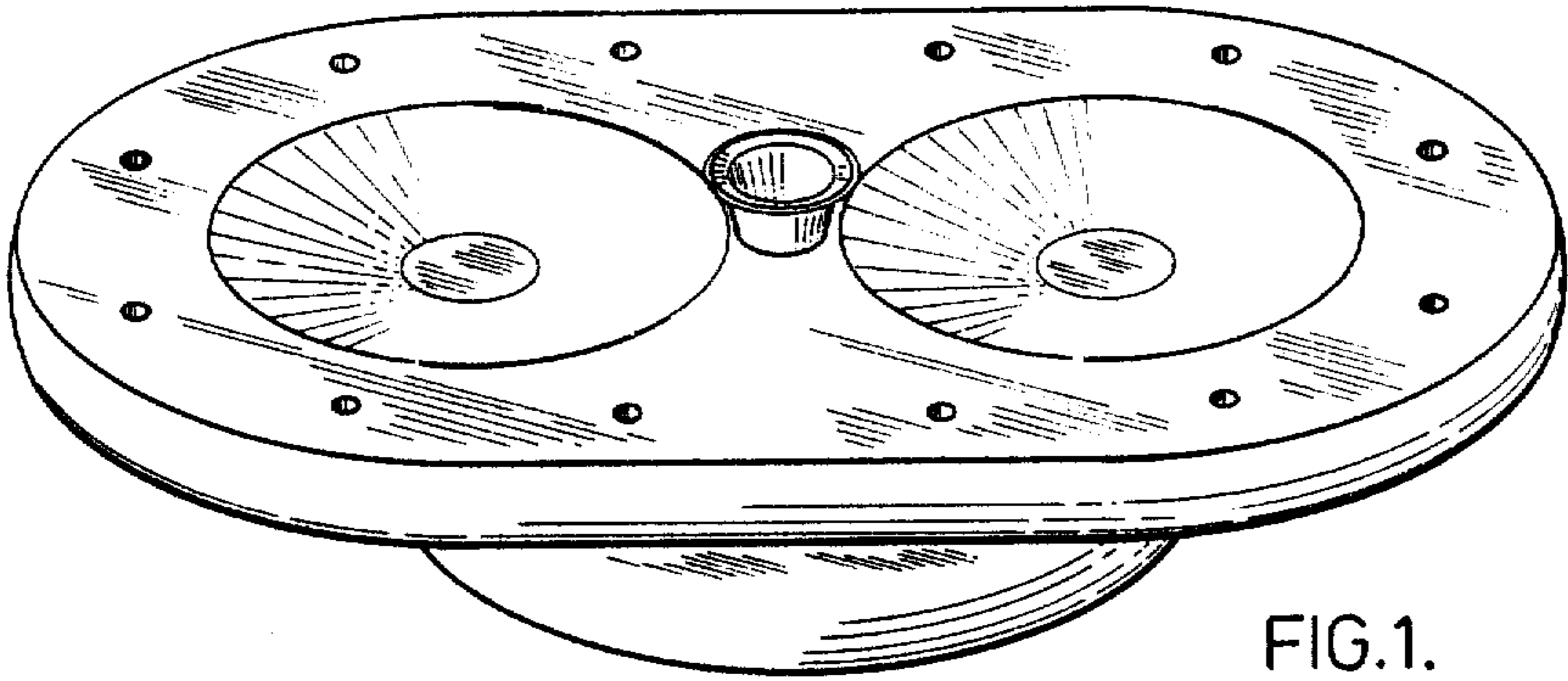

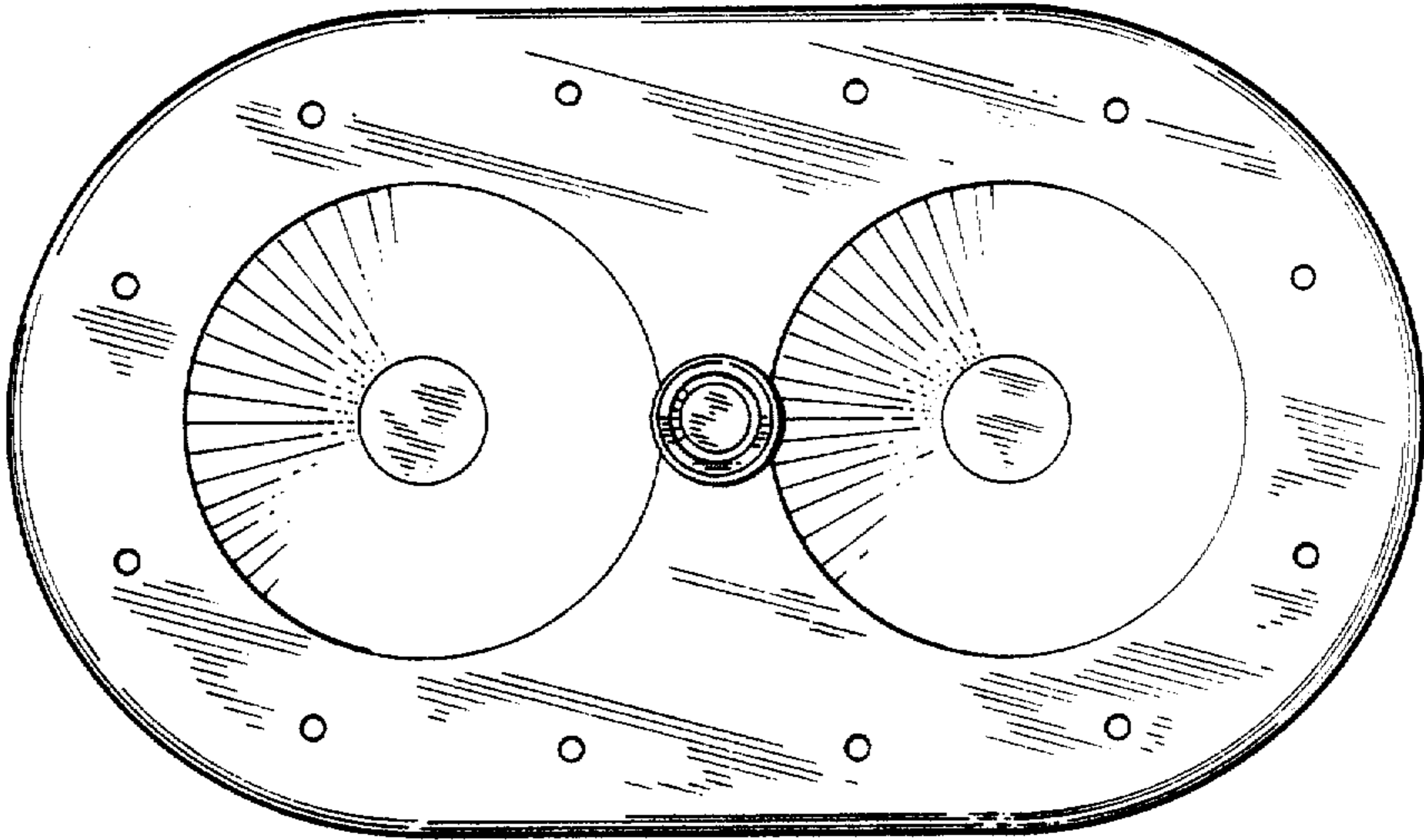

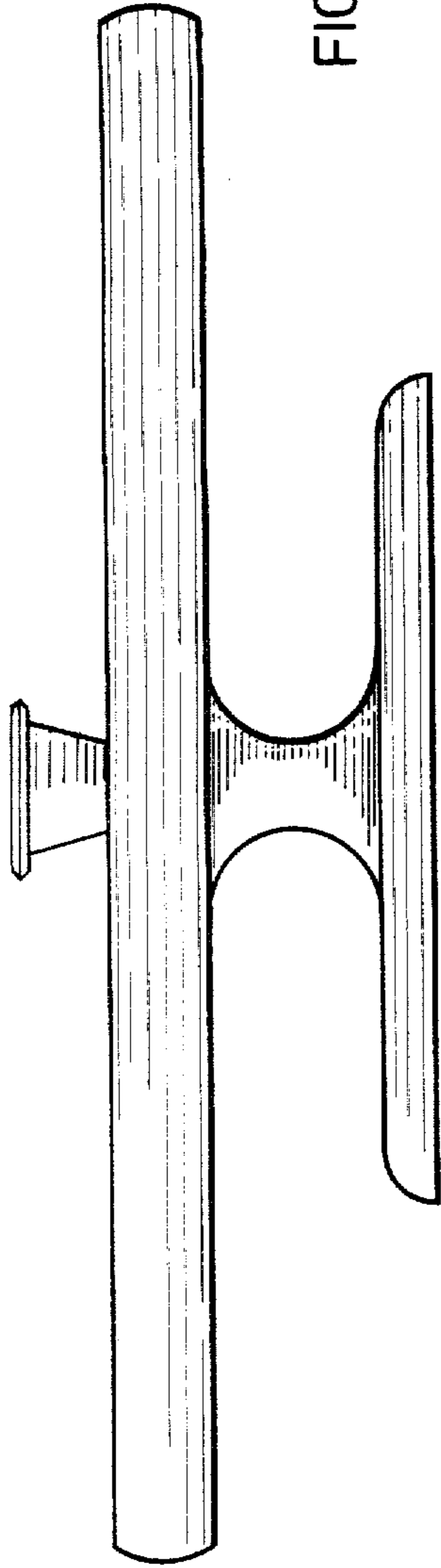

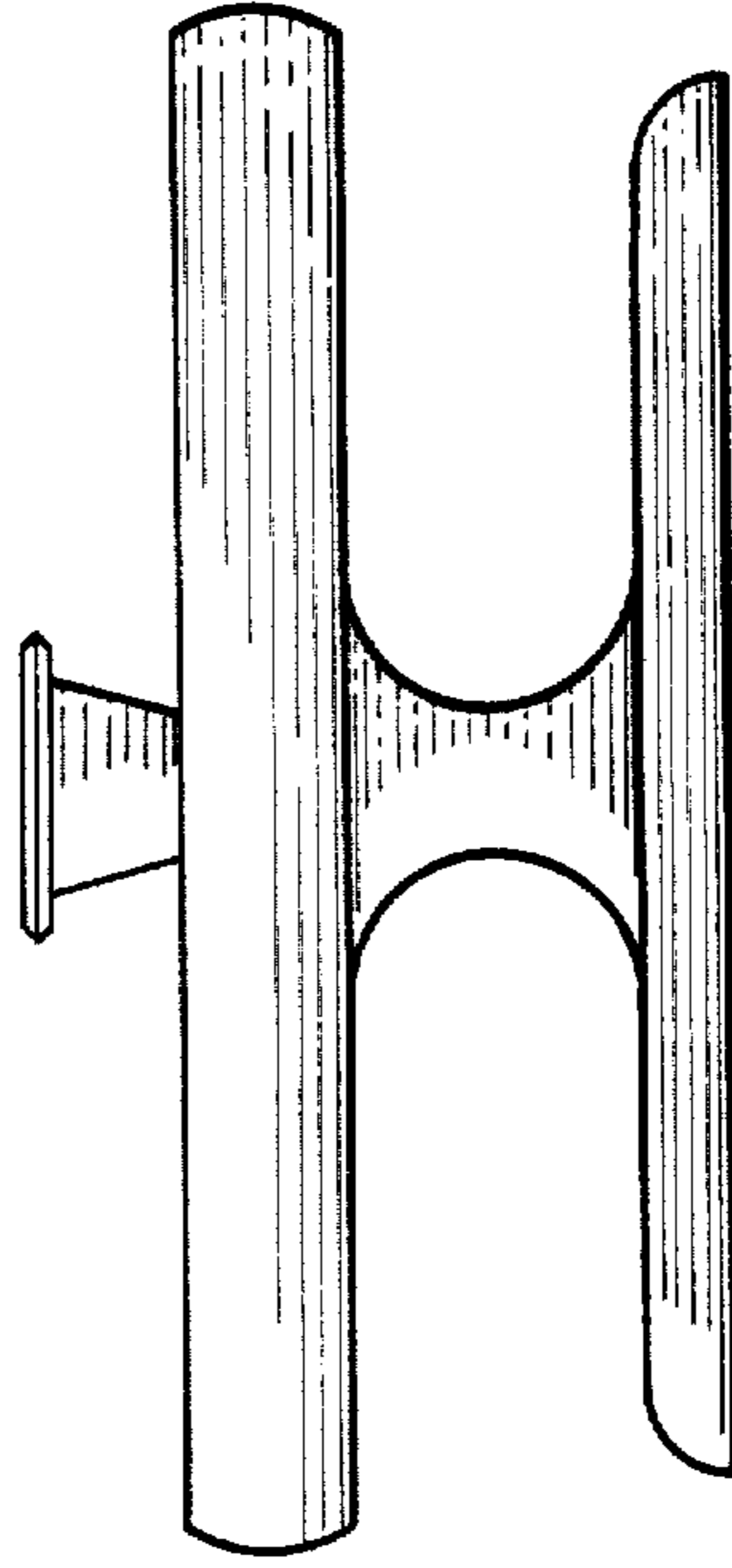
