[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a chair, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevation view of a chair showing my new design, the recessed areas are shaded for color contrast;

FIG. 2 is a side elevation view thereof, the undisclosed side being substantially identical with the side shown, the recessed areas are shaded for color contrast;

FIG. 3 is a rear elevation view thereof, the recessed areas are shaded for color contrast;

FIG. 4 is a top view thereof; the recessed areas are shaded for color contrast;

FIG. 5 is a cross-section taken on line 5-5 of FIG. 2, the recessed areas are shaded for color contrast;

FIG. 6 is a second embodiment of FIG. 1, the recessed areas are shaded for color contrast;

FIG. 7 is a third embodiment of FIG. 1, the recessed areas are shaded for color contrast;

FIG. 8 is a fourth embodiment of FIG. 1, the recessed areas are shaded for color contrast; and

FIG. 9 is a second embodiment of FIG. 2, the sole difference being the back is curved, the recessed areas are shaded for color contrast.

The side of the chair not shown is a mirror image of the side shown.

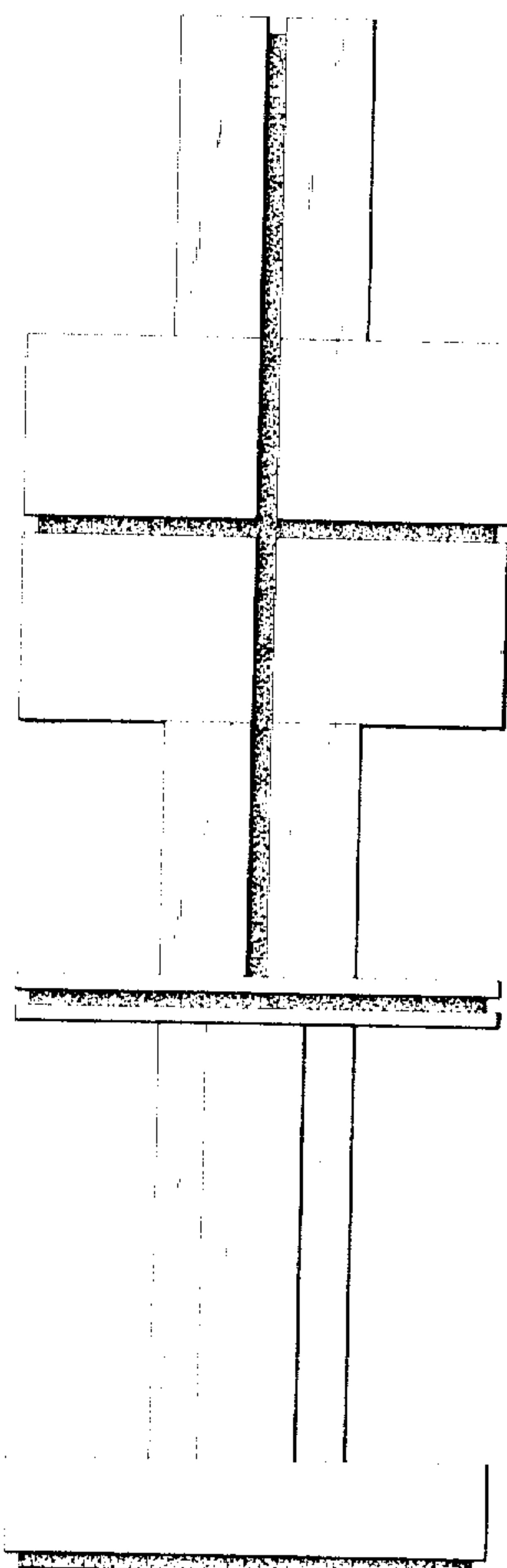

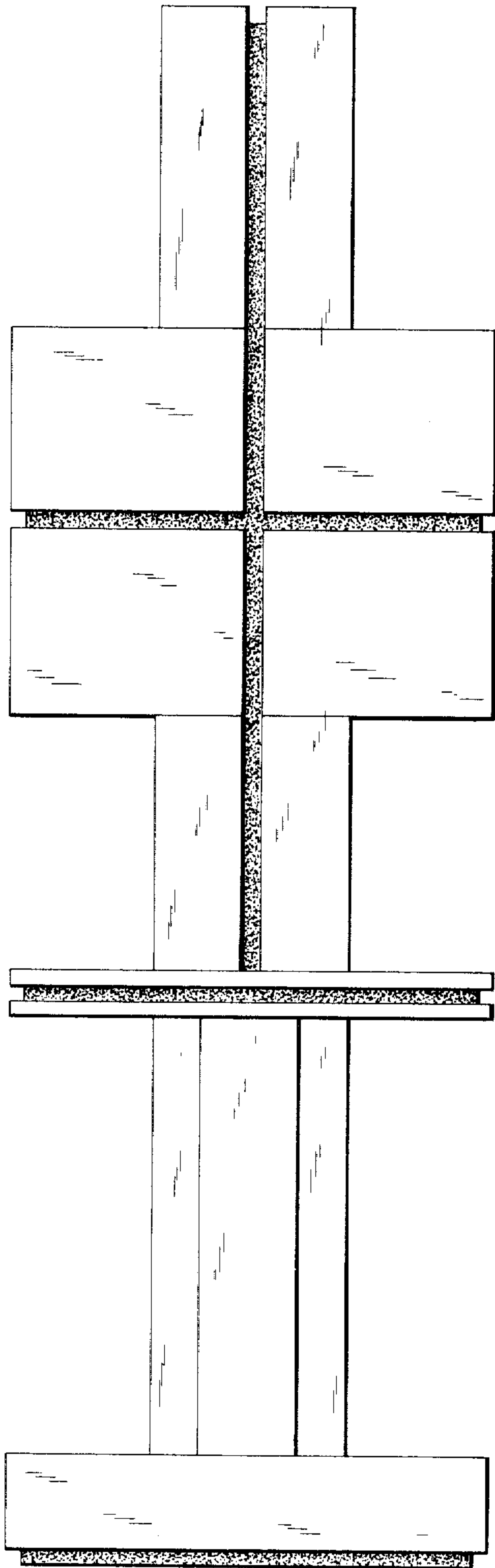

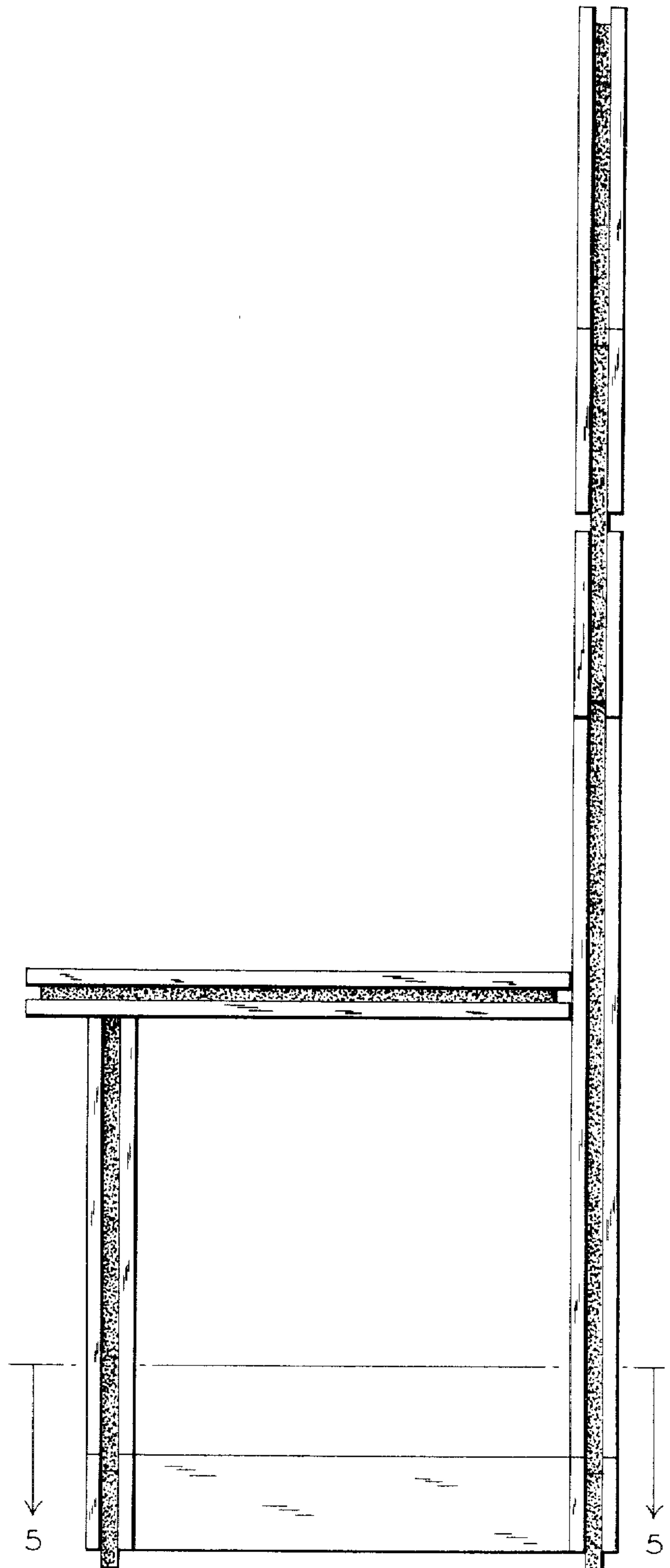

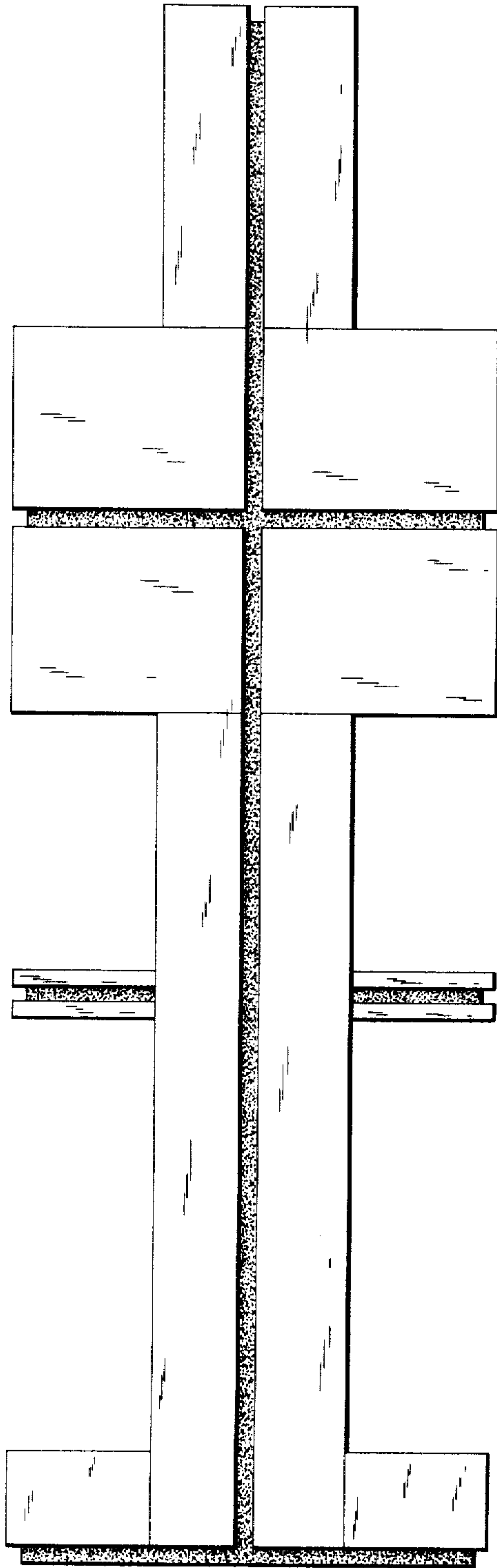

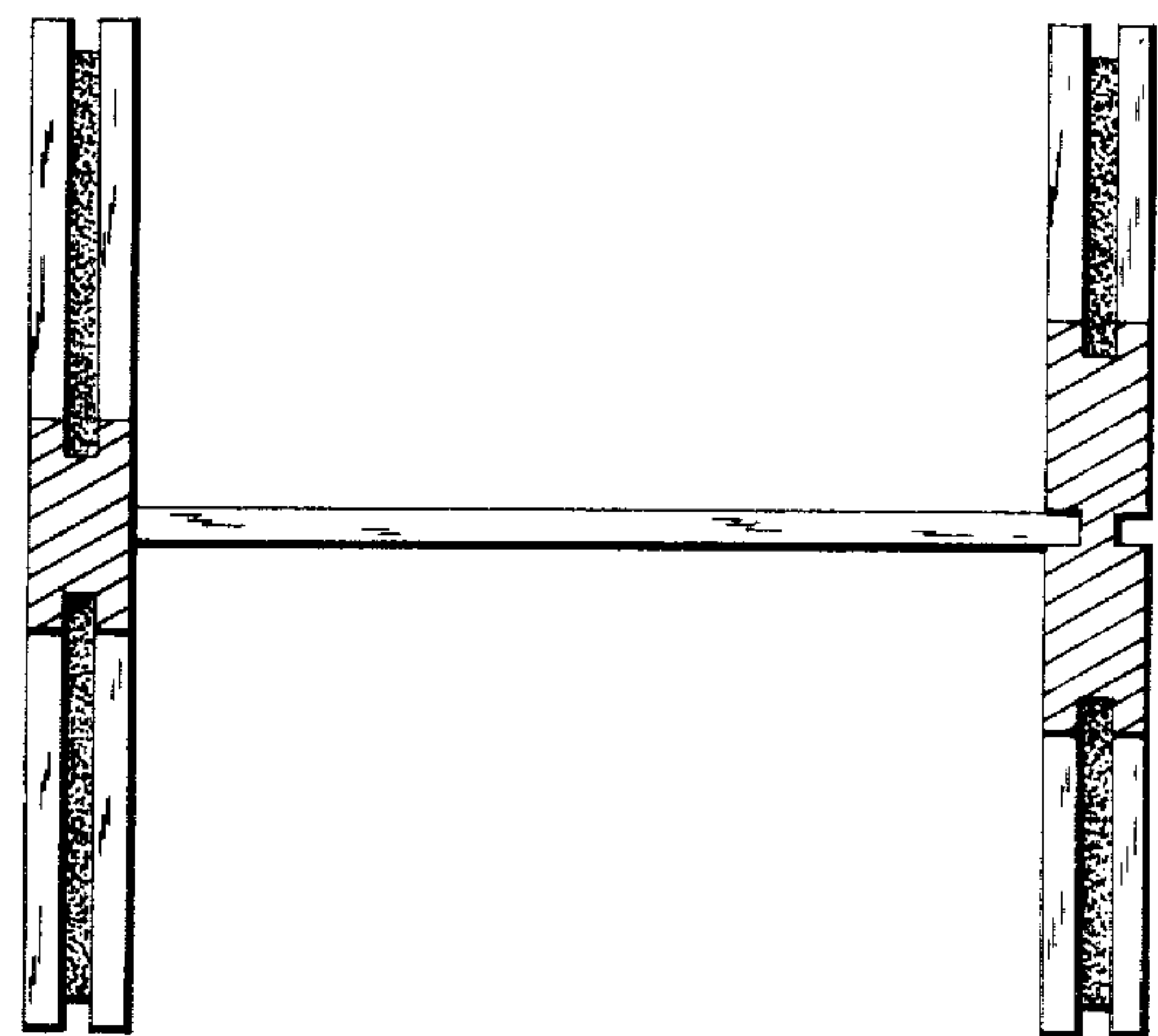
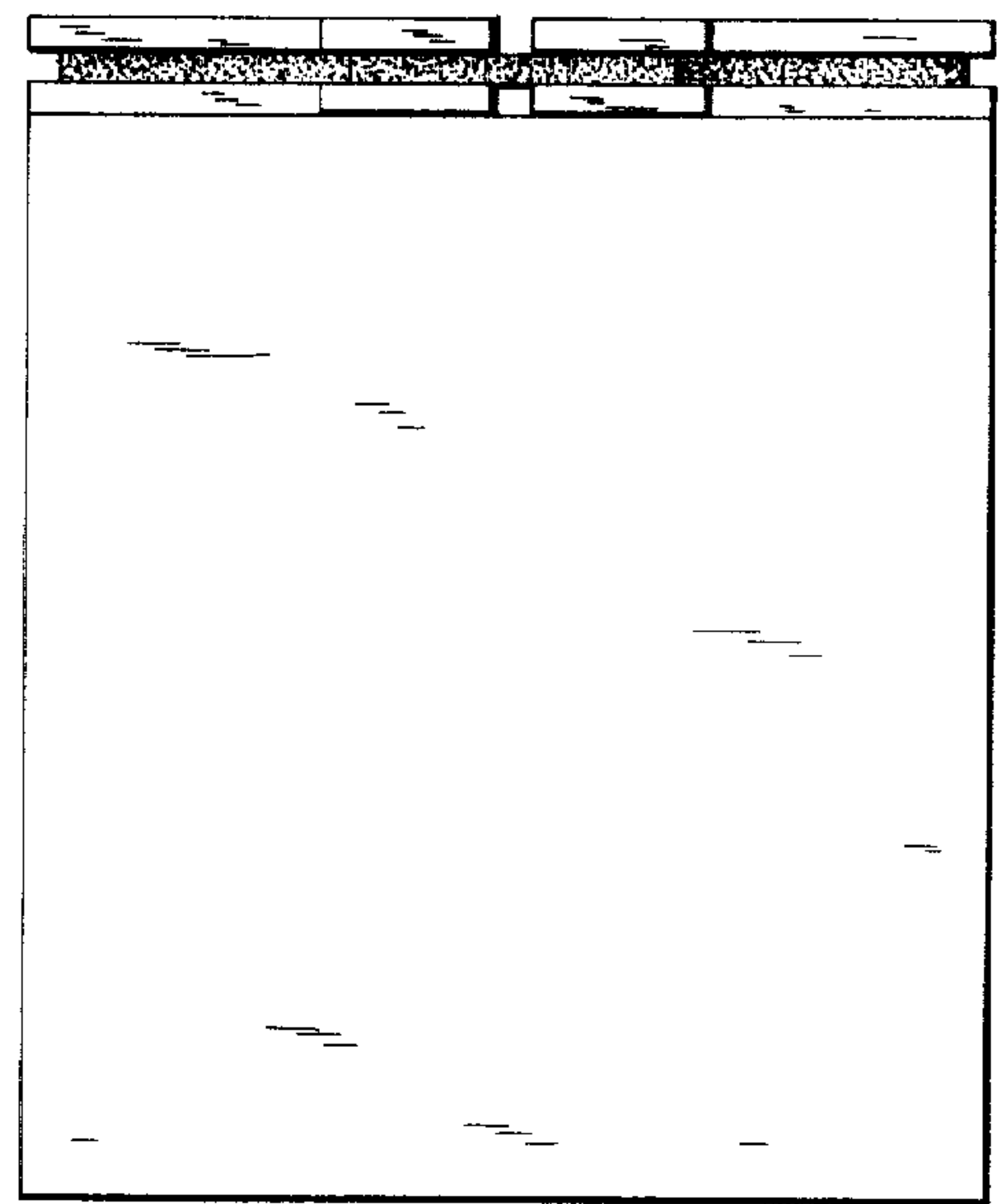

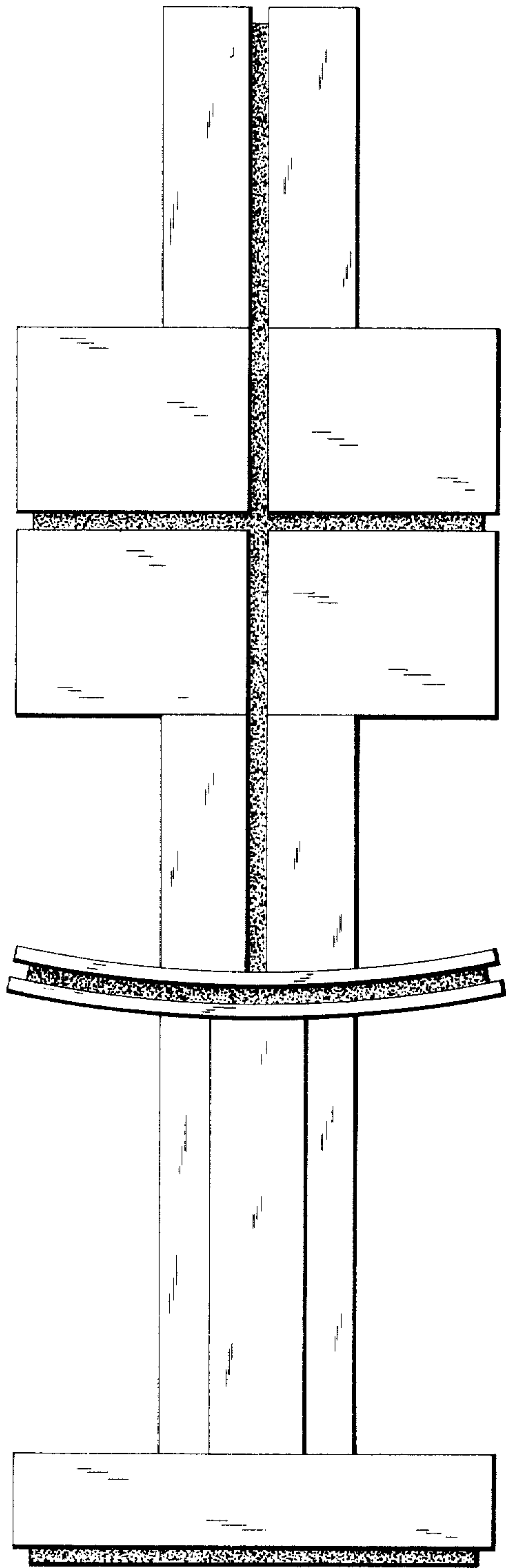

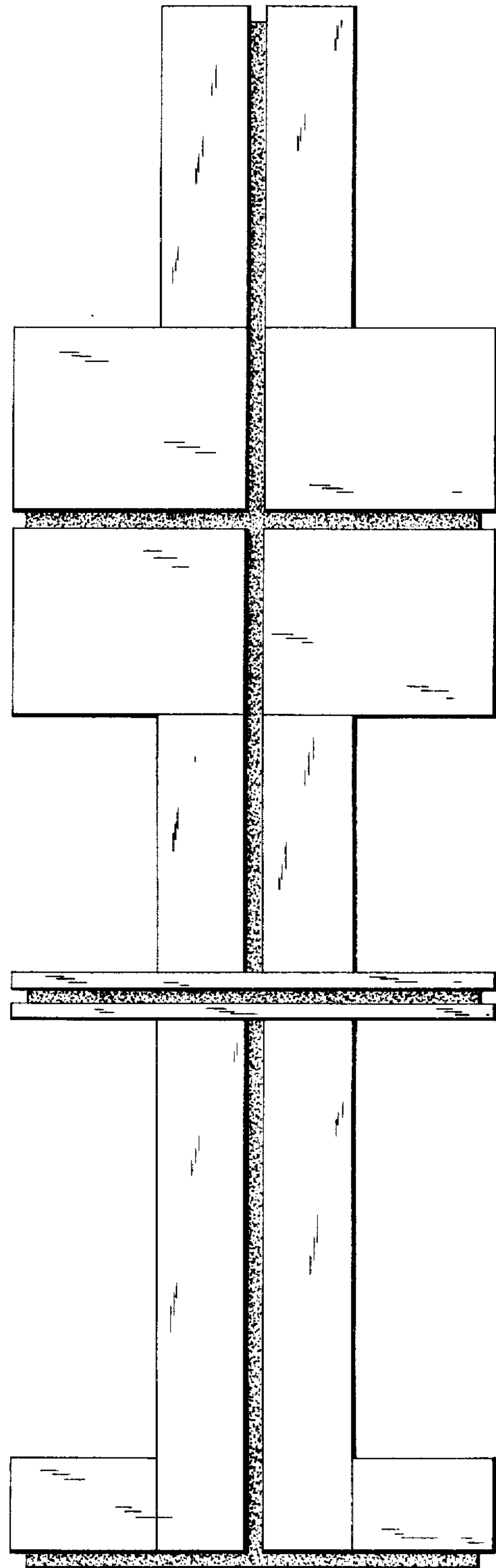

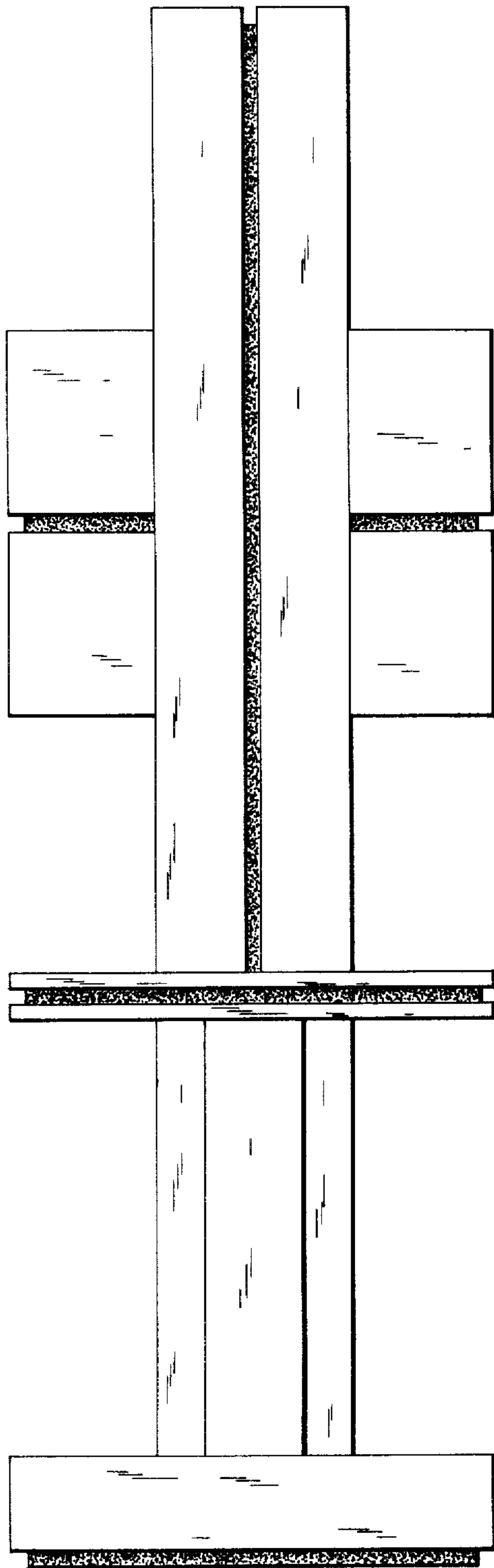
