DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of a combined cutting board,
serving dish and support stand showing my new design;
FIG. 2 is a front elevational view taken along line 2—2
of FIG. 1, with the back elevational view being a mirror
image;
FIG. 3 is a side elevational view taken along line 3—3 of
FIG. 1.
FIG. 4 is a side elevational view taken along line 4—4 of
FIG. 1.

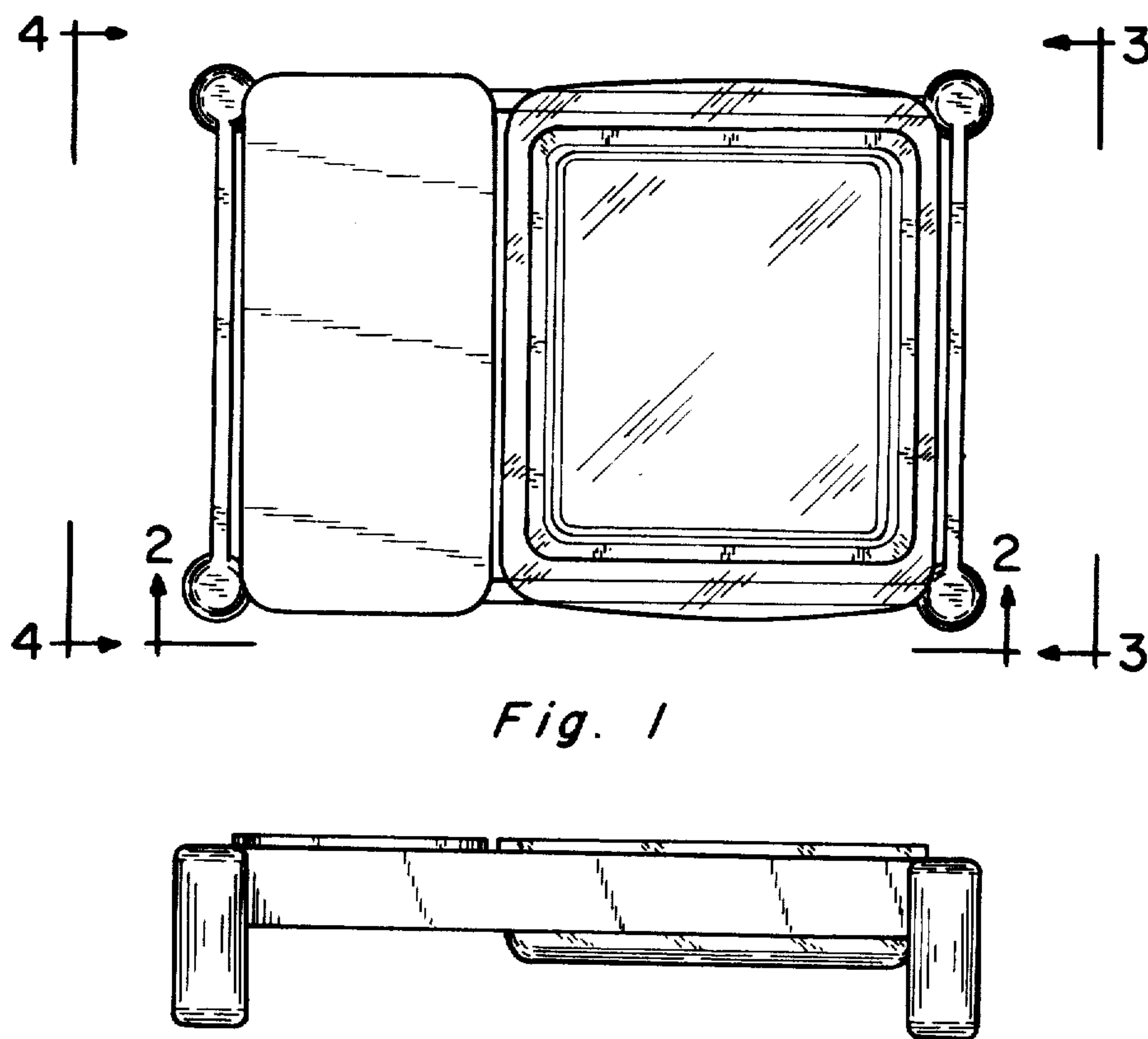

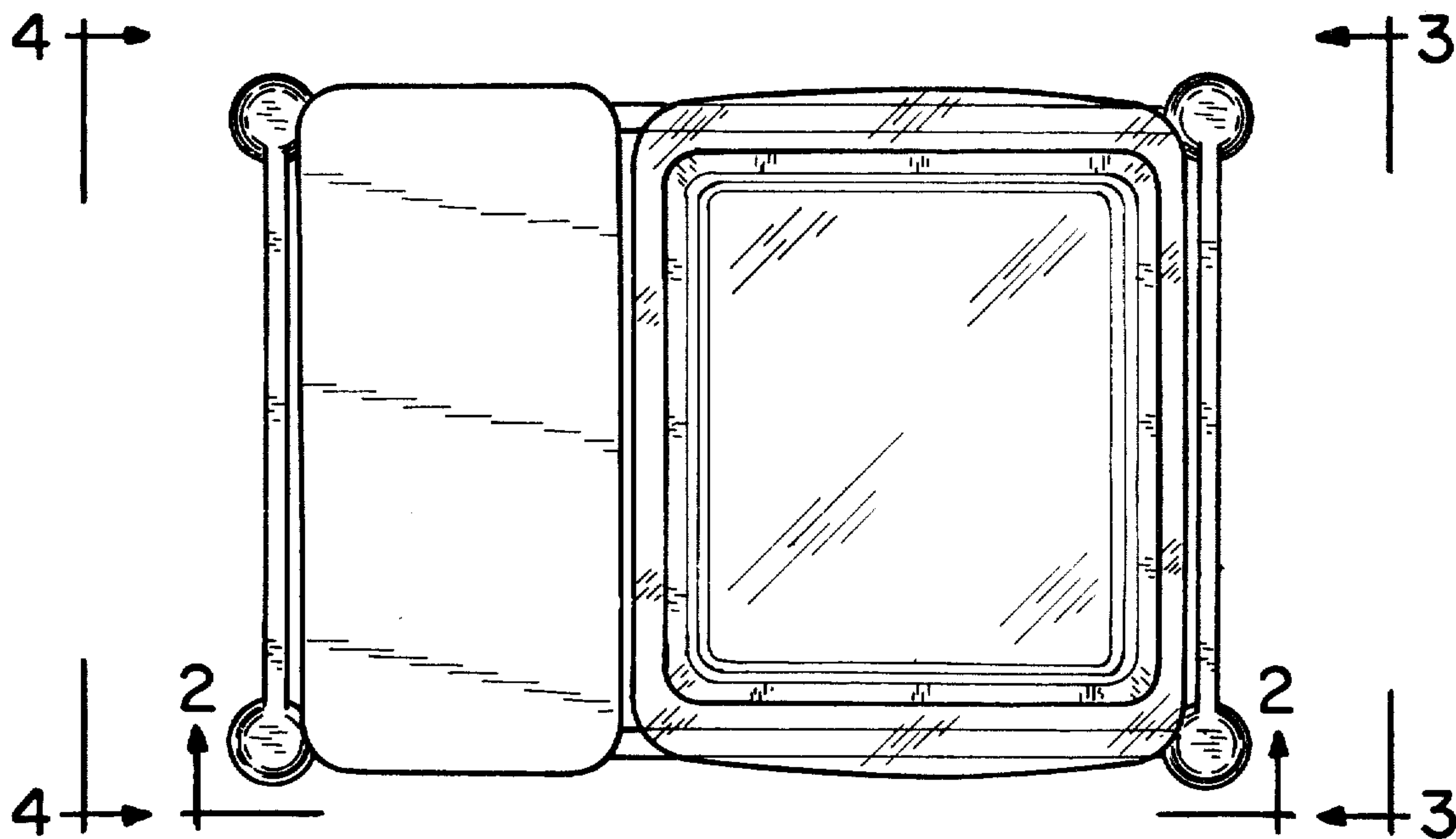

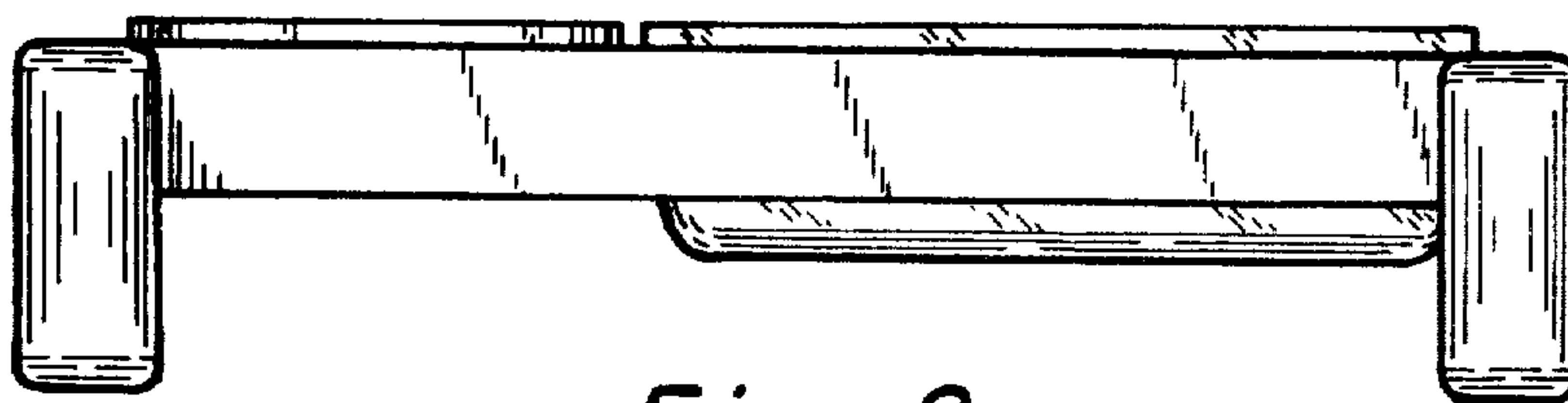

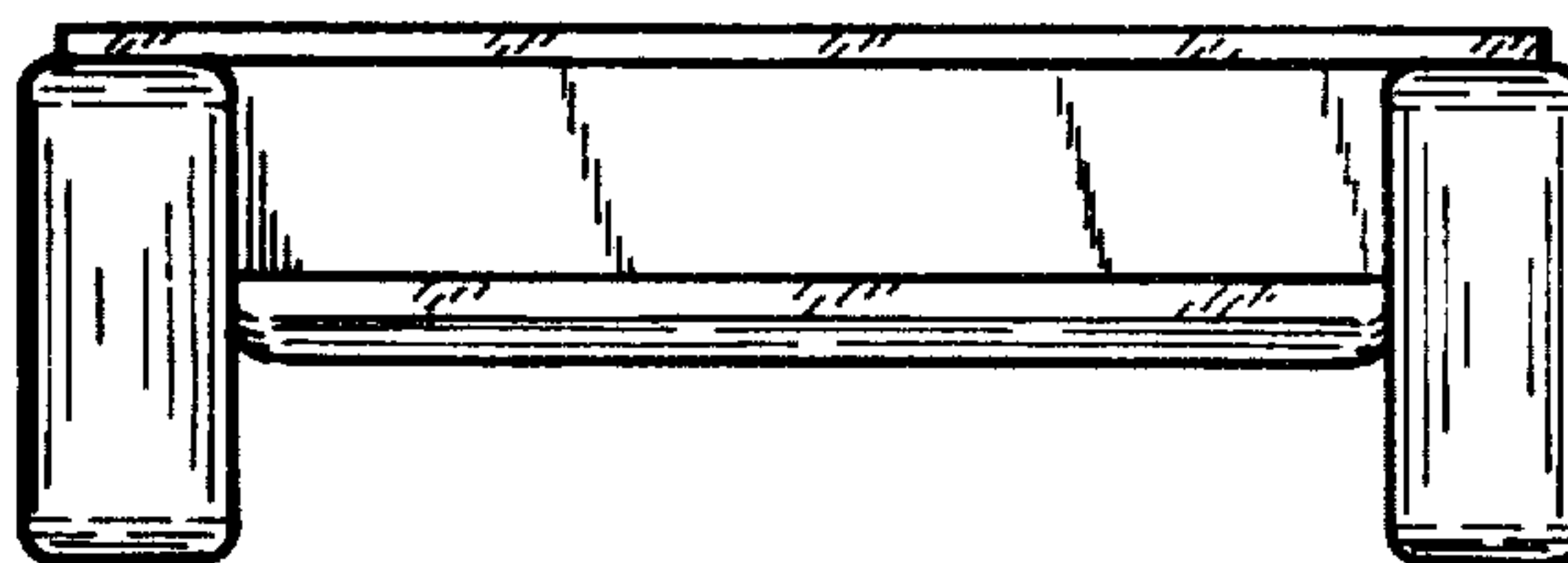

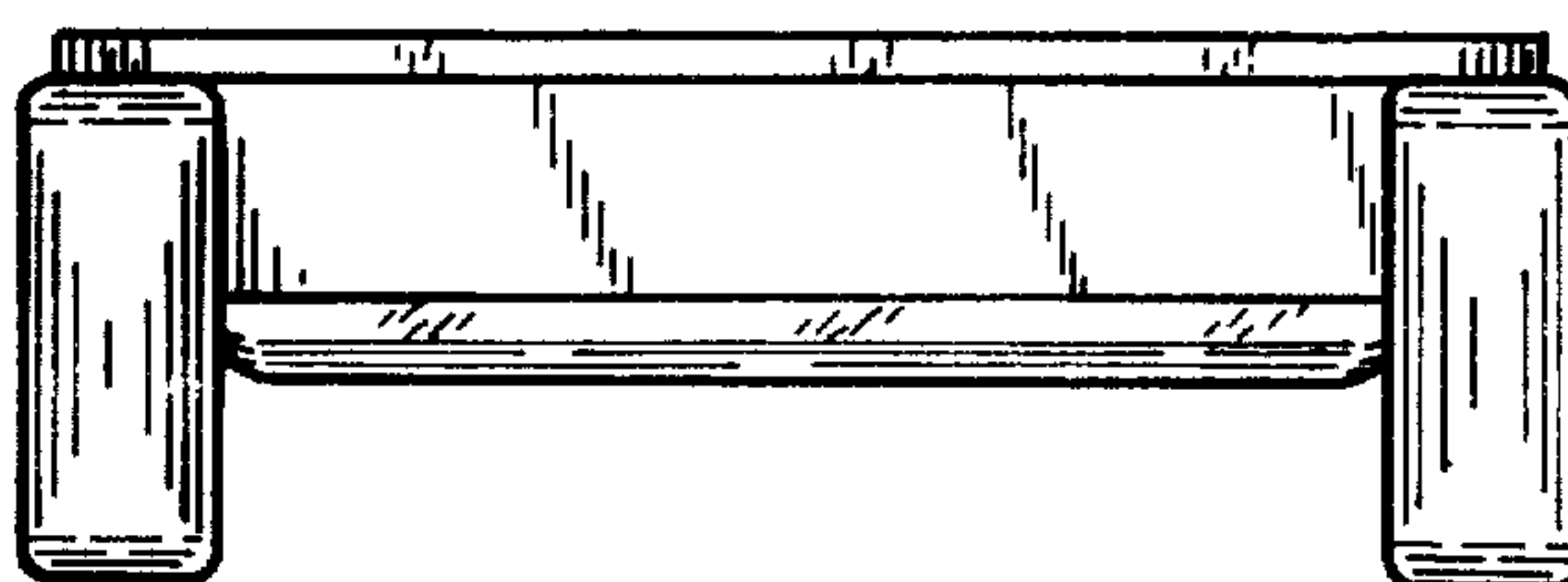
