The rear of the lighted merchandise display unit is plain and unornamental.

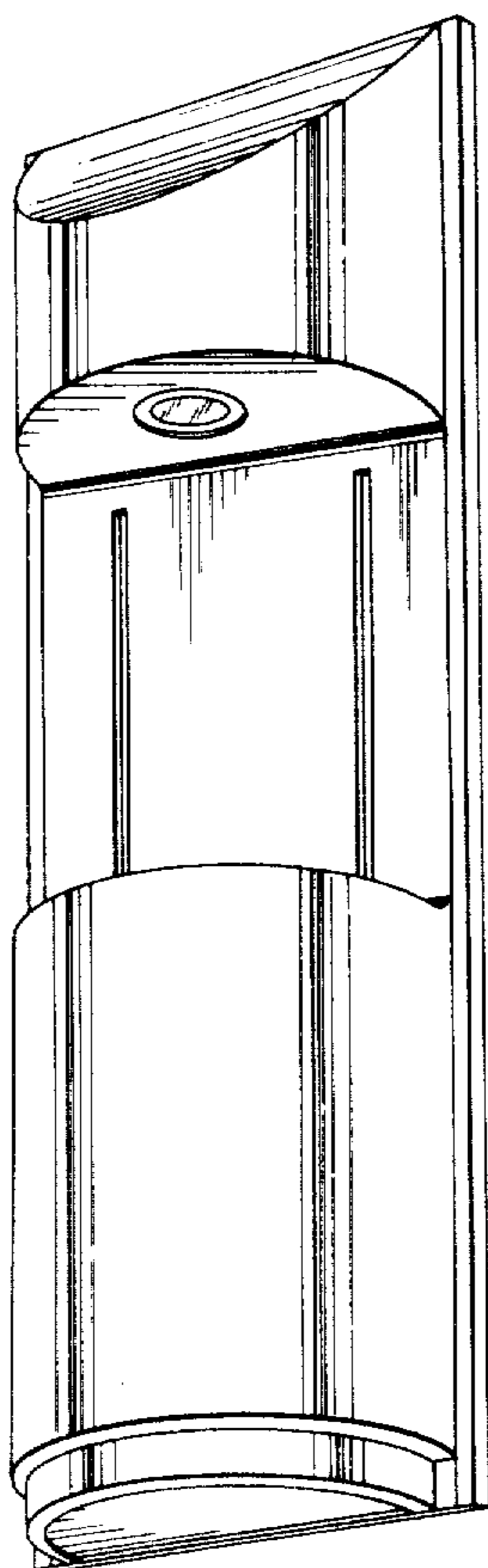

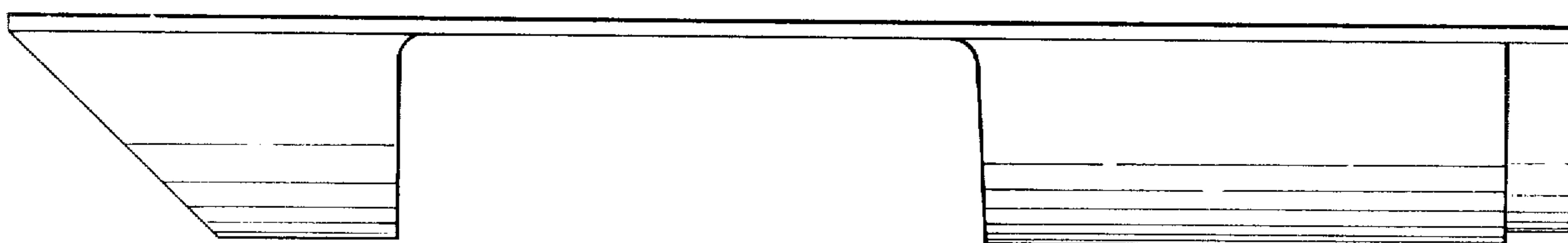

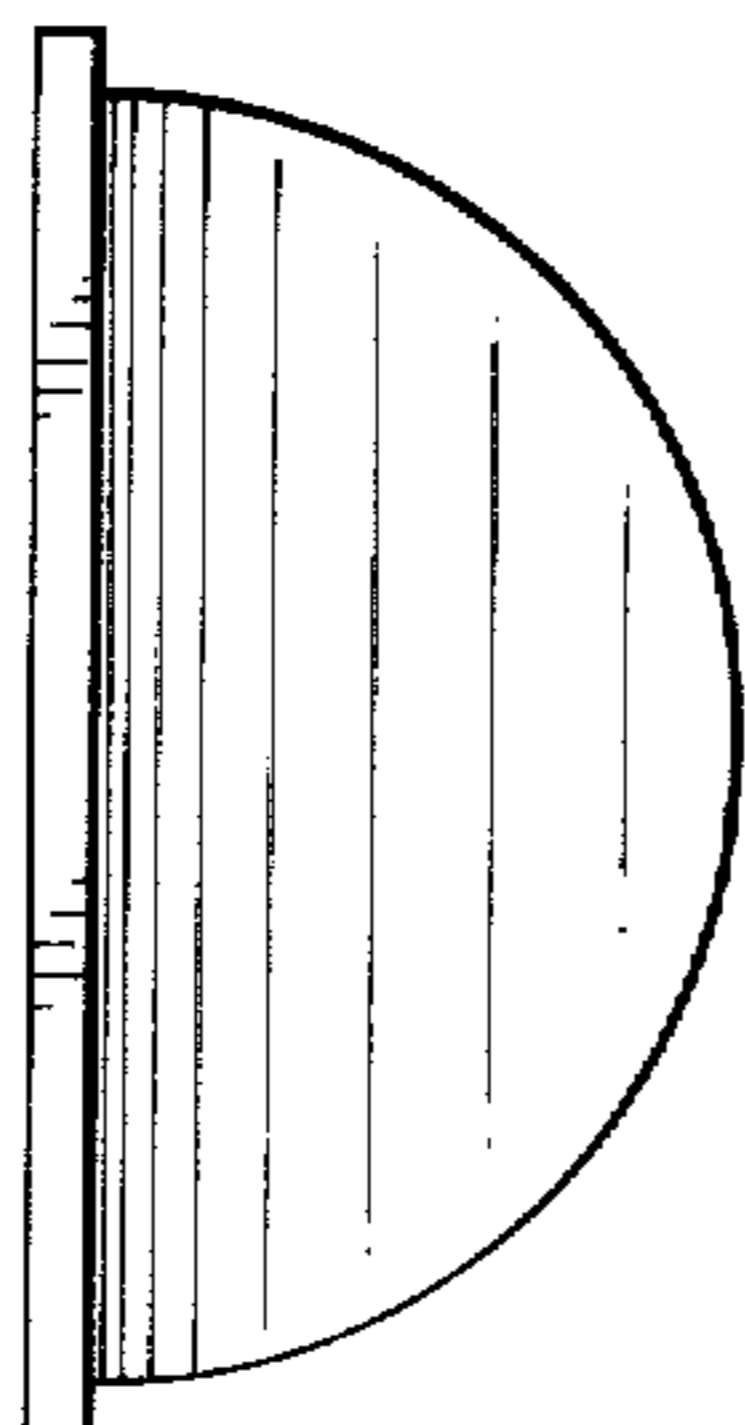

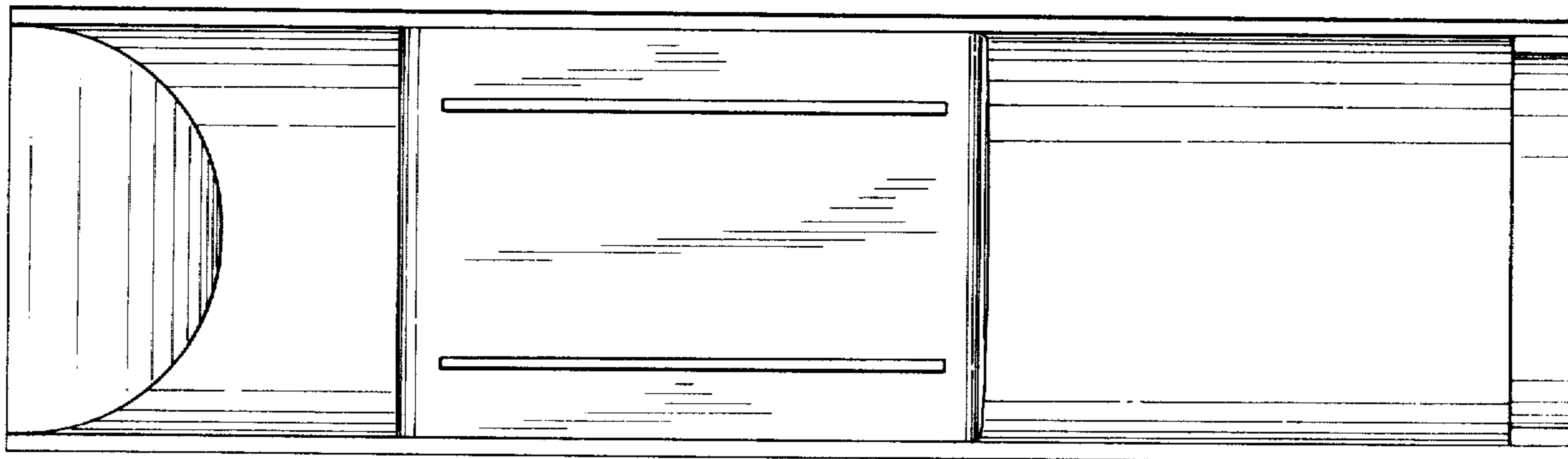
