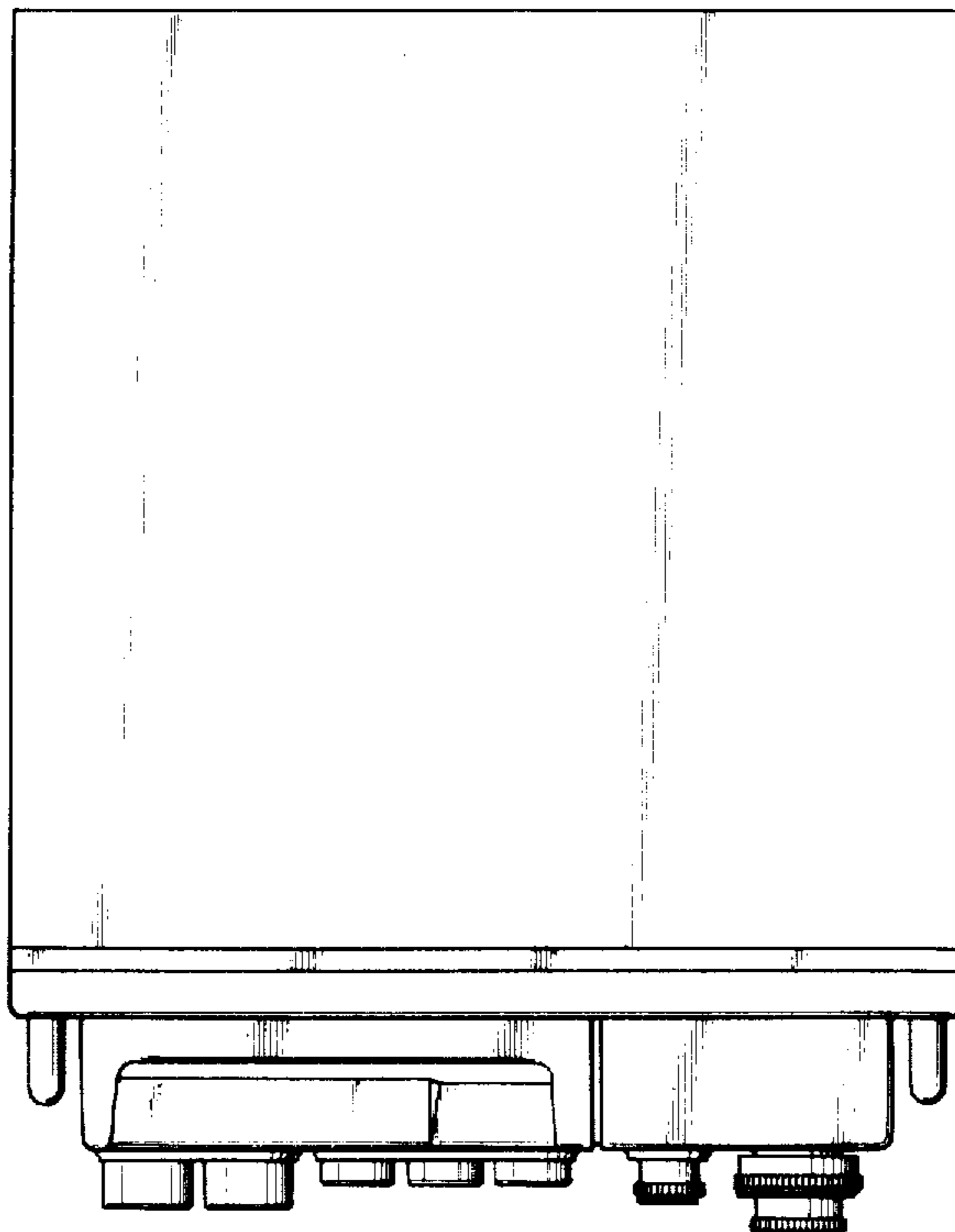
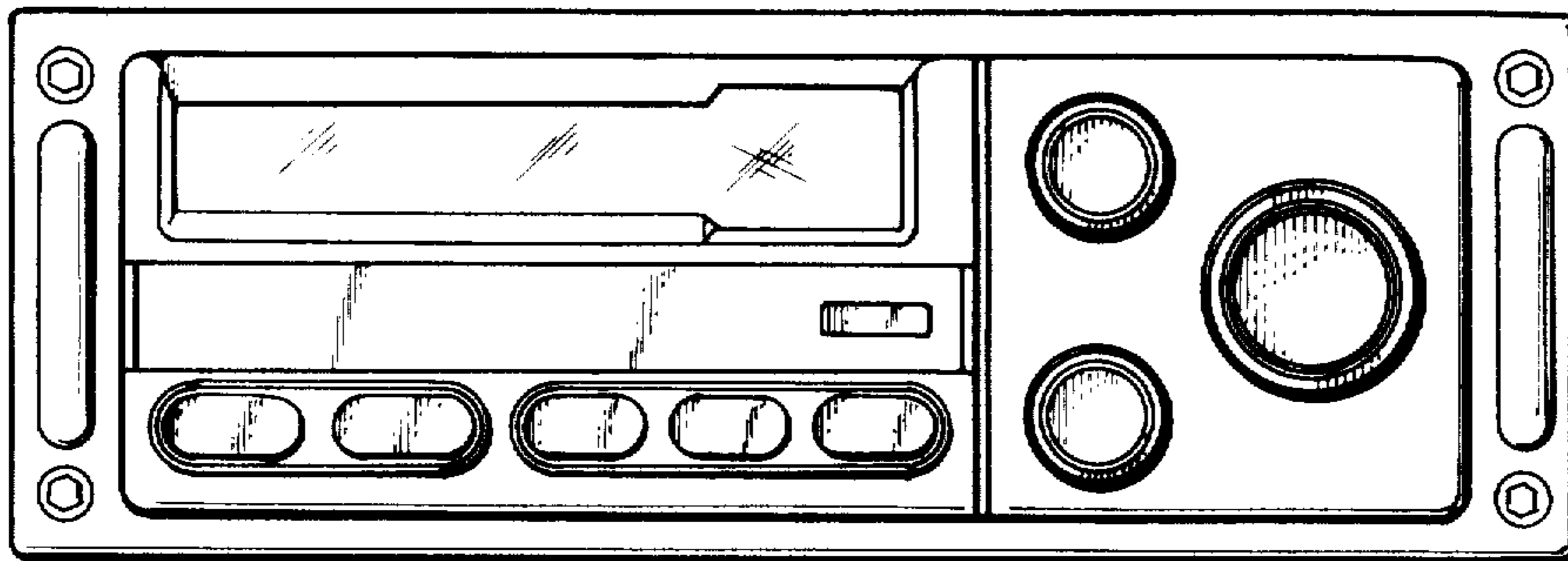

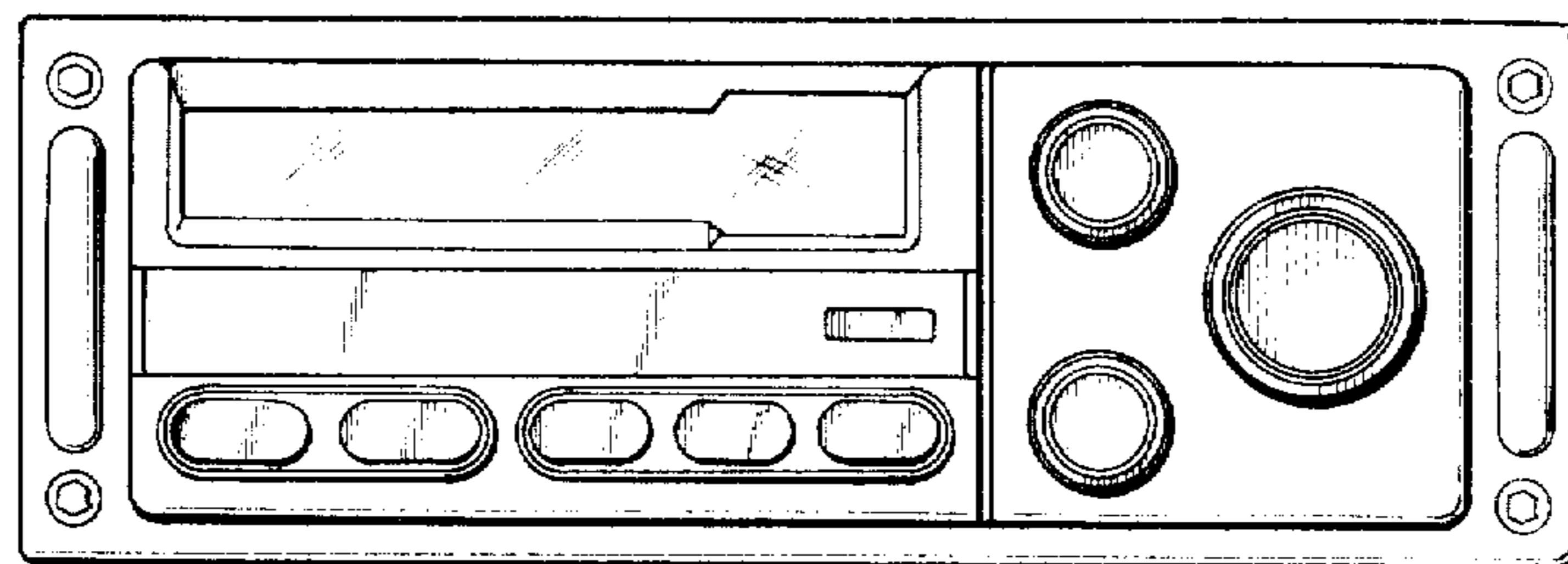
The ornamental design for a motor vehicular cassette player, substantially as shown.

DESCRIPTION

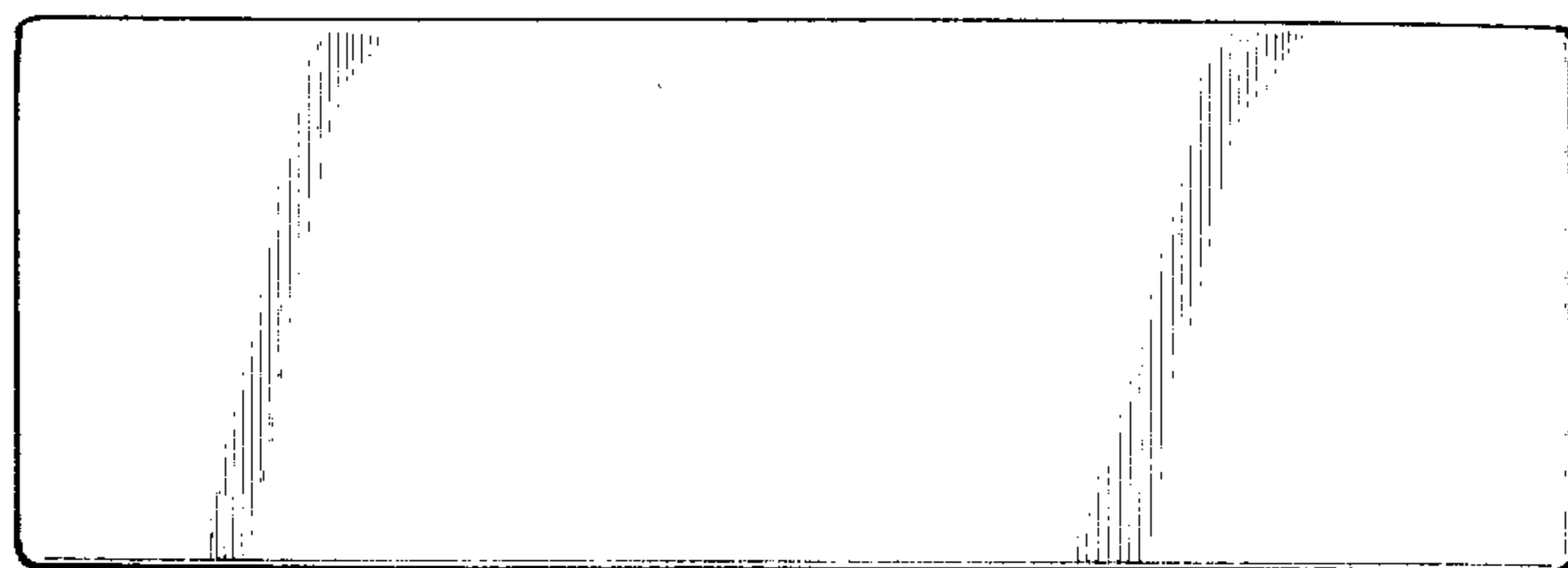

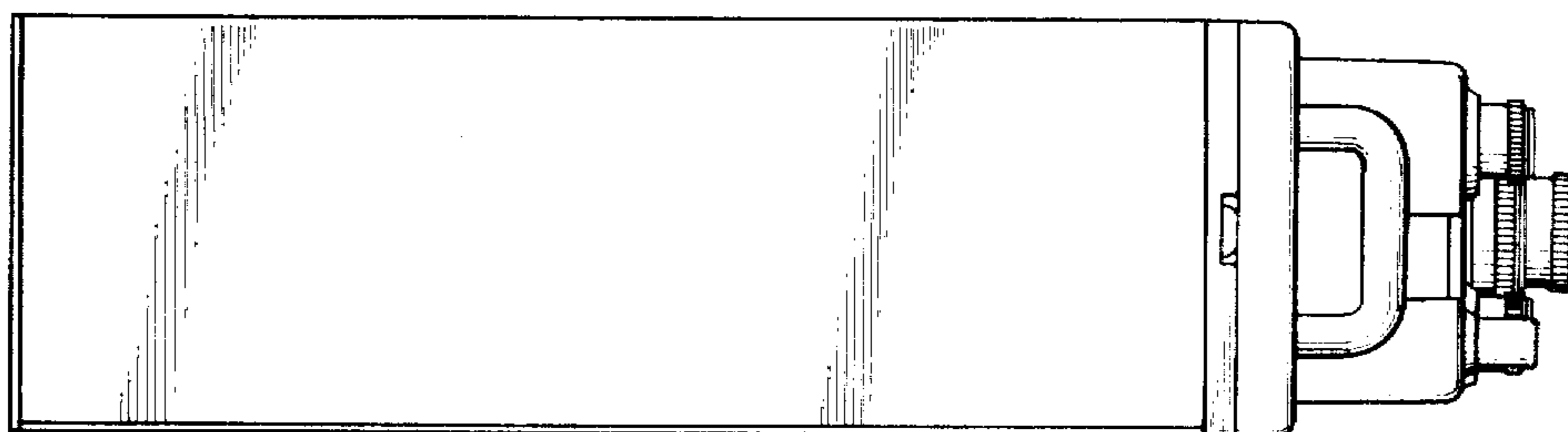

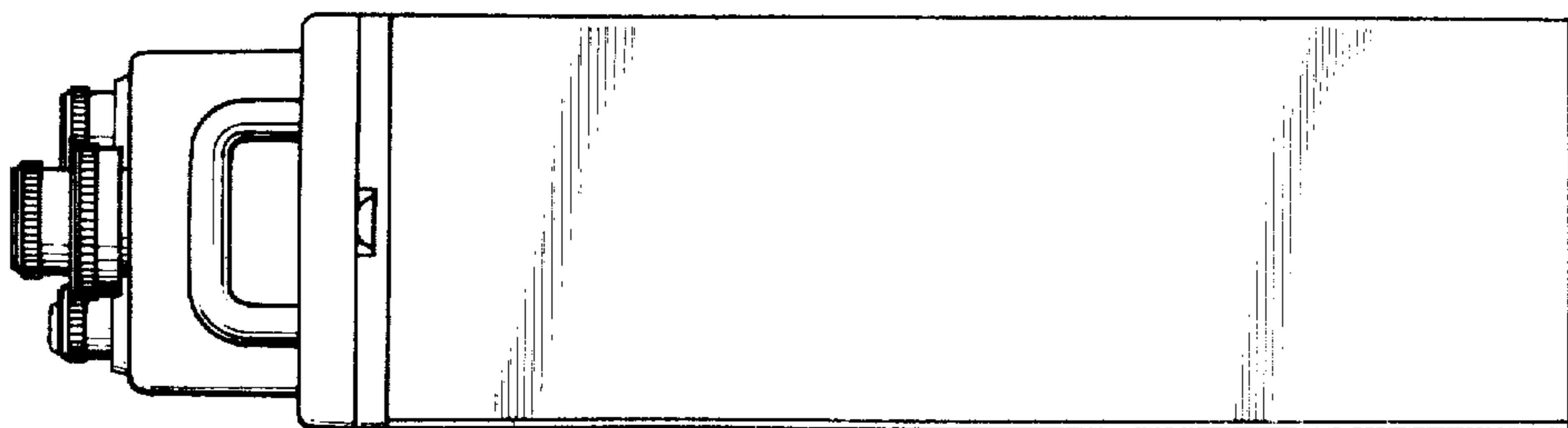

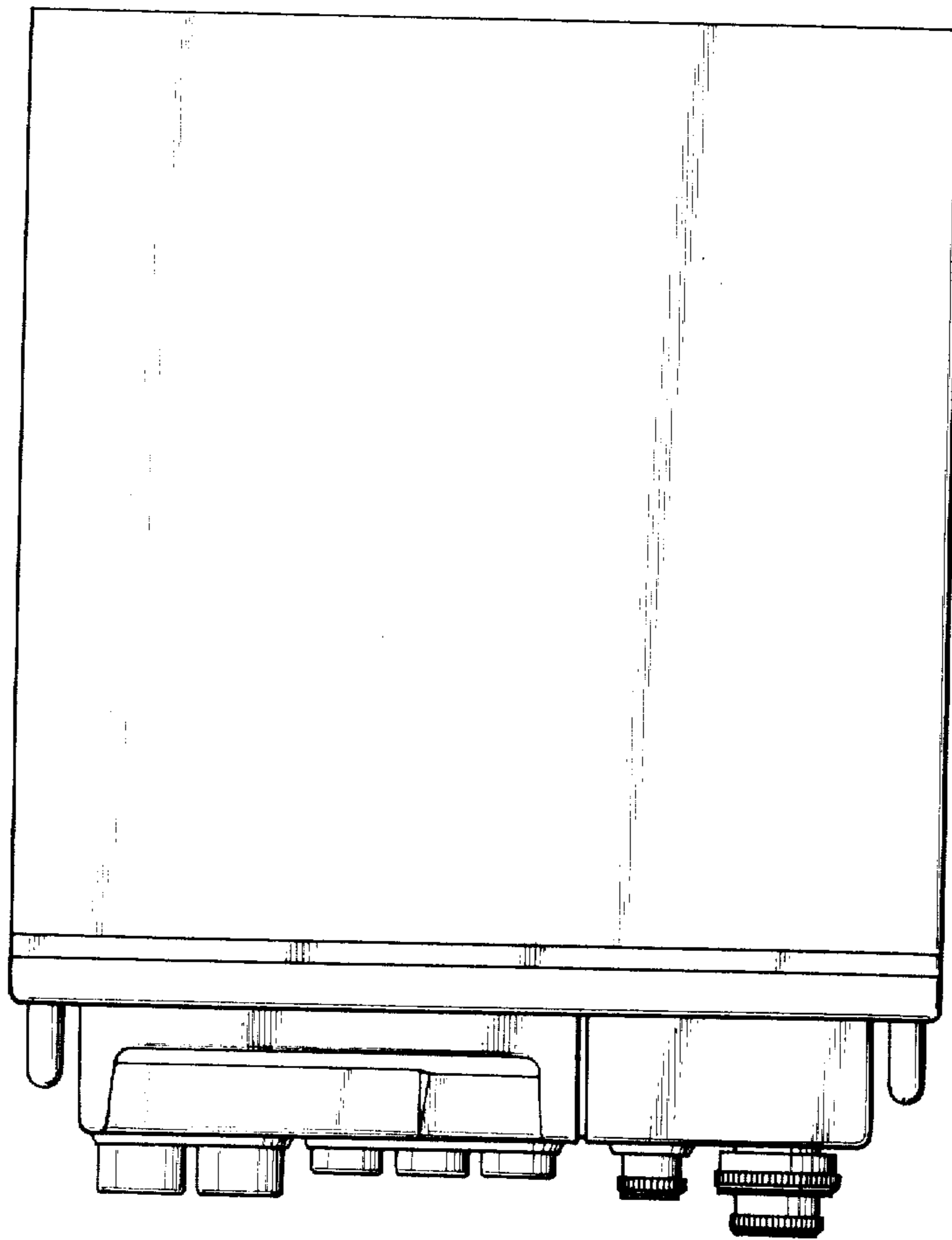
