DESCRIPTION

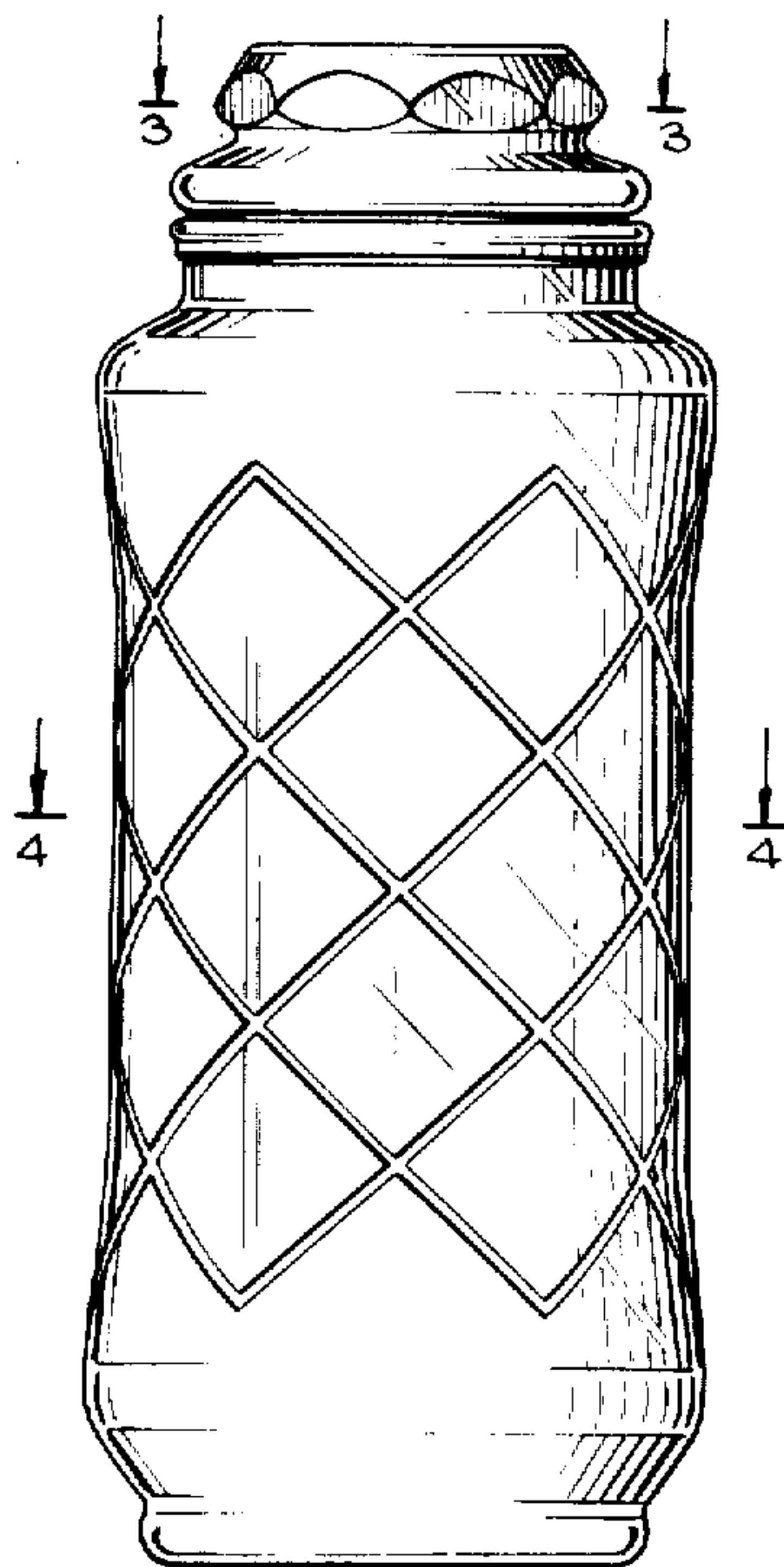
FIG. 1 is an elevational view of a jar or similar article showing my new design;

FIG. 5 is a fragmentary exploded side elevational view thereof.



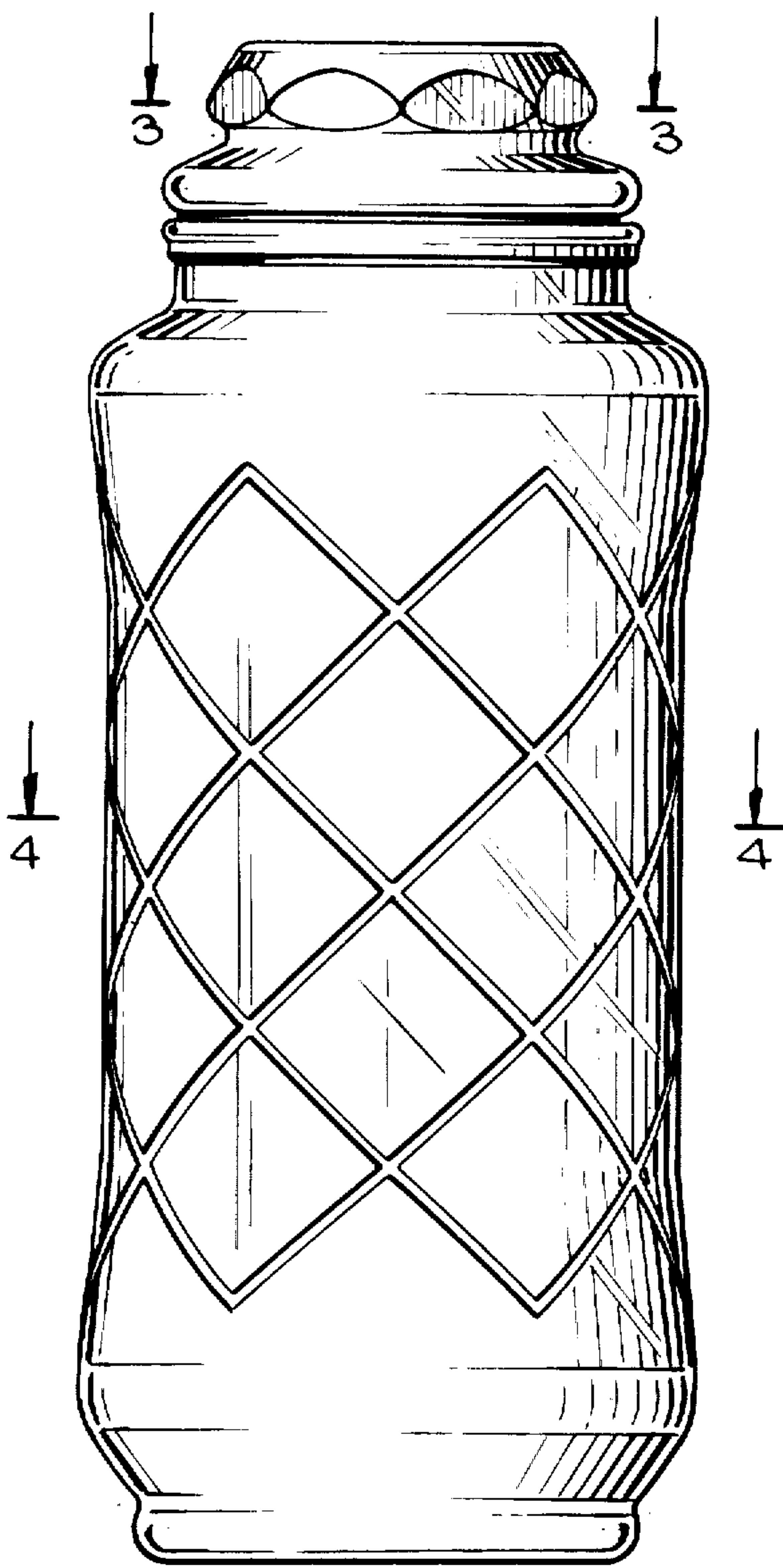

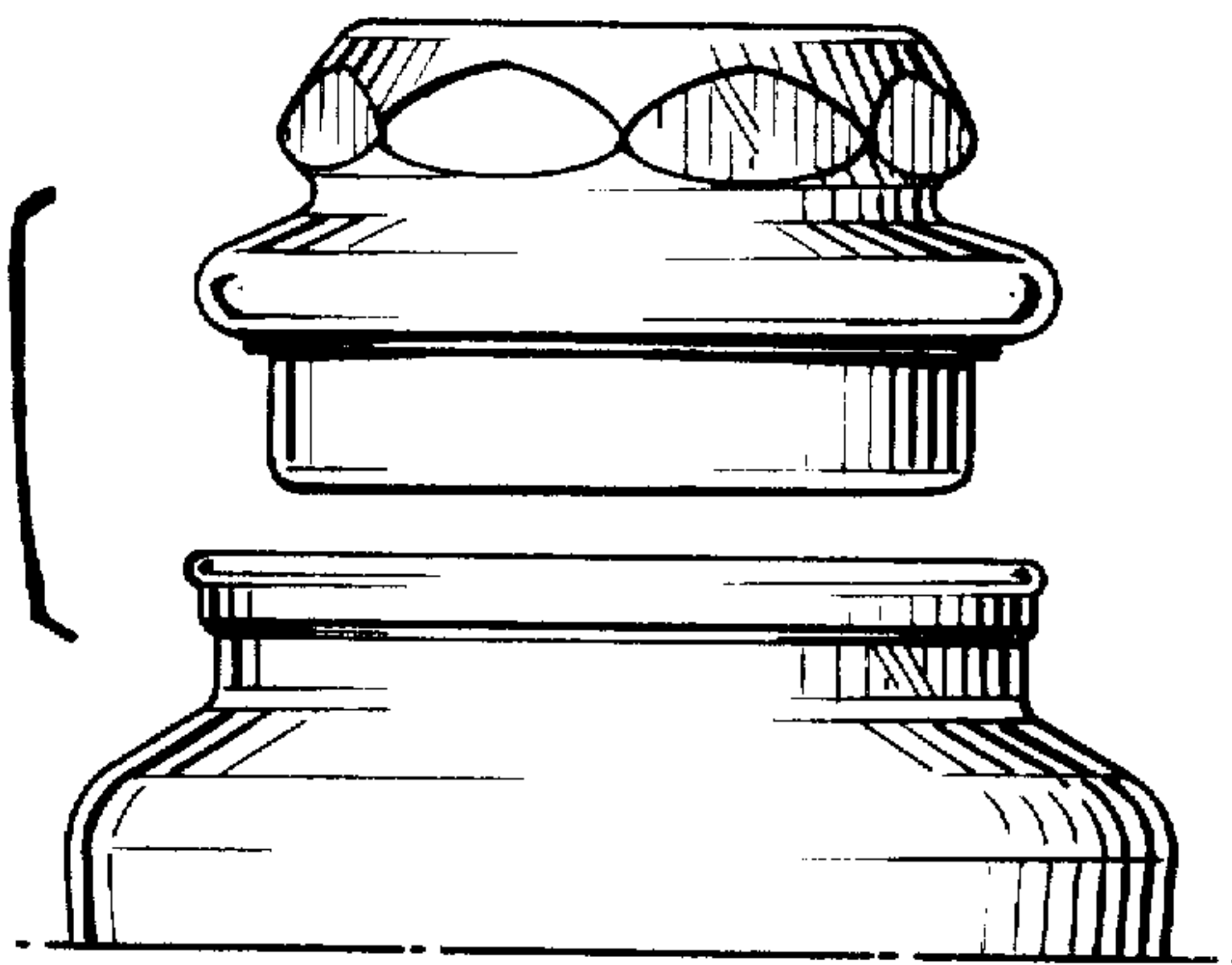

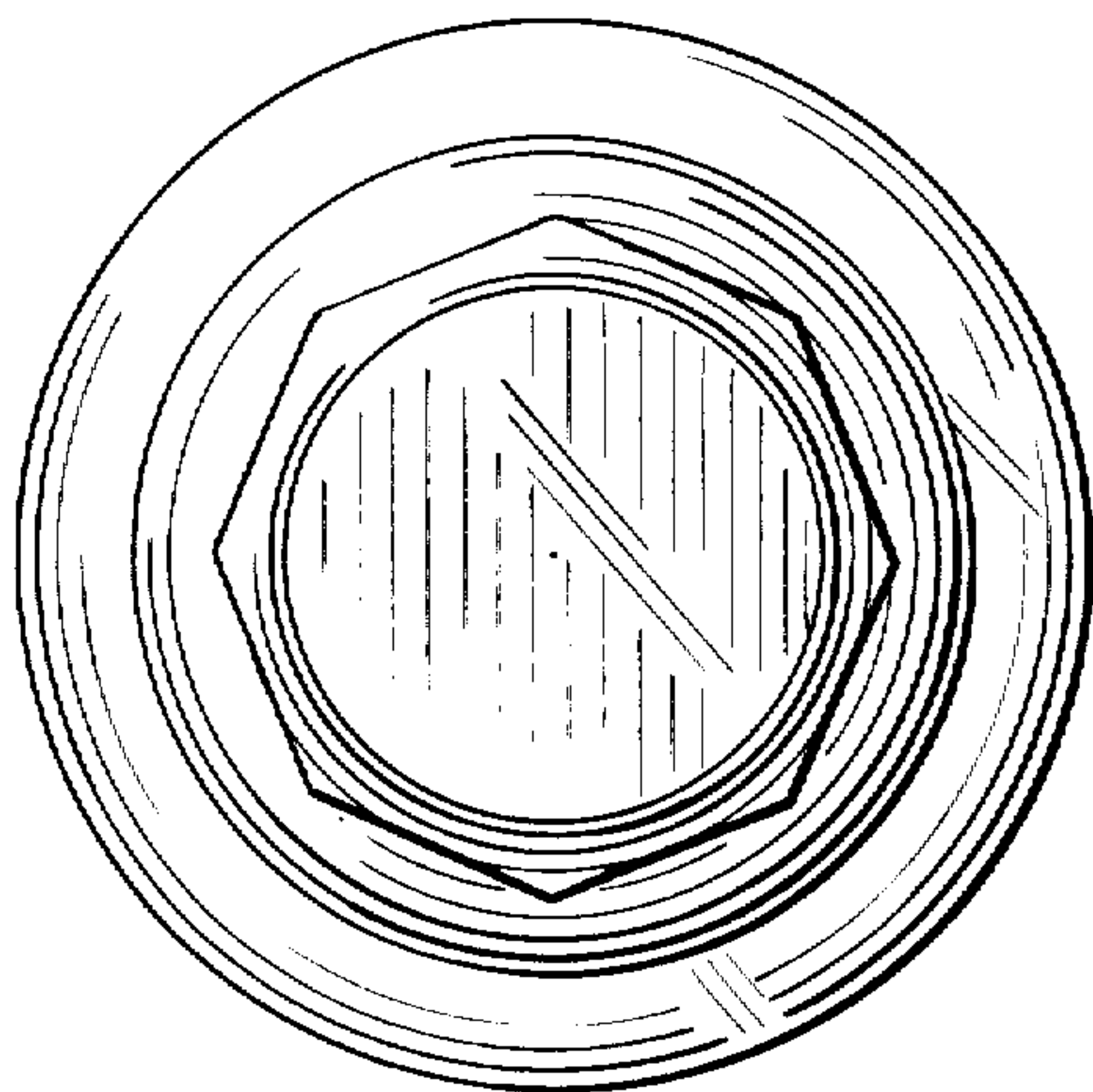

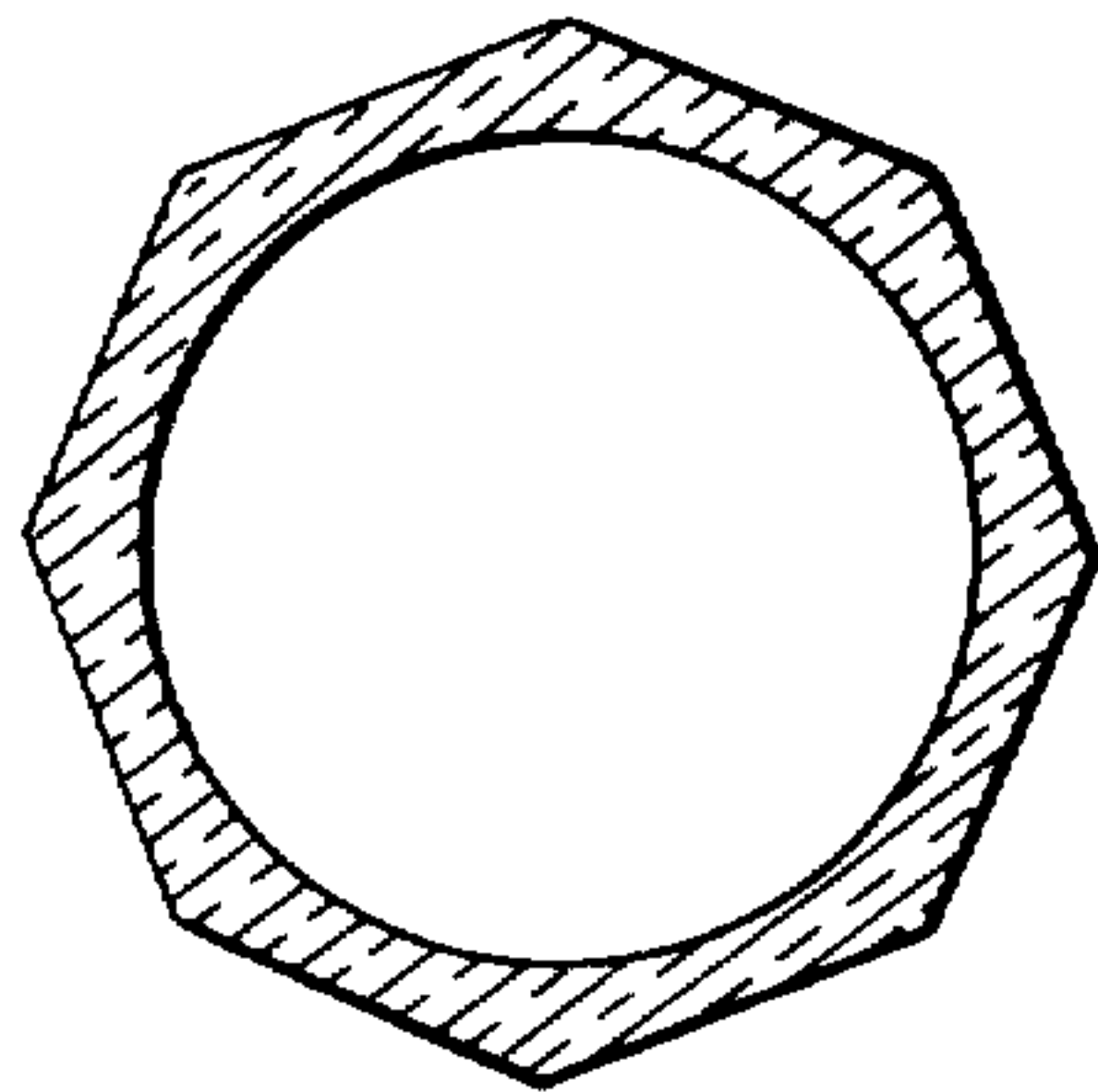
