[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a vehicle article carrier, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a vehicle article carrier showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a front elevational view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a top plan view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a rear elevational thereof;

FIG. 6 is a perspective view of a vehicle article carrier showing a second embodiment of my new design;

FIG. 7 is a front elevational view of the embodiment of FIG. 6;

FIG. 8 is a side elevational view of the embodiment of FIG. 6;

FIG. 9 is a top plan view of the embodiment of FIG. 6; and

FIG. 10 is a rear elevational view of the embodiment of FIG. 6.

FIGS. 1 and 6 show the respective embodiments as installed at the inside rear wall of the cab of an automotive vehicle.

FIGS. 2 through 5 and 7 through 10 show the respective embodiments in flat condition.

The broken lines showing the frames of the rear window and side door of the vehicle in FIGS. 1 and 6 are understood to be for illustrative purposes only, and the broken lines on the surface of the article carrier shown in FIGS. 1, 2, 6 and 7 represent stitching.
