The ornamental design for a television monitor, as shown and described.

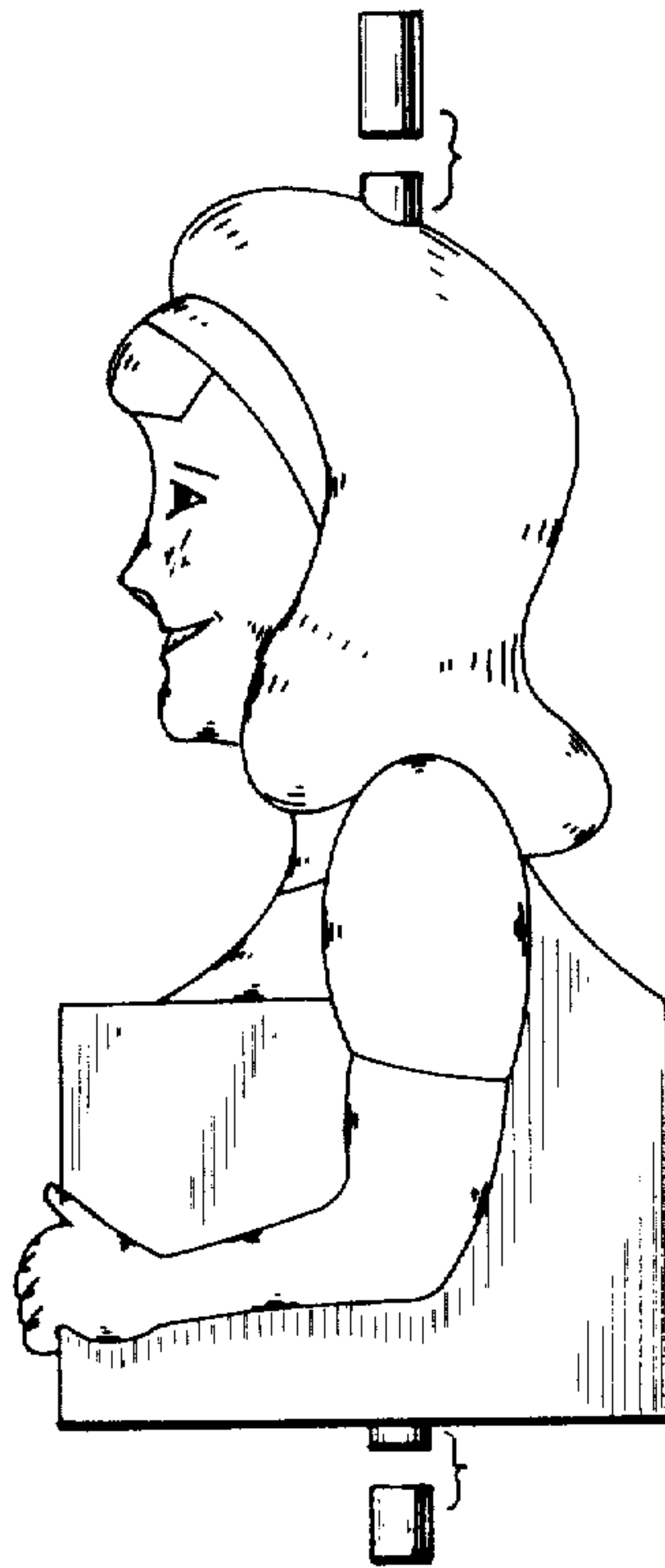
DESCRIPTION

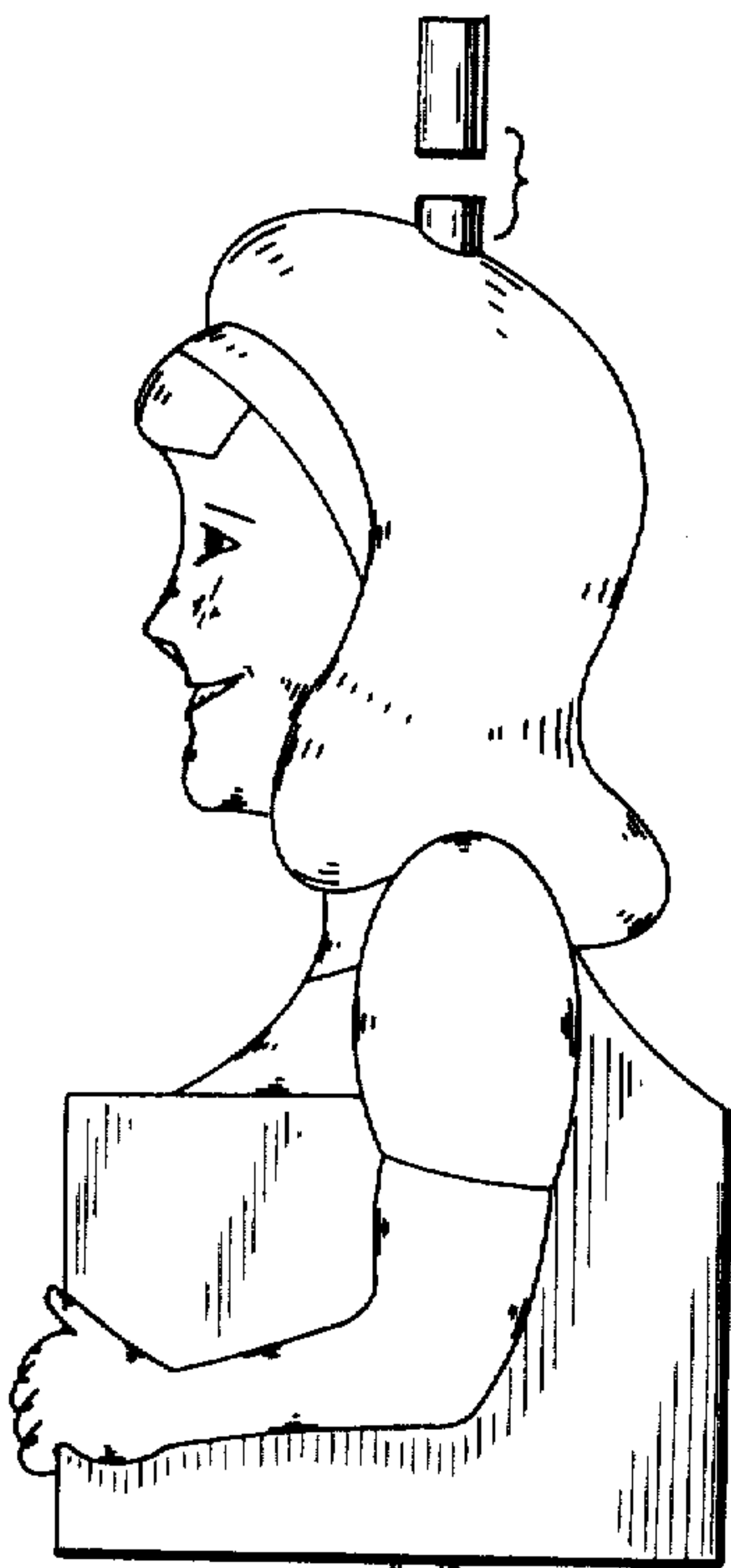

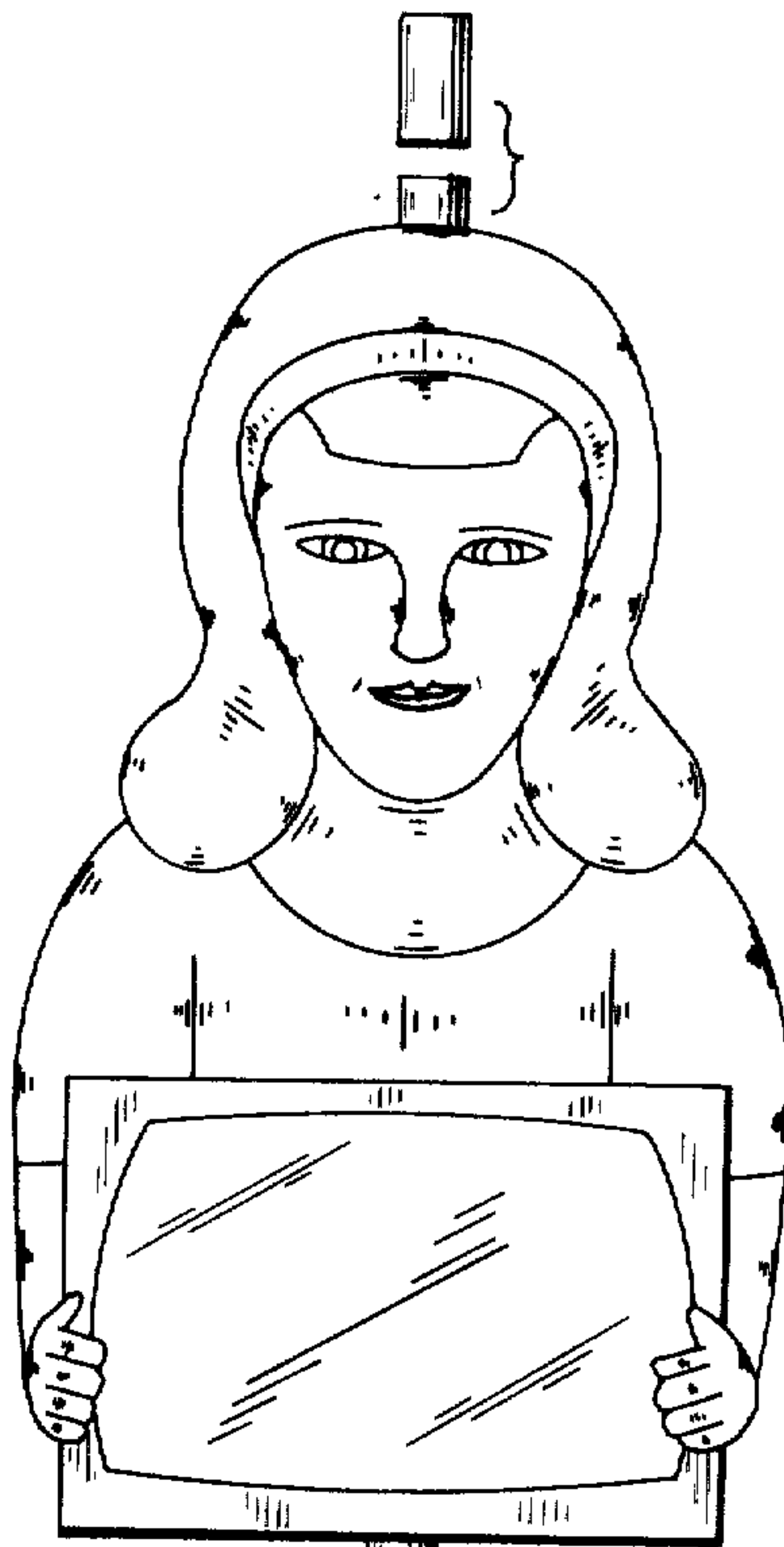

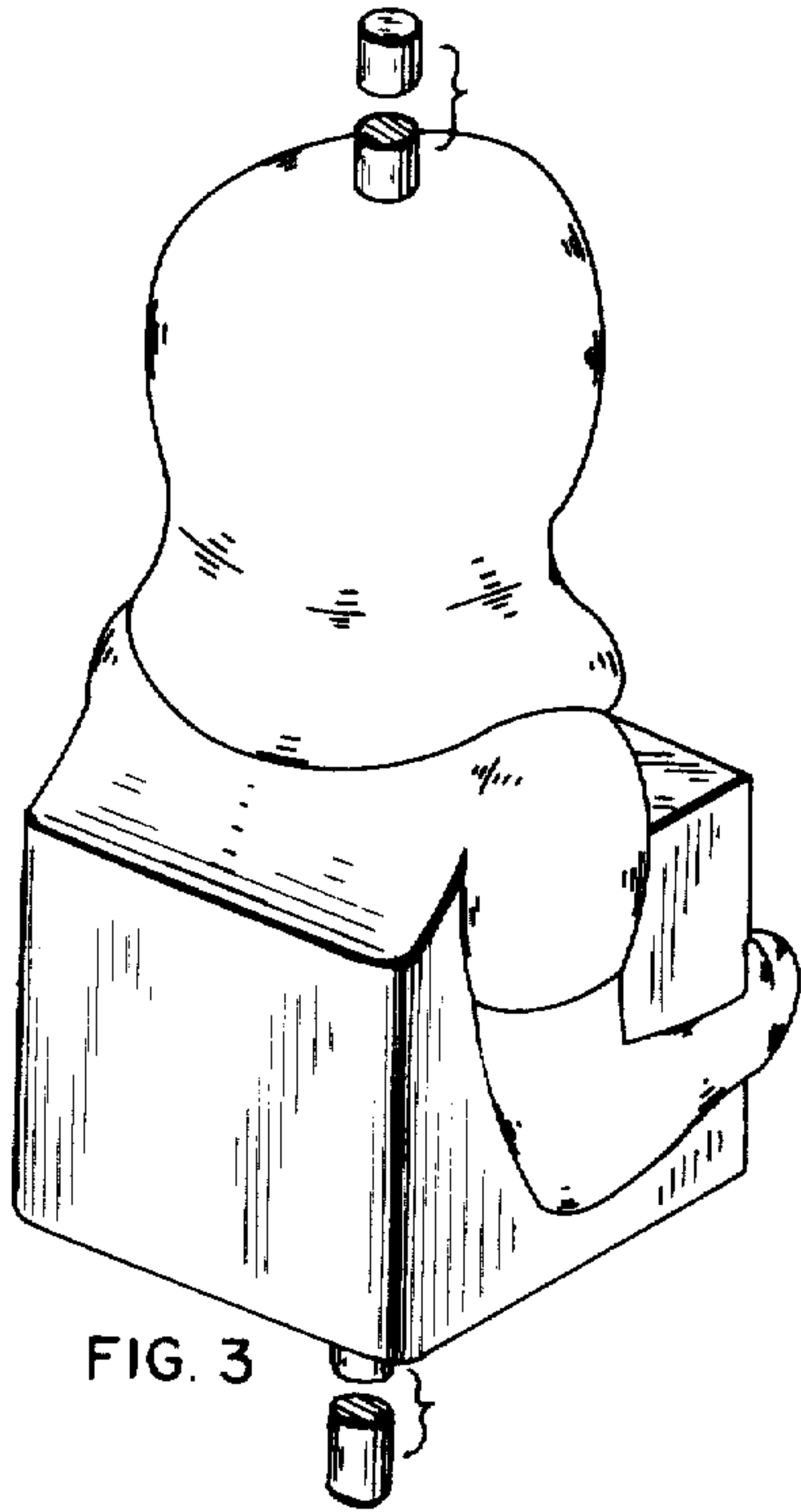

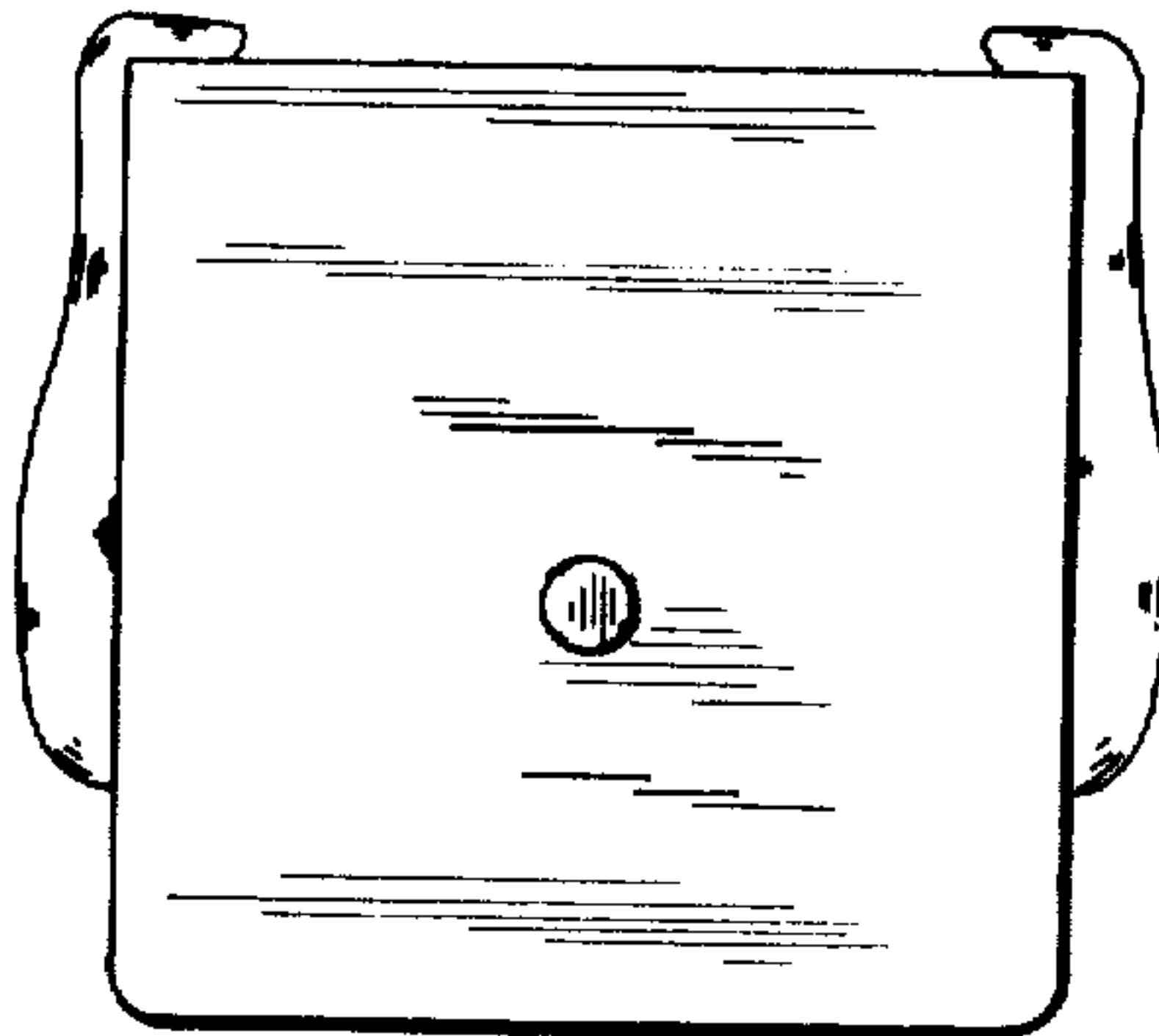
