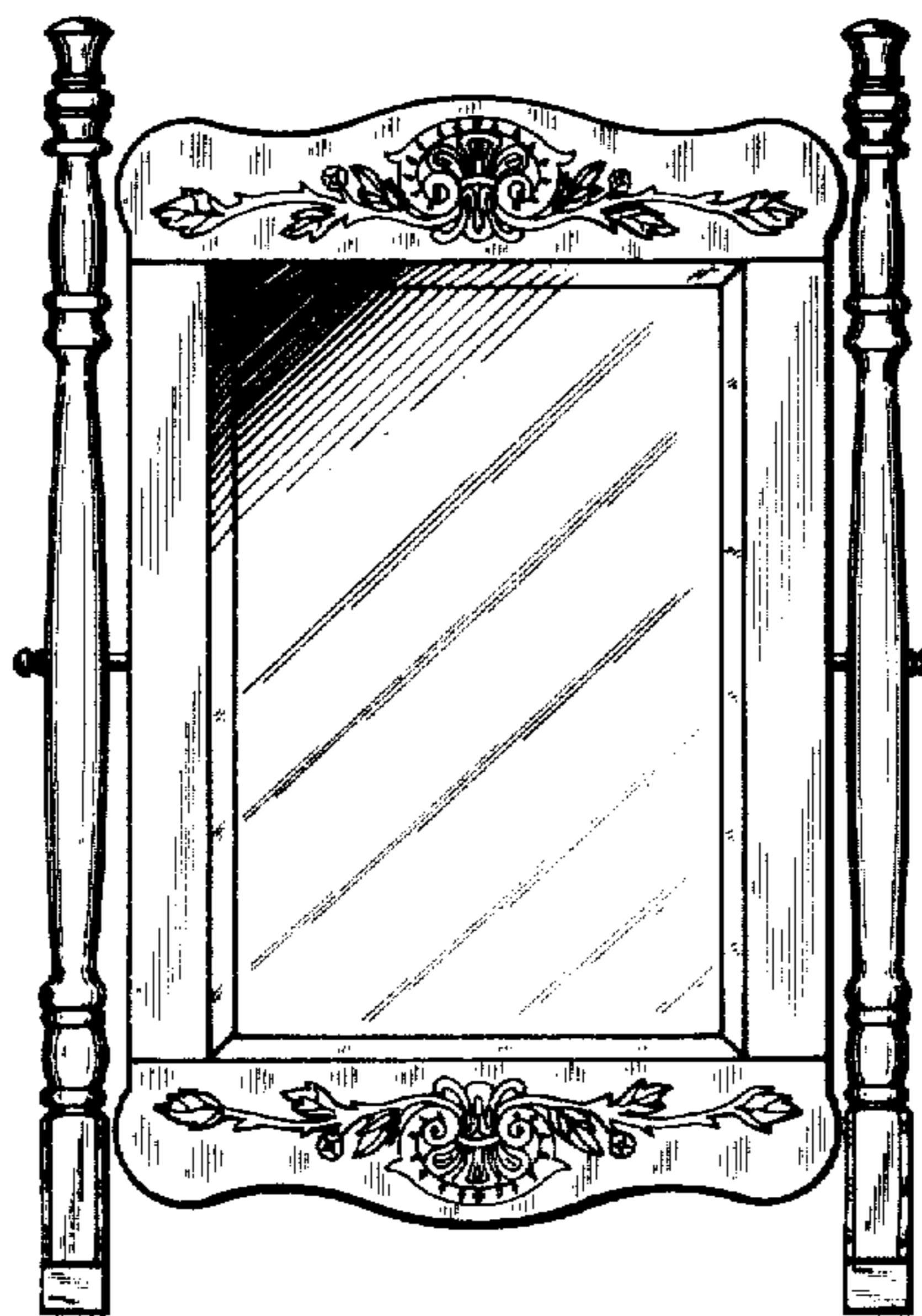

The ornamental design for a dresser mirror, as shown and described.

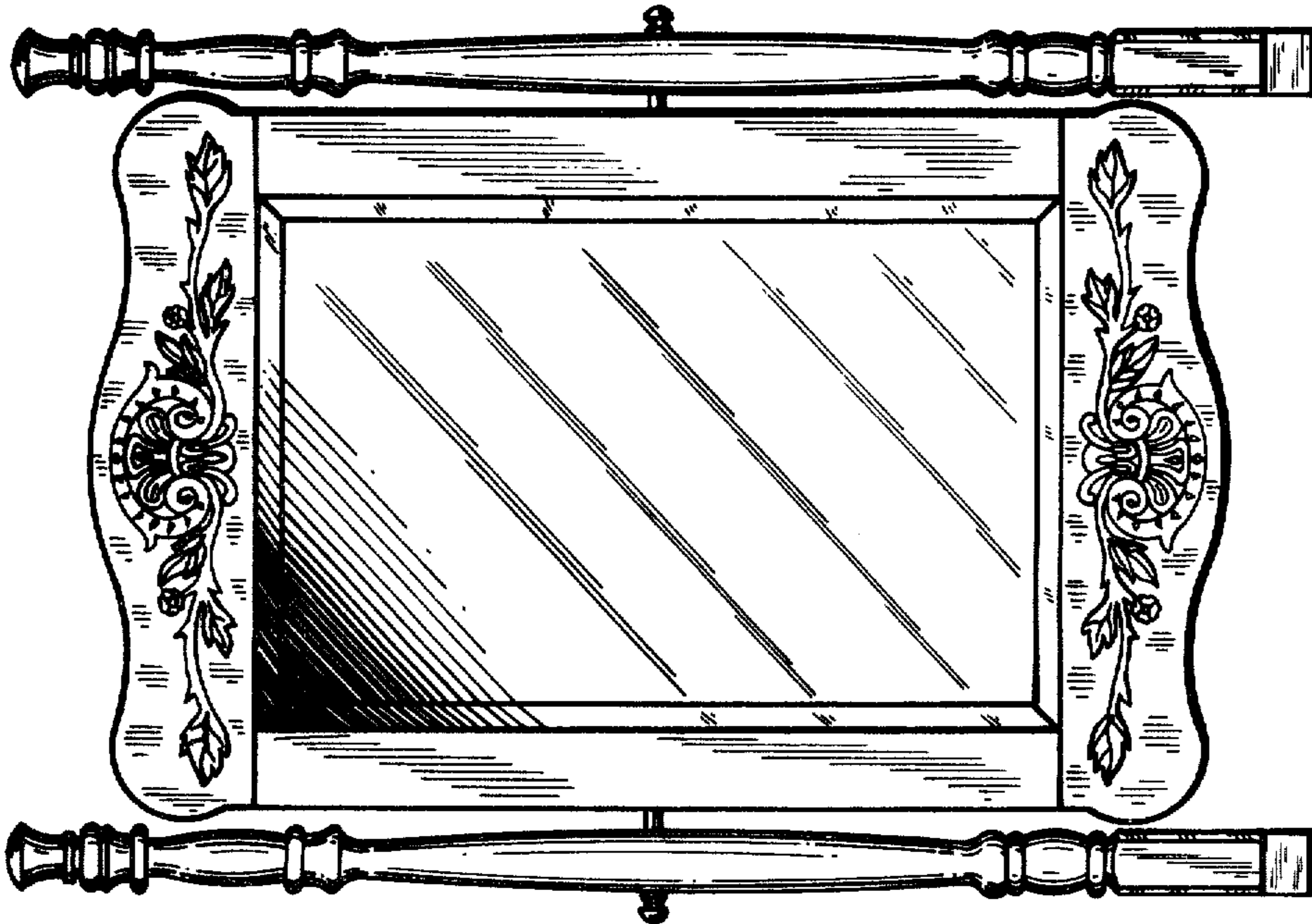
DESCRIPTION

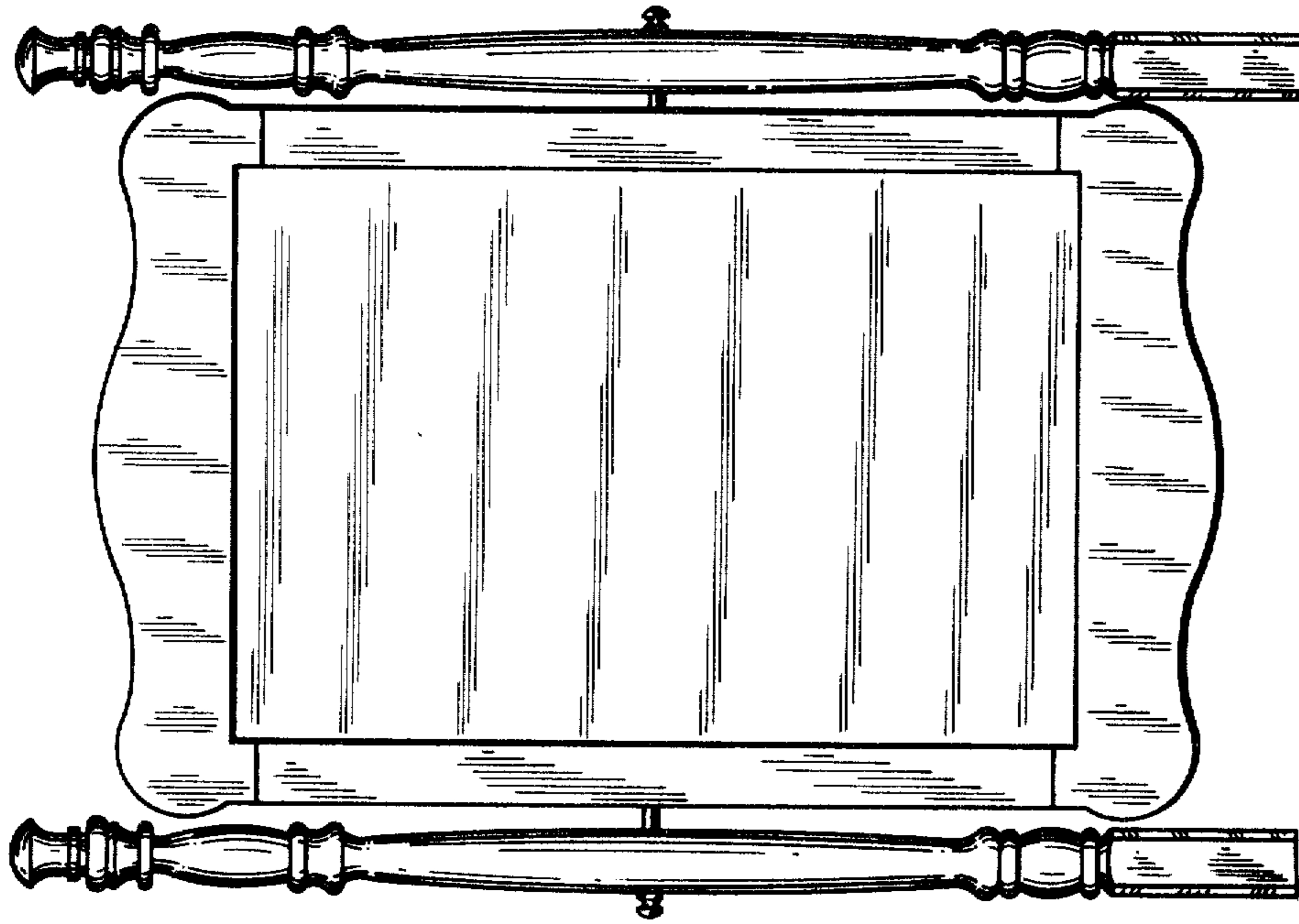
