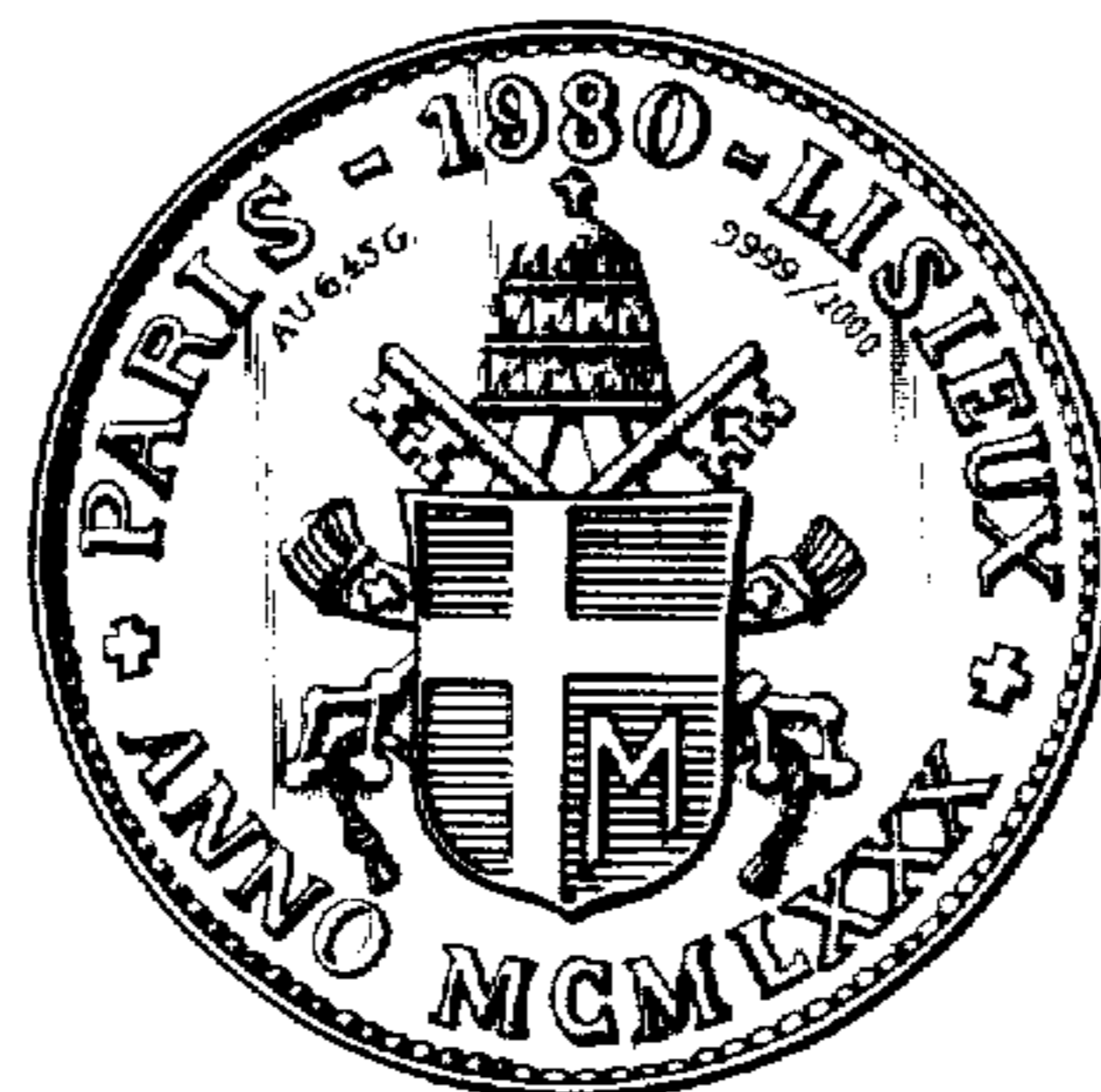

FIG. 2 is a reverse side elevational view thereof.



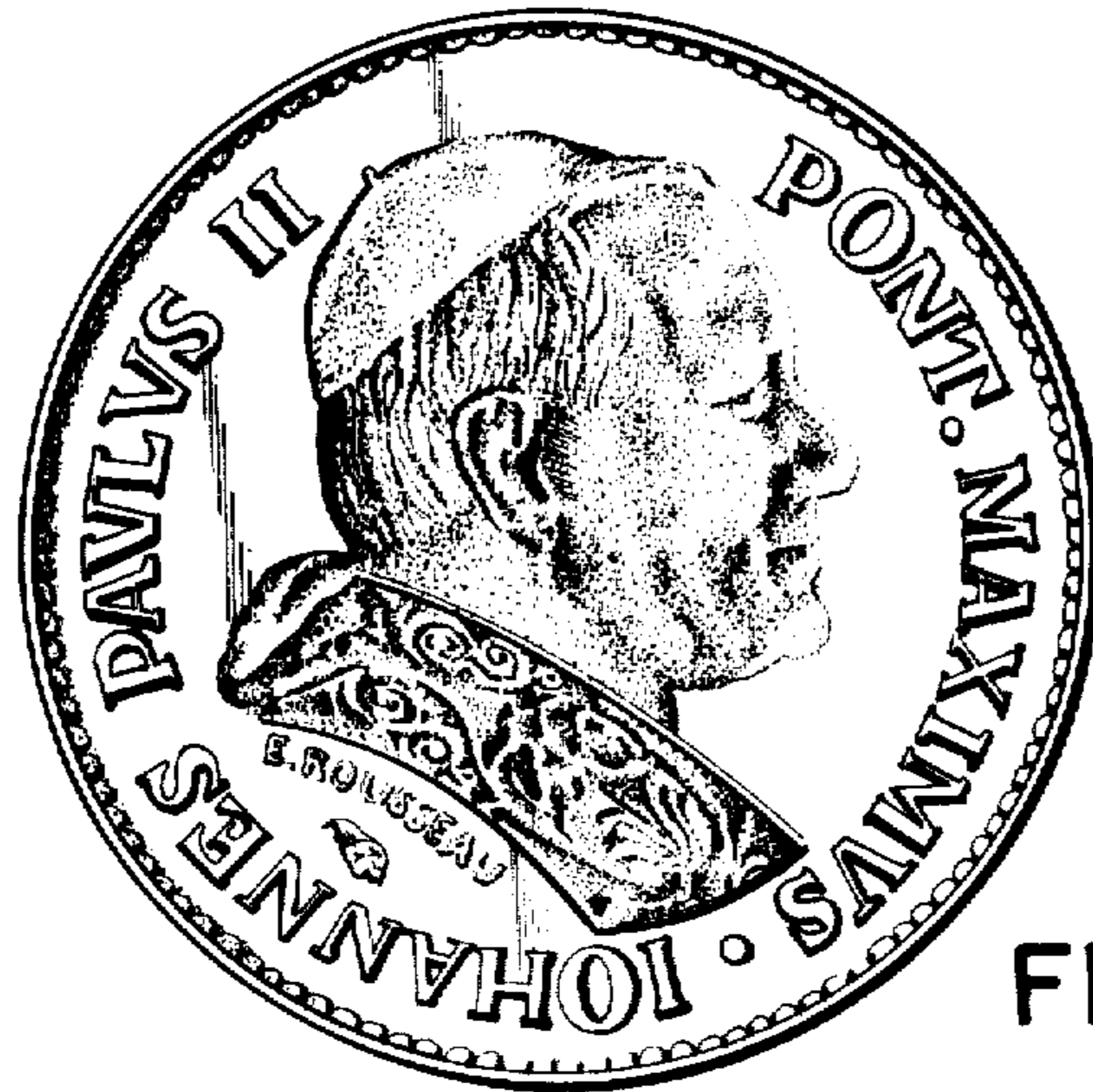

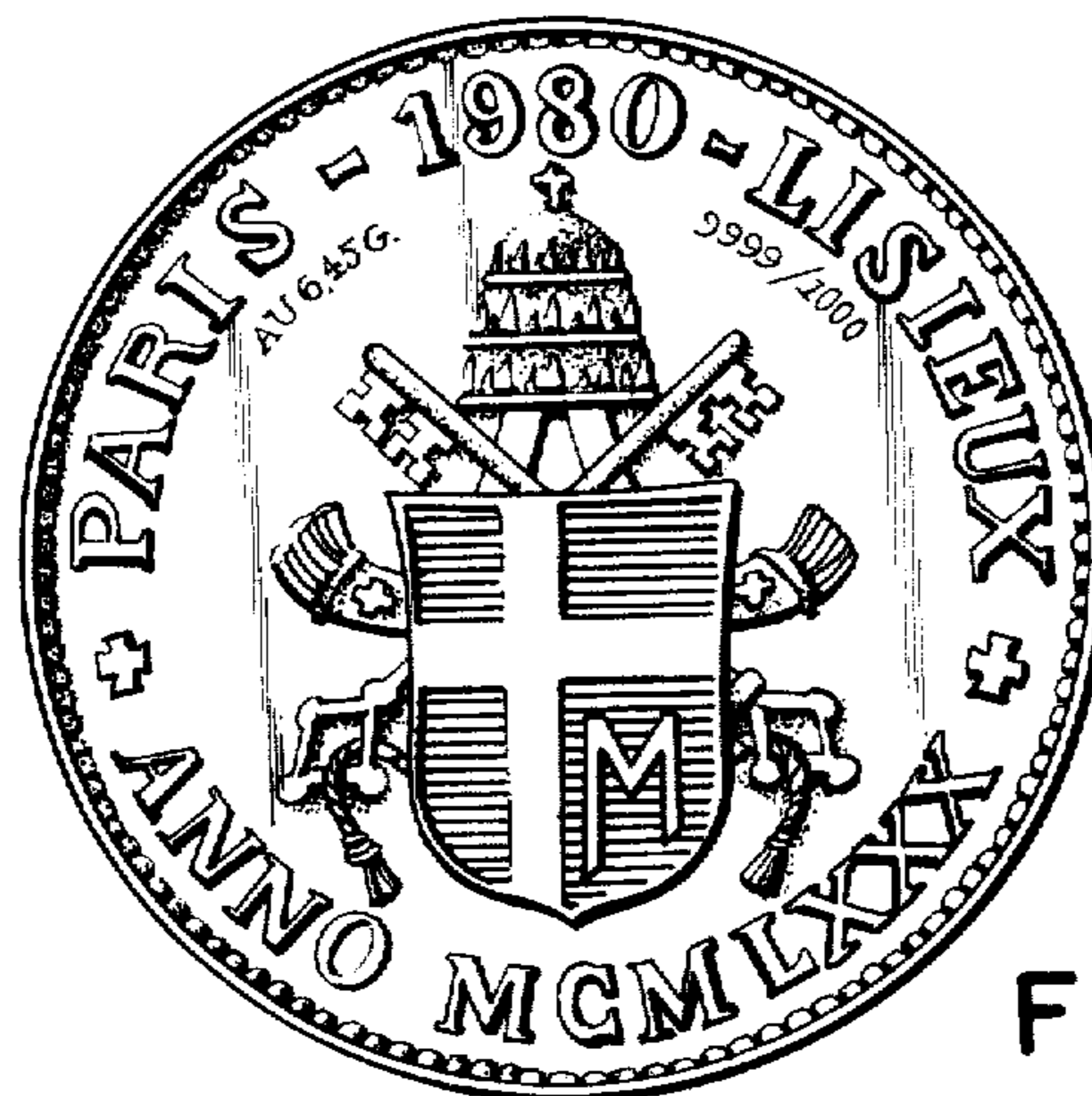
