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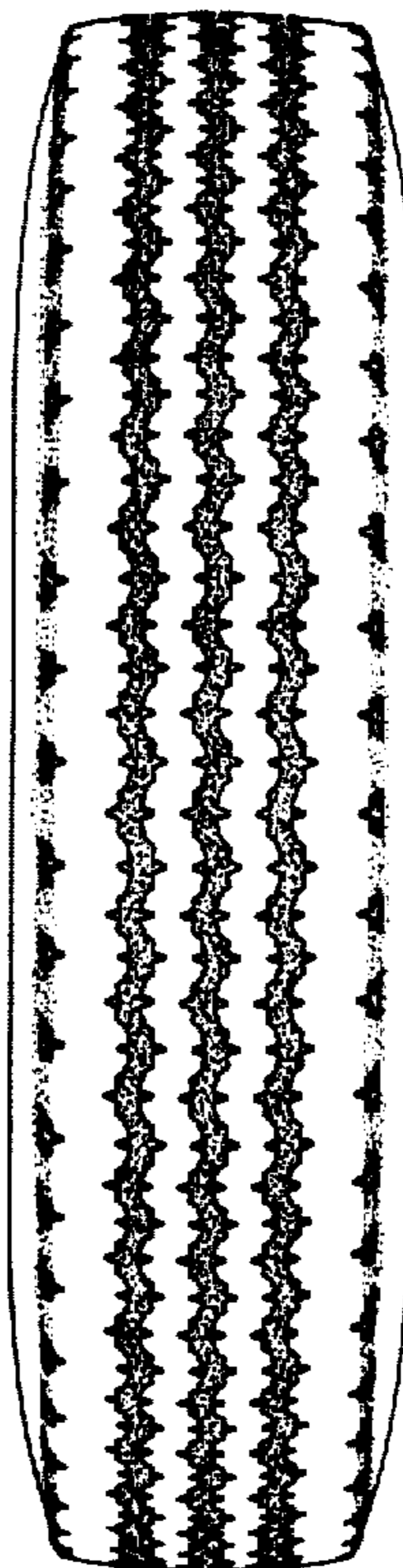

The ornamental design for a tire, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a tire showing the new design, it being understood that the tread pattern is repeated throughout the circumference of the tire; and FIG. 2 is a side elevational view thereof the opposite side being substantially the same as that shown.



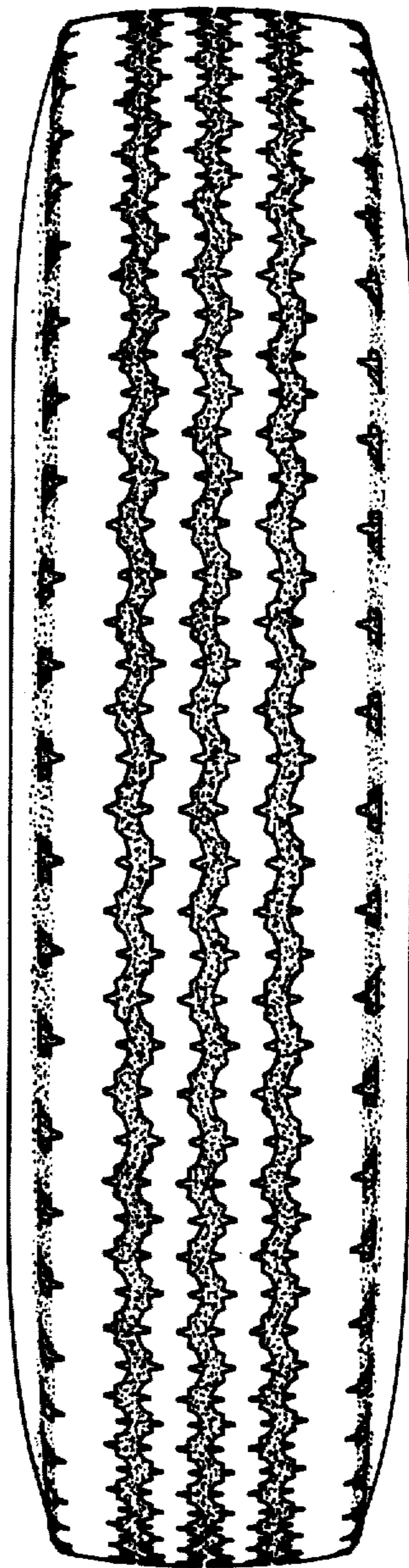

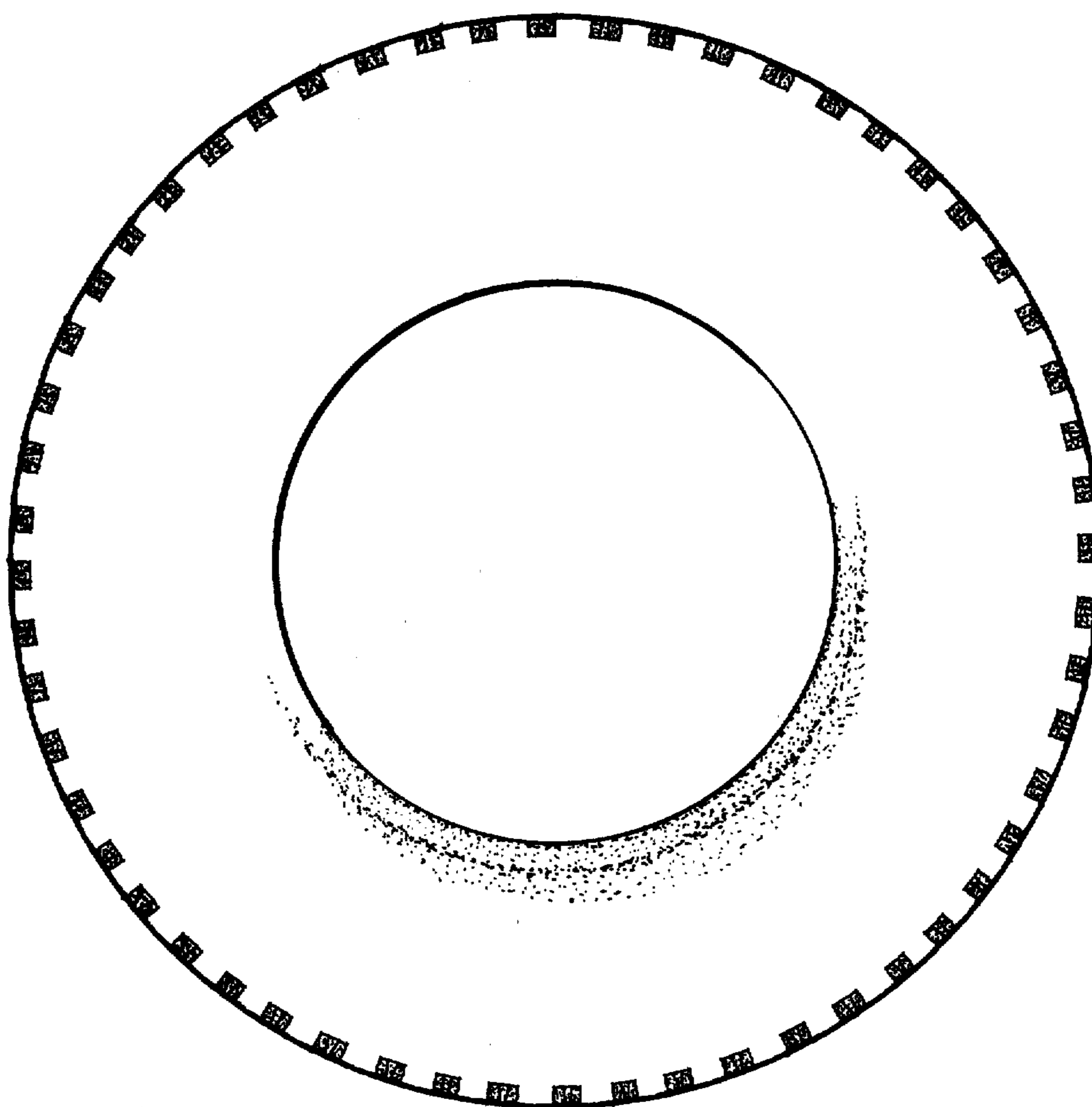
