[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a disposable pan for heating and serving food, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan of a disposable pan for heating and serving food showing our new design;
FIG. 2 is a bottom plan thereof;
FIG. 3 is a side elevation thereof, the appearance being the same from one side as the other;
FIG. 4 is an end elevation thereof as viewed from the left of FIG. 1; and
FIG. 5 is an end elevation thereof as viewed from the right of FIG. 1.

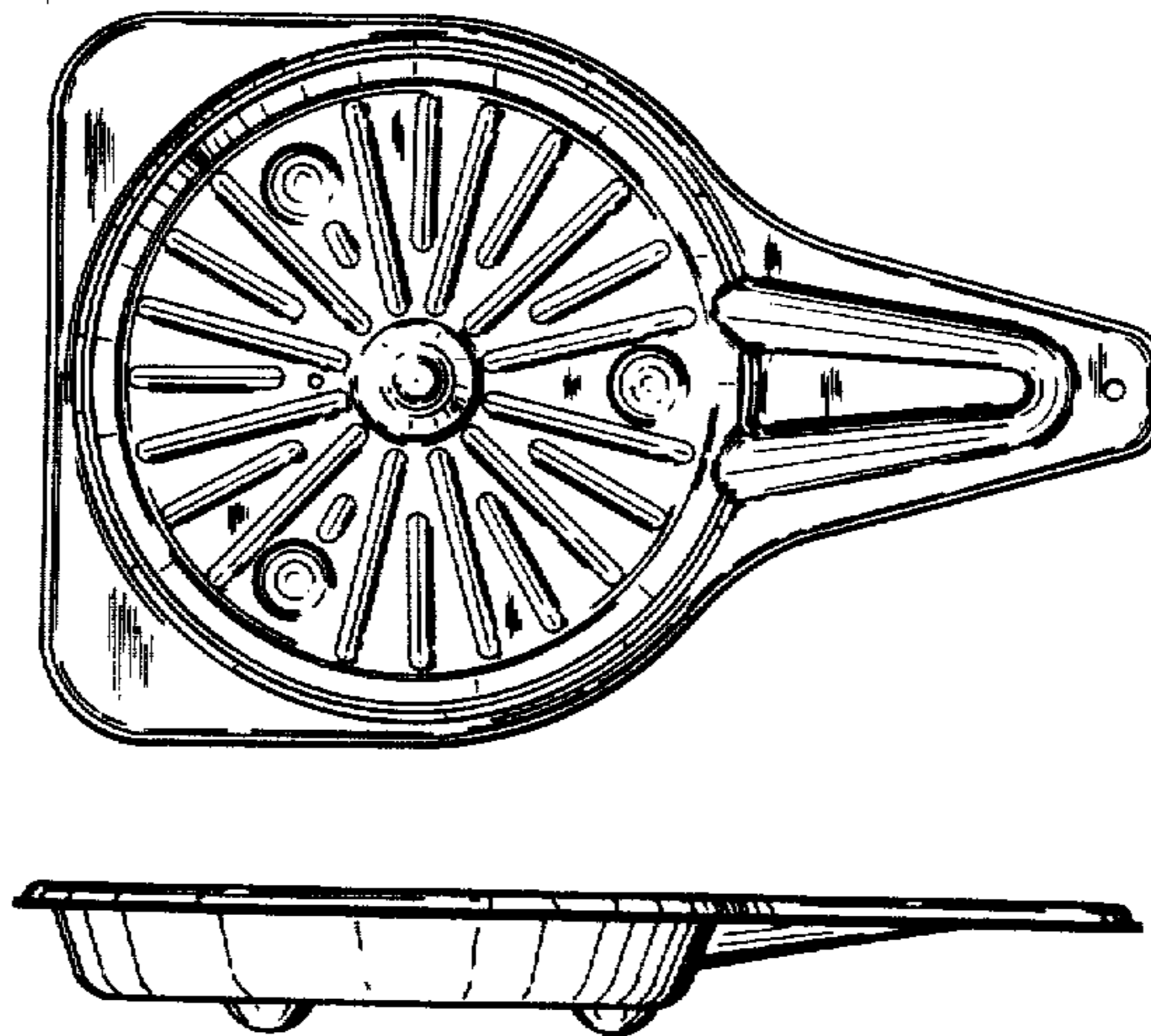

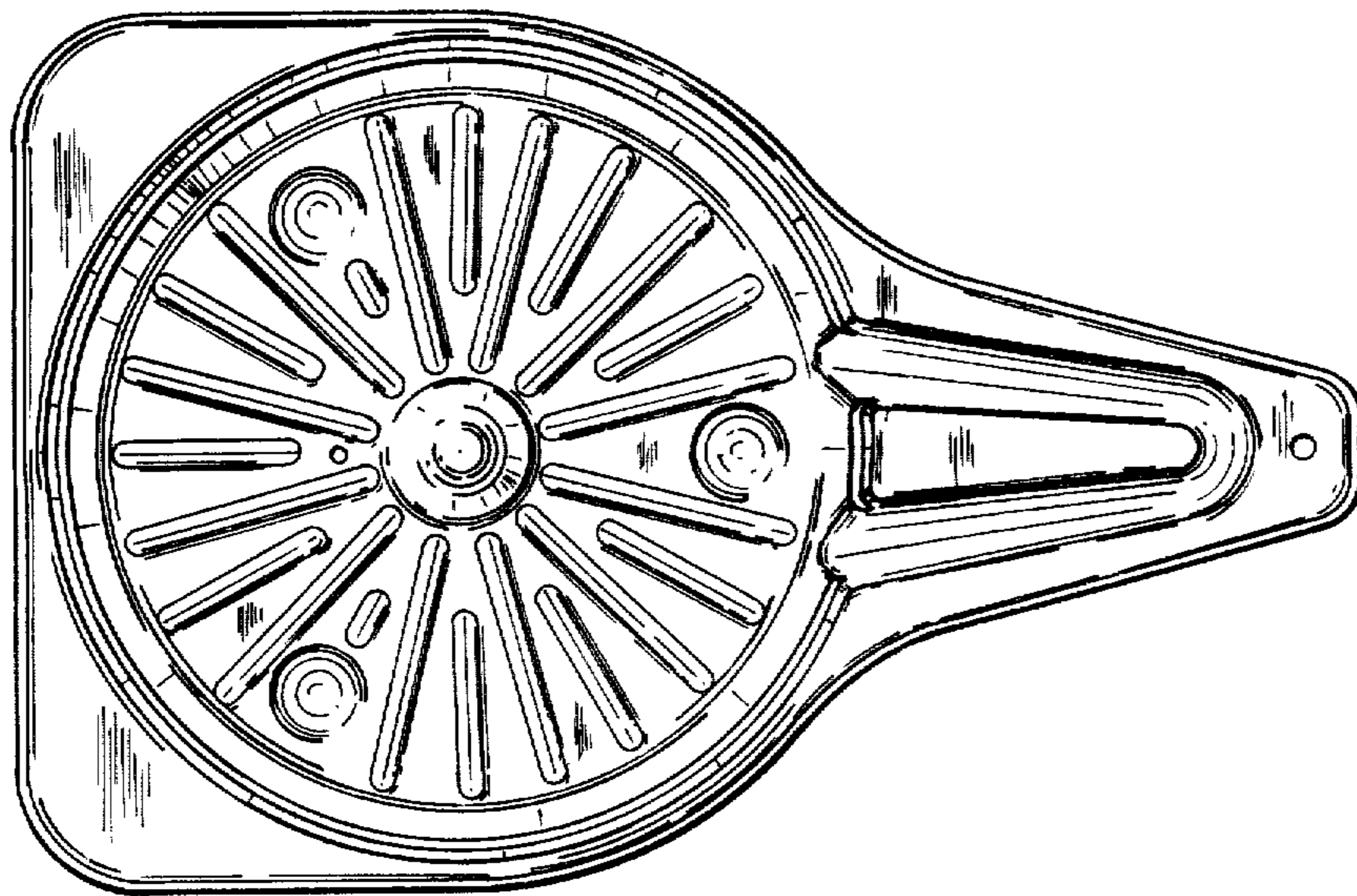

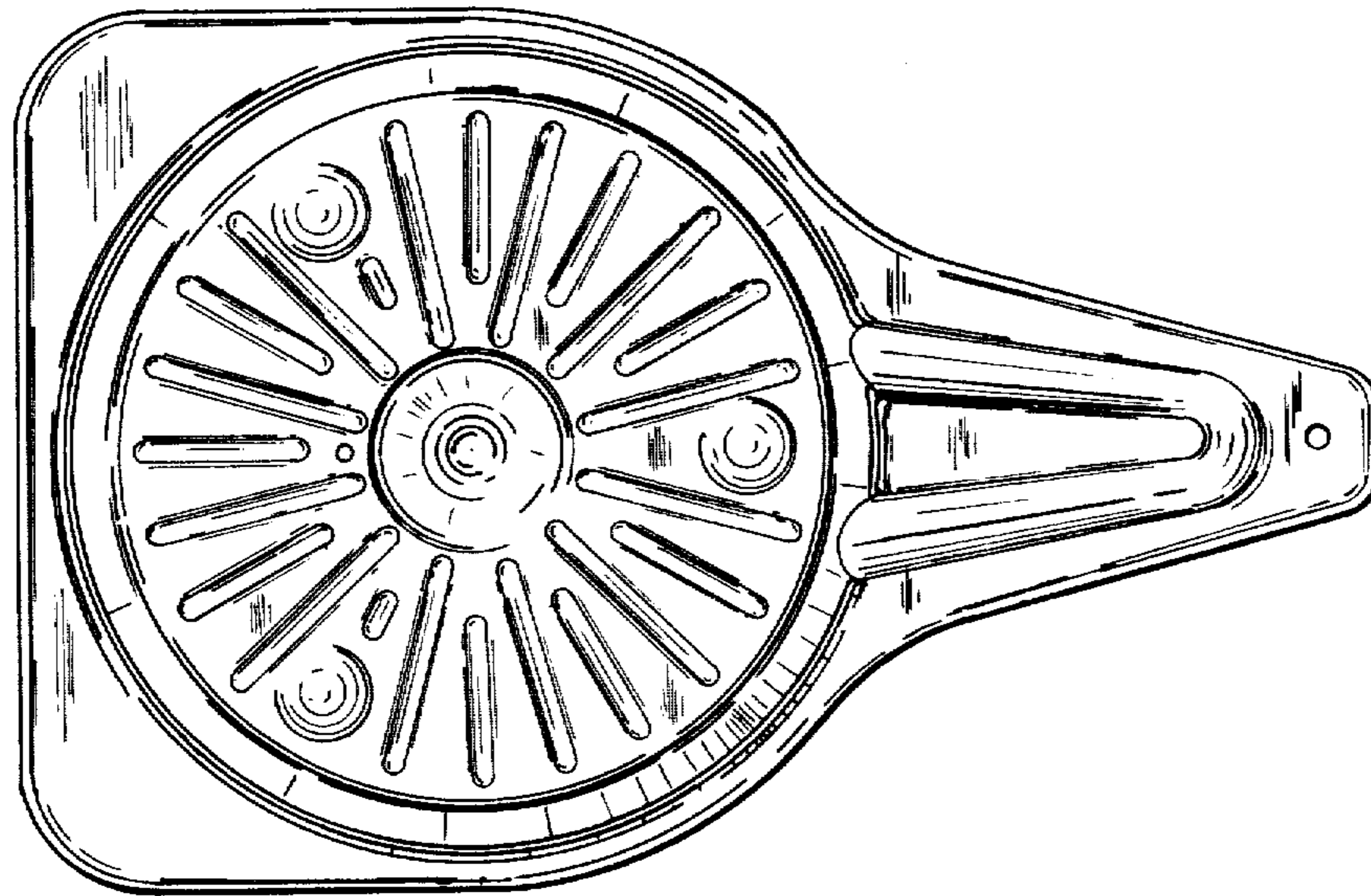

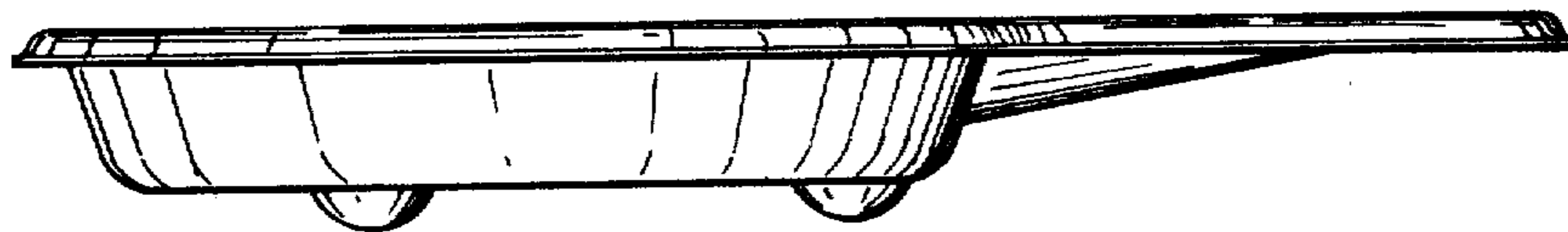
