DESCRIPTION

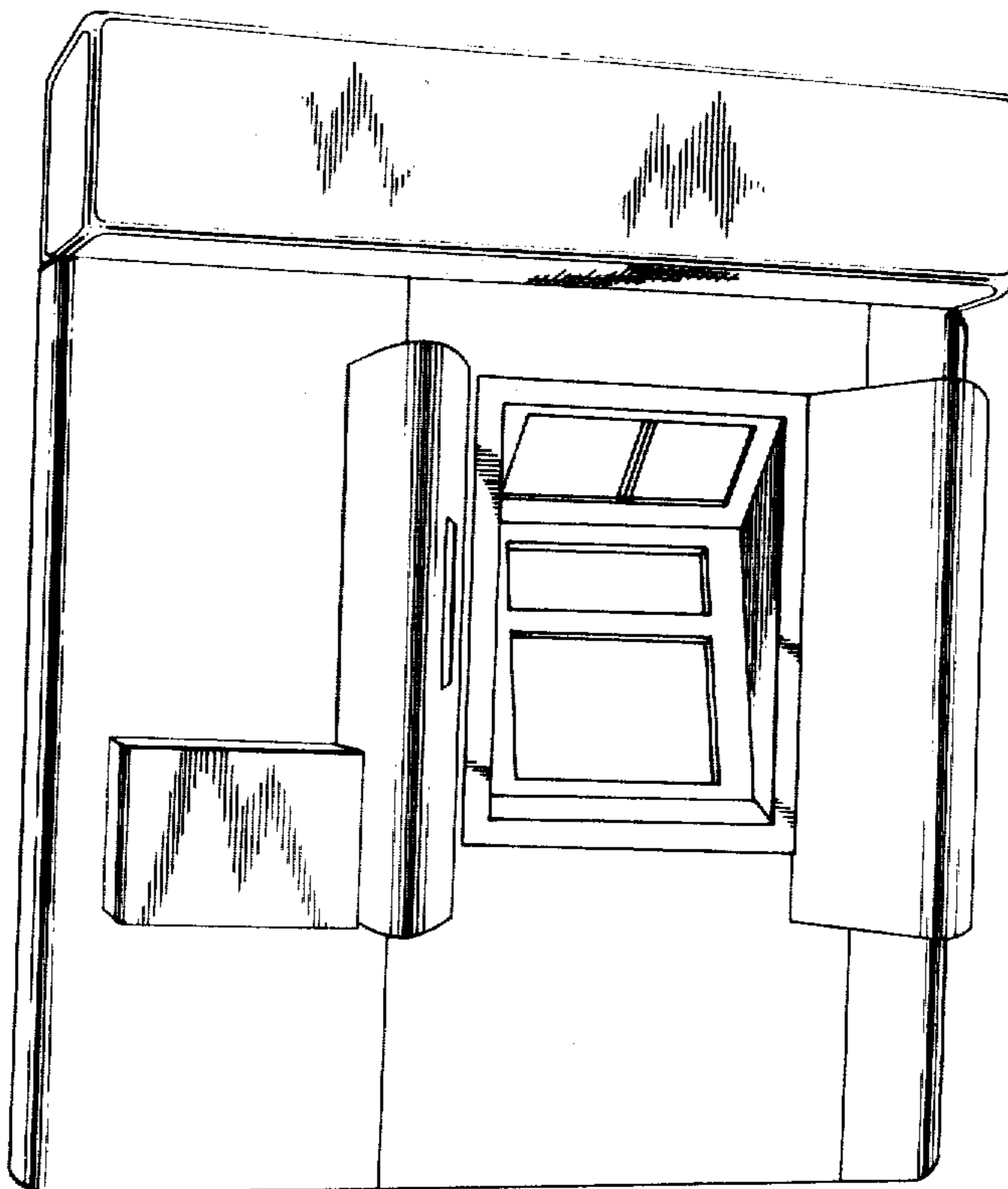
FIG. 1 is a left front perspective view of a automatic teller machine booth for mounting on a wall showing my new design;

FIG. 5 is a right side elevational view.



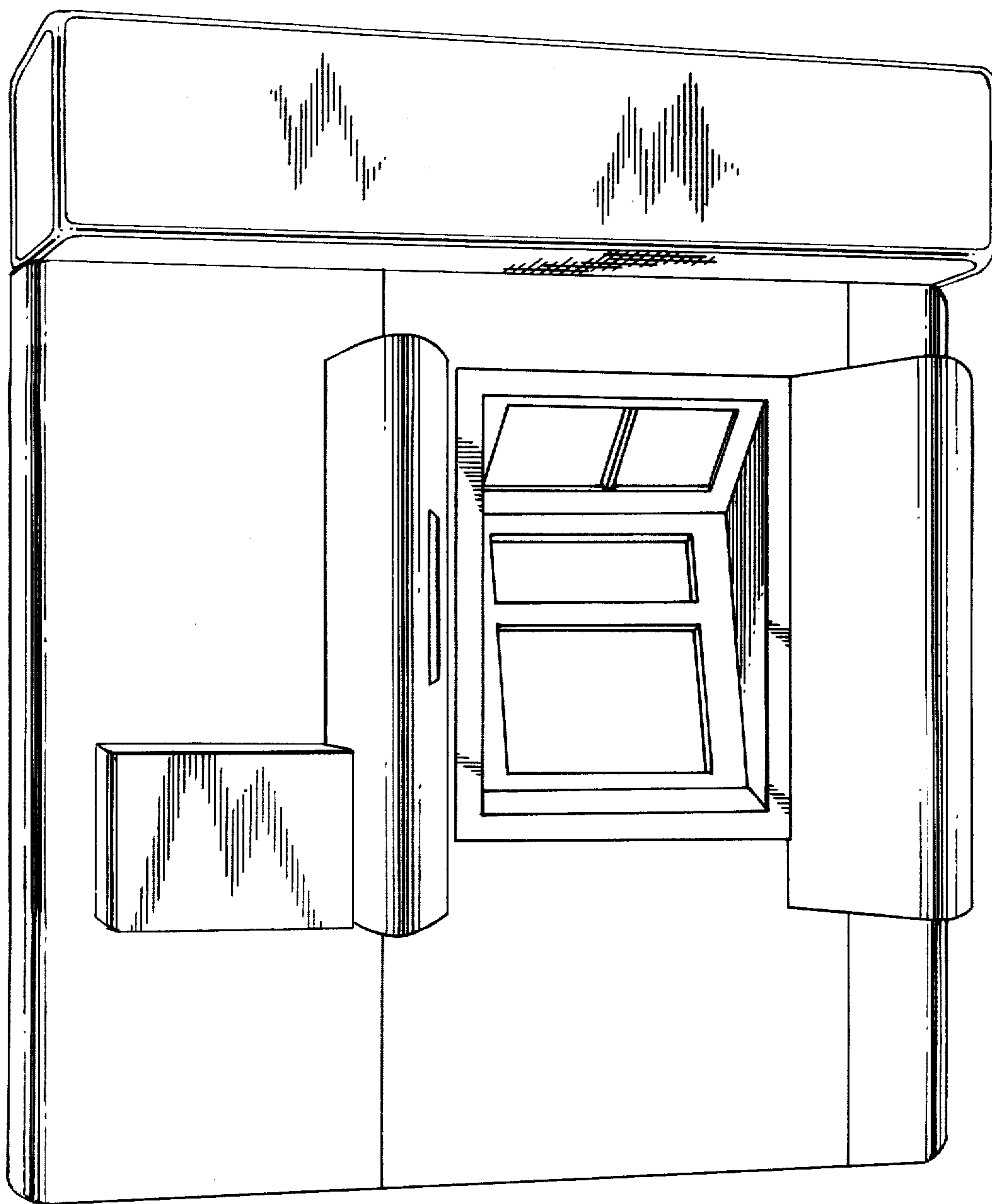

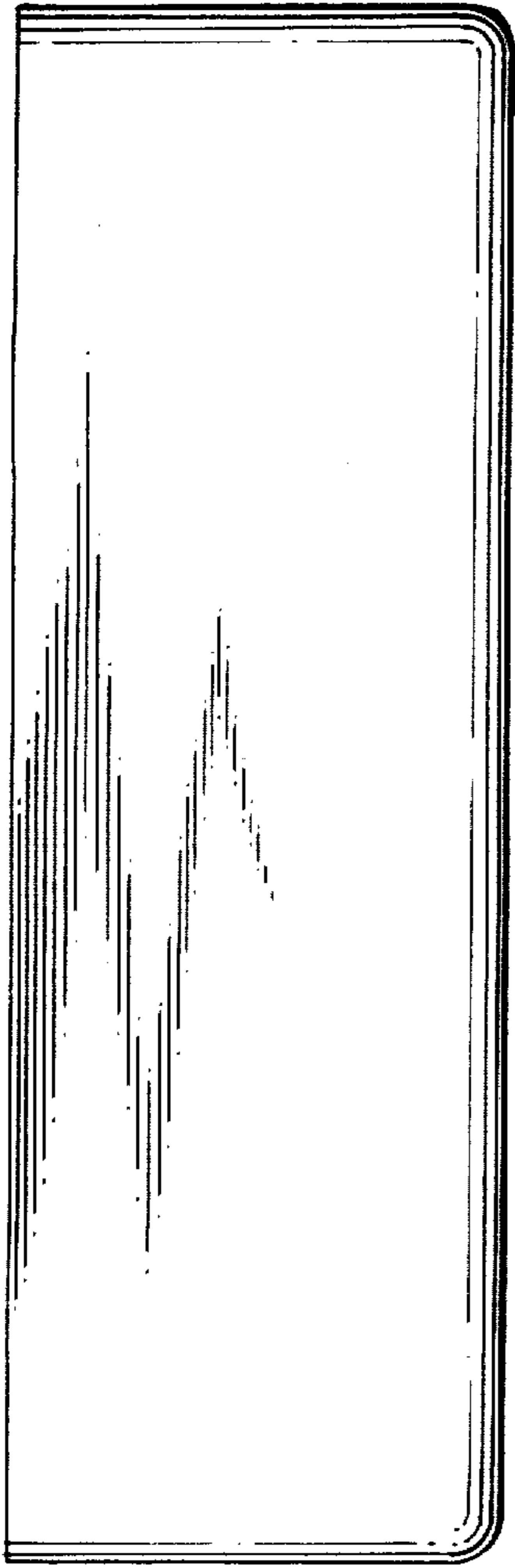

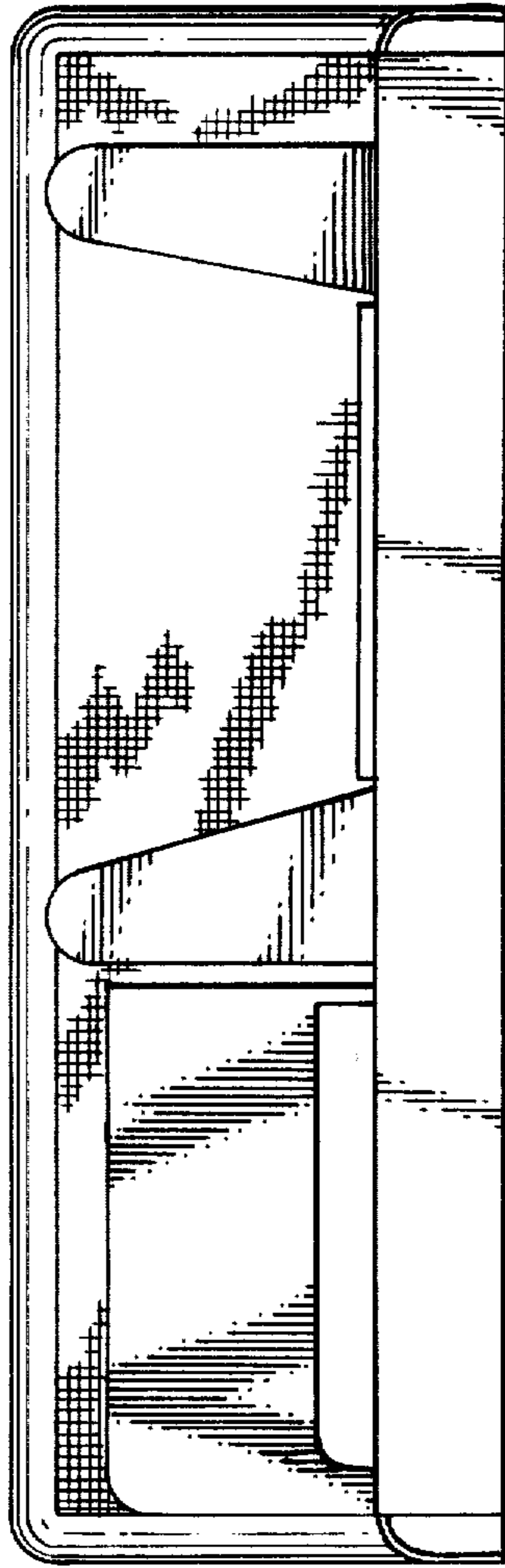

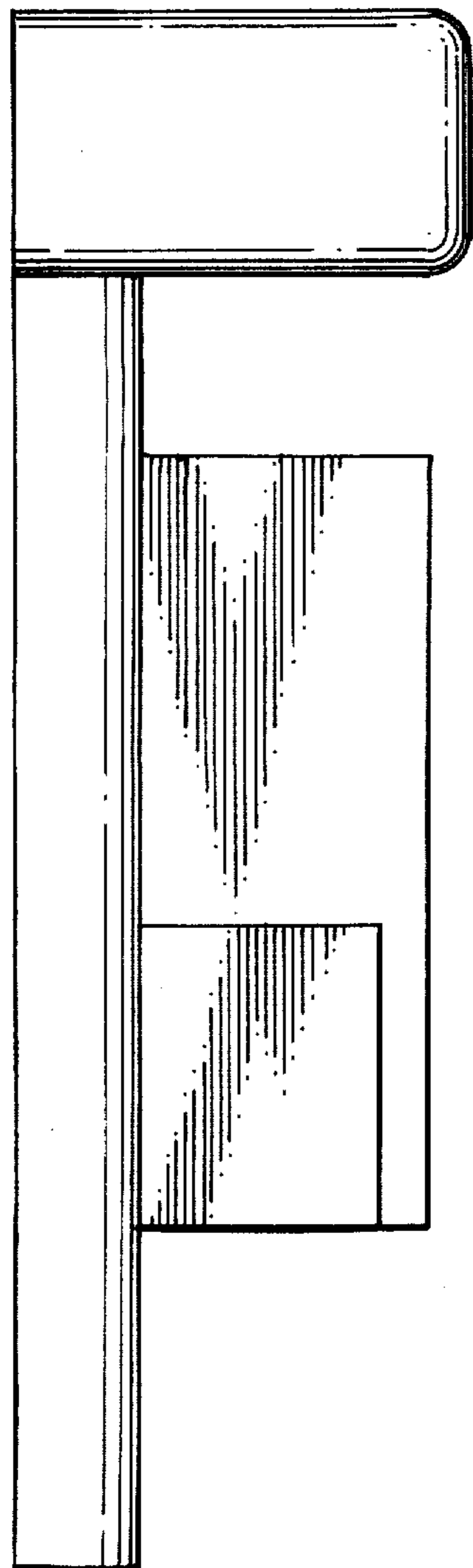

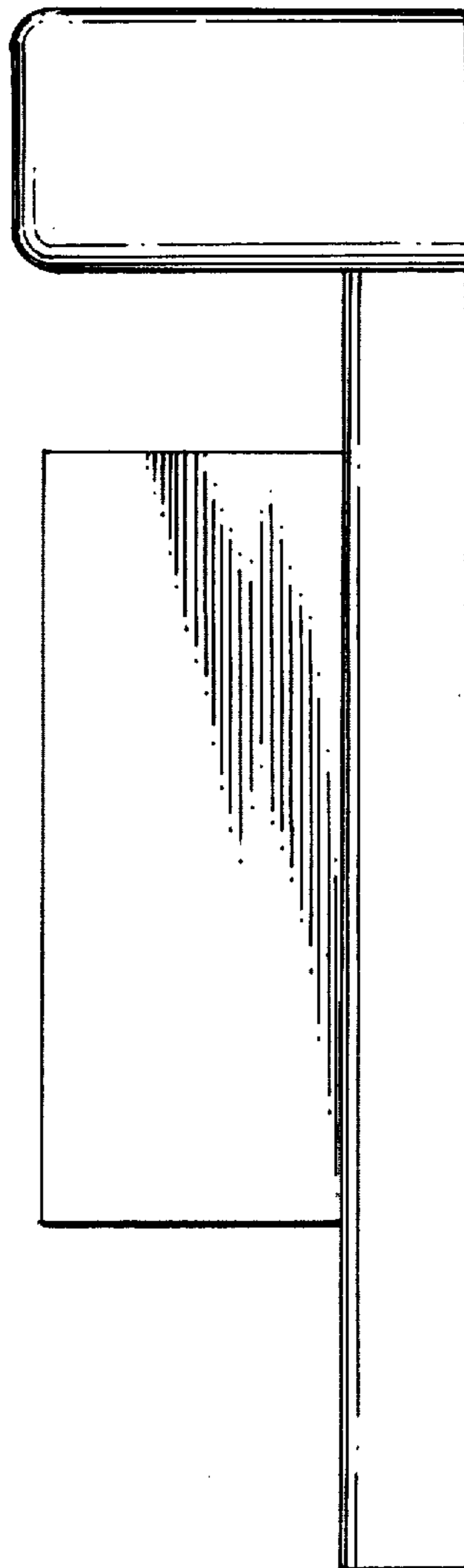
