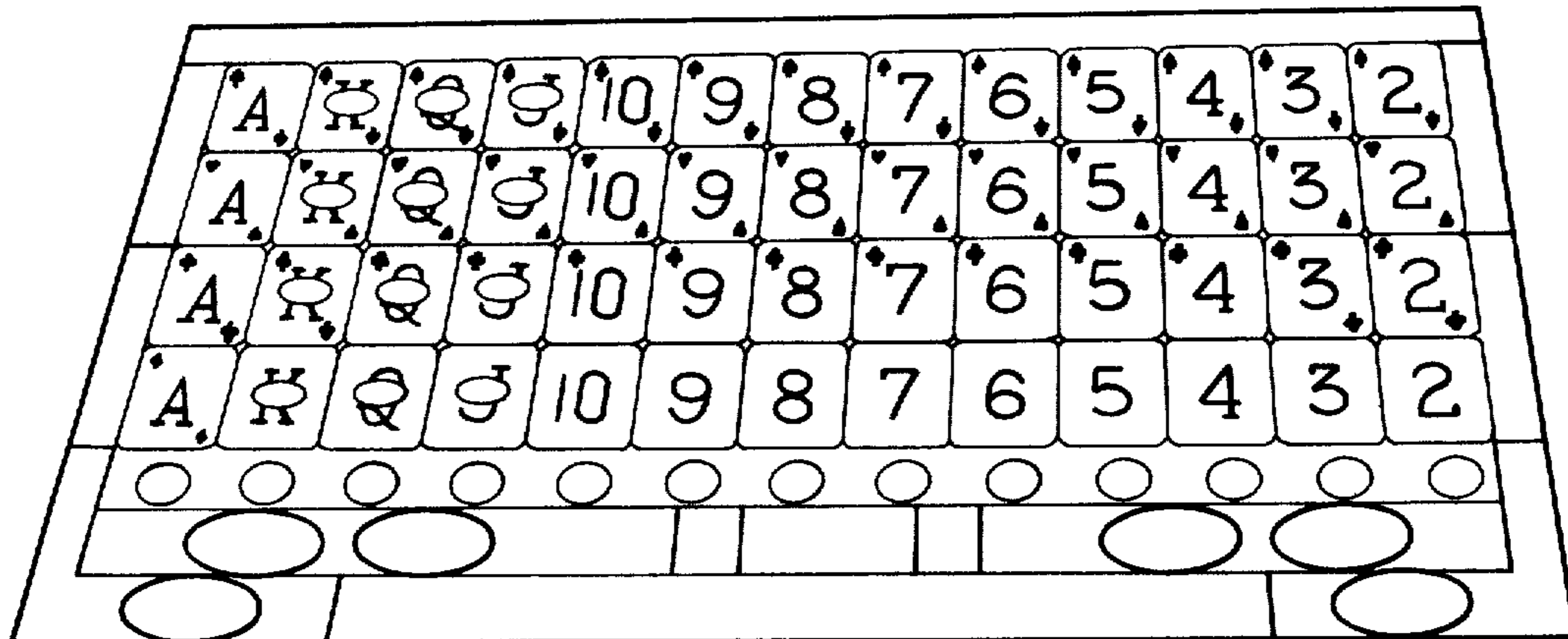

The FIGURE is a perspective view of a game board showing our new design, and being of no appreciable thickness.



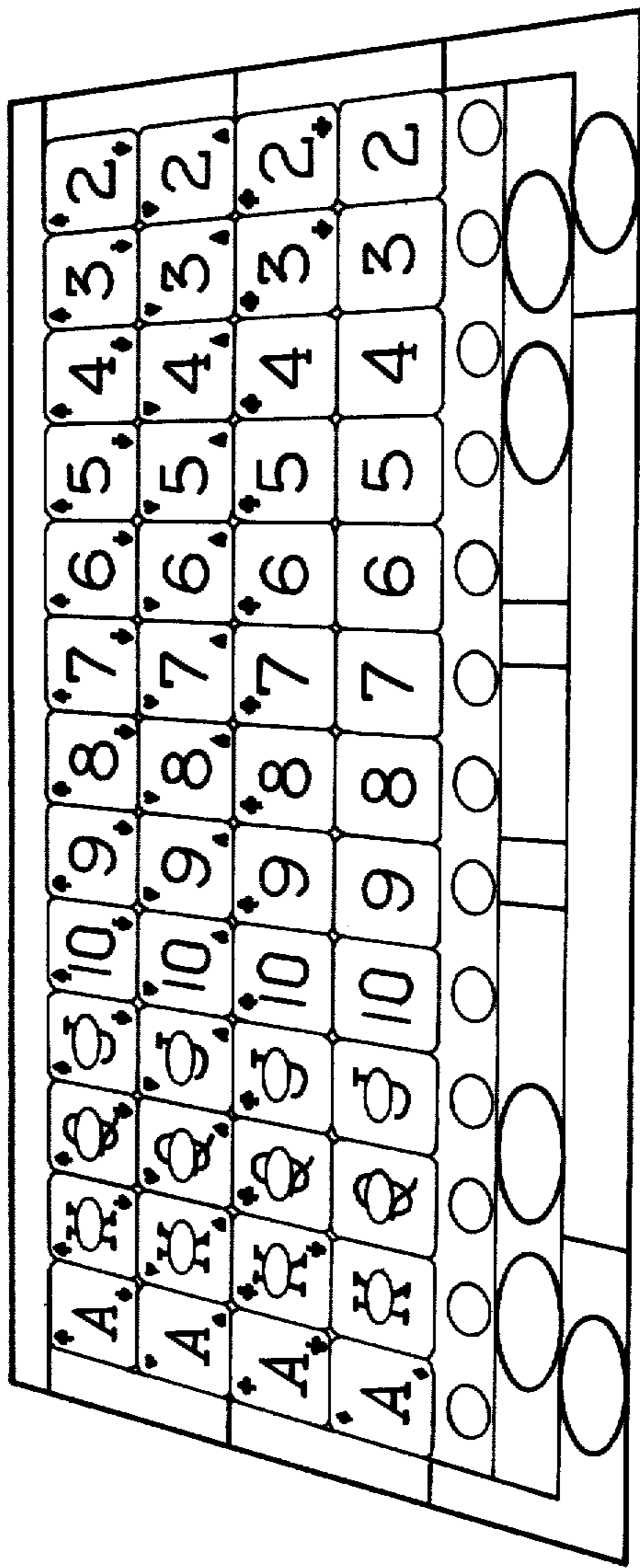
