CLAIM

[57] The ornamental design for a plate or similar article, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of a plate or similar article showing my new design in the size and proportions of a relish dish;
 FIG. 2 is a bottom plan view thereof;
 FIG. 3 is a side view thereof;
 FIG. 4 is a sectional view taken along line 4—4 of FIG. 1;
 FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view of a modification of my new design for a plate or similar article in the size and proportion of a platter;
 FIG. 6 is a side view thereof;
 FIG. 7 is a sectional view taken along line 7—7 of FIG. 5;
 FIG. 8 is a top plan view of another modification of my new design for a plate or similar article in the size and proportions of a saucer;
 FIG. 9 is a bottom plan view thereof;
 FIG. 10 is a side view thereof;
 FIG. 11 is a sectional view taken along line 11—11 of FIG. 8;
 FIG. 12 is a partial bottom plan view of a modification of the plate or similar article of FIG. 5 in the size and proportions of a dinner plate; and
 FIG. 13 is a partial bottom plan view of a modification of the plate or similar article of FIG. 5 in the size and proportions of a salad plate.
 The facets that would be visible through the transparent walls in FIGS. 4, 7, and 11, have been omitted for convenience of illustration. The side and sectional views of FIGS. 12 and 13 are substantially similar to FIGS. 6 and 7.

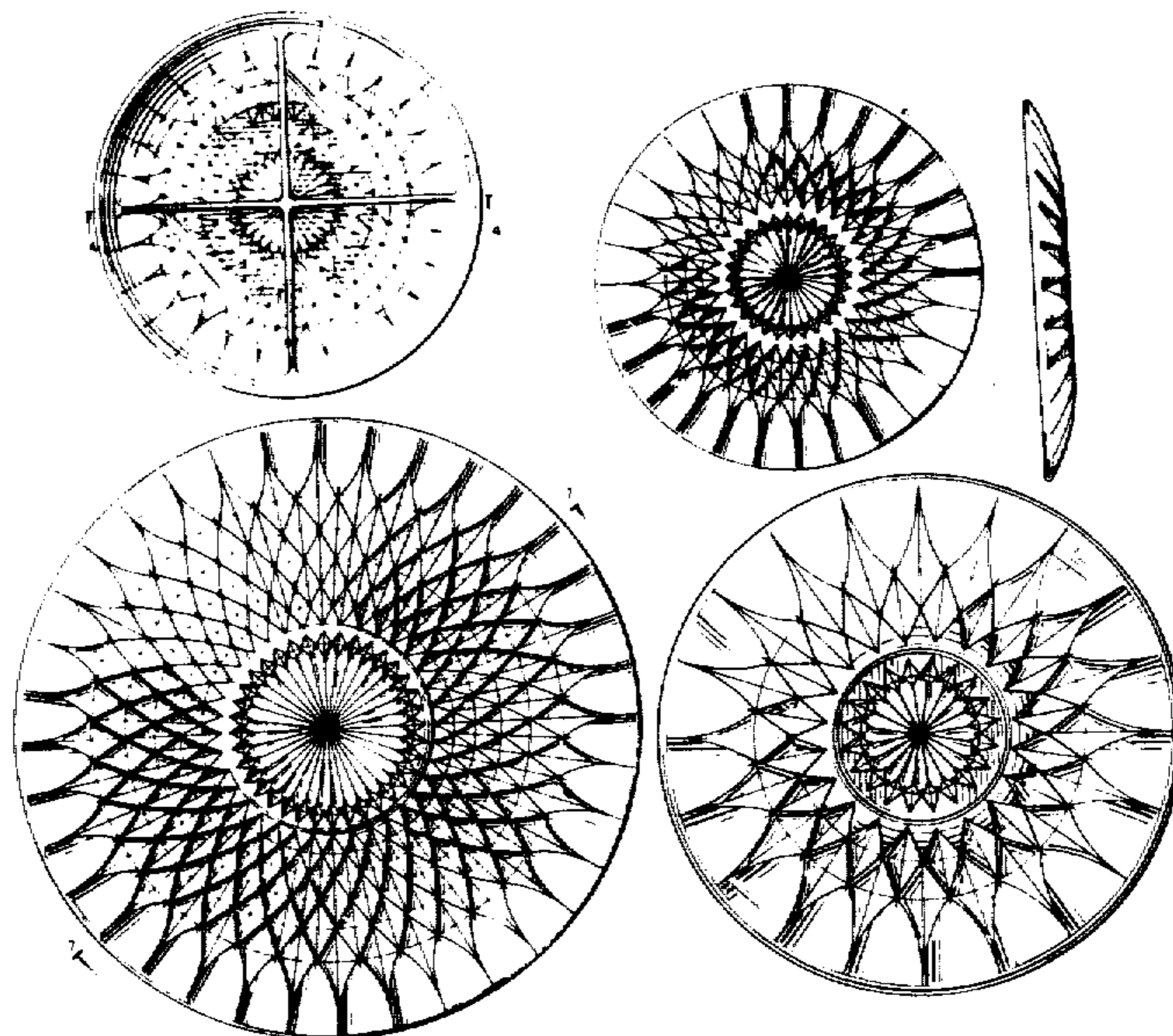

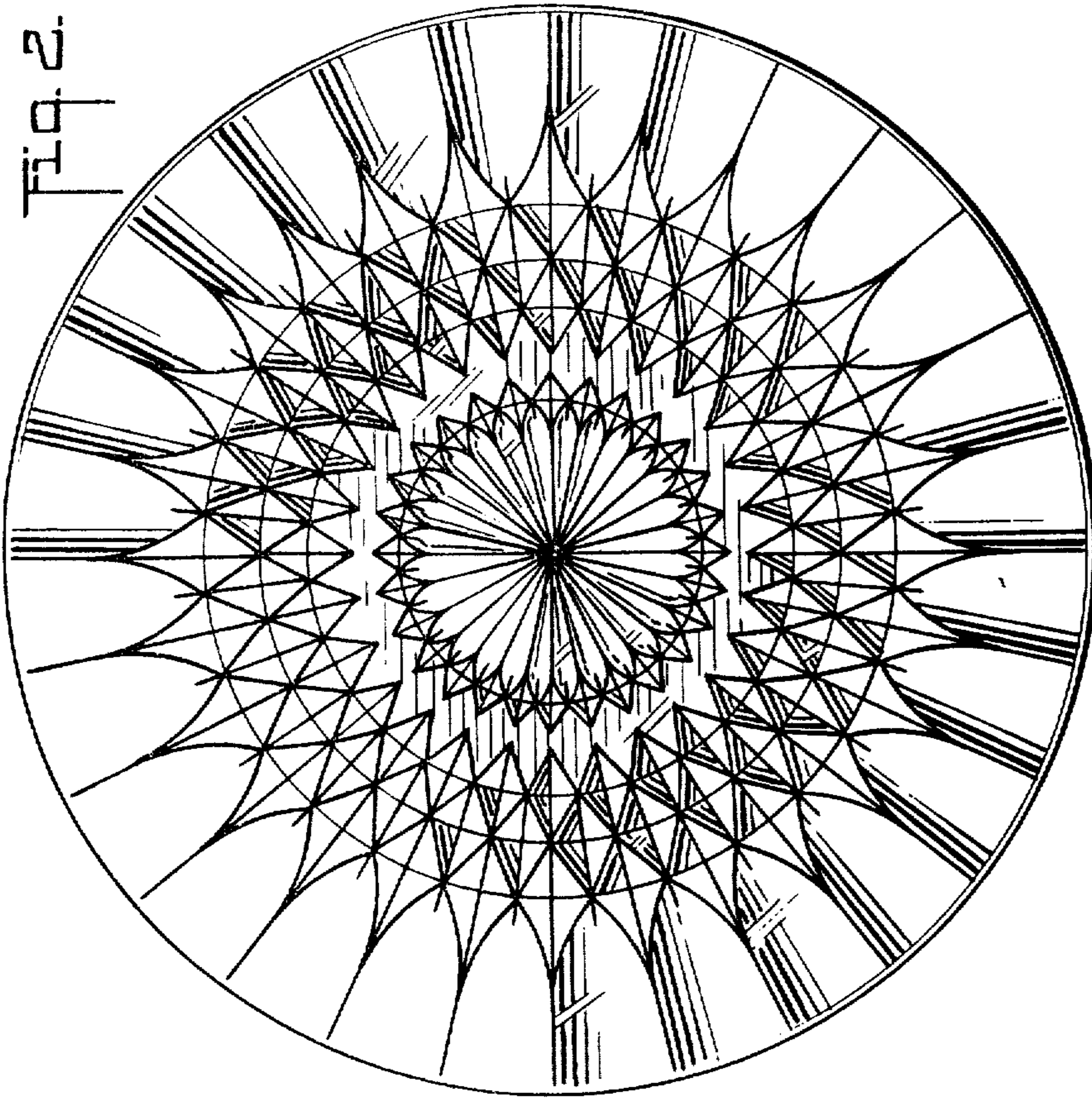

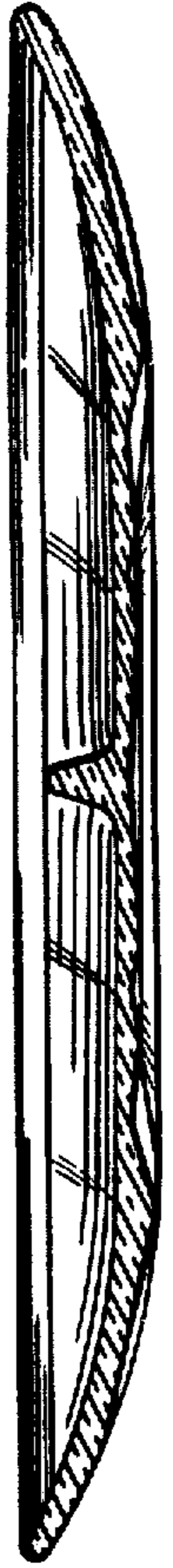

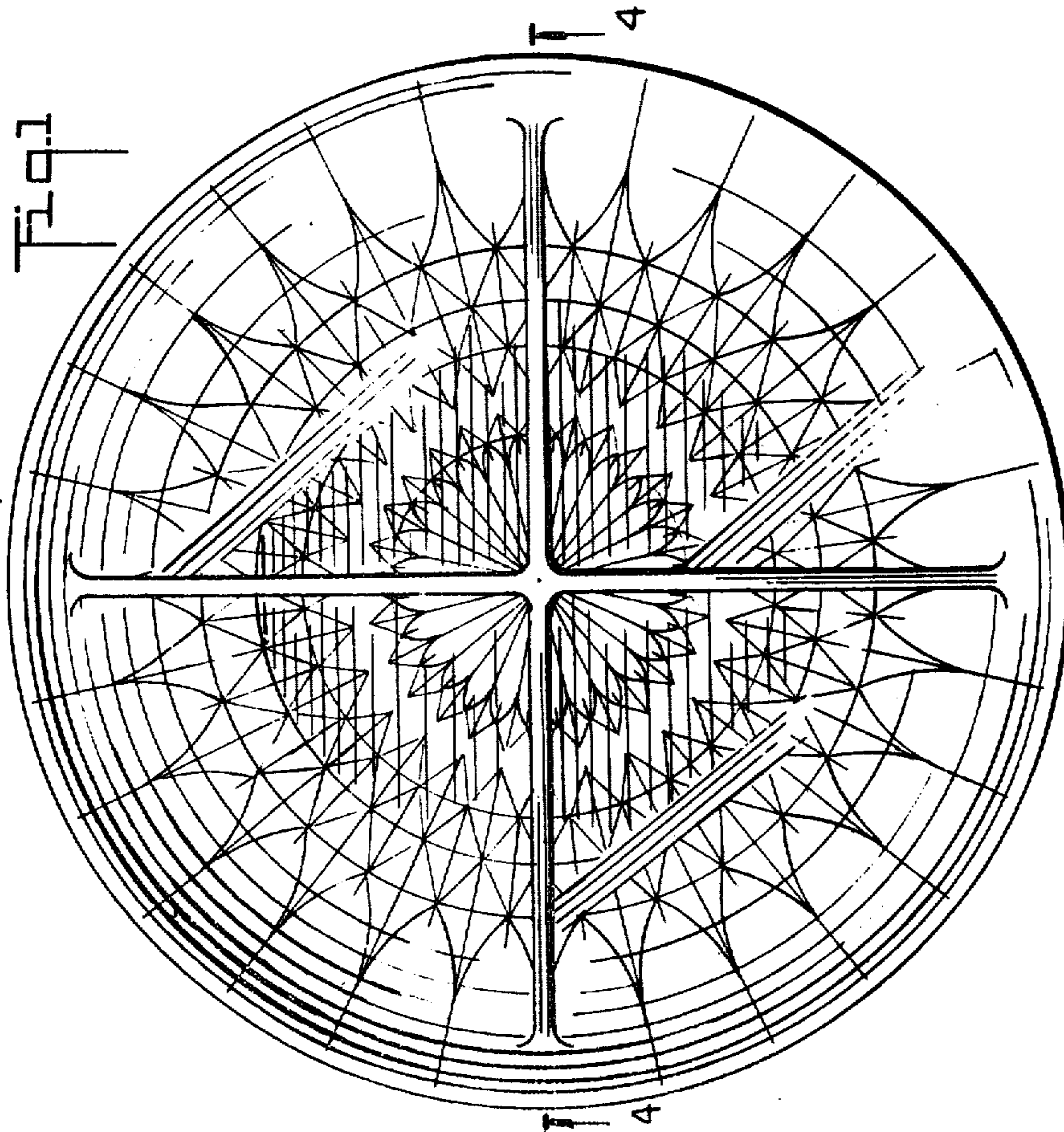

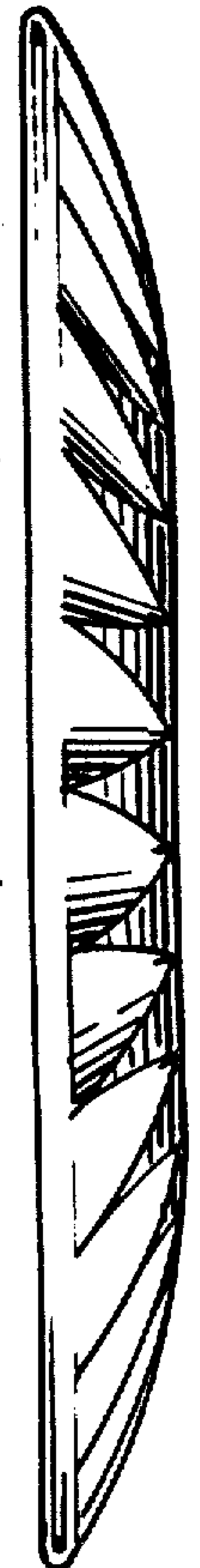

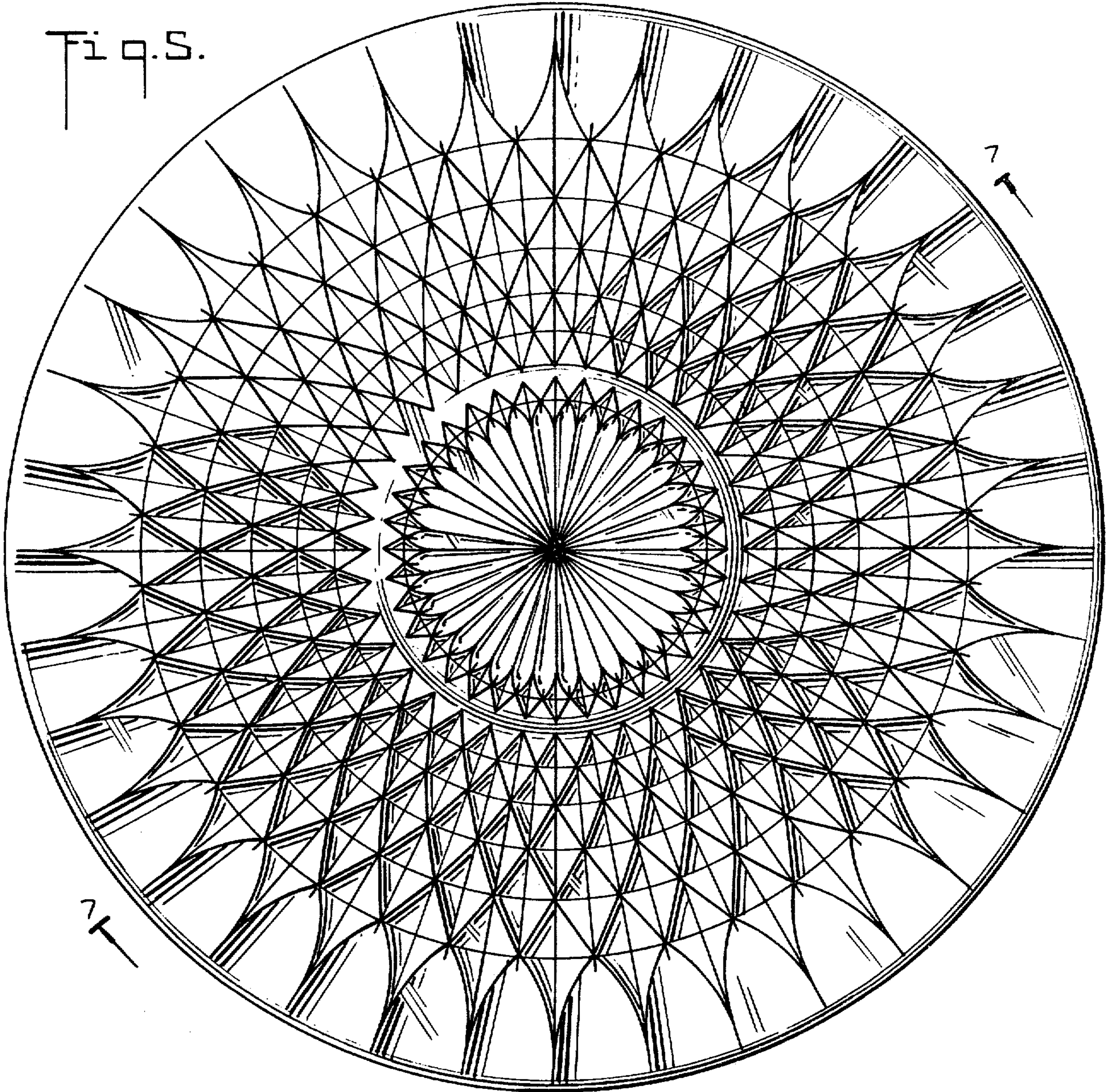

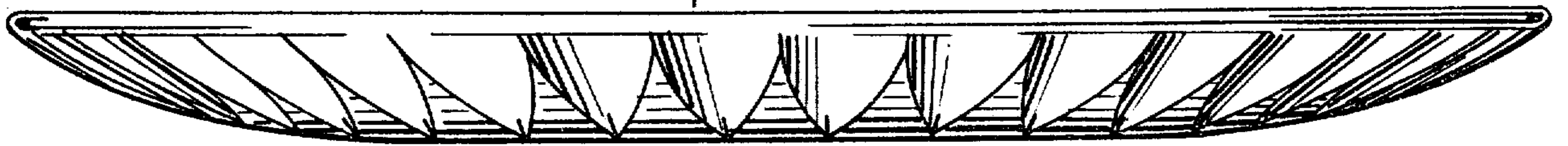

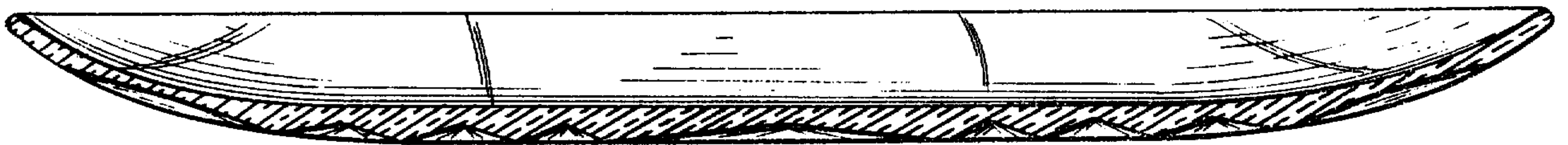

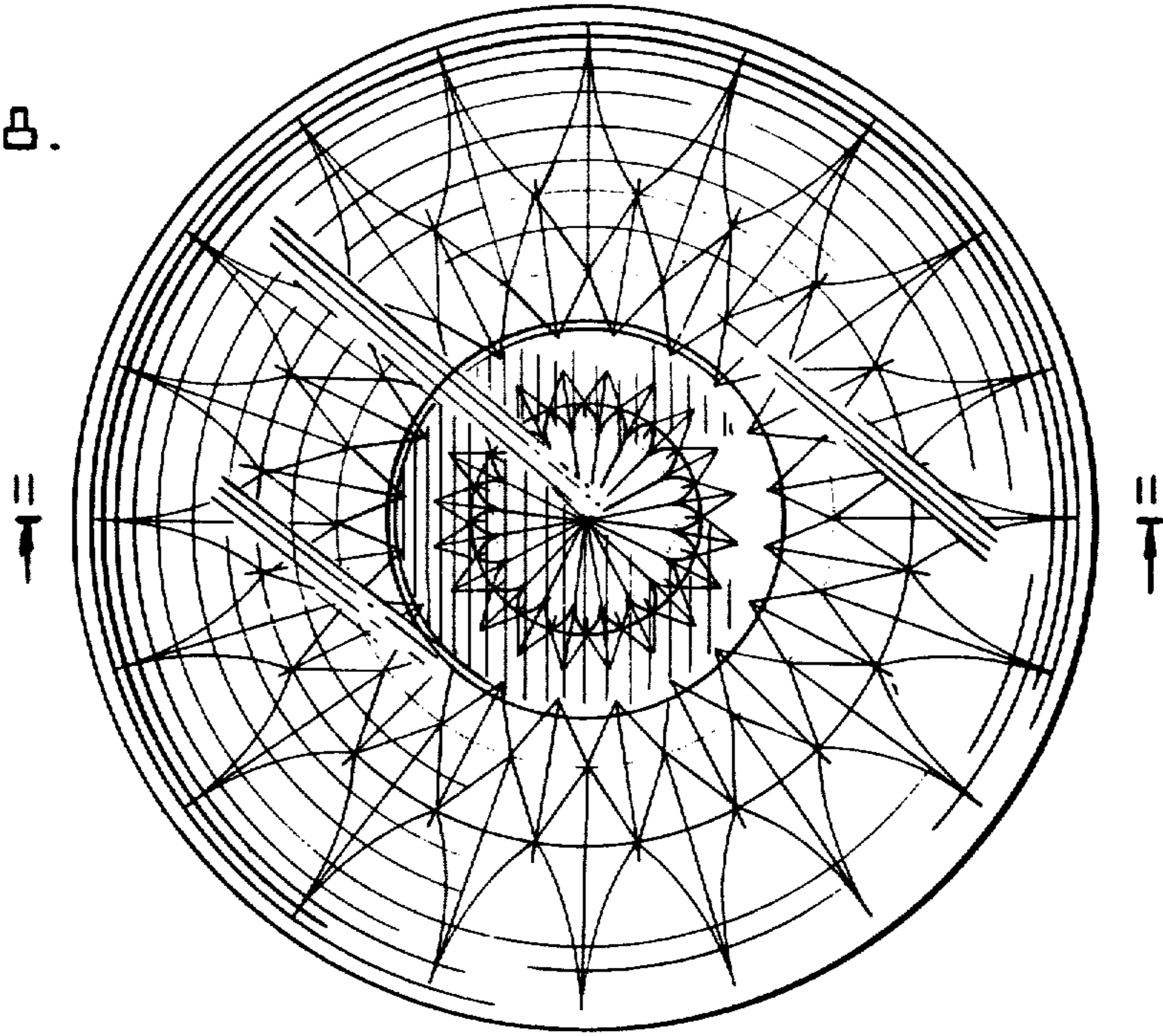
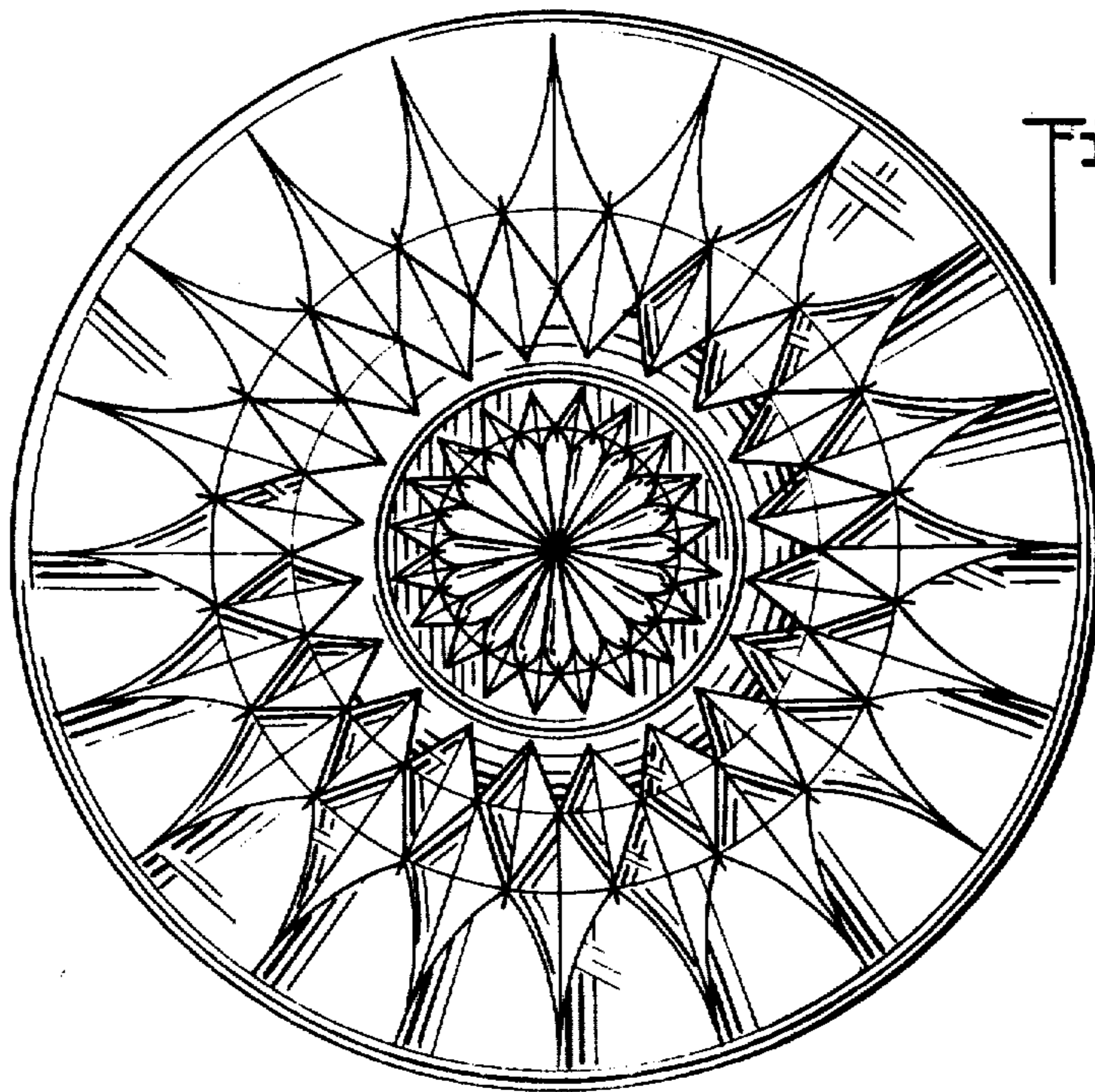

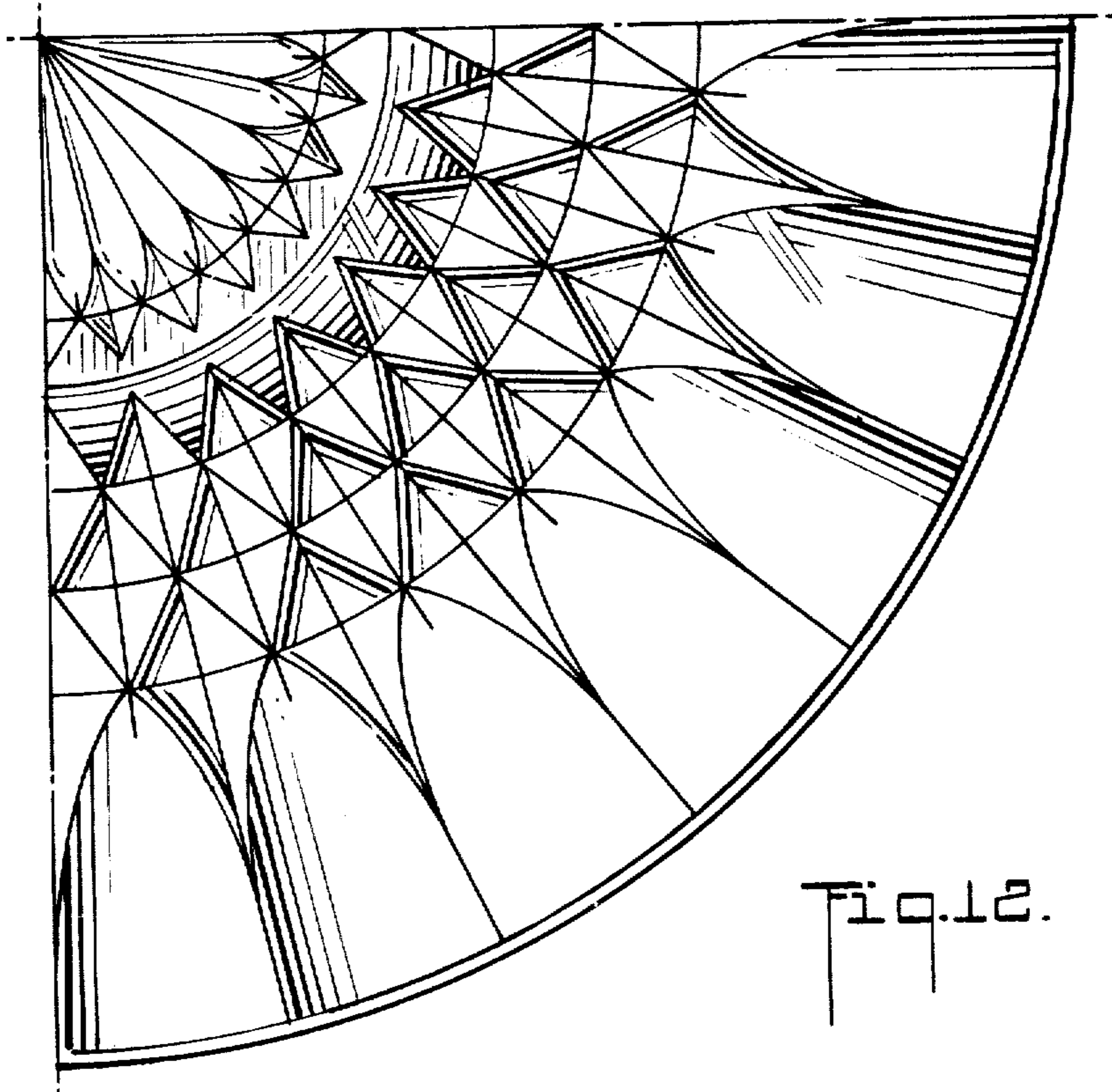

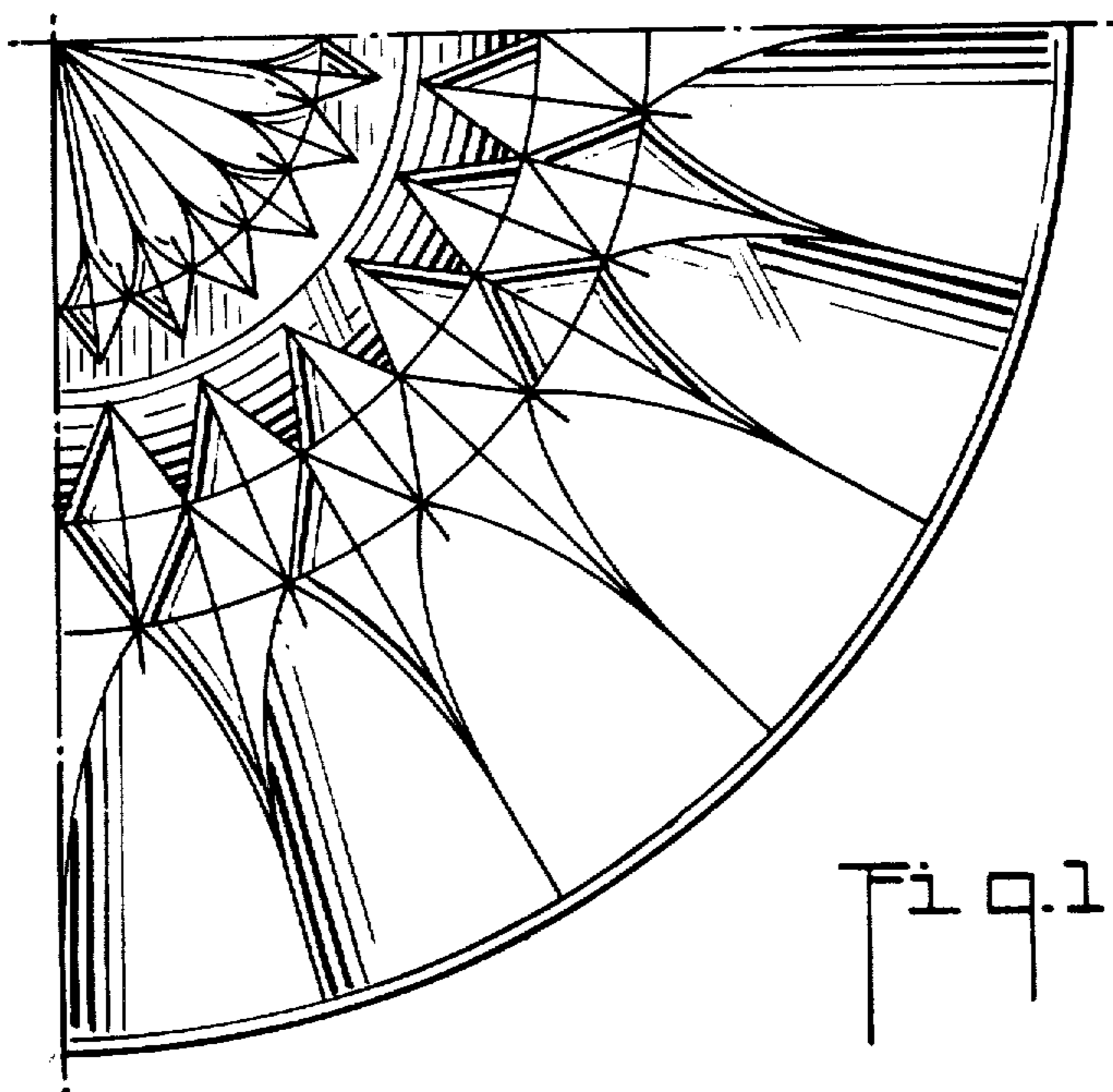
