The ornamental design for a compact fluorescent lamp or similar article for a lighting unit, as shown and described.

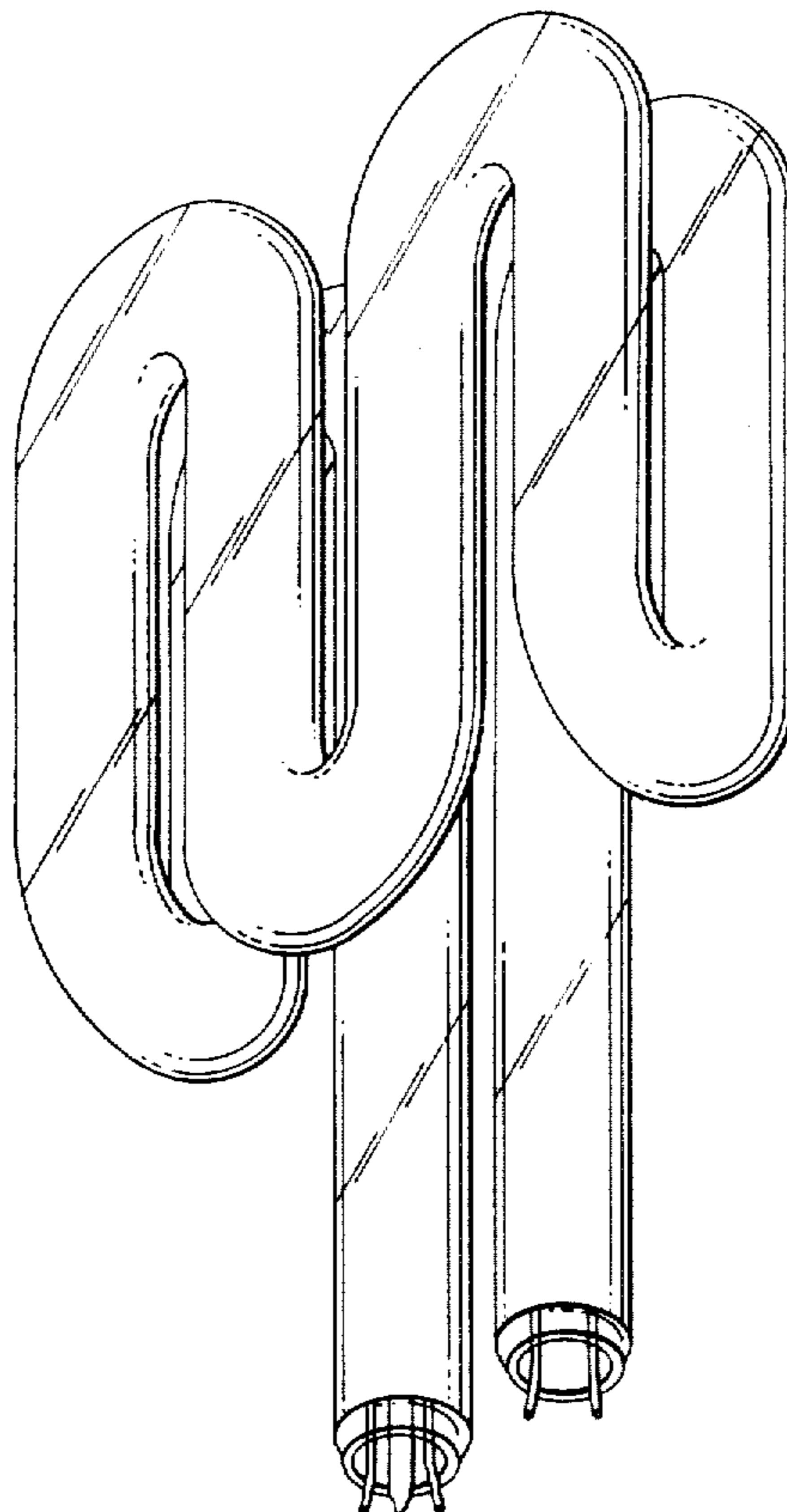
DESCRIPTION

FIG. 4 is a top plan view thereof.



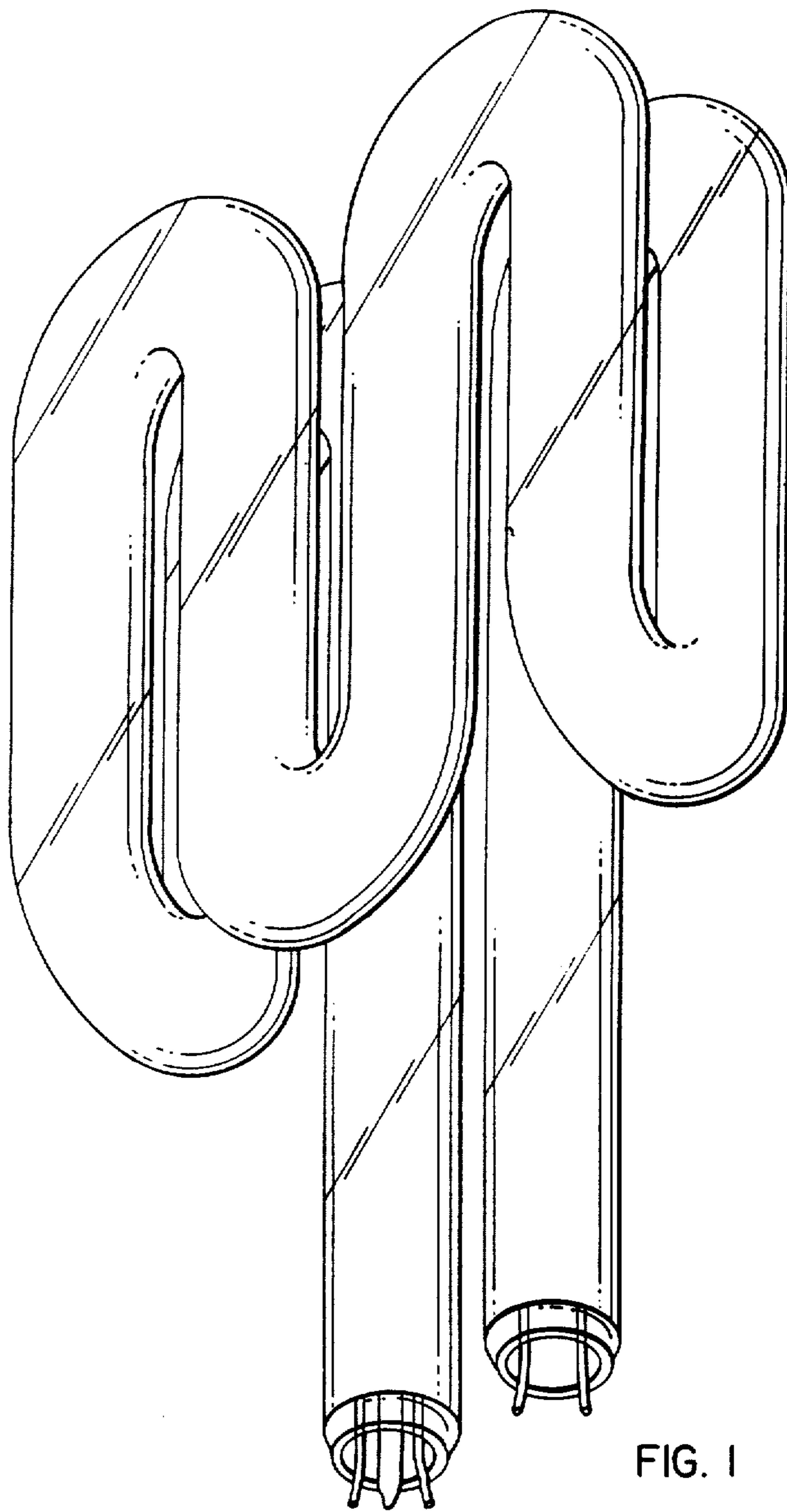

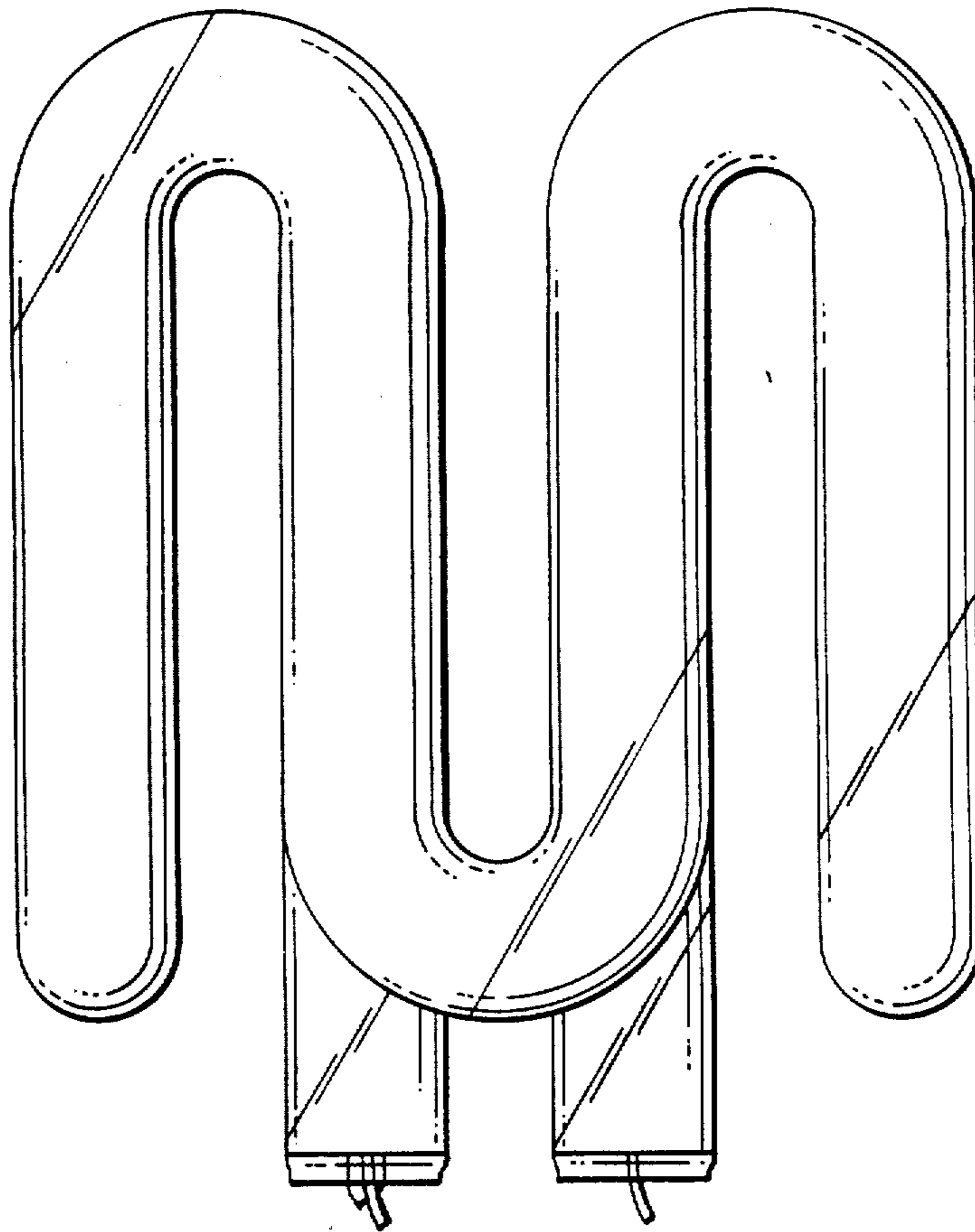

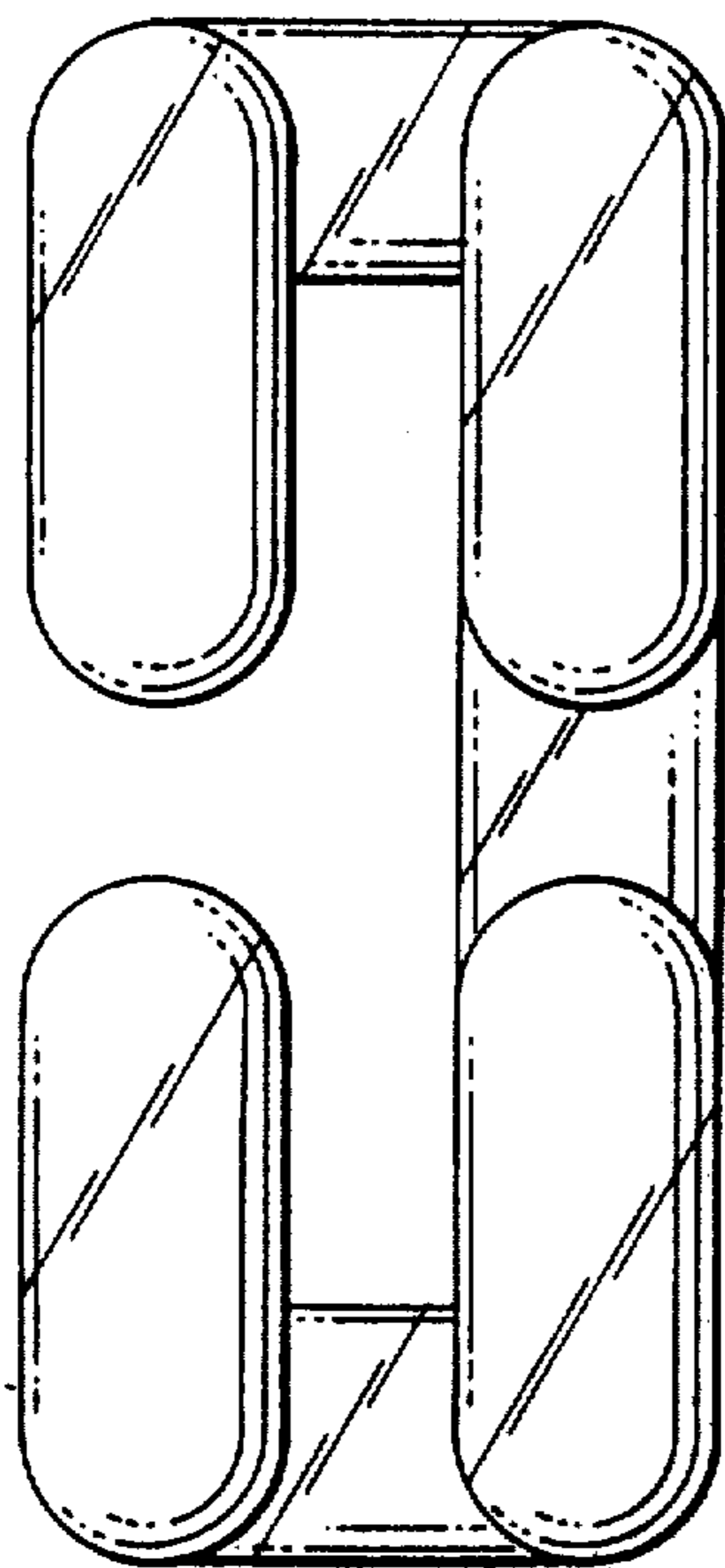

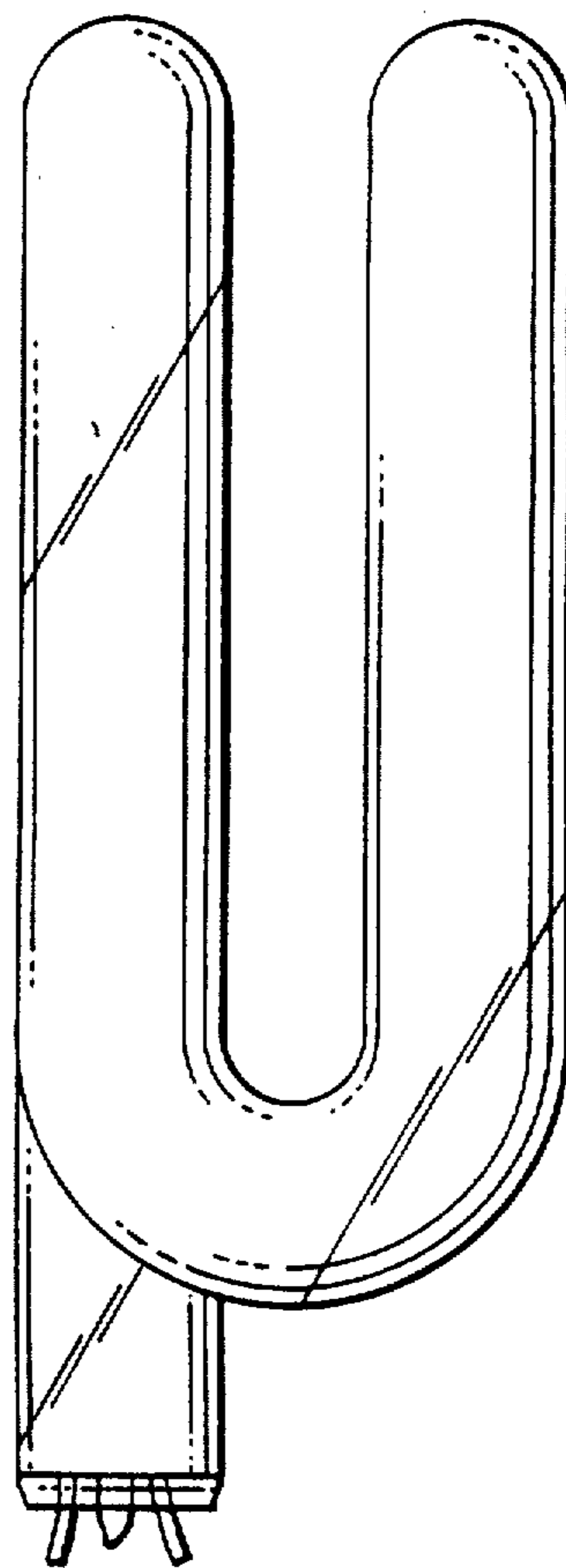
