[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a pitcher or the like, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top perspective view of the pitcher or the like, showing my new design;

FIG. 14 is a right side elevational view of another modi-


fied form of the pitcher or the like of FIG. 1;


FIG. 15 is a rear elevational view thereof;


FIG. 16 is a front elevational view thereof;


FIG. 17 is a top plan view thereof; and

FIG. 18 is a bottom plan view thereof.





















