[57] **CLAIM**
The ornamental design for a male incontinence pad, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION
FIG. 1 is a rear elevation of a male incontinence pad showing my new design;
FIG. 2 is a side elevation thereof, in an open position;
FIG. 3 is a side elevation thereof, in a closed position;
FIG. 4 is an end elevation thereof;
FIG. 5 is a cross-section view taken on line 5—5 of FIG. 3.

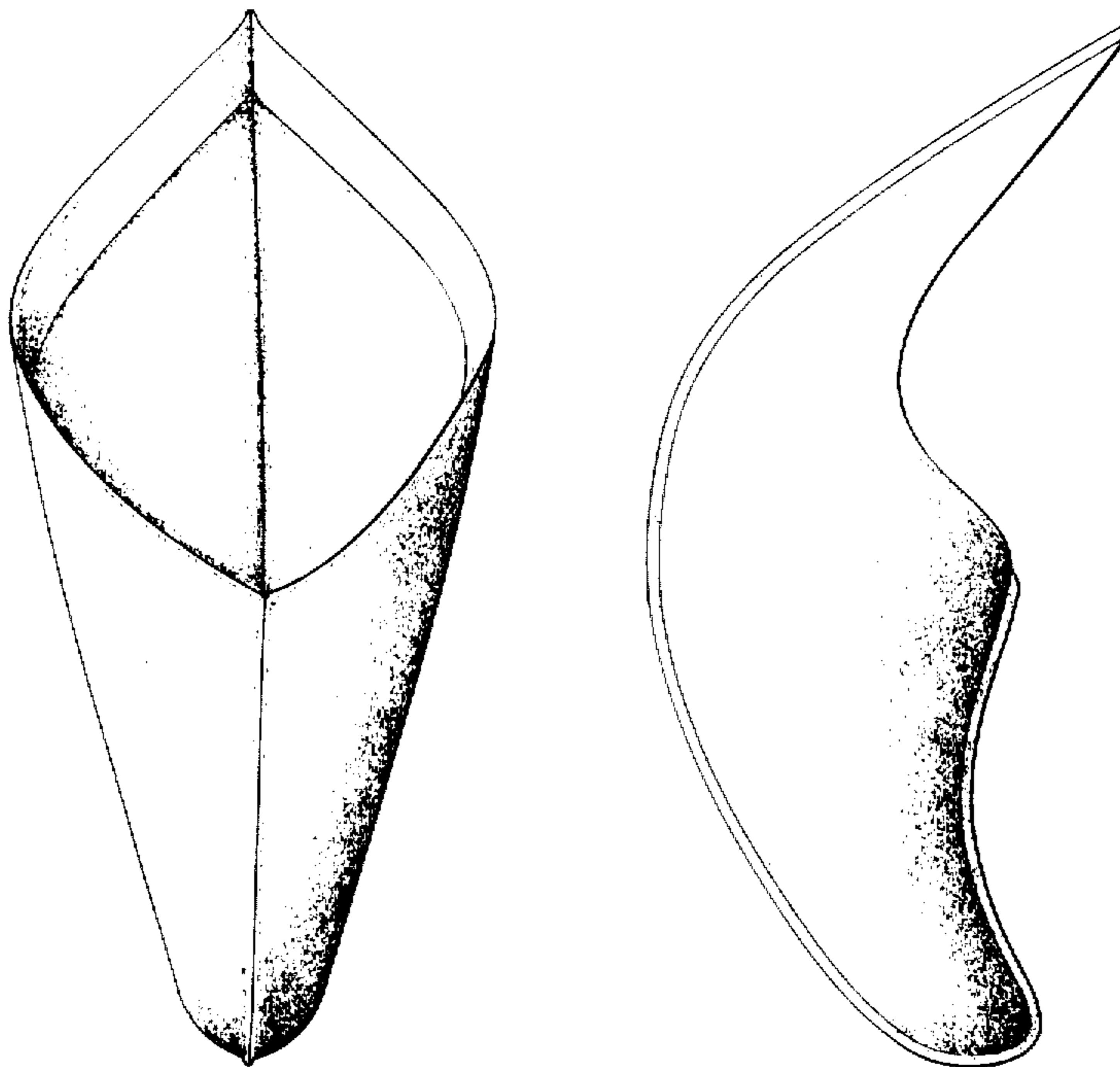

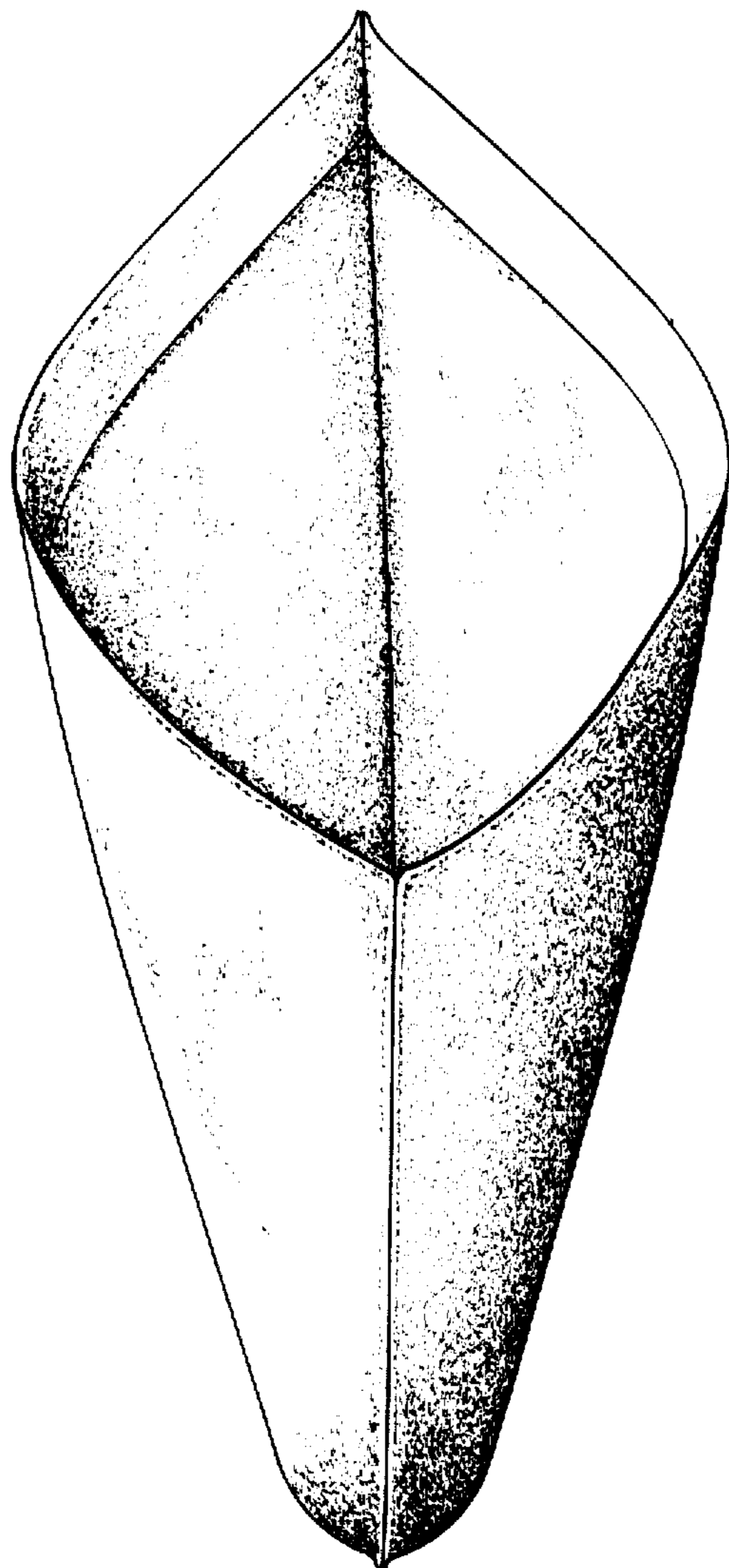
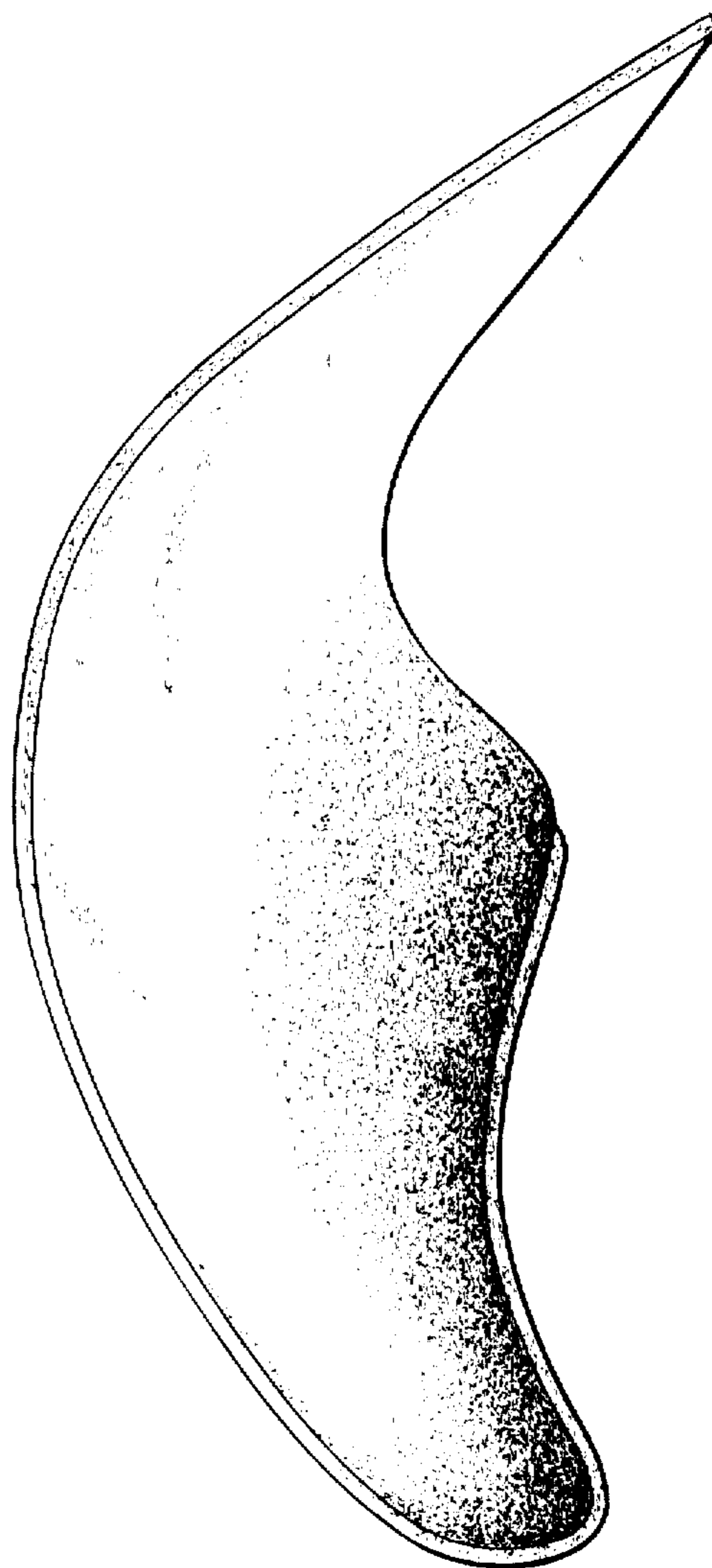

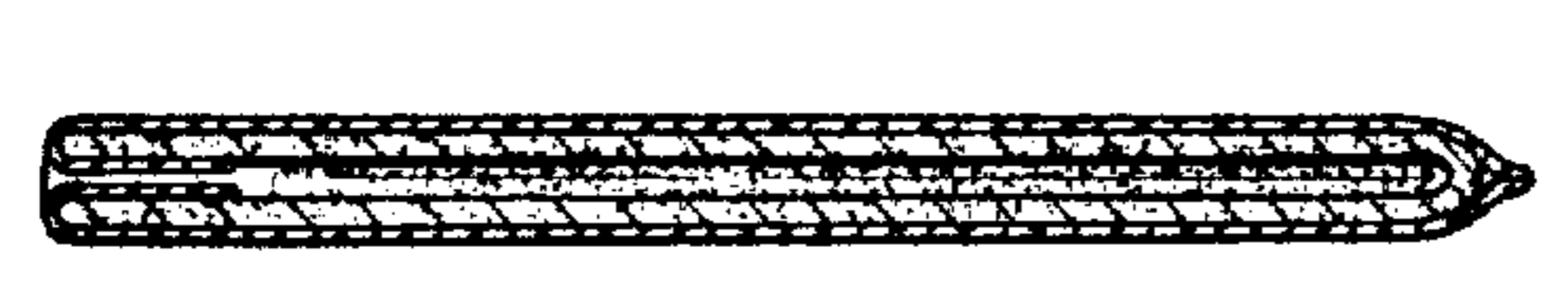
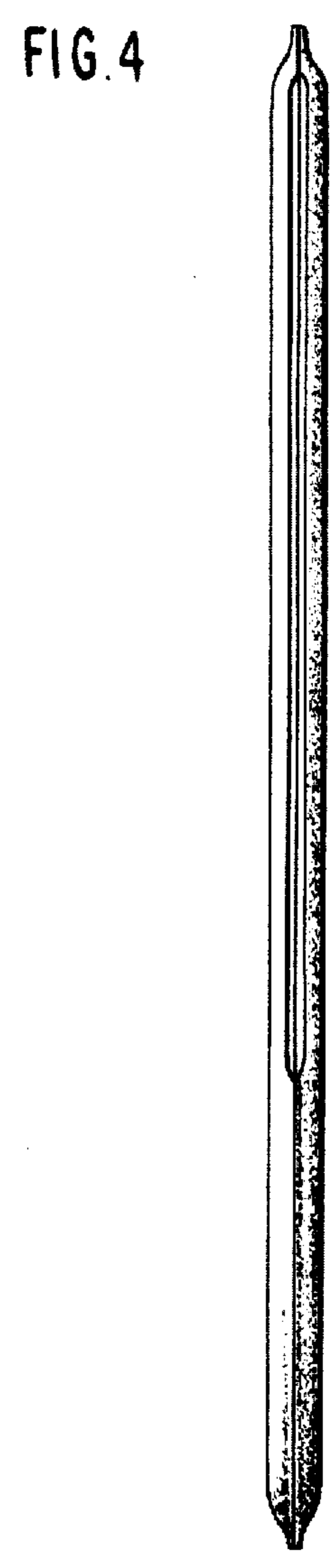
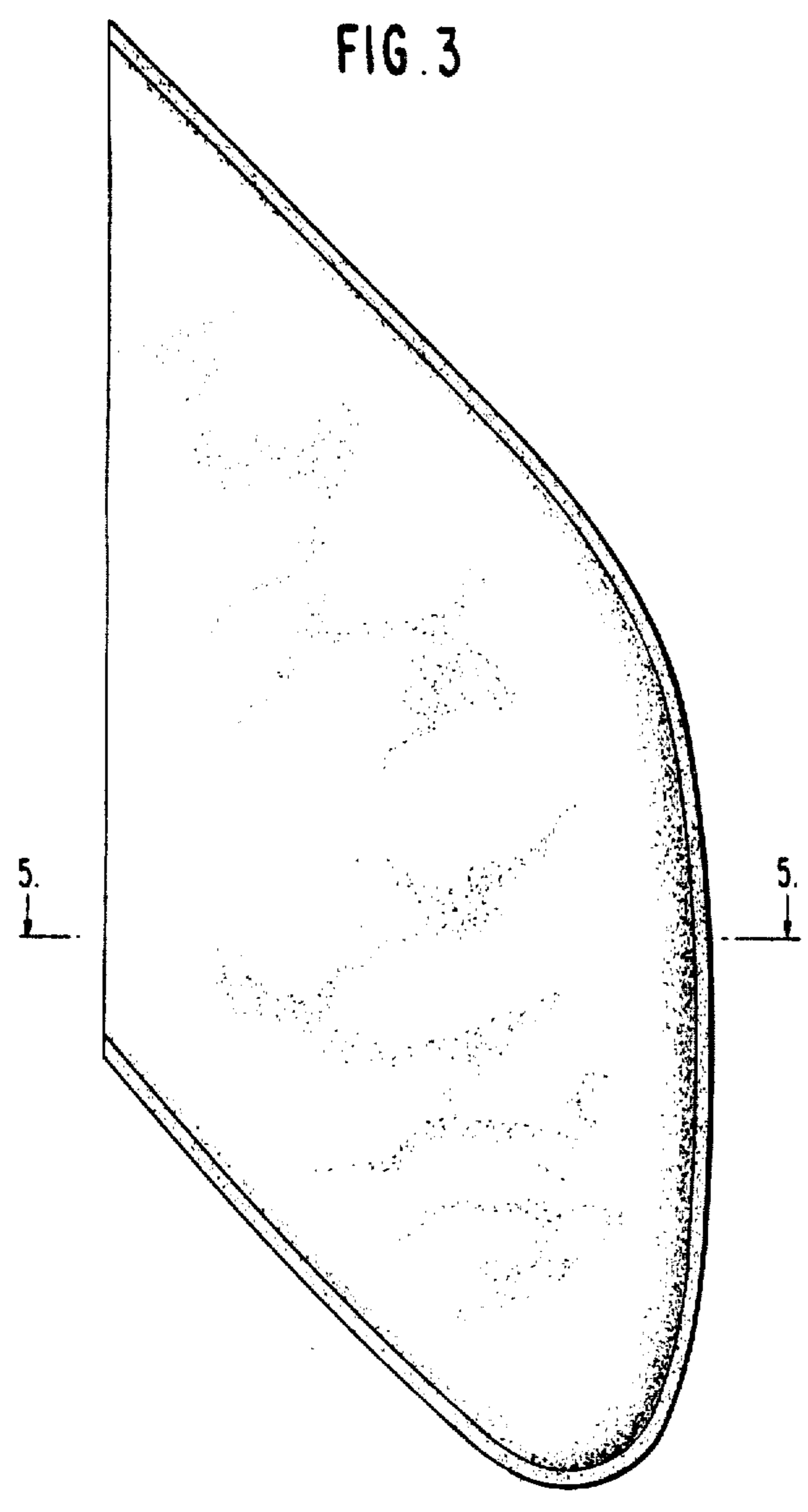
