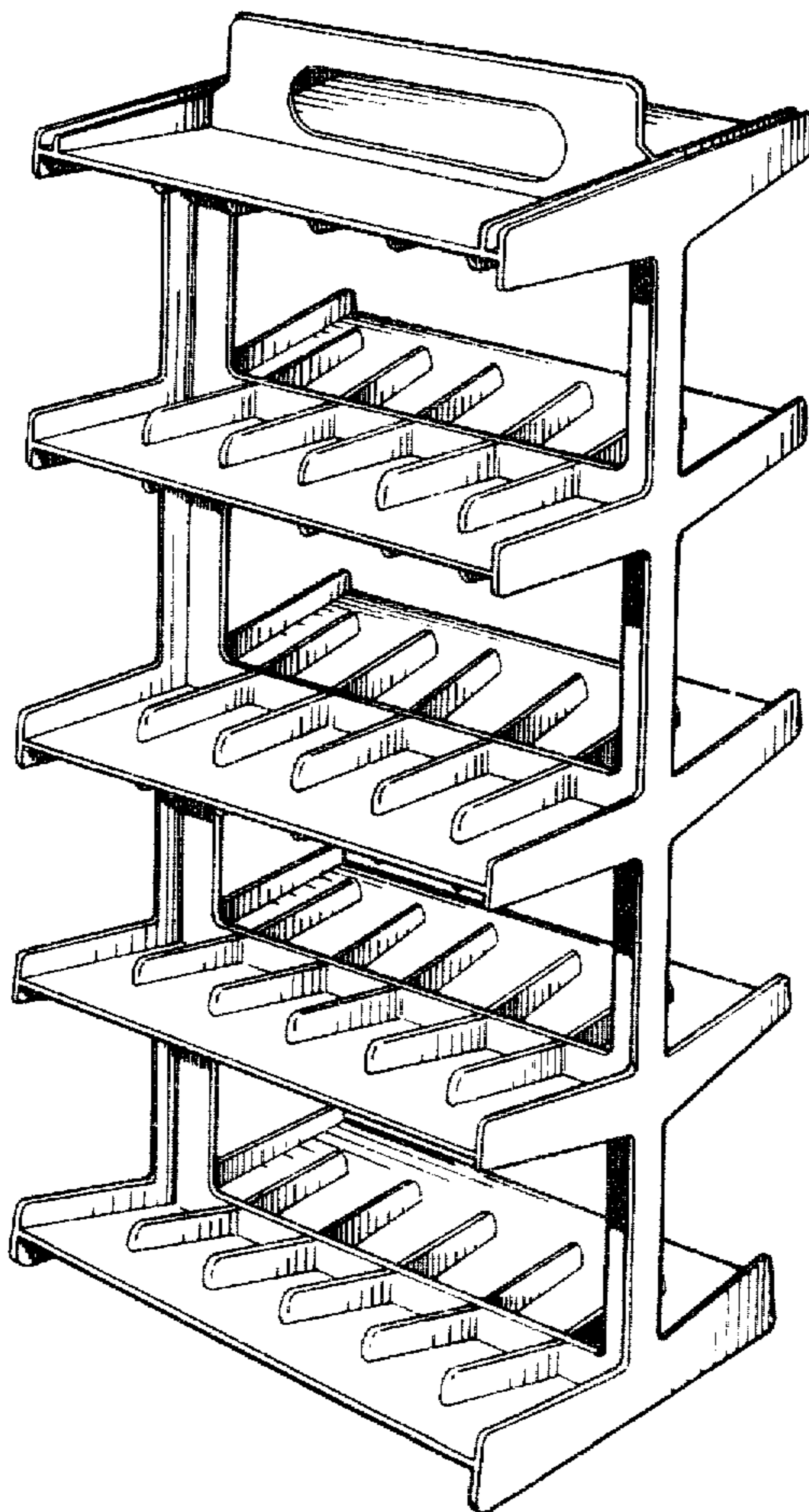
FIG. 4 is a partial sectional view taken along line IV—IV of FIG. 3; and

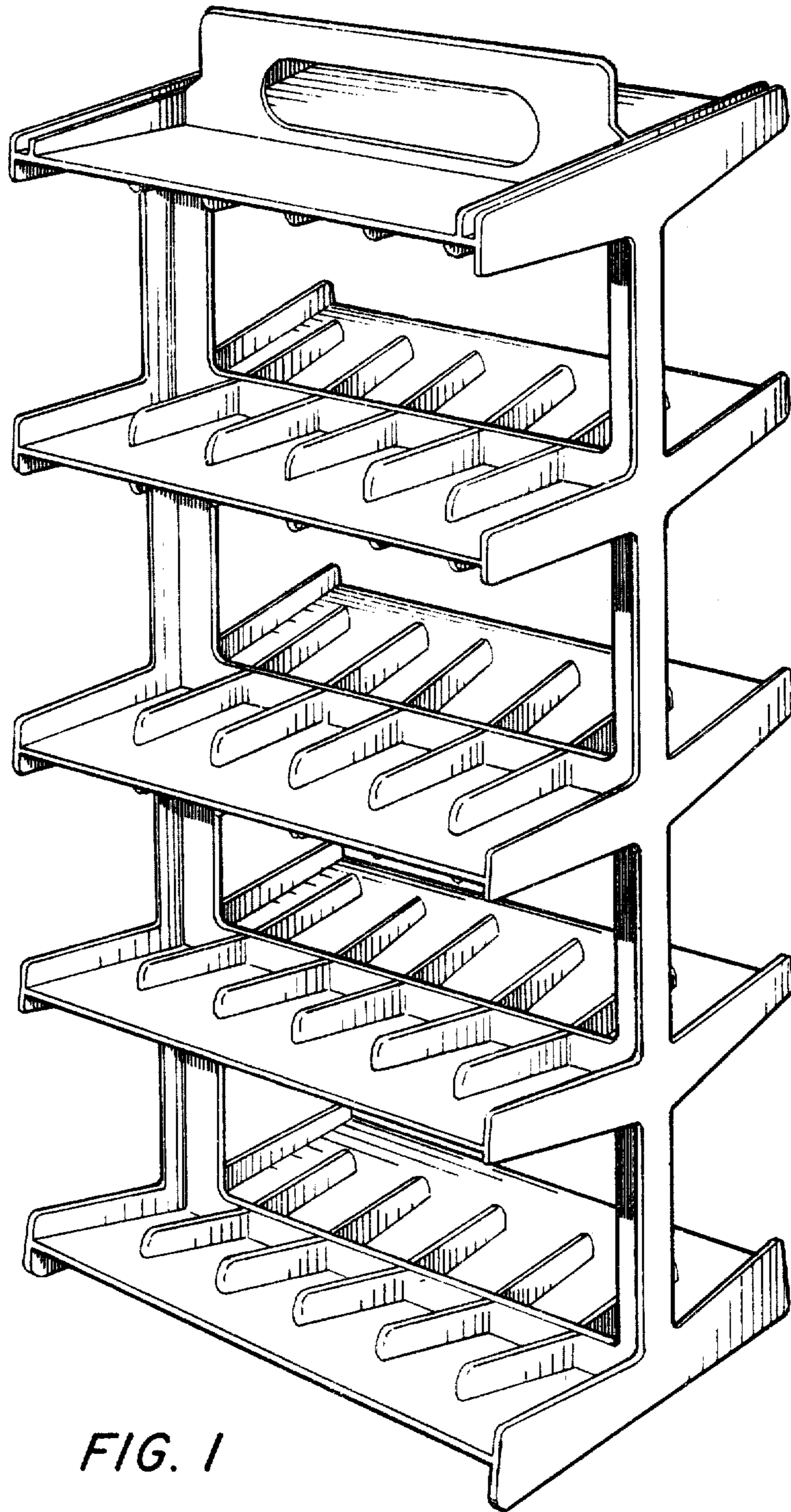

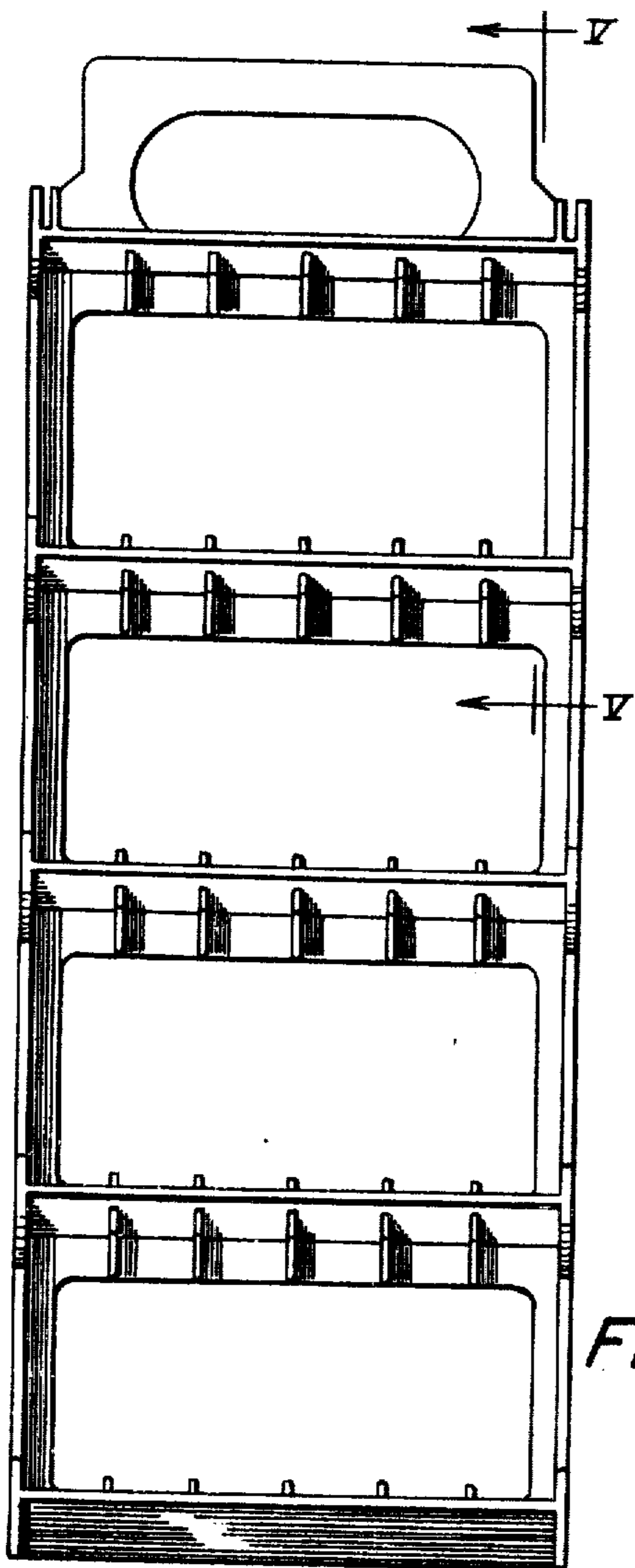

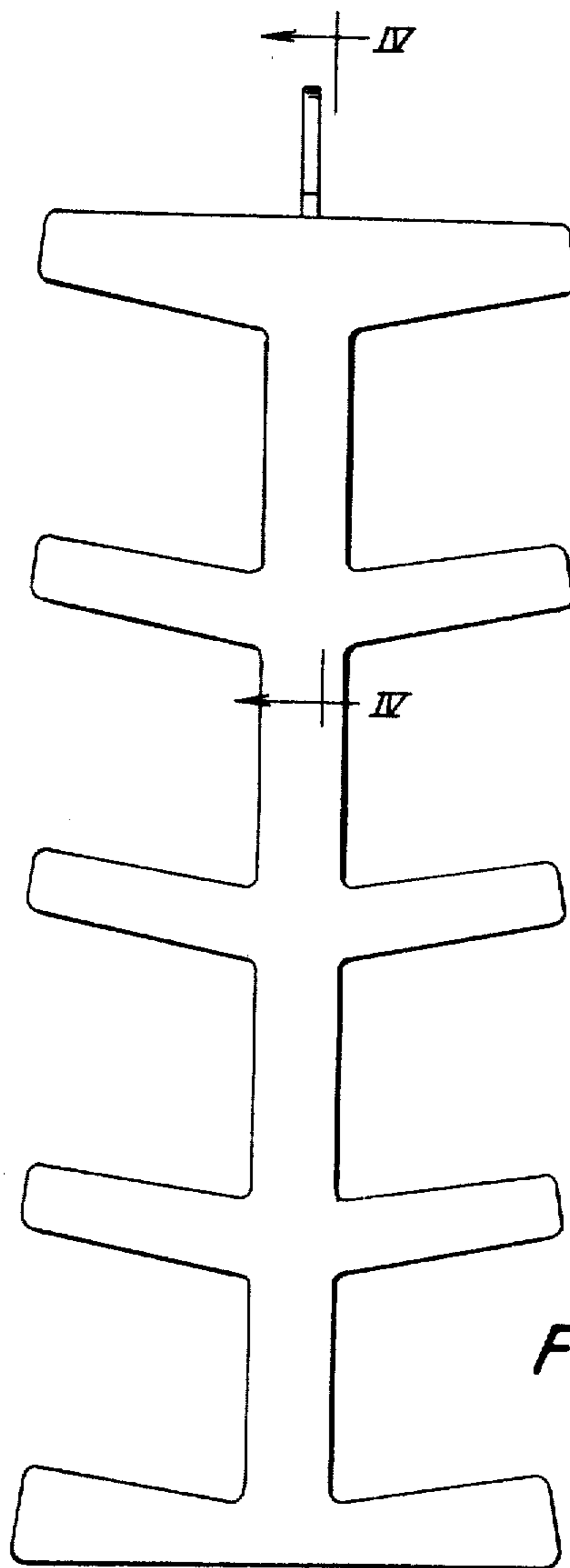

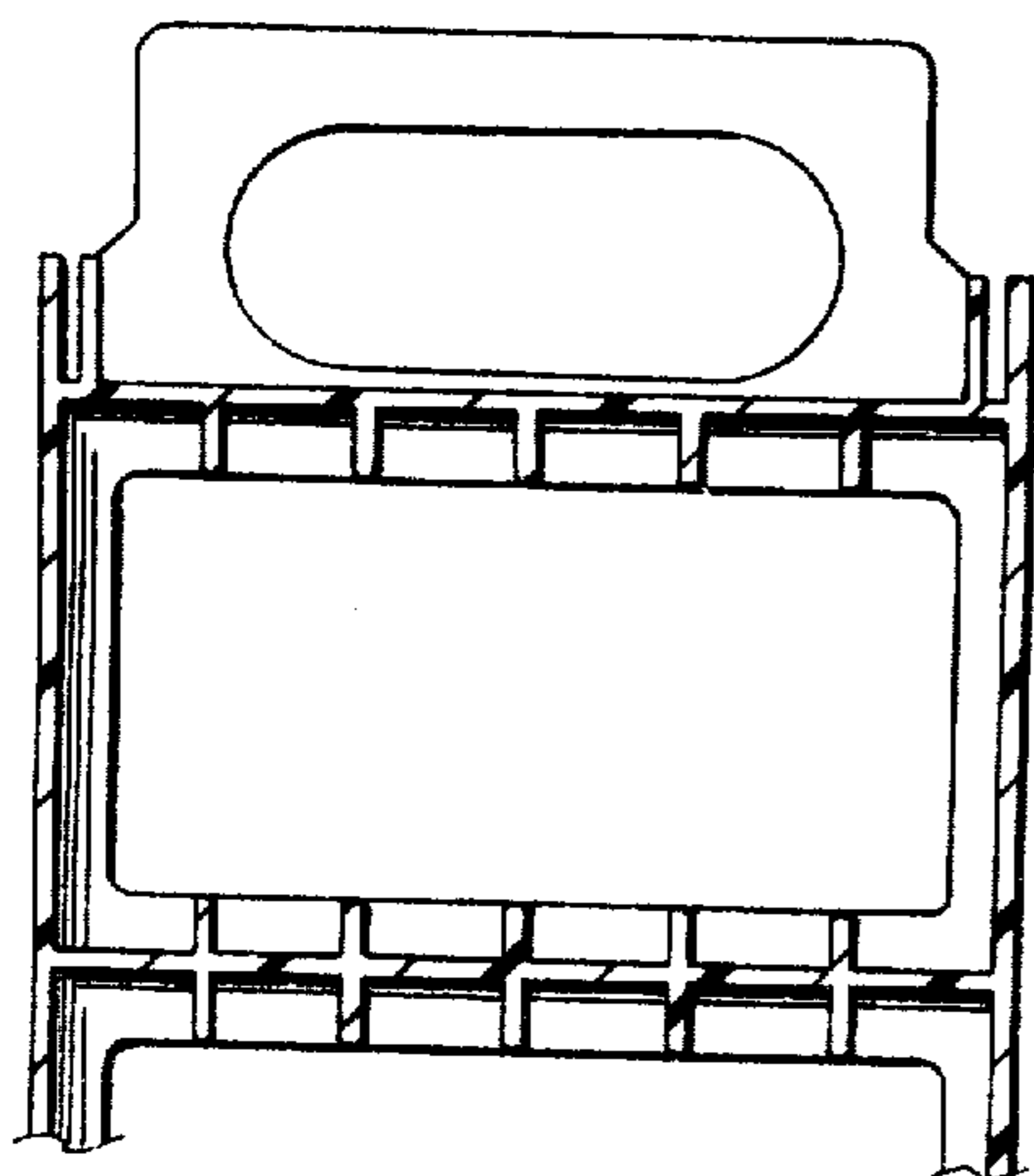

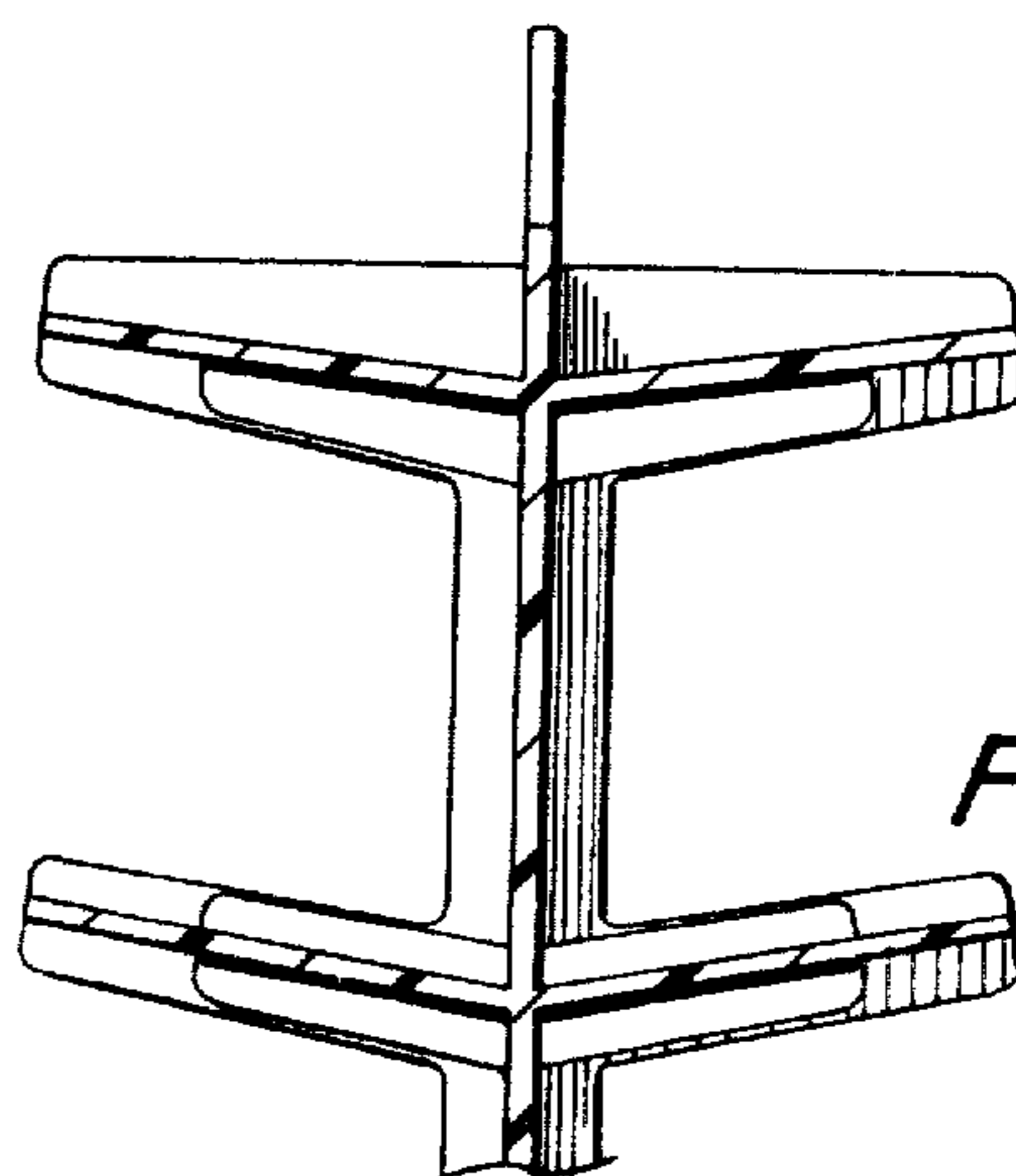
