CLAIM

The ornamental design for an anti-slip bathtub bottom, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of an ornamental design of an anti-slip bathtub bottom embodying my new design; and  
 FIG. 2 is a cross-sectional view taken on line 2—2 of FIG. 1;  
 The broken line showing of a bathtub in FIG. 1 is for purposes of illustration only.

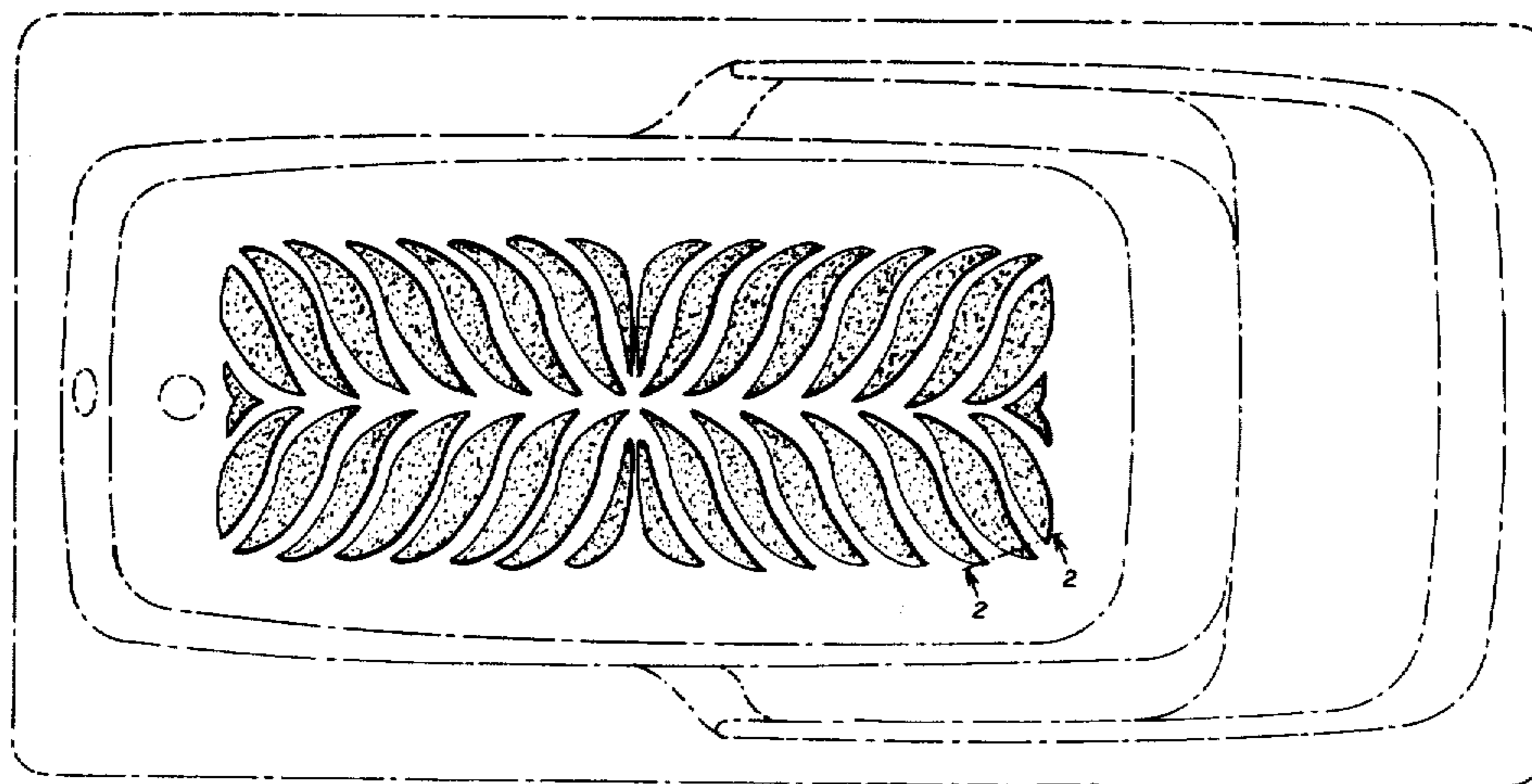

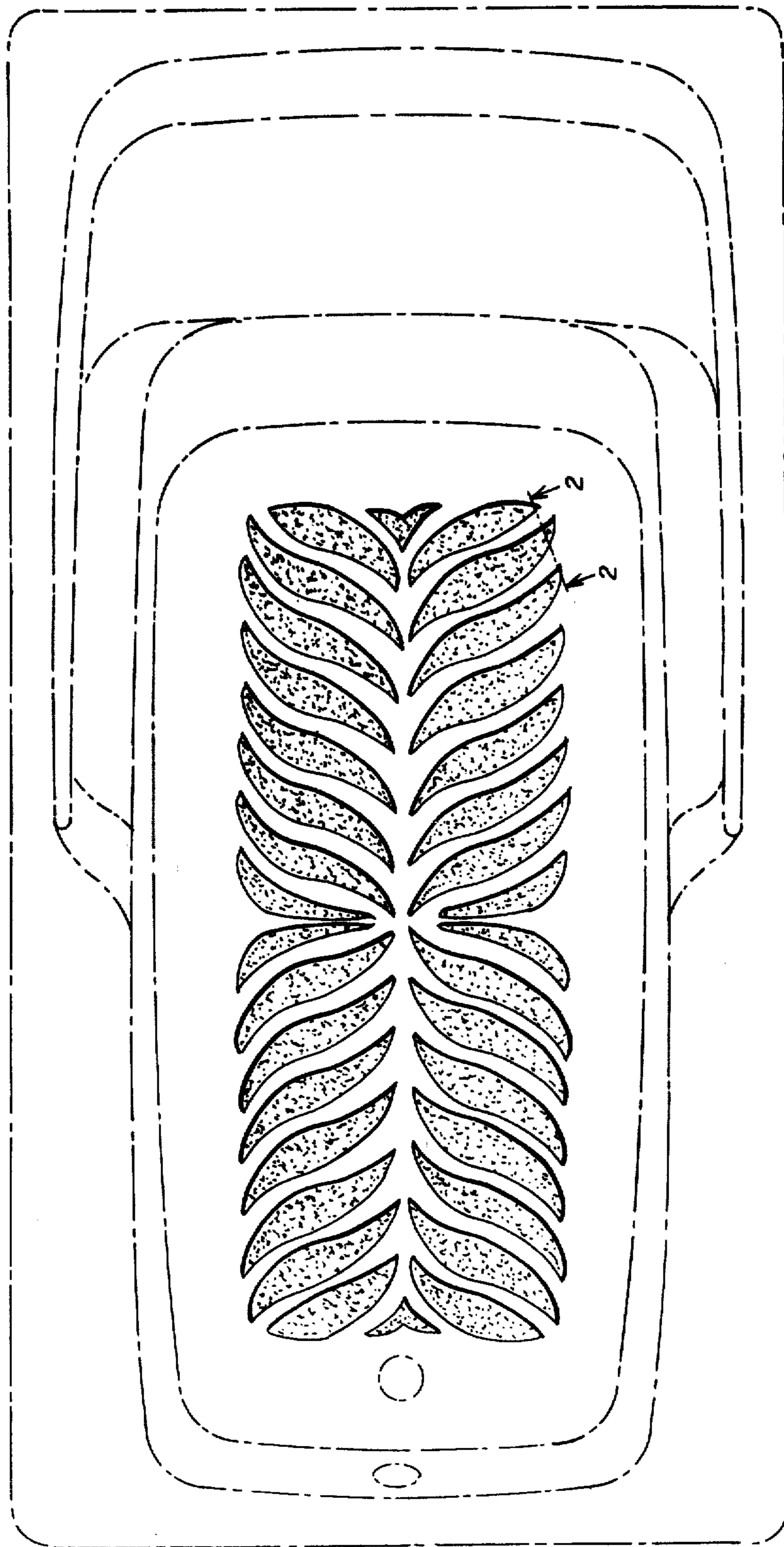
