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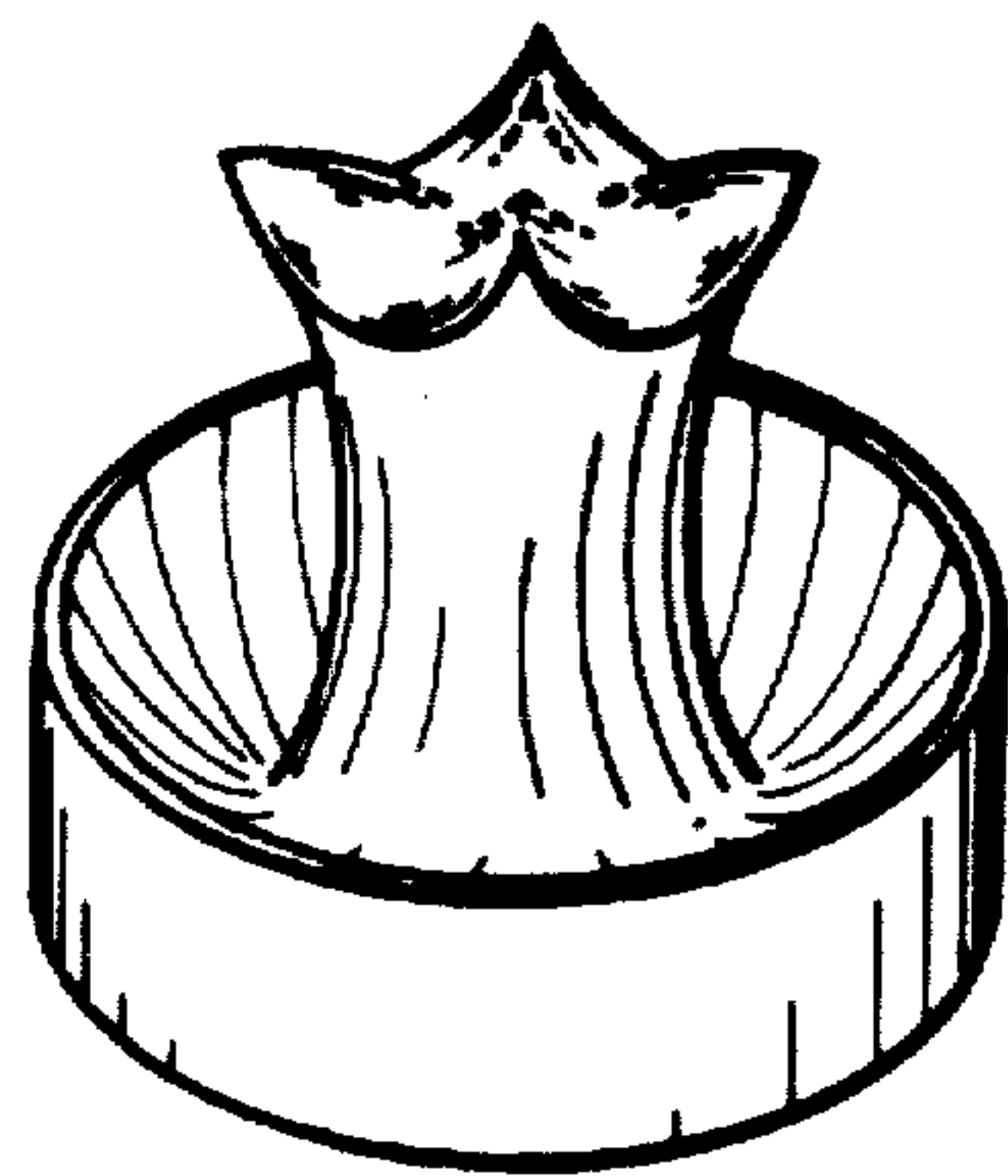

The ornamental design for a soap stand, as shown and
described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a soap holder embody-
ing my new design,
FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof,
FIG. 3 is a front elevational view thereof, as seen look-
ing in the direction of arrow 3—3 of FIG. 2,
FIG. 4 is a side elevational view as seen looking in the
direction of arrow 4—4 of FIG. 2,
FIG. 5 is a perspective view of a second embodiment of
the design of FIG. 1,
FIG. 6 is a top plan view of FIG. 5,
FIG. 7 is a front elevational view, as seen looking in the
direction of arrow 7—7 of FIG. 6,
FIG. 8 is a side elevational view, as seen looking in the
direction of arrow 8—8 of FIG. 6.
The bottom of both embodiments is flat and unorna-
mented.



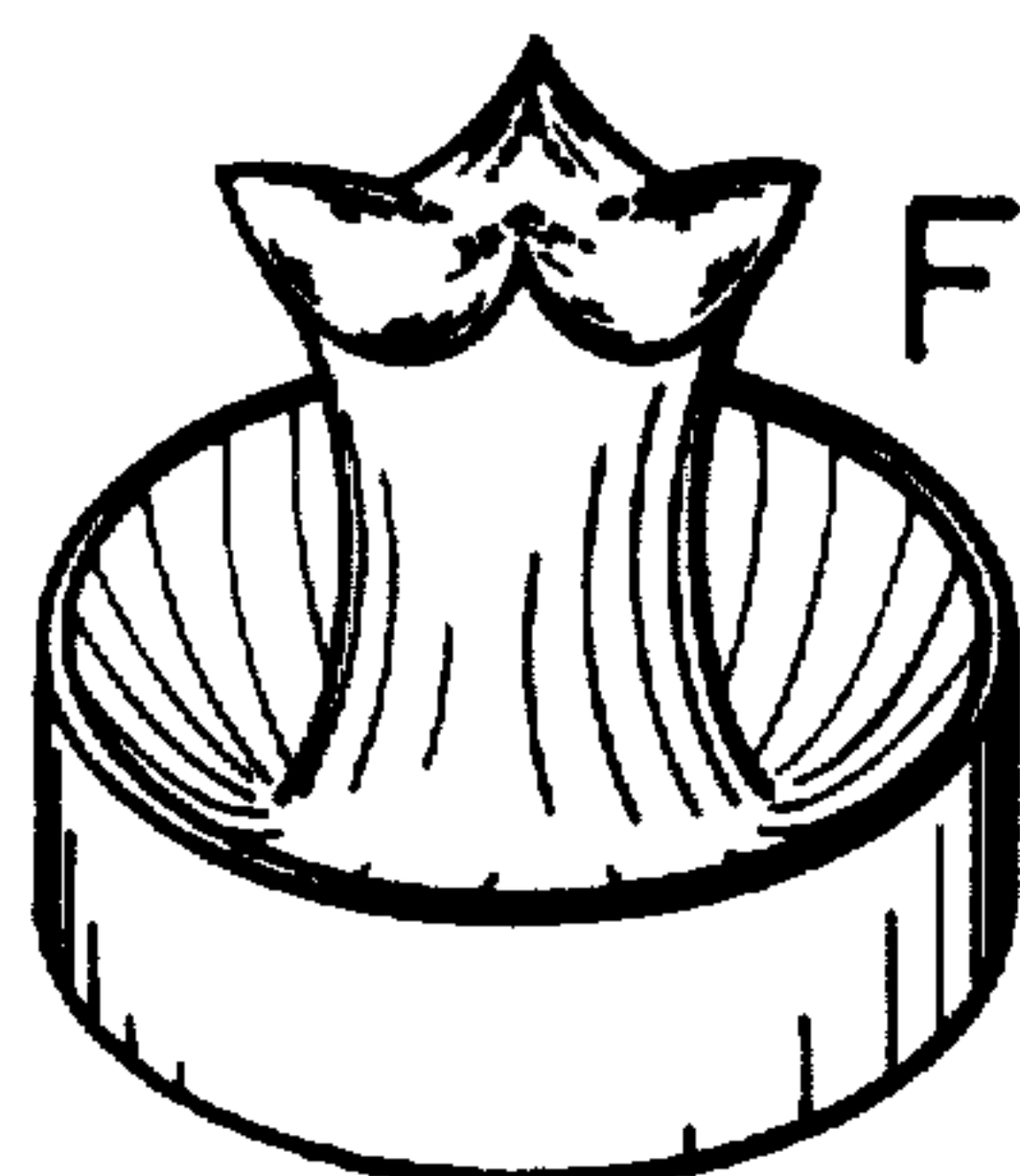

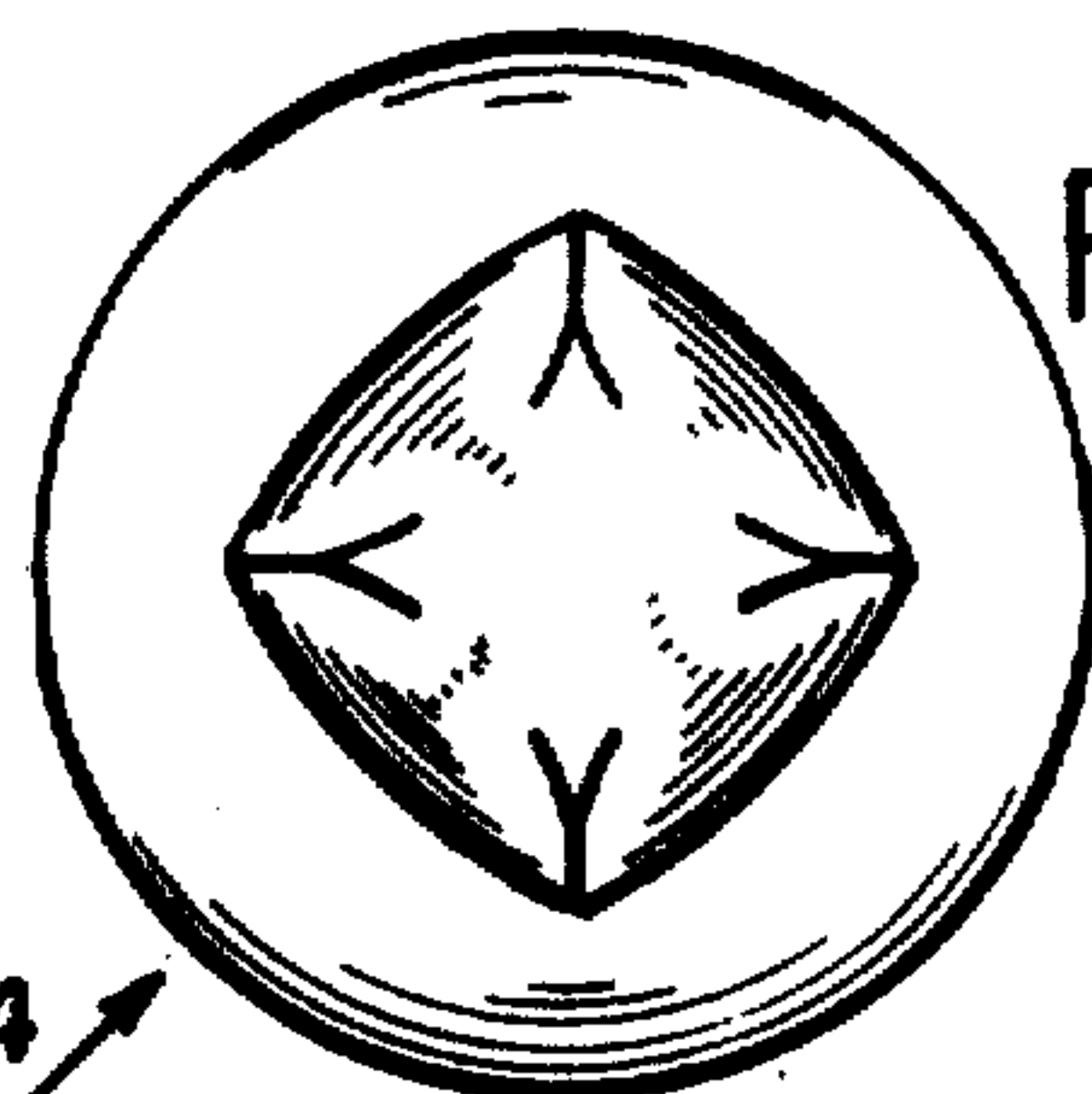

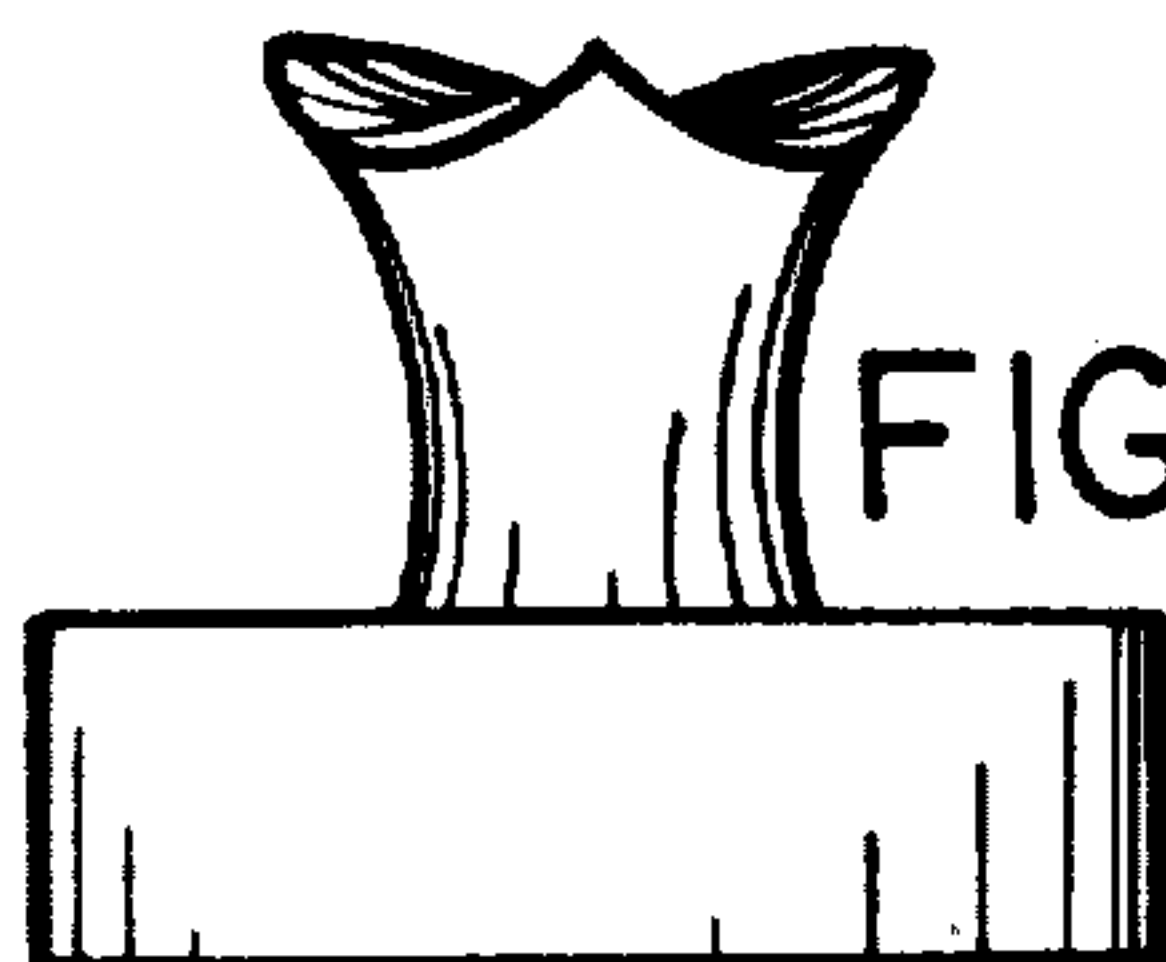

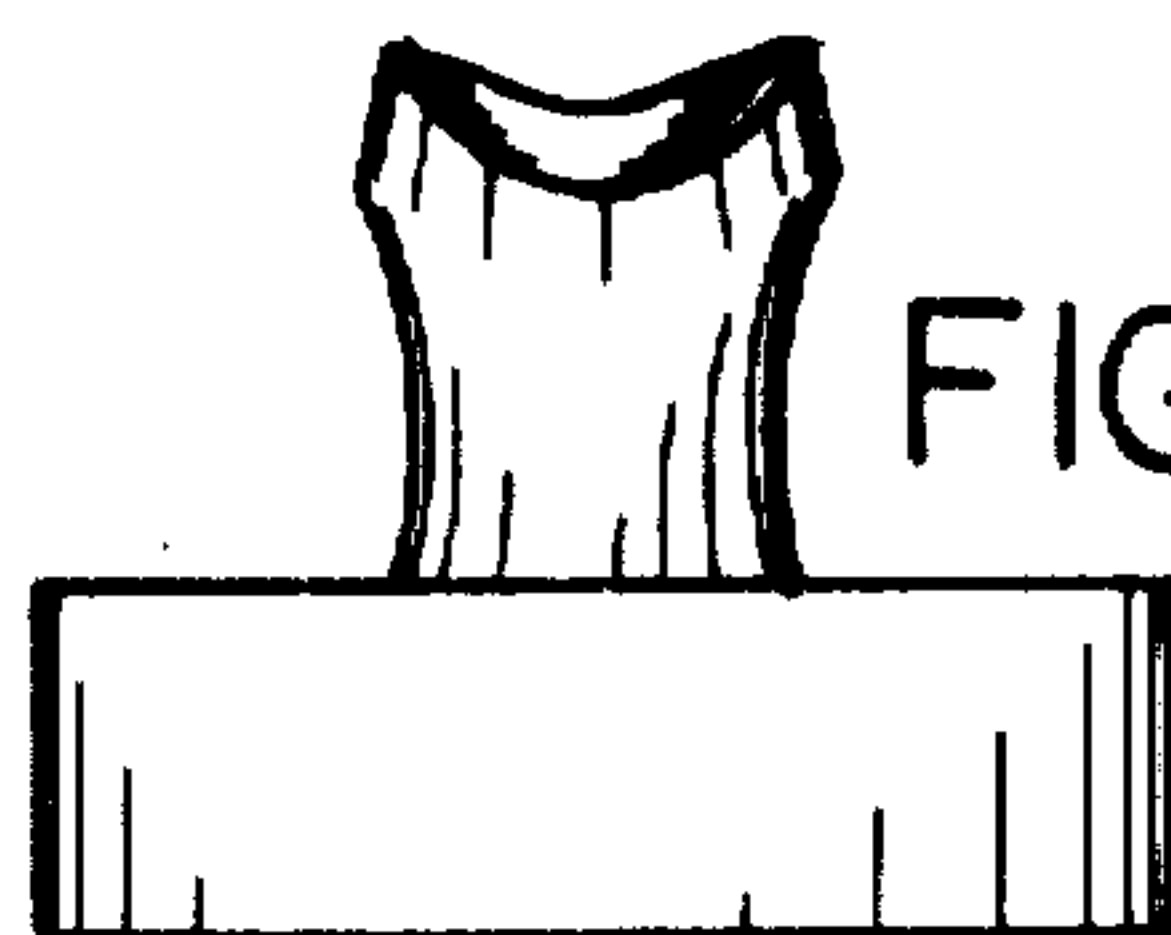

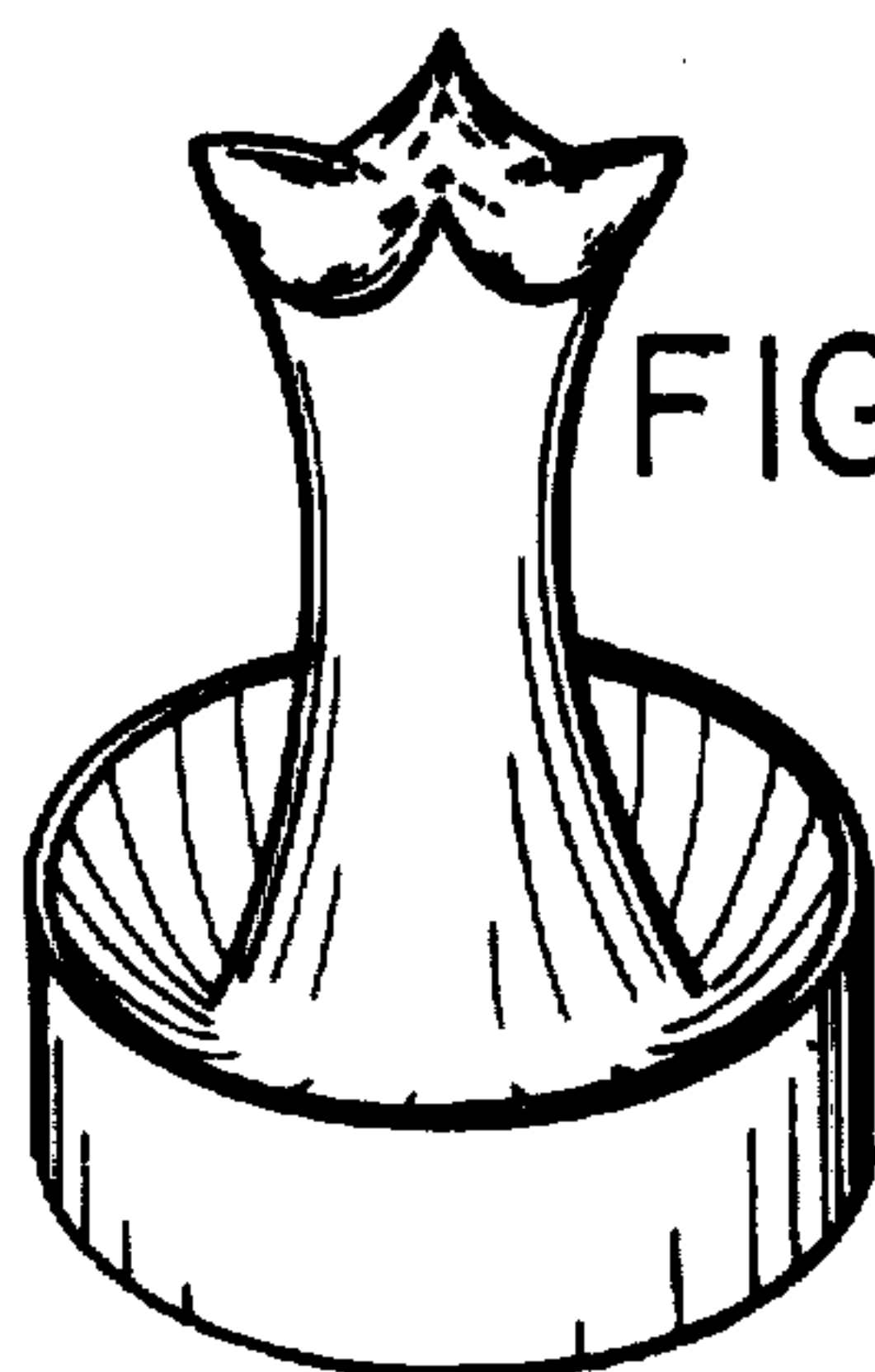

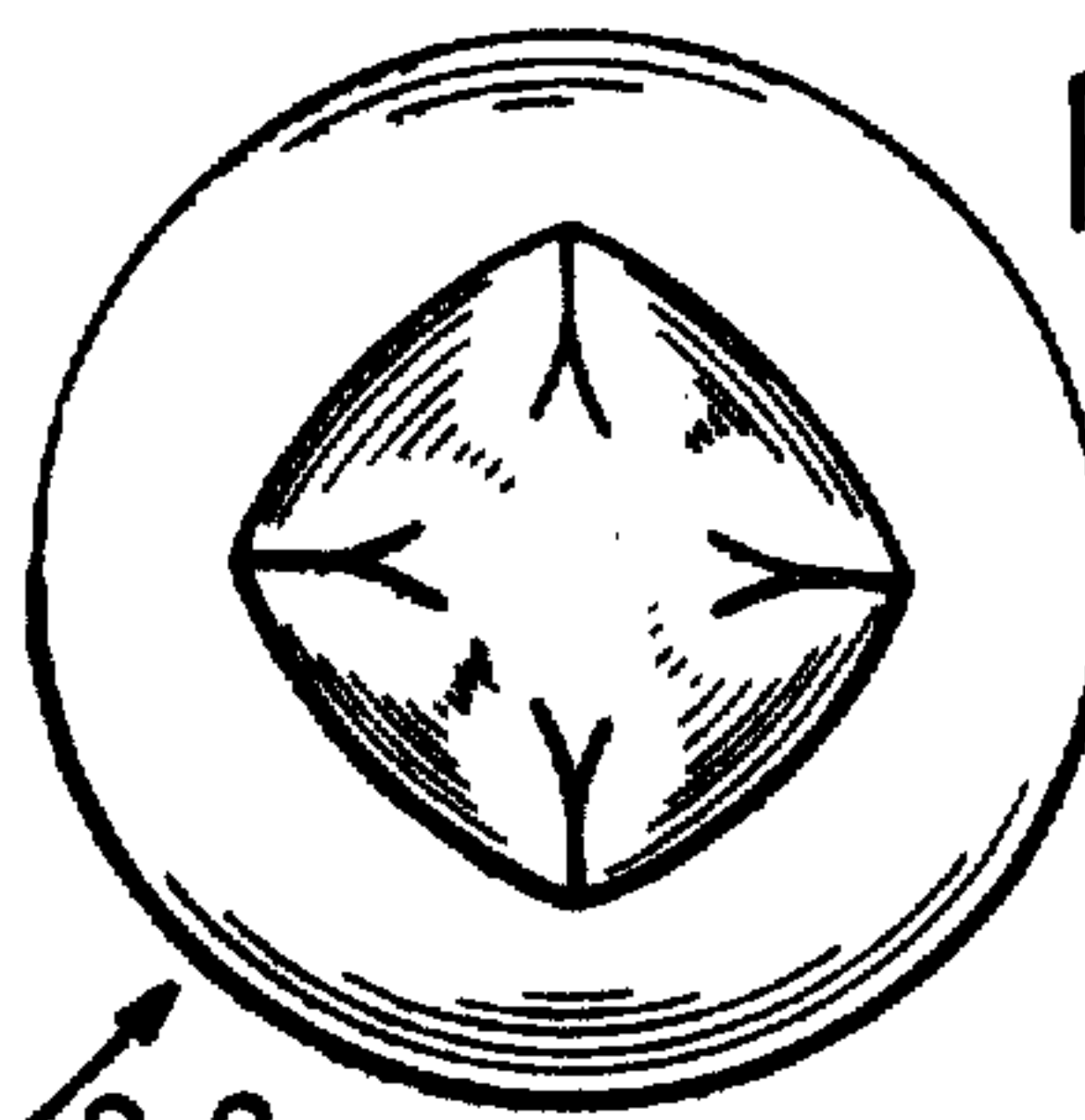

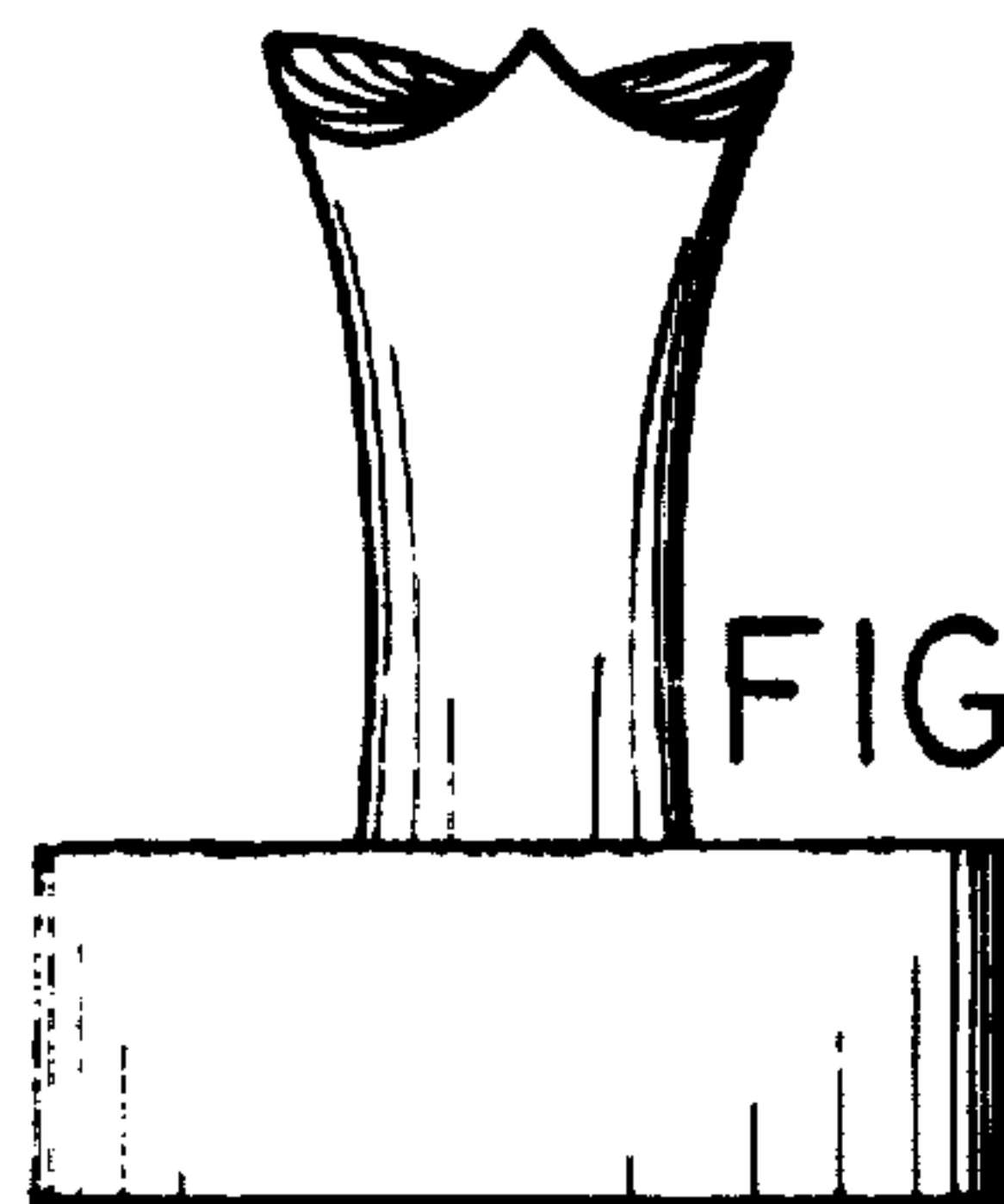

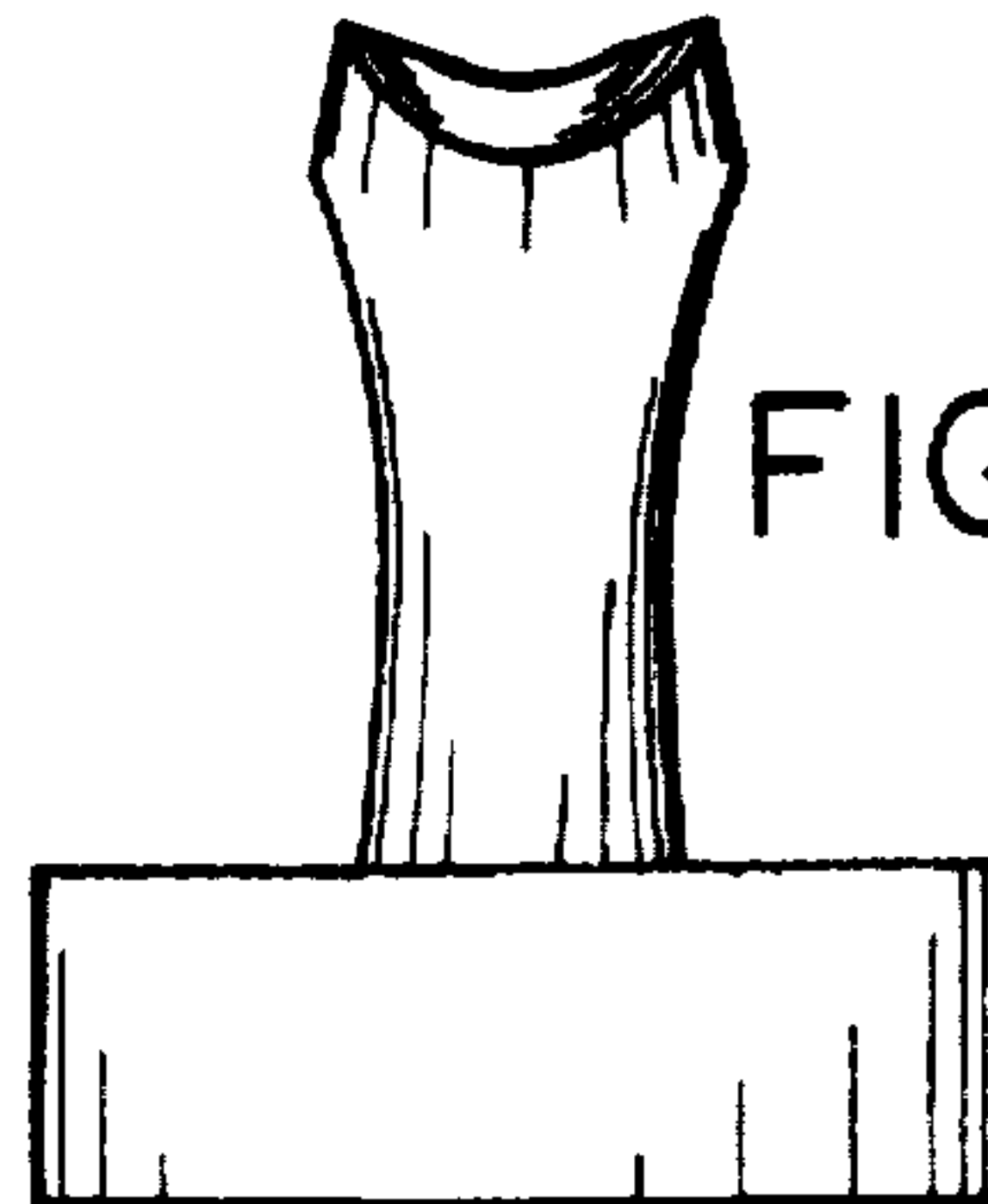
