The broken line showing in FIG. 1 is for illustrative purposes only and forms no part of the claimed design, and the recessed cooking area is of conventional depth.

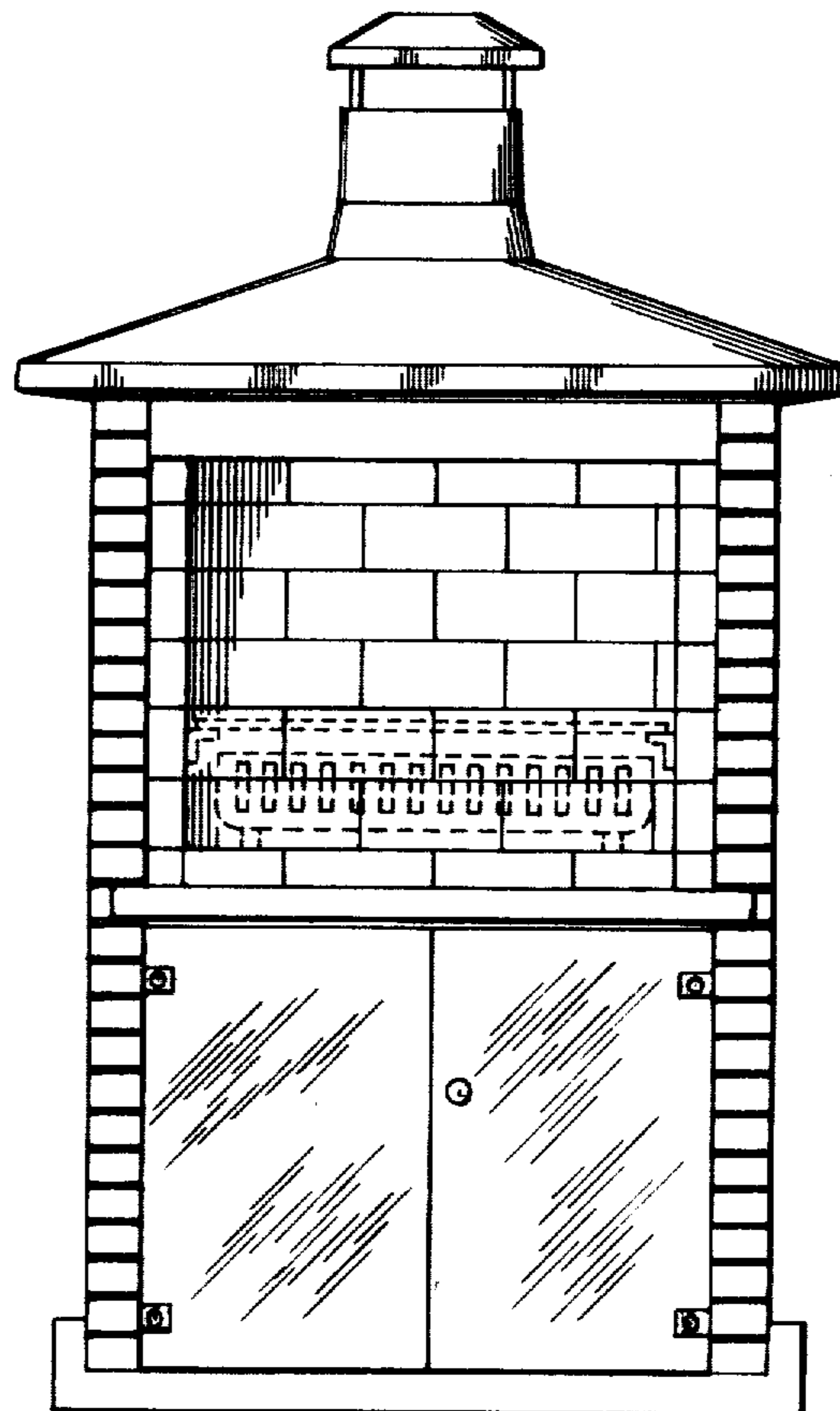

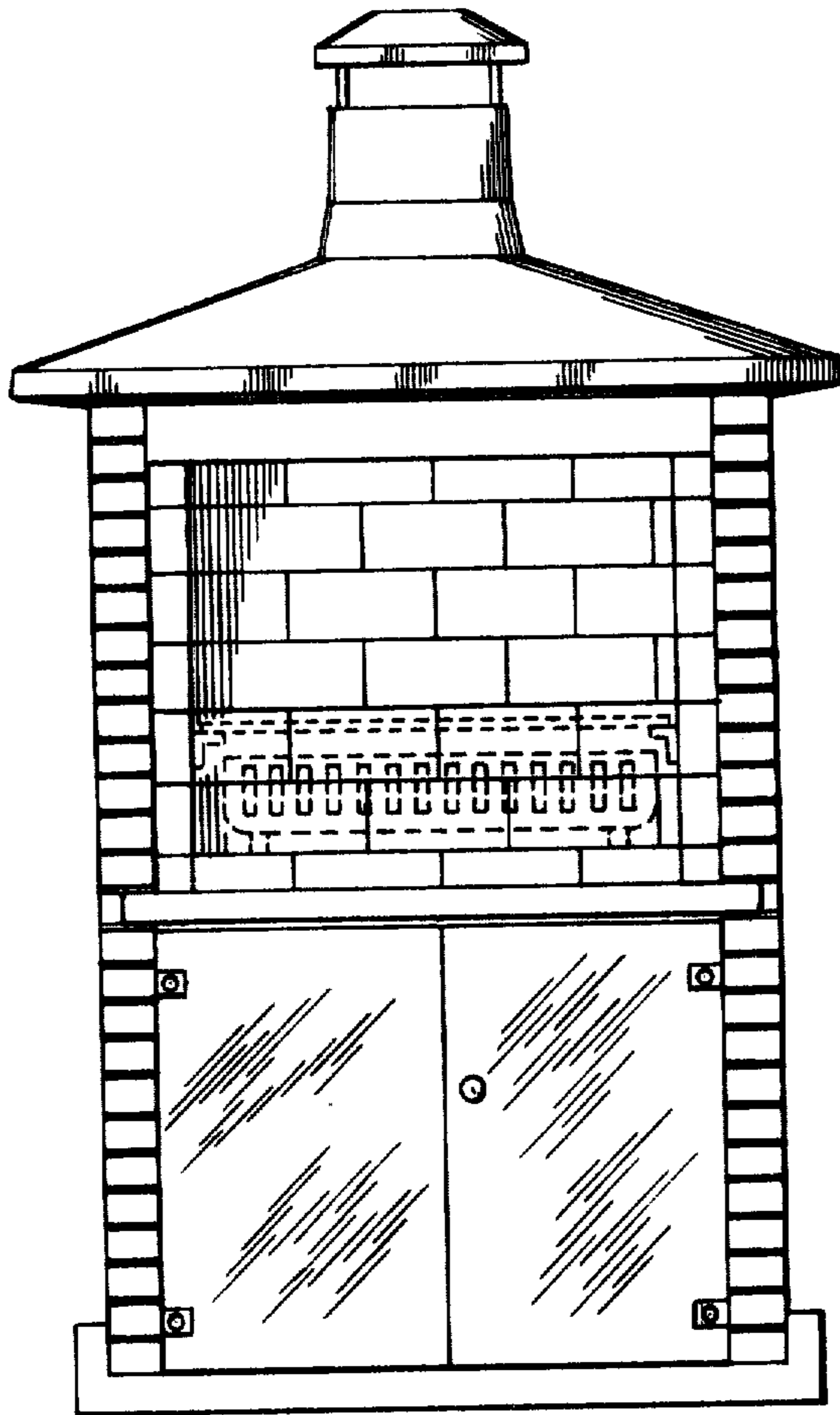

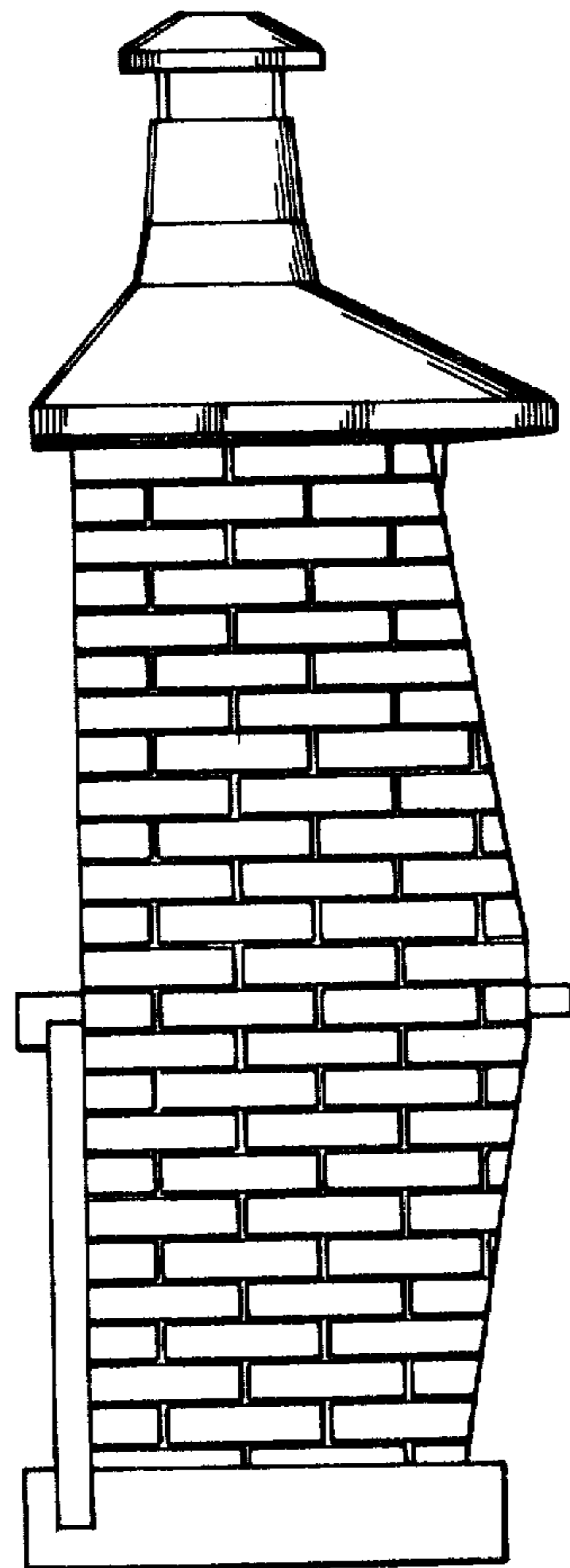

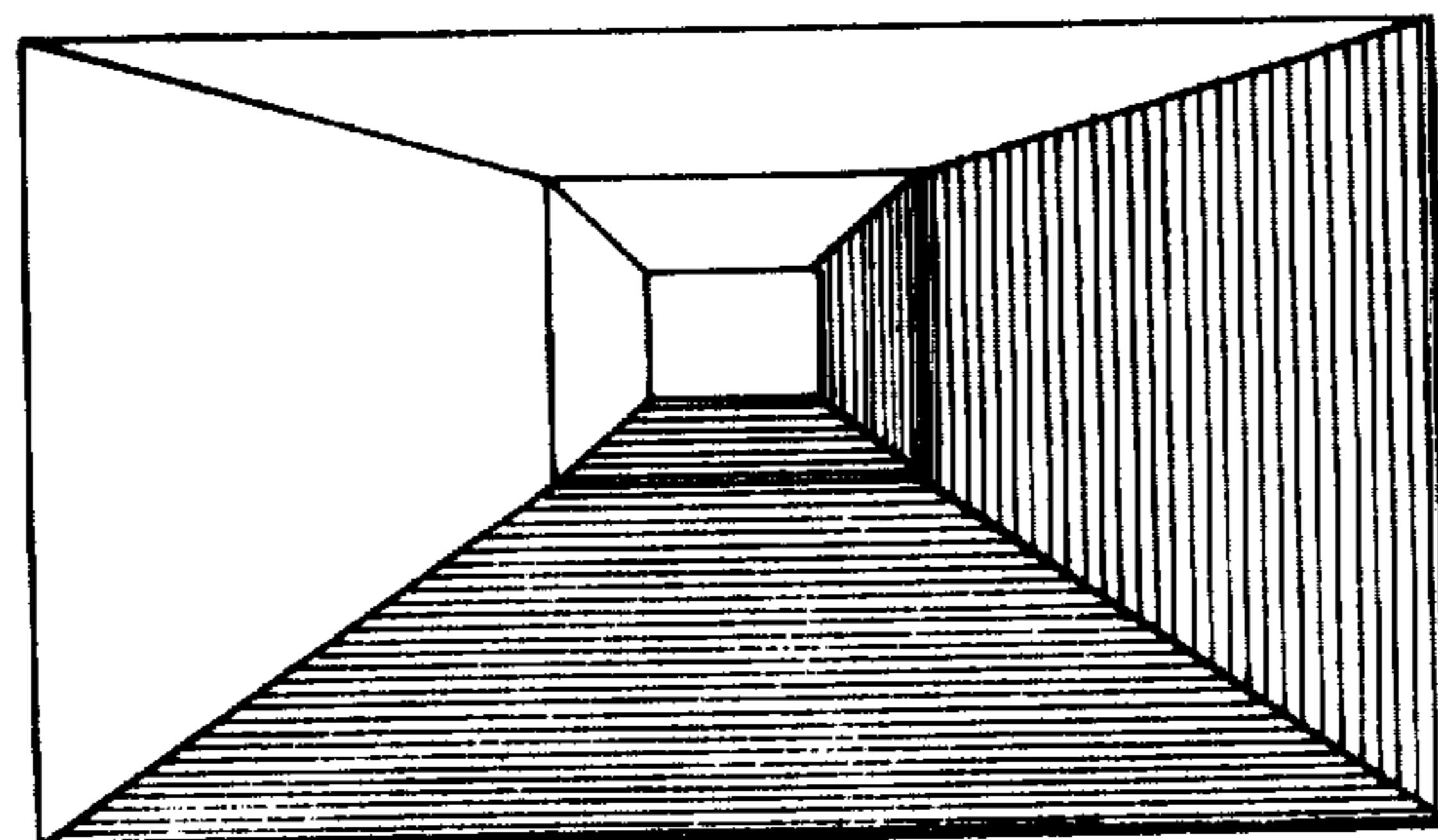
