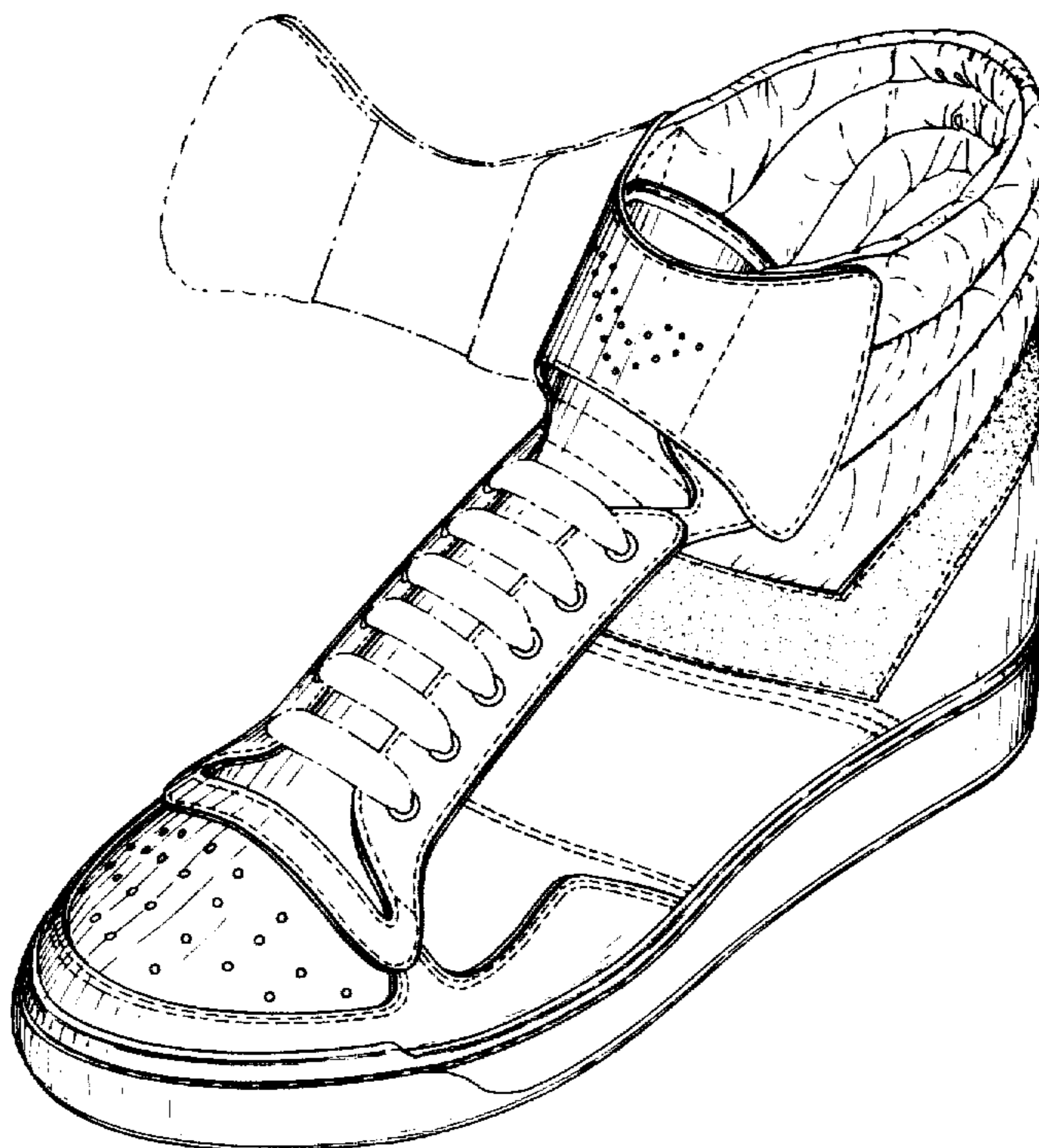
FIG. 1 is a top and right front perspective view of a high cut athletic shoe showing my new design, the bottom being plain and unornamented;

The broken-line showings of shoelaces are environmental only and form no part of the claimed design.



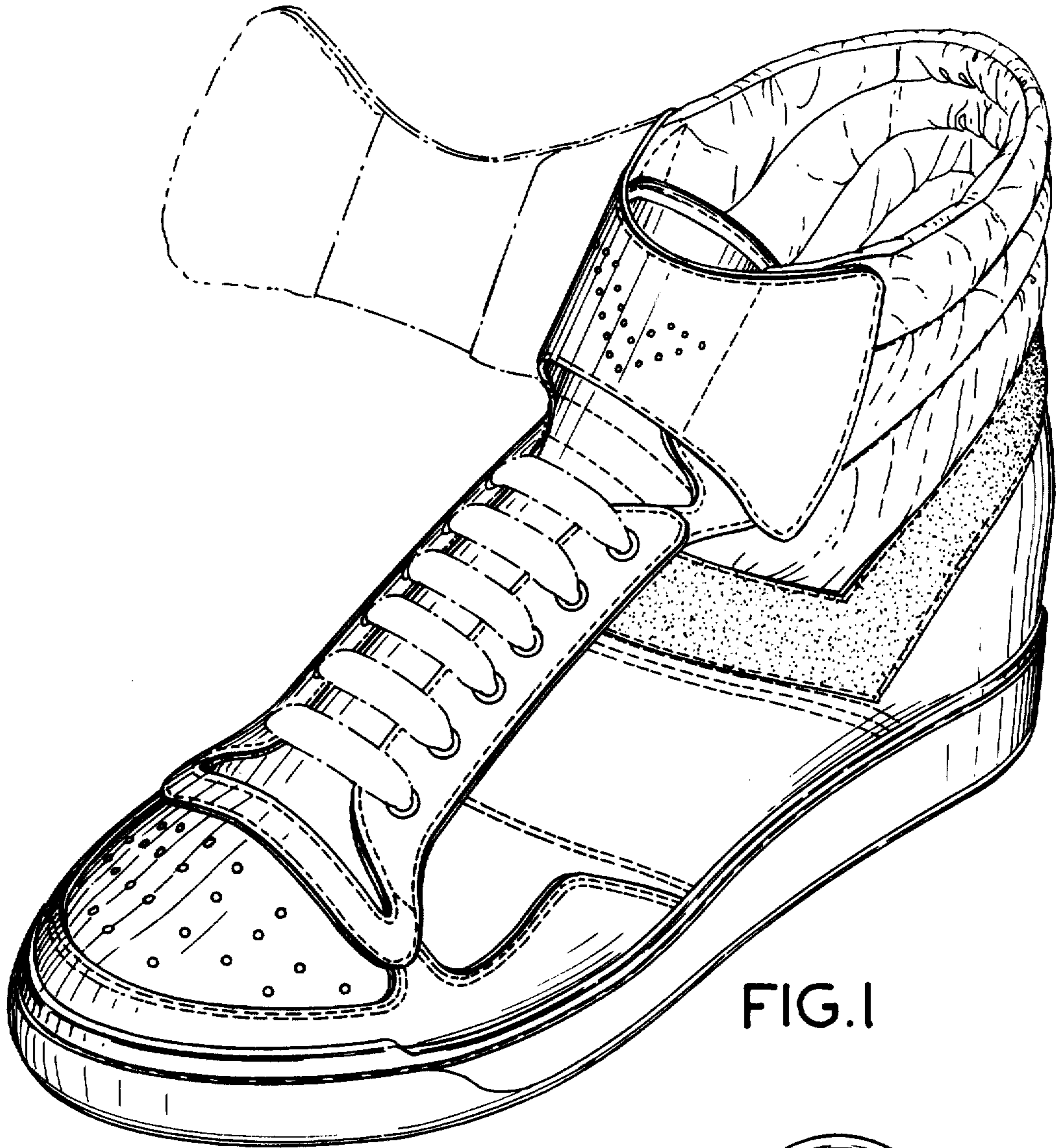

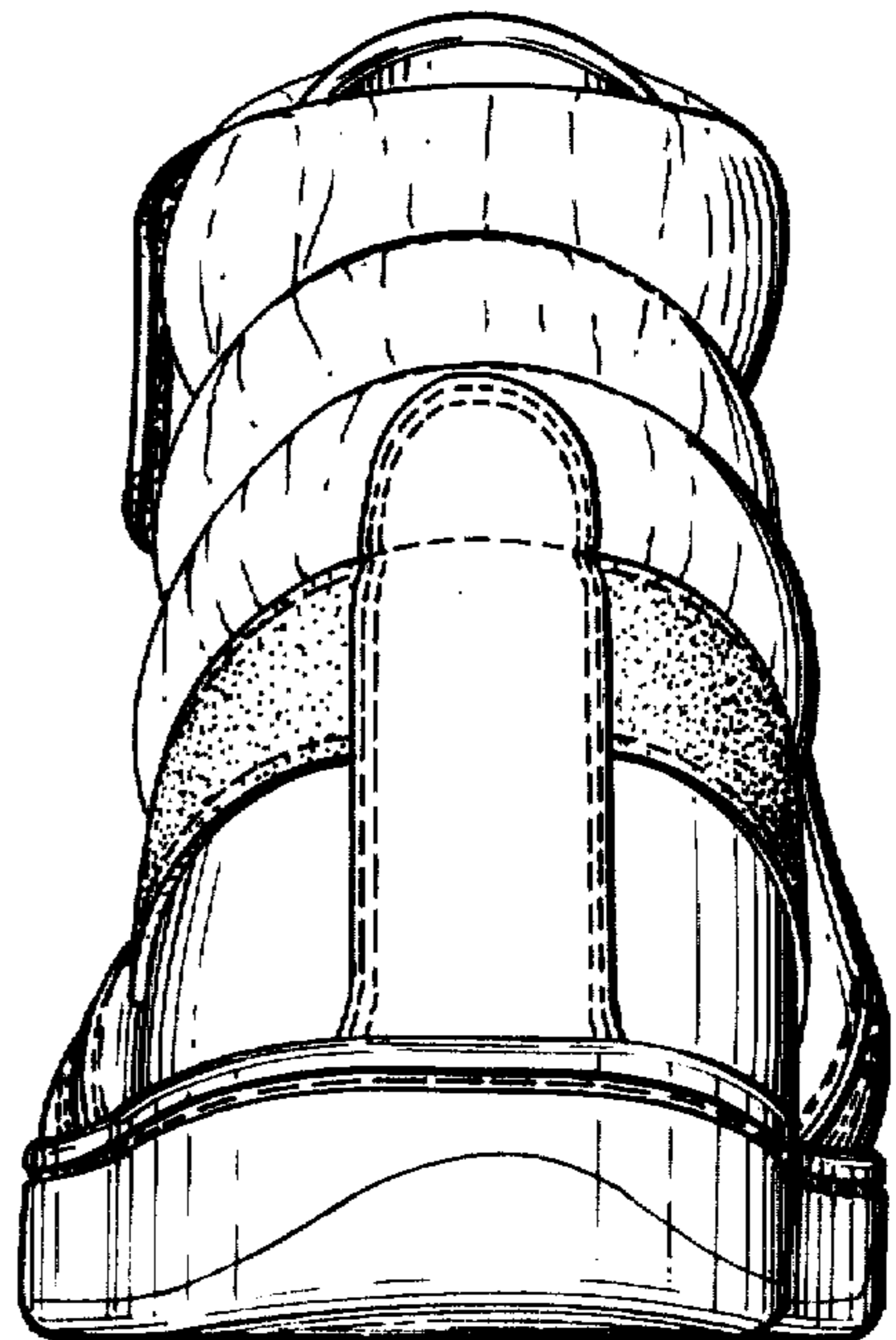

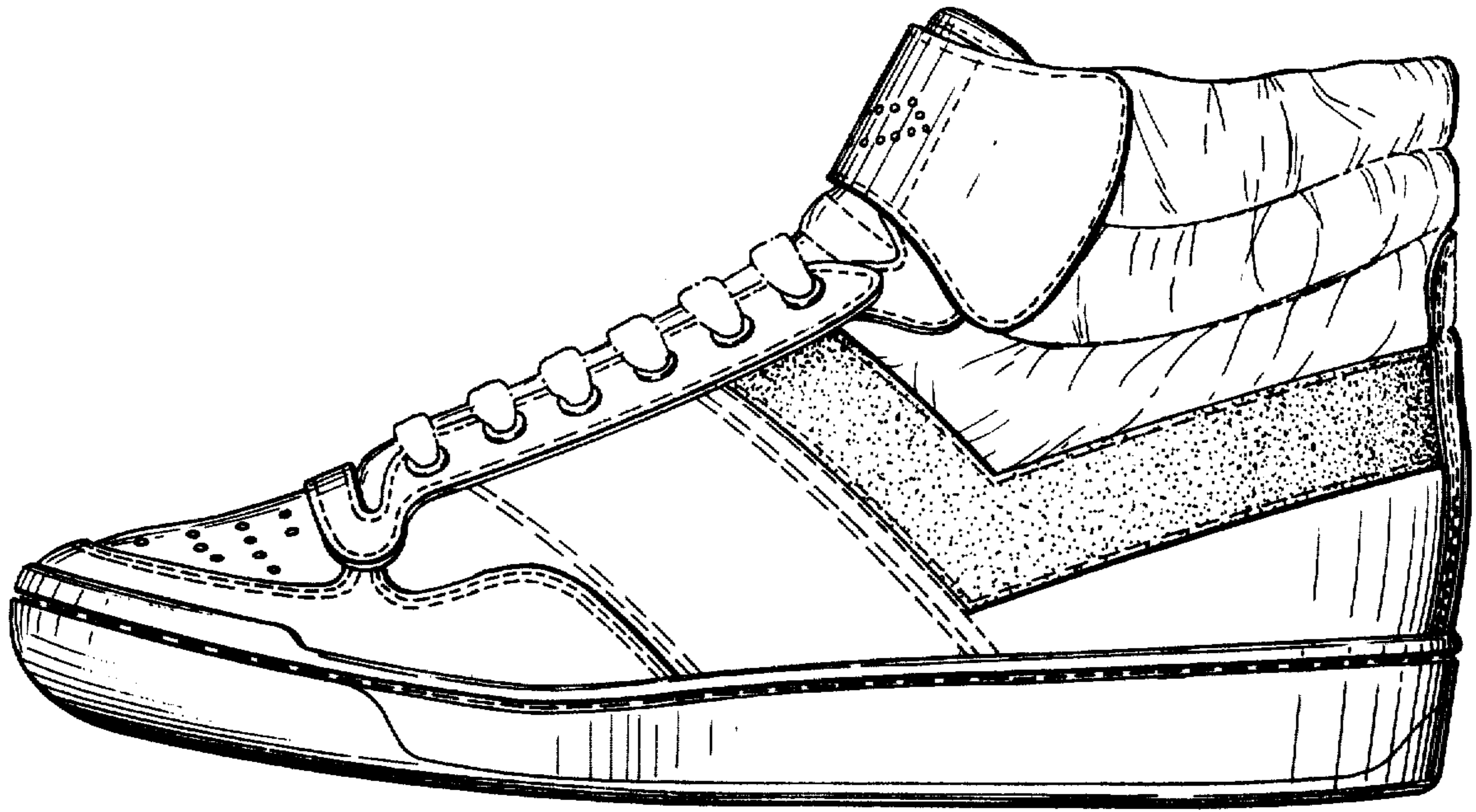

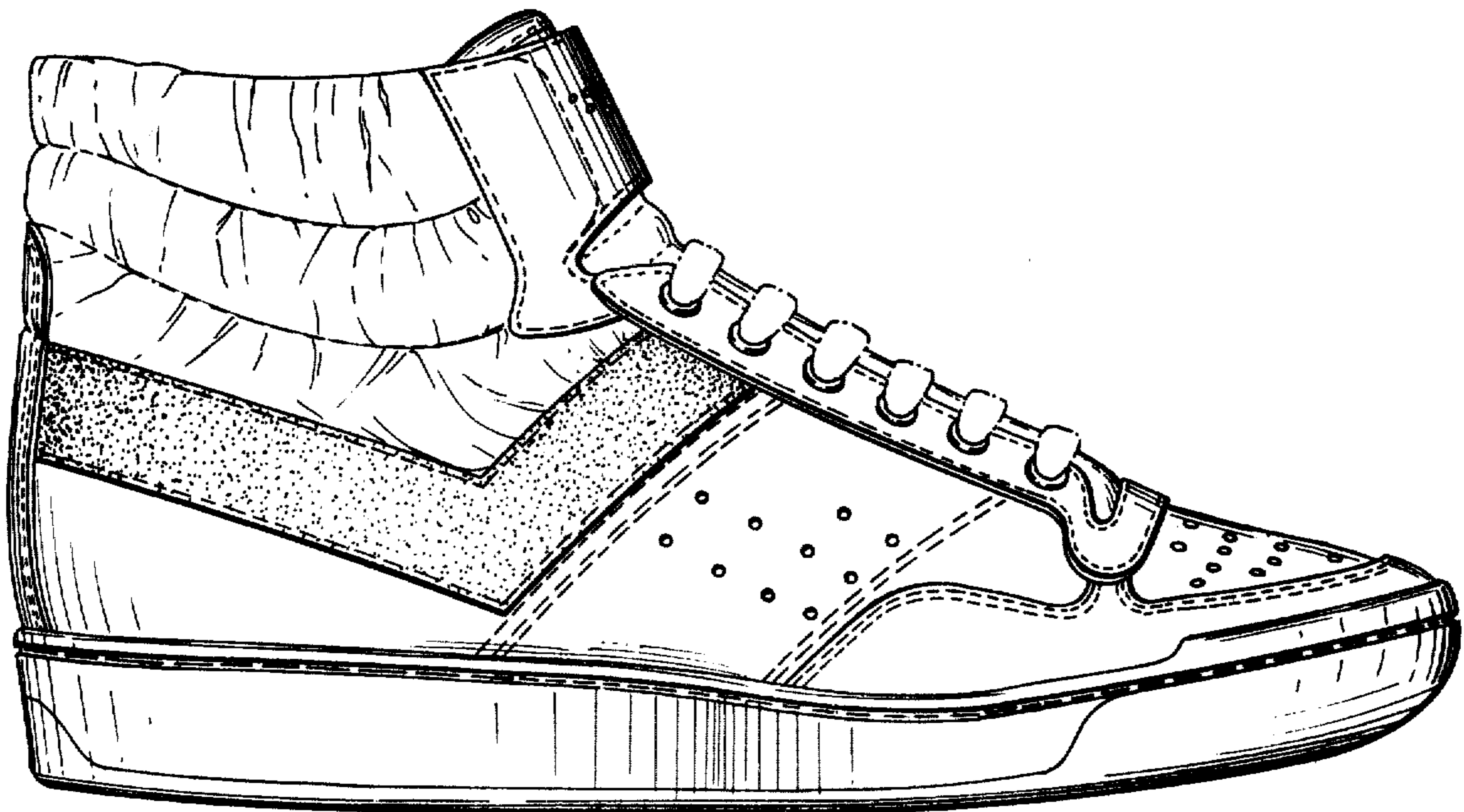
