[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a liquid transfer device for medicaments and the like, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of the liquid transfer device for medicaments and the like showing our new design.

FIG. 2 is a side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a bottom plan view thereof;

FIG. 4 is an end elevational view as seen from the right of FIG. 2; and

FIG. 5 is another end elevational view as seen from the left of FIG. 2.
