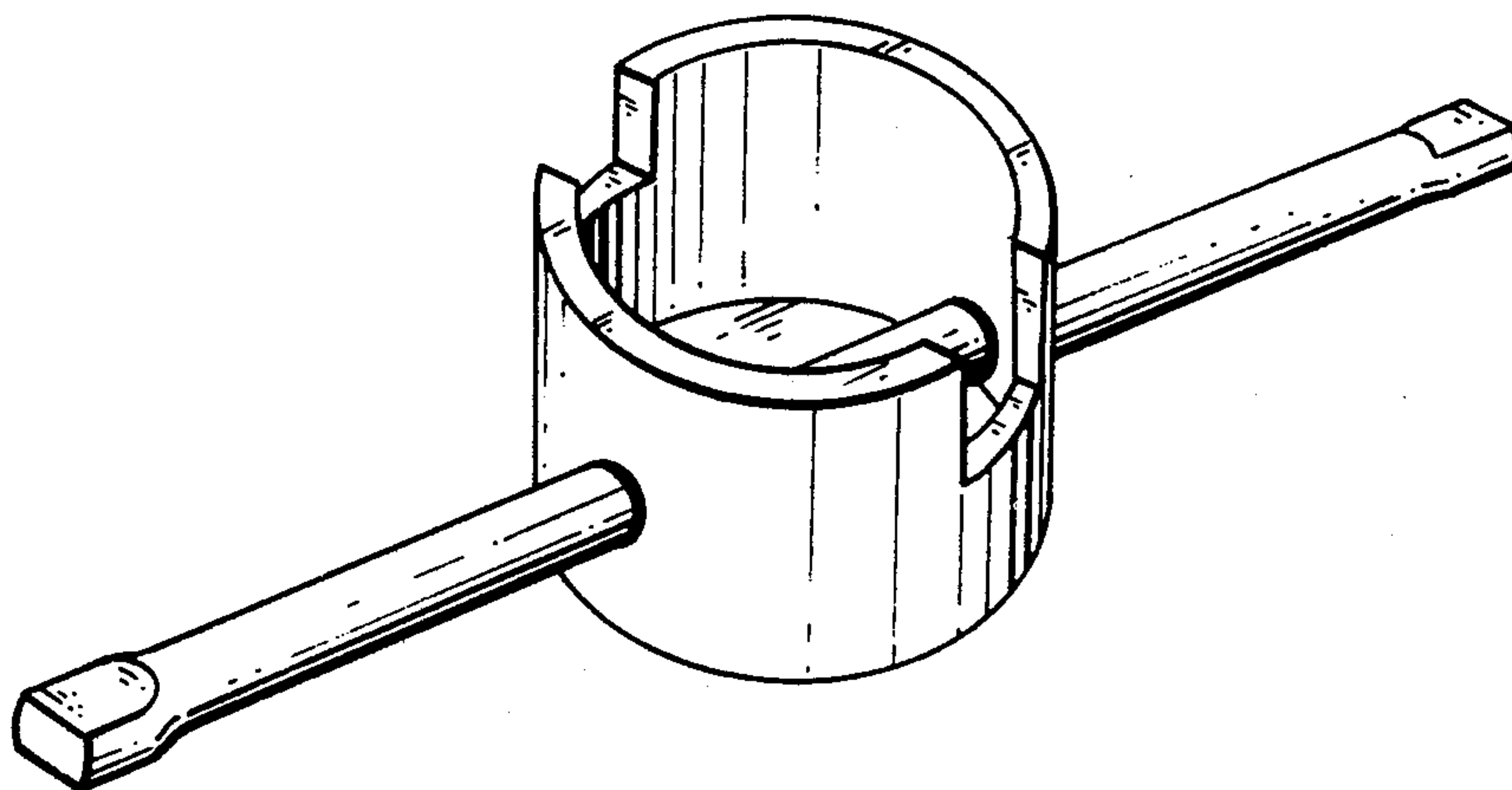

FIG. 4 is a side elevational view thereof.



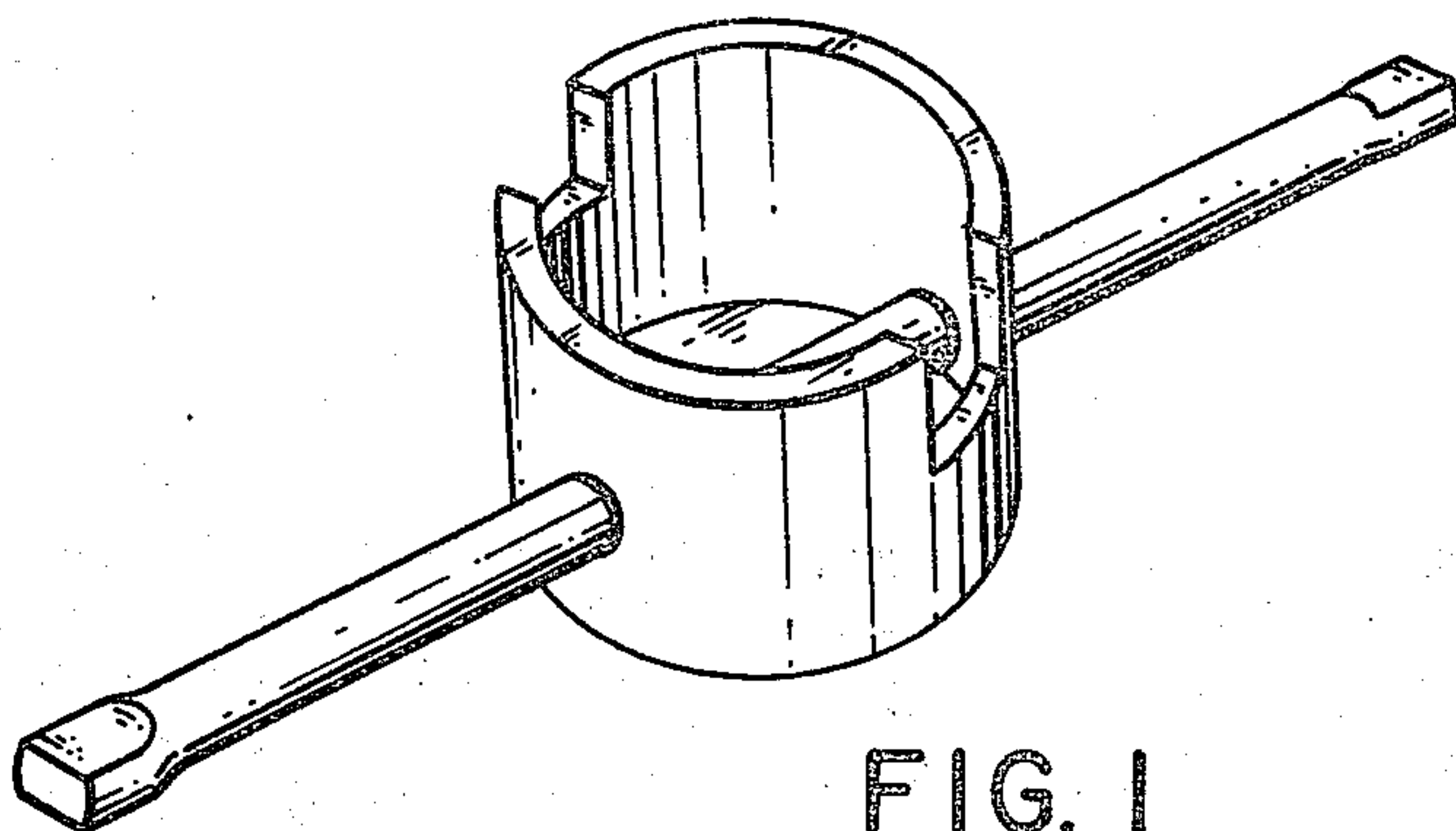

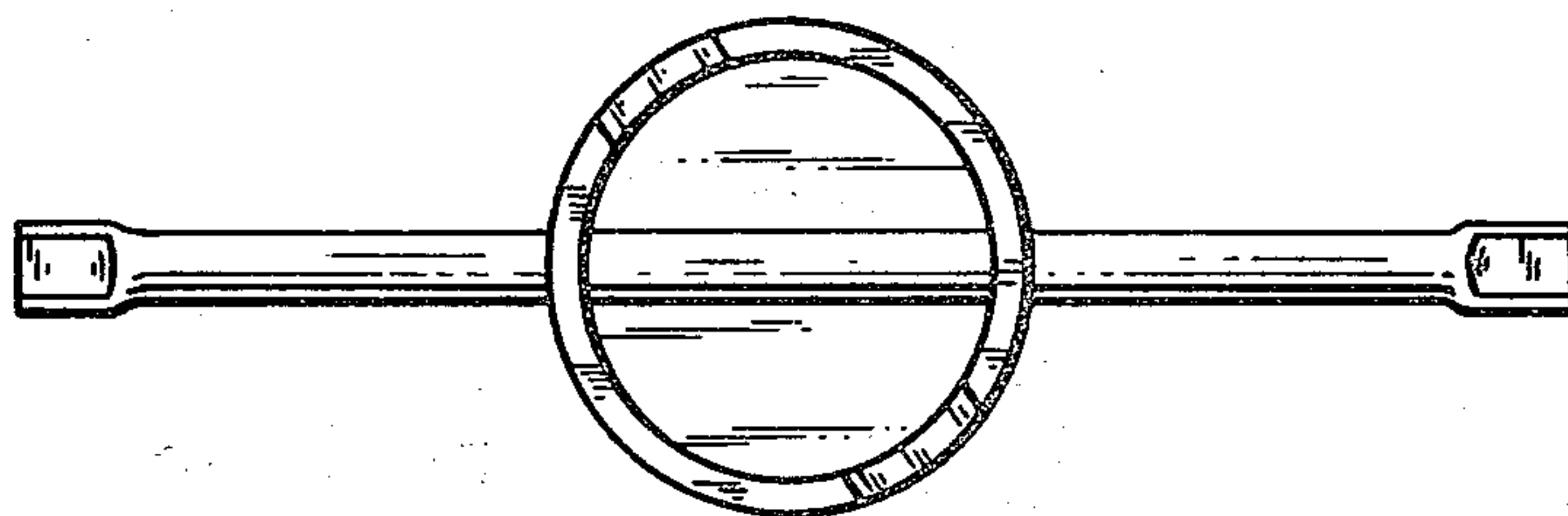

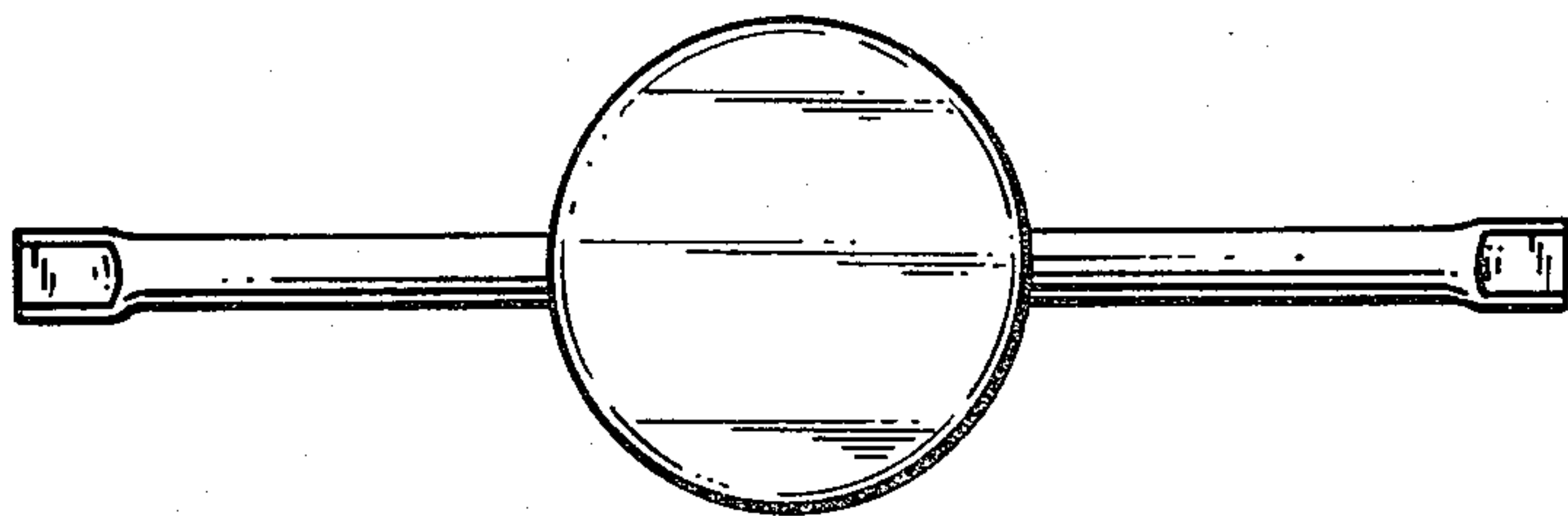

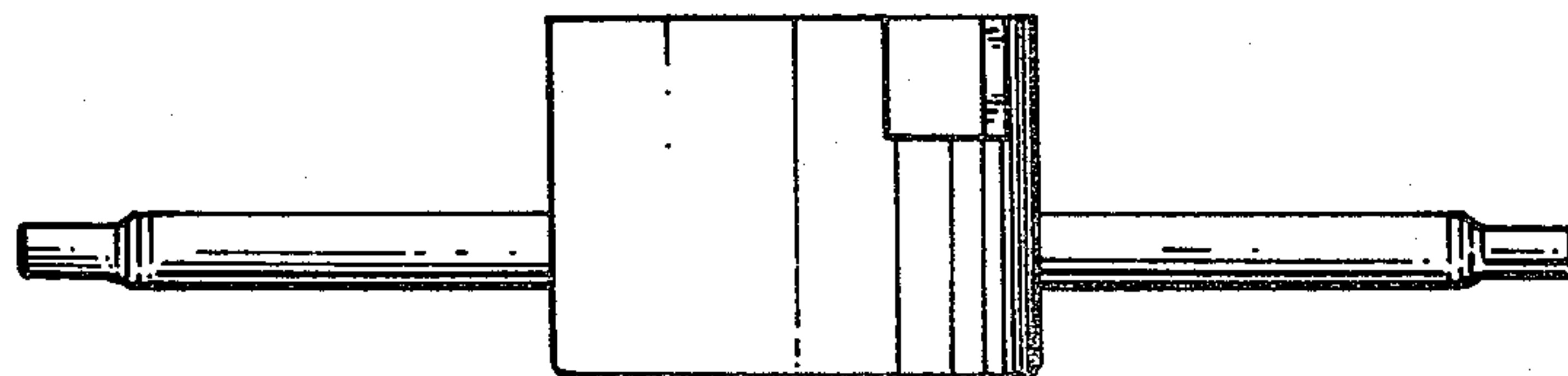
