[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a bag attachable to bicycles or the like, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of my bag attachable to bicycles or the like showing my new design, with the tubular parts of the bicycle frame being shown in broken lines for illustrative purposes only;
FIG. 2 is a front elevational view thereof;
FIG. 3 is a right side elevational view thereof;
FIG. 4 is a rear elevational view thereof;
FIG. 5 is a left side elevational view thereof; and
FIG. 6 is a bottom plan view thereof.

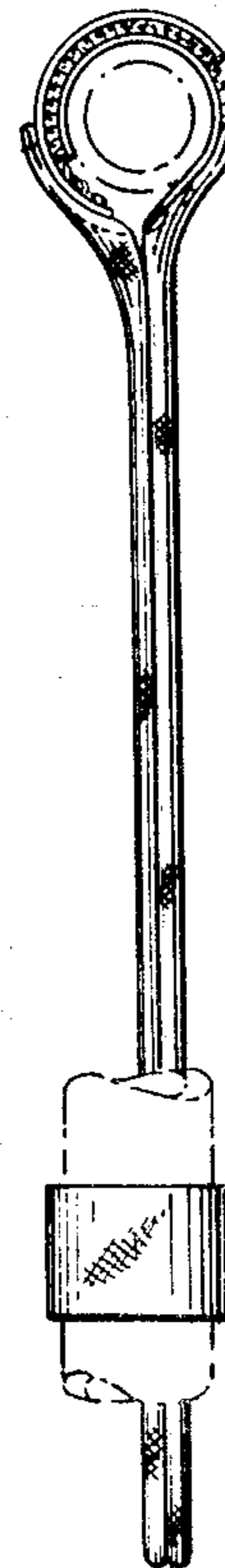
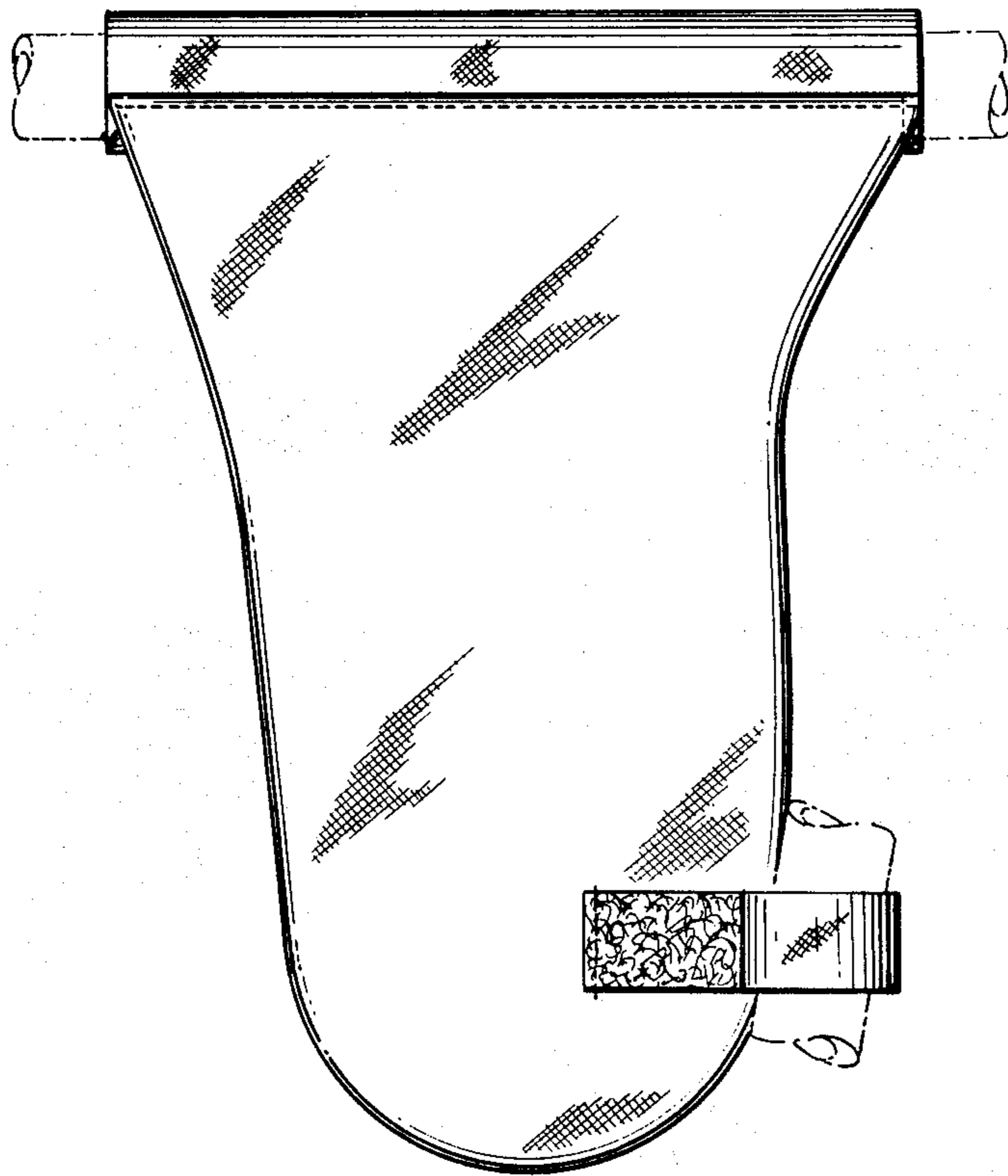

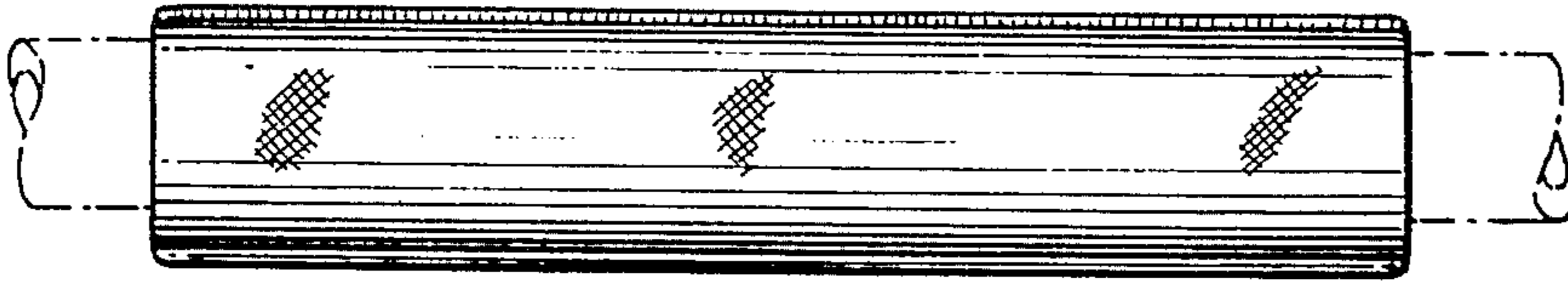

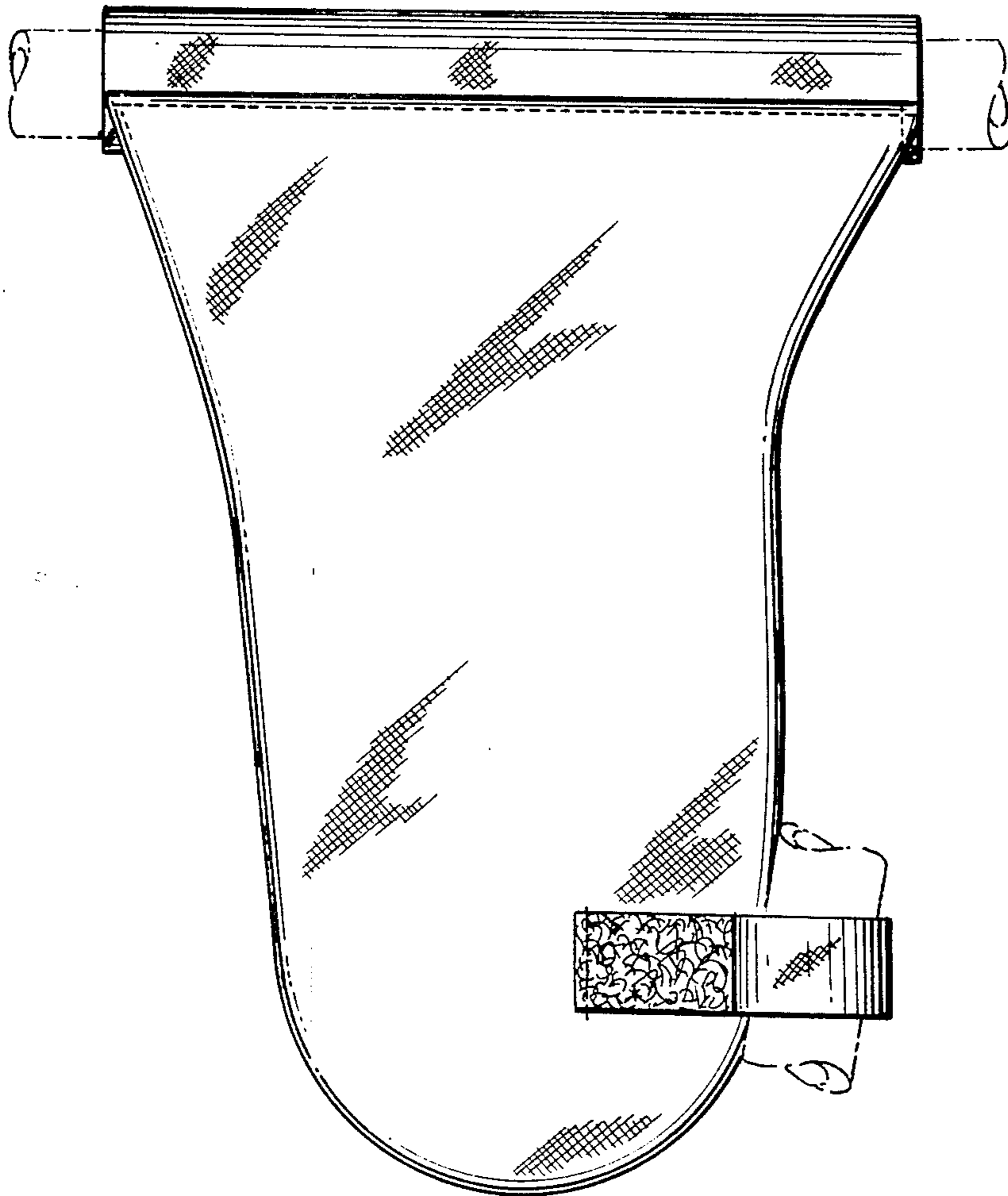

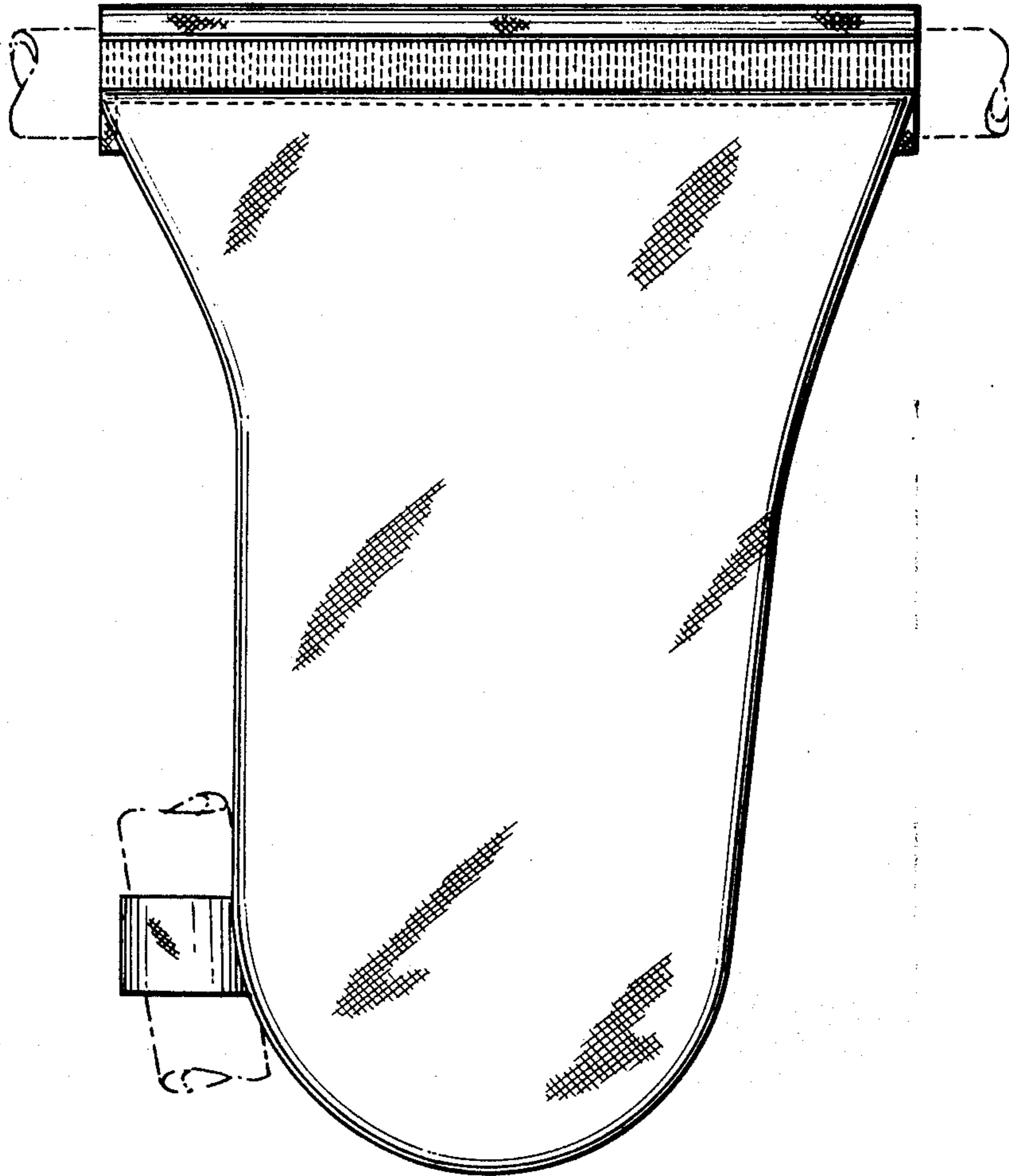

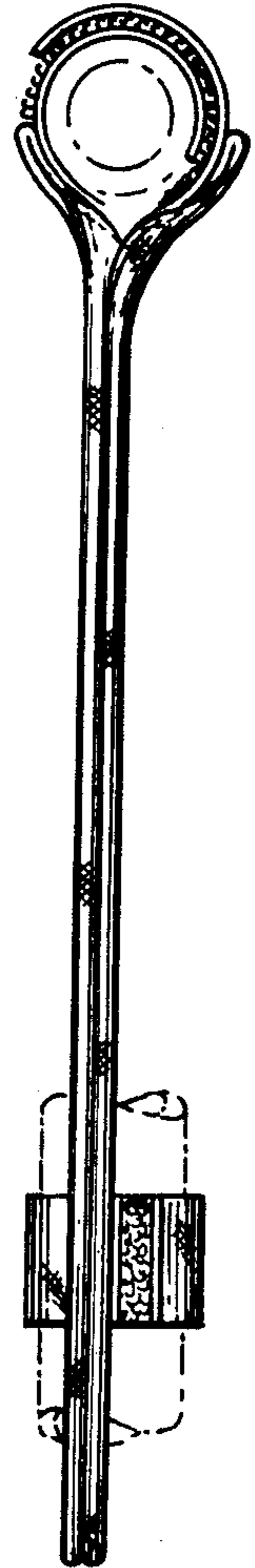
