

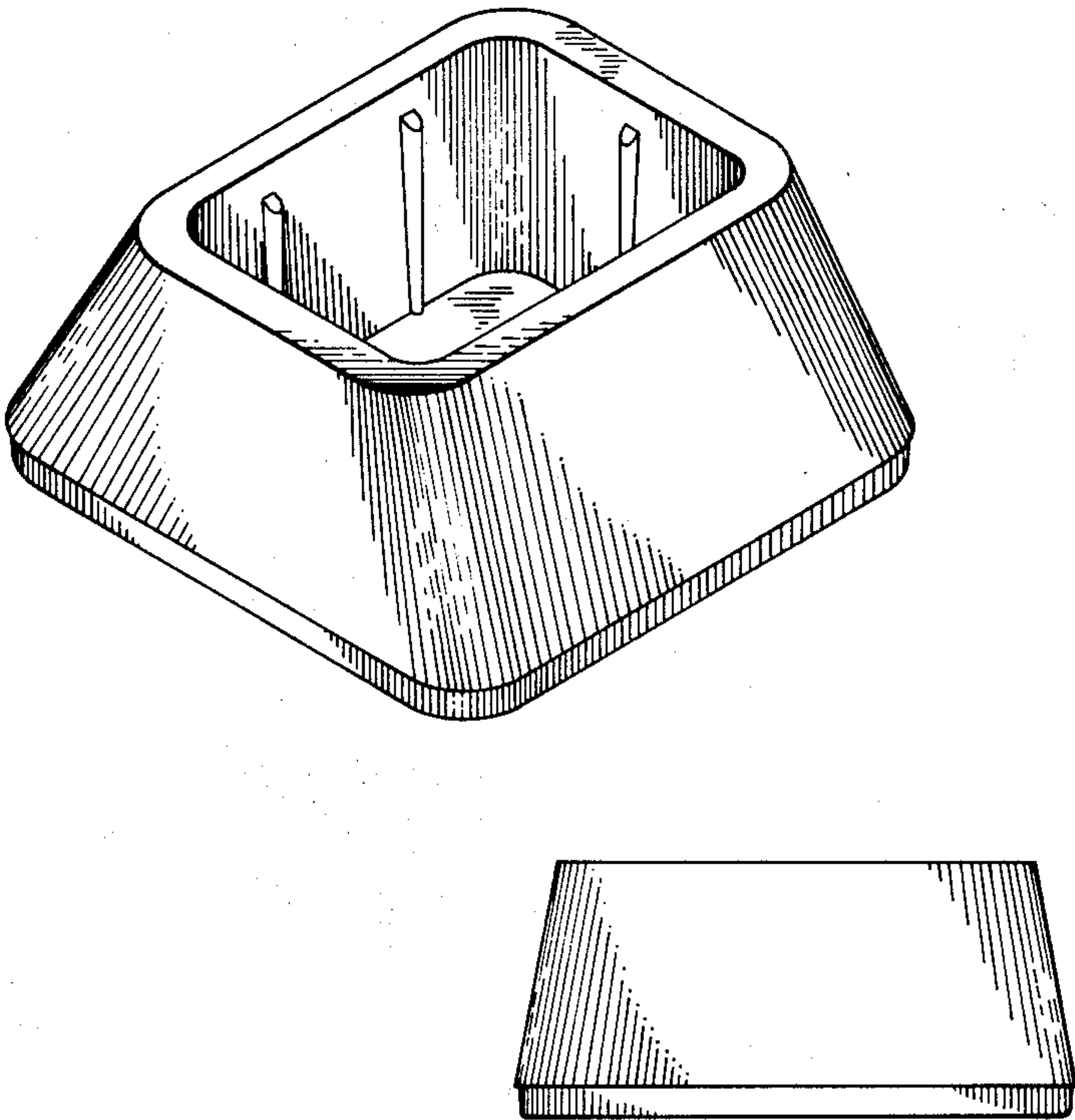

FIG. 3 is a bottom plan view thereof.



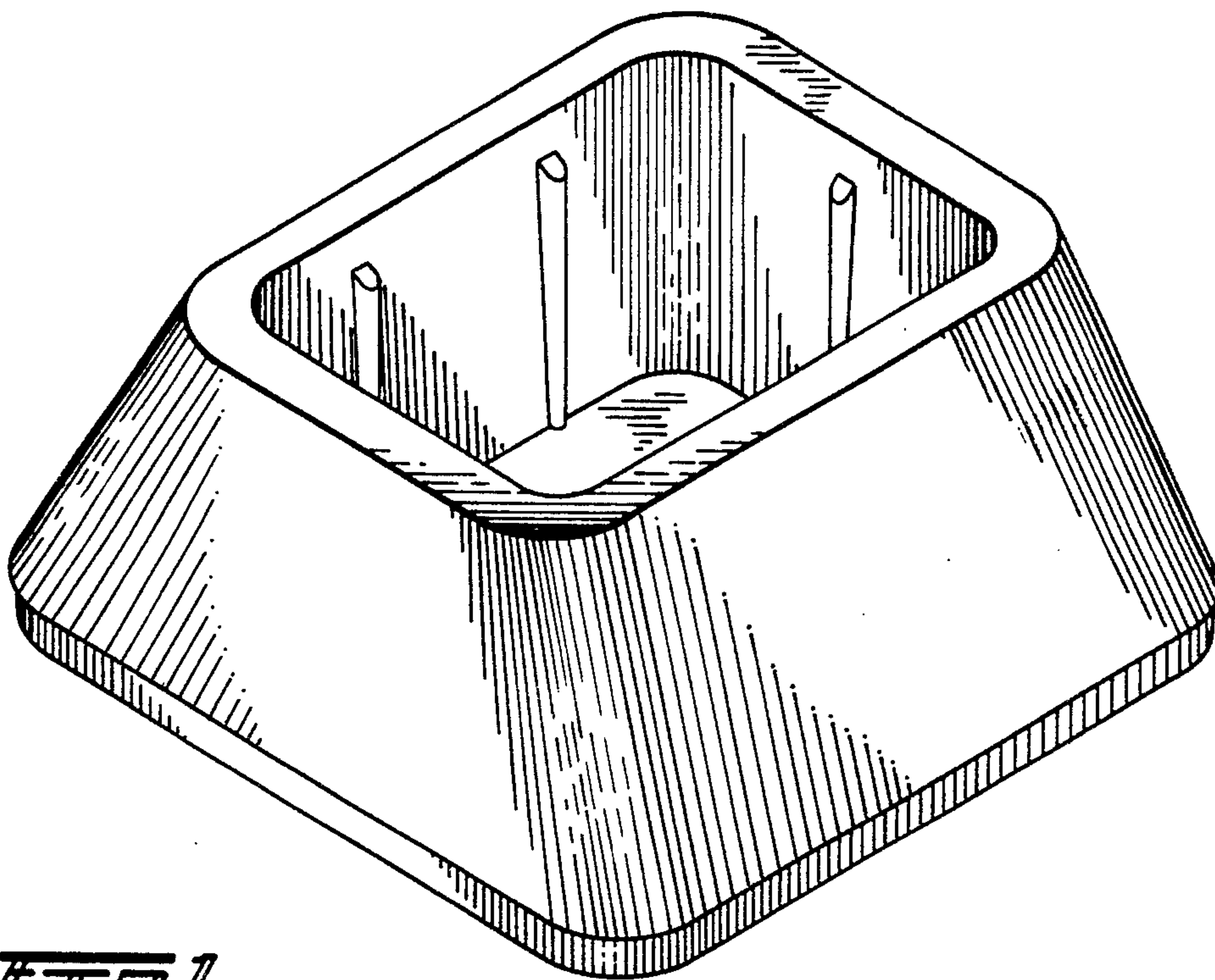

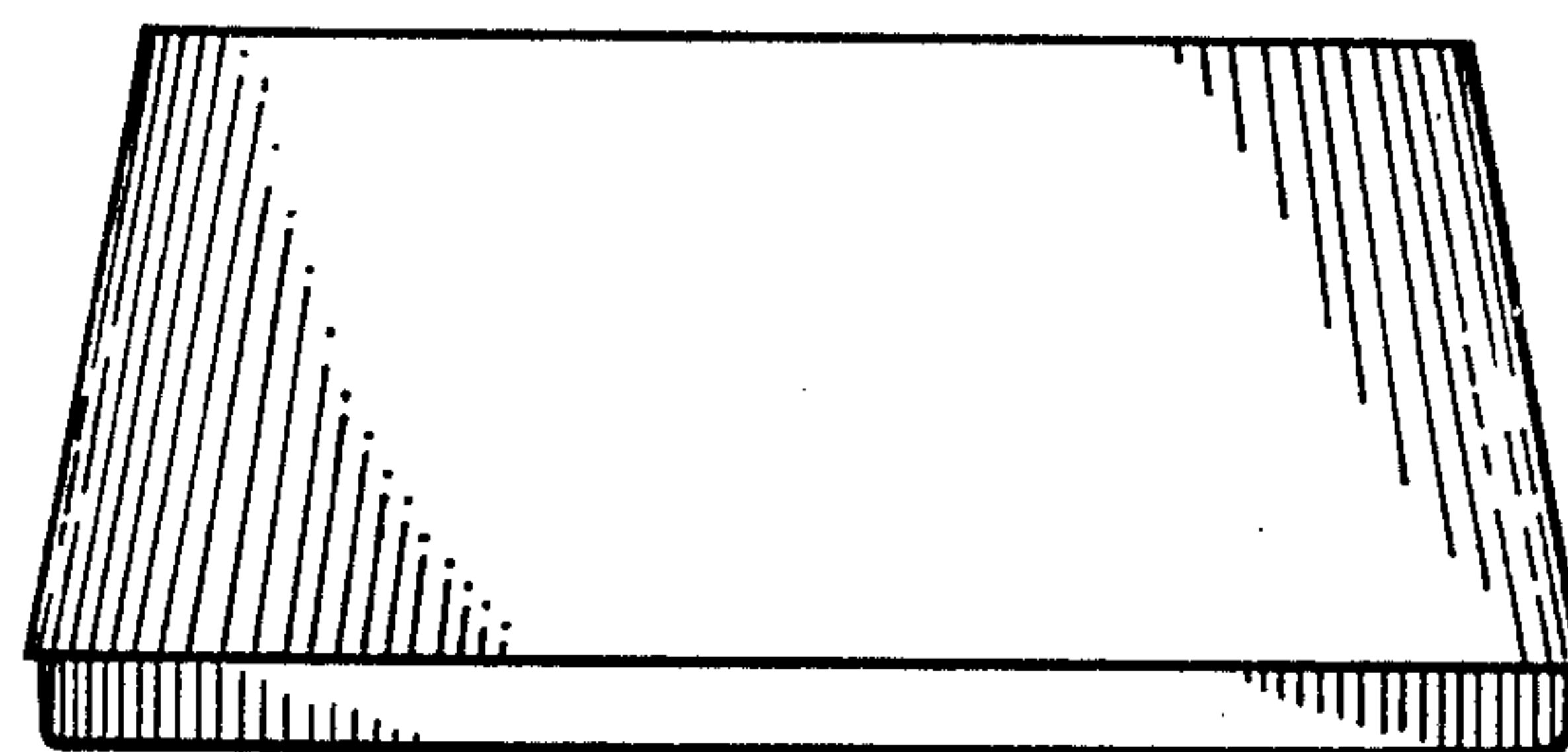

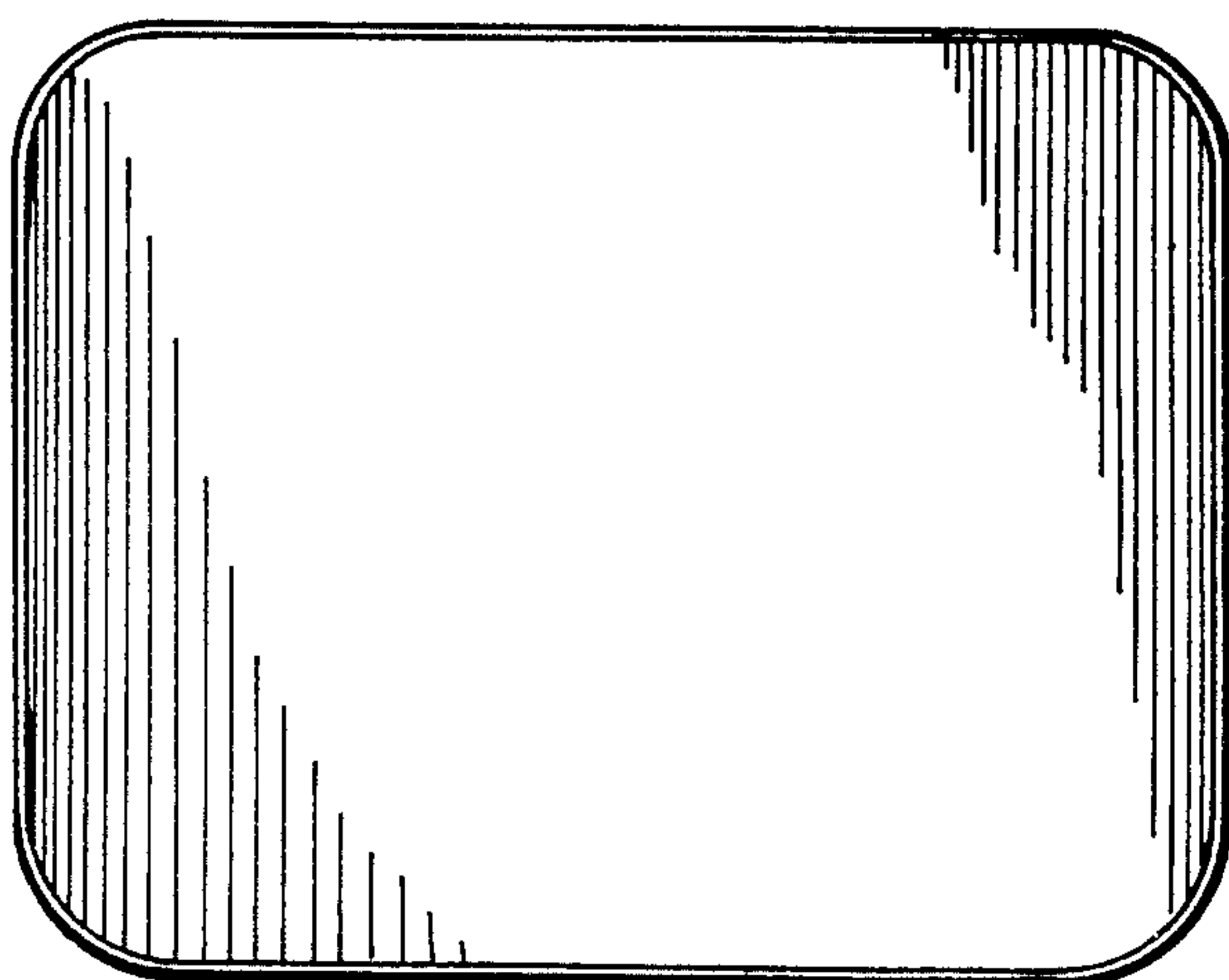
