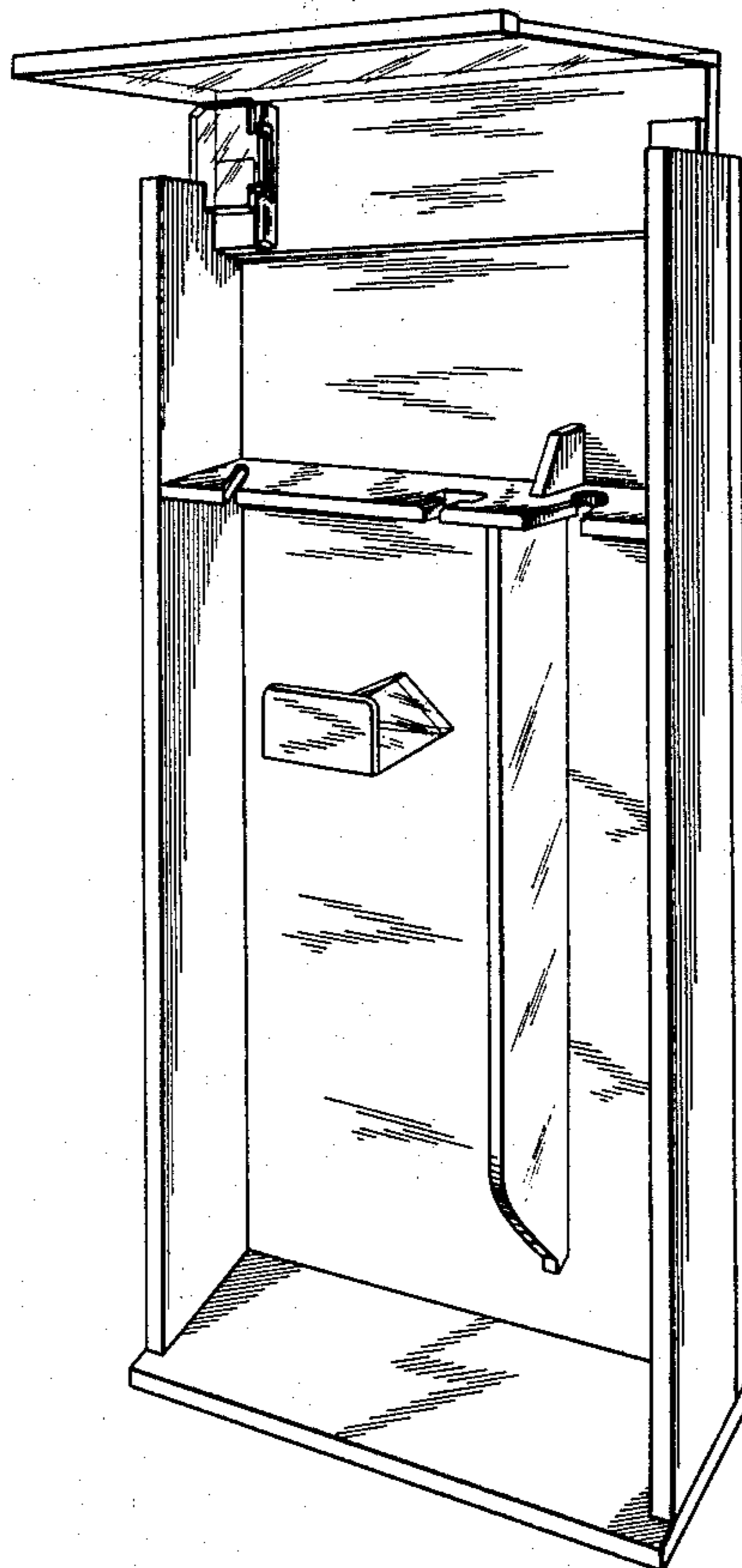

The ornamental design for an endoscopic instrument cabinet, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of an endoscopic instrument cabinet showing my new design;
 FIG. 2 is a right side elevational view, the left side being a mirror image thereof;
 FIG. 3 is a top plan view thereof;
 FIG. 4 is a rear elevational view thereof;
 FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view thereof; and
 FIG. 6 is a perspective view with the door latched in open position.



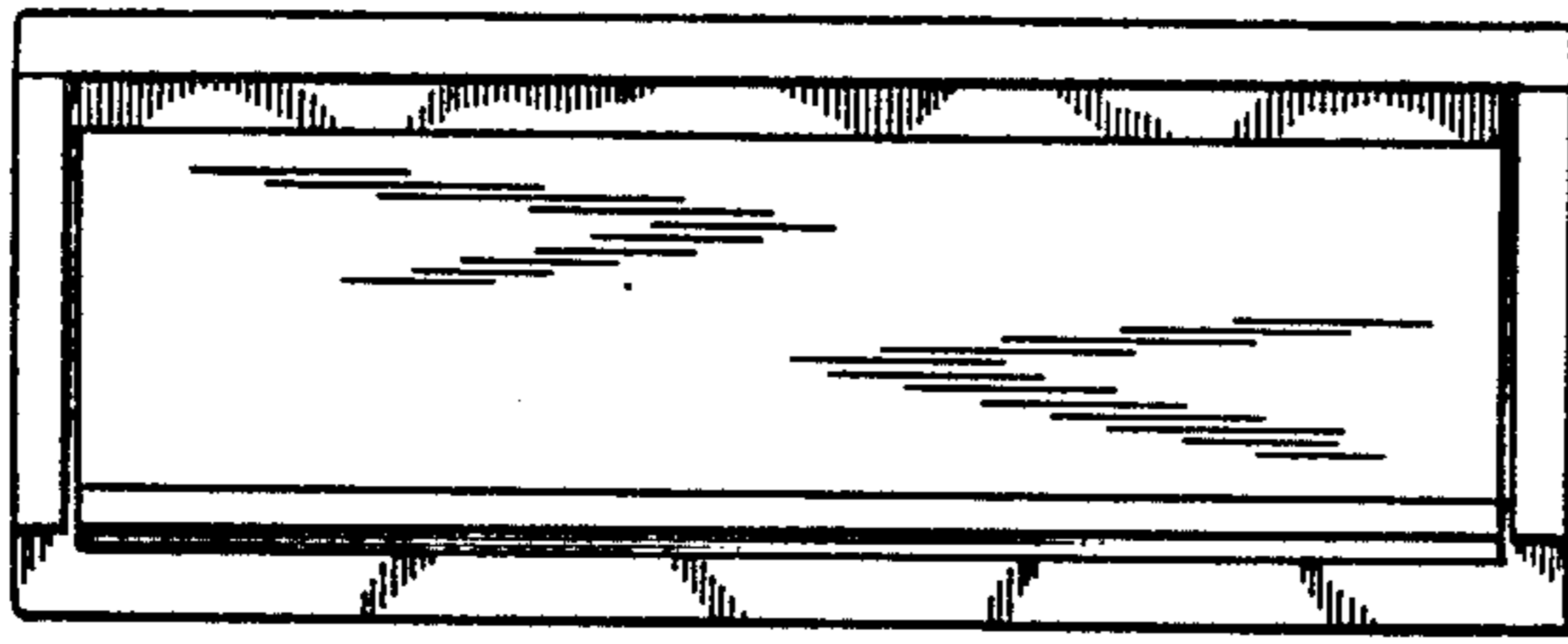

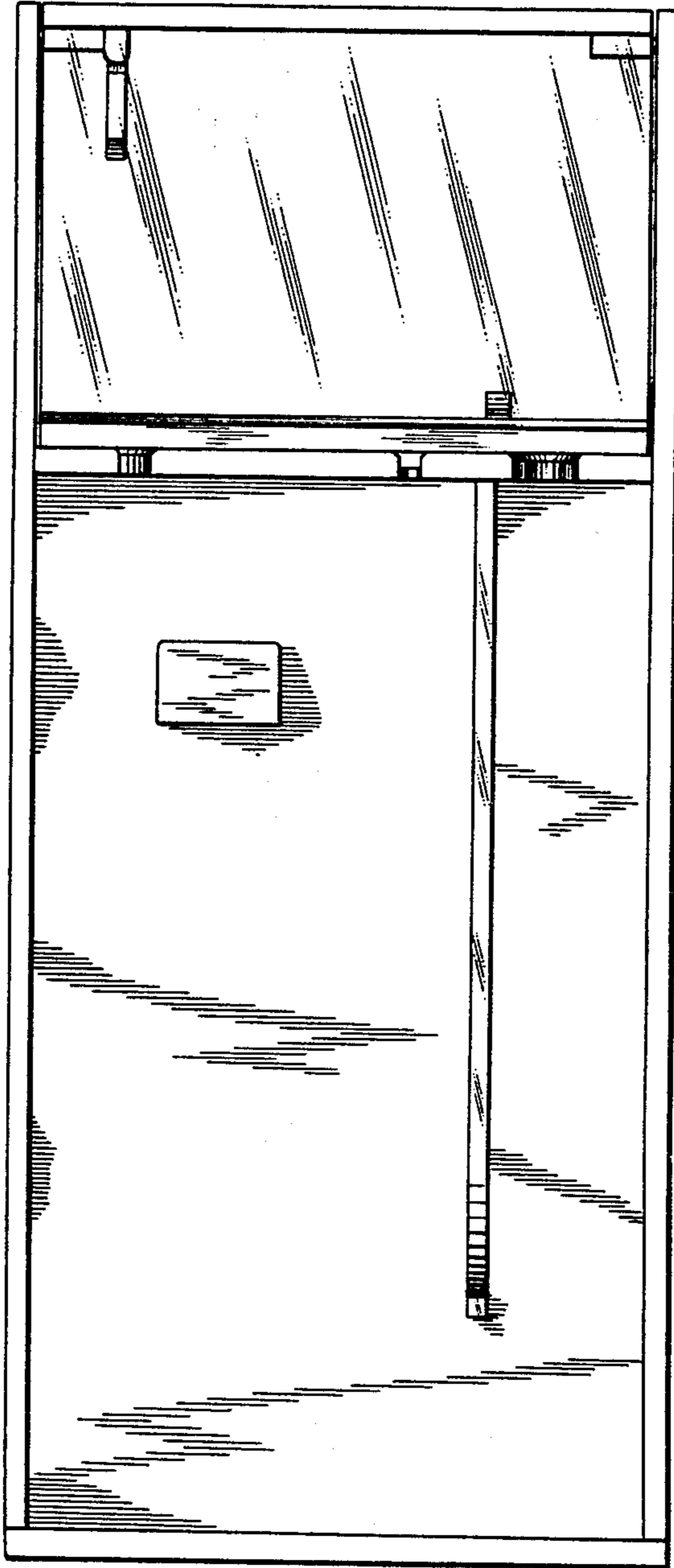

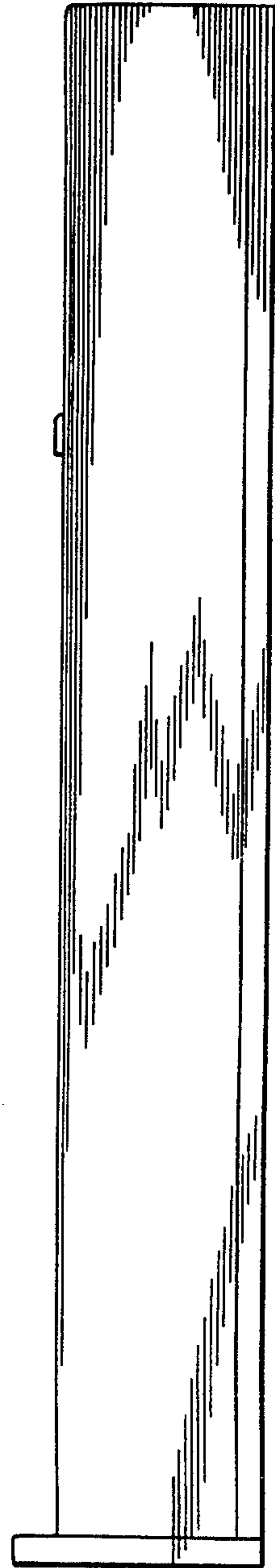

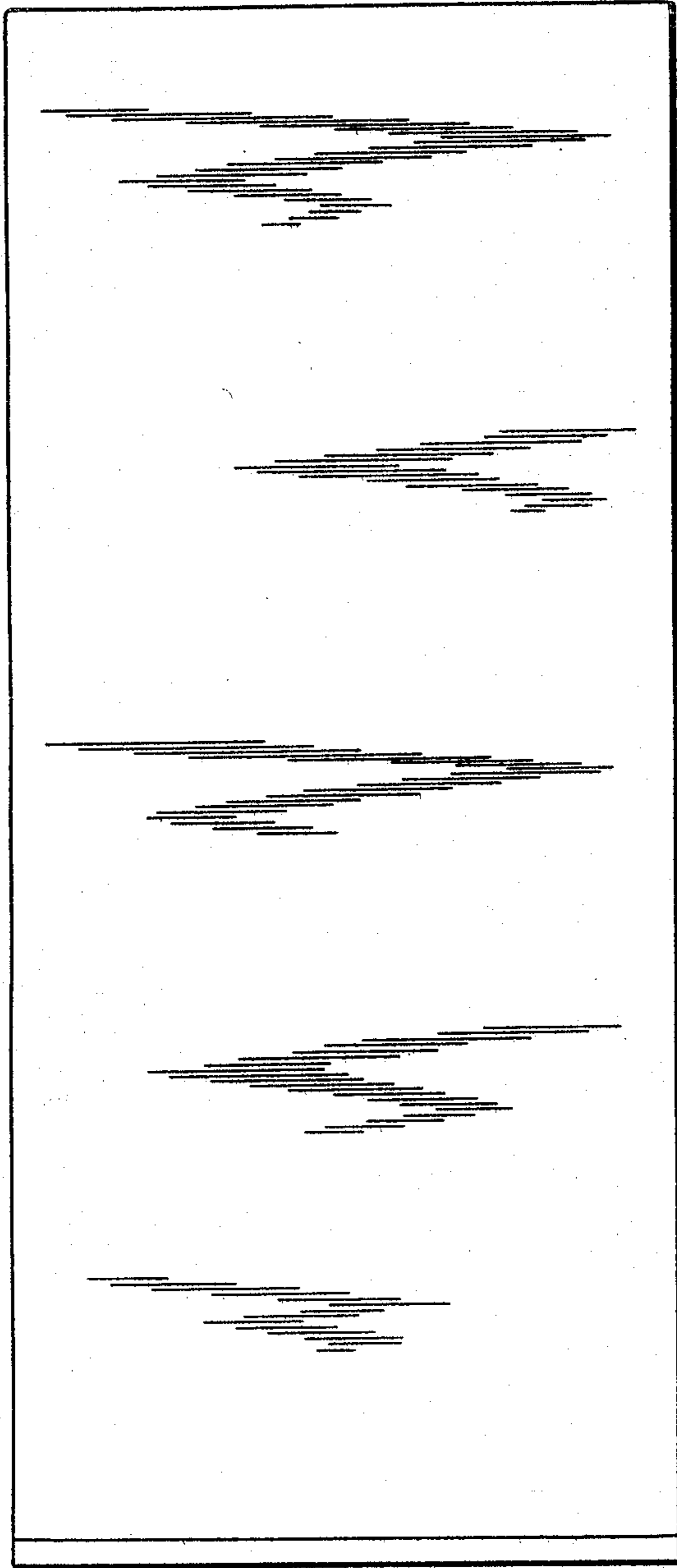

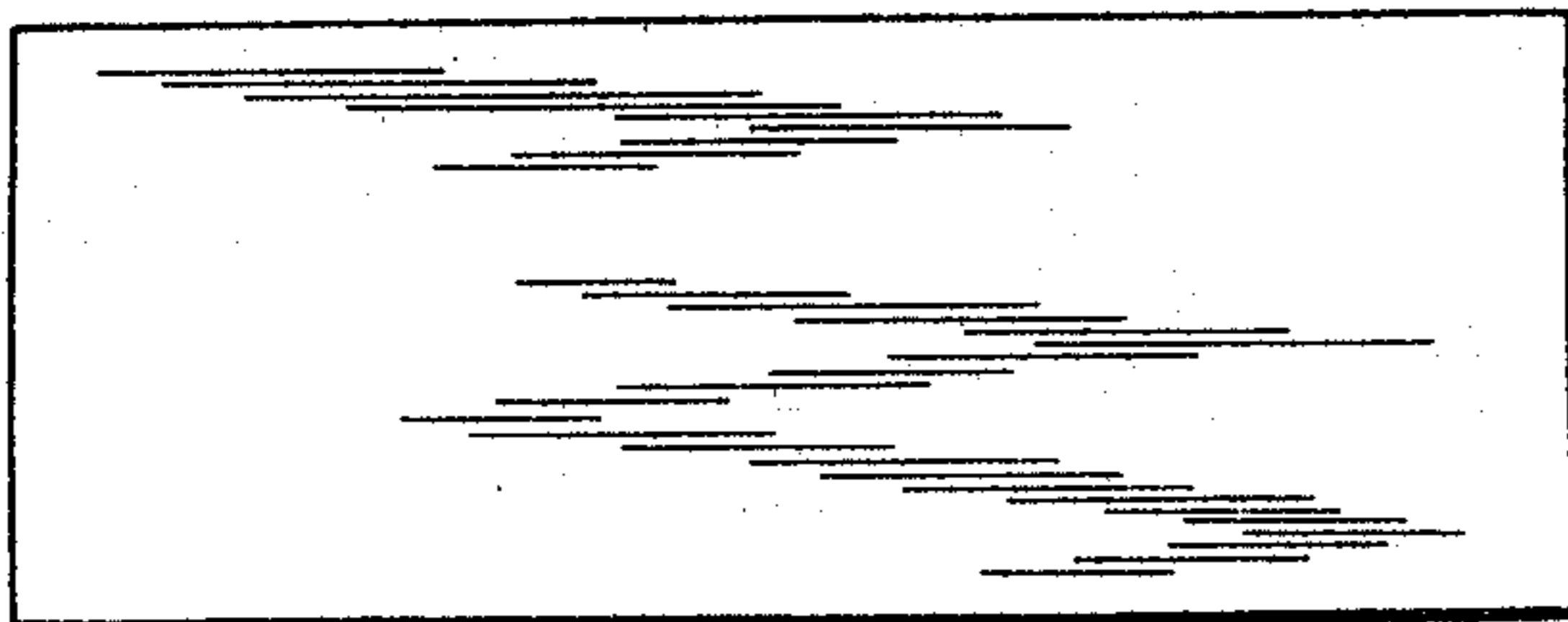

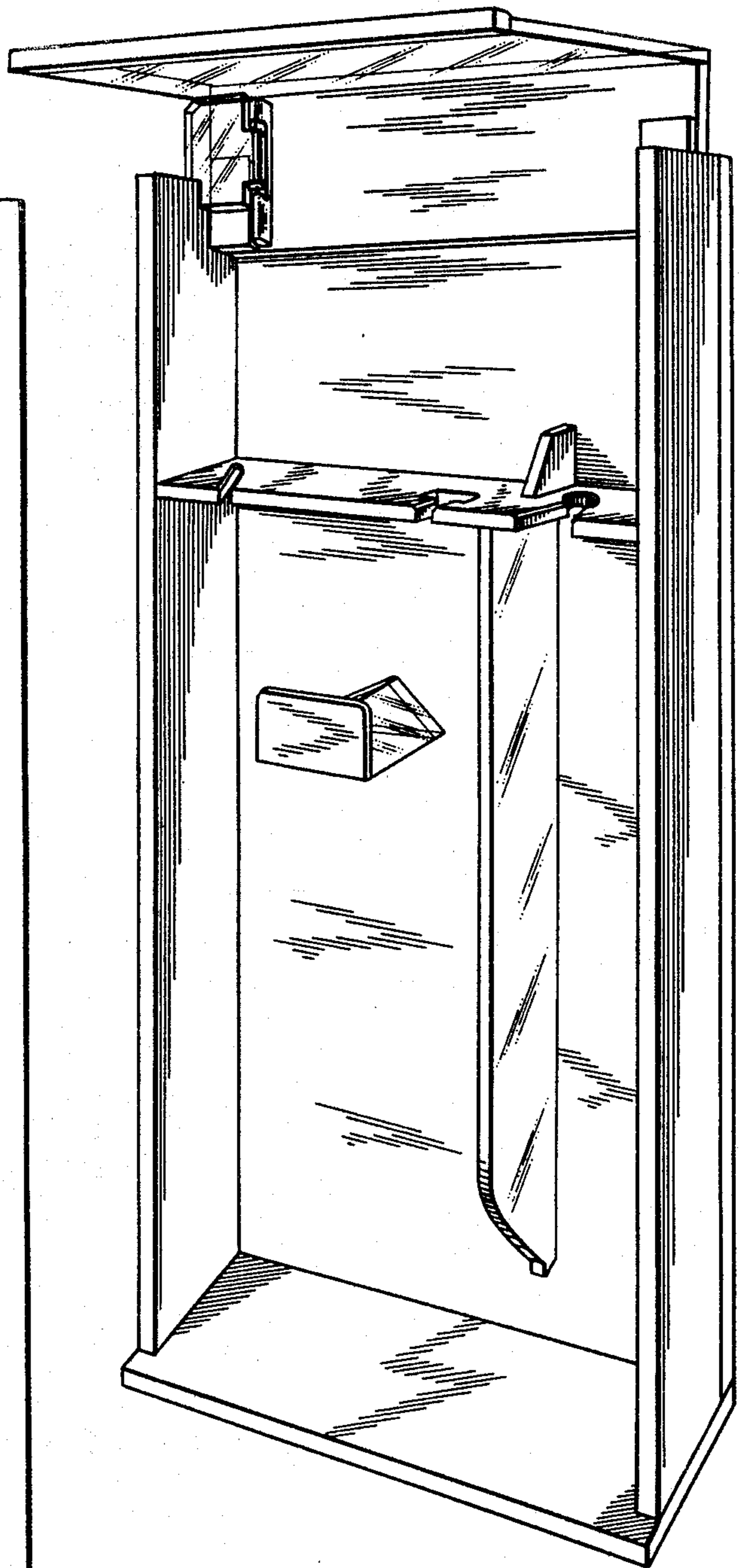
