[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a laboratory water bath, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a laboratory water bath showing my new design; FIG. 2 is a rear perspective view thereof; FIG. 3 is a front elevation thereof; and FIG. 4 is a fragmentary cross section taken on line 4—4 of FIG. 3.

The bottom thereof is free of ornamentation.

The characteristic feature of my design resides in the specific configuration of the instrument panel as best shown in FIGS. 1, 3 and 4.

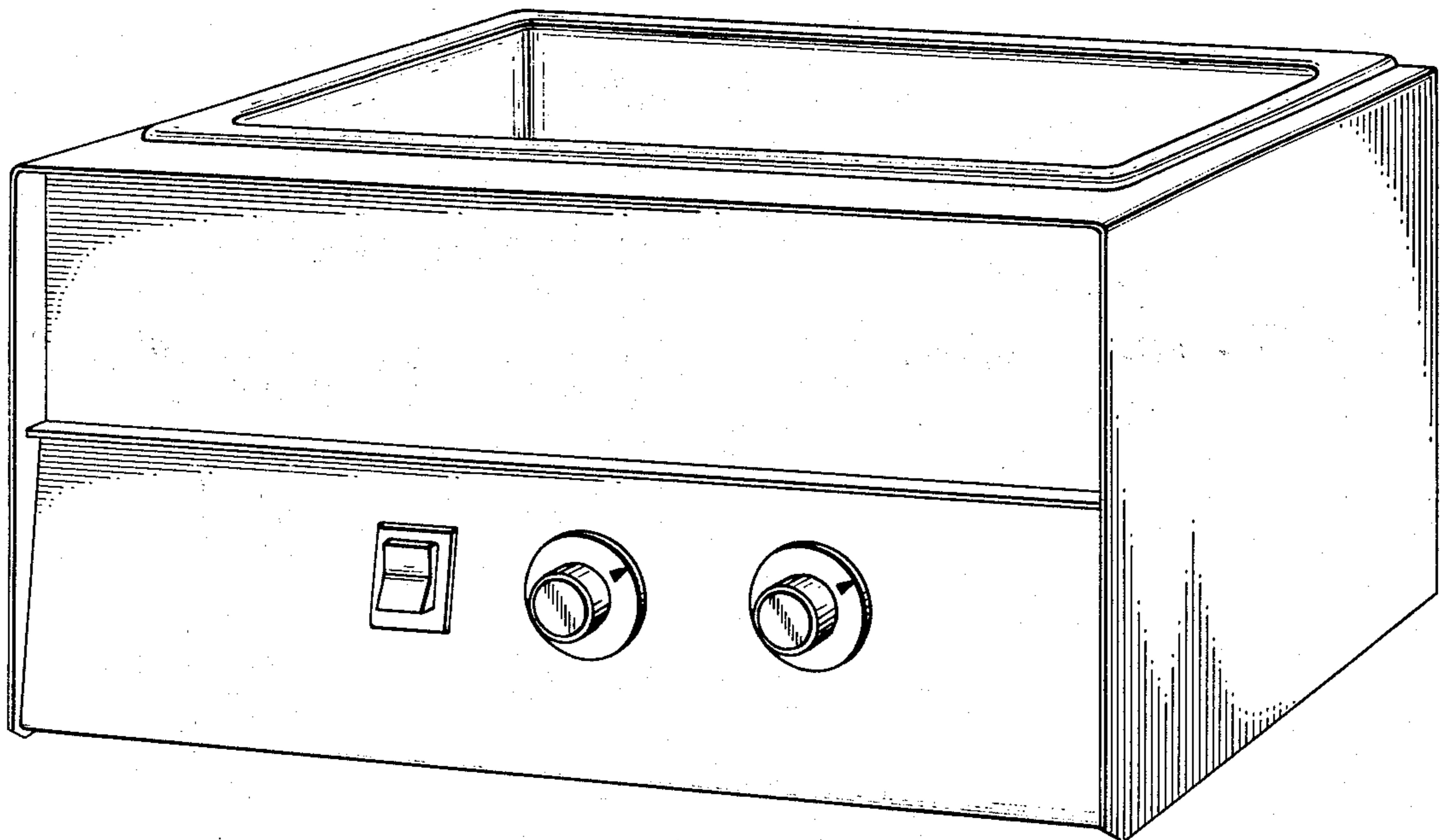

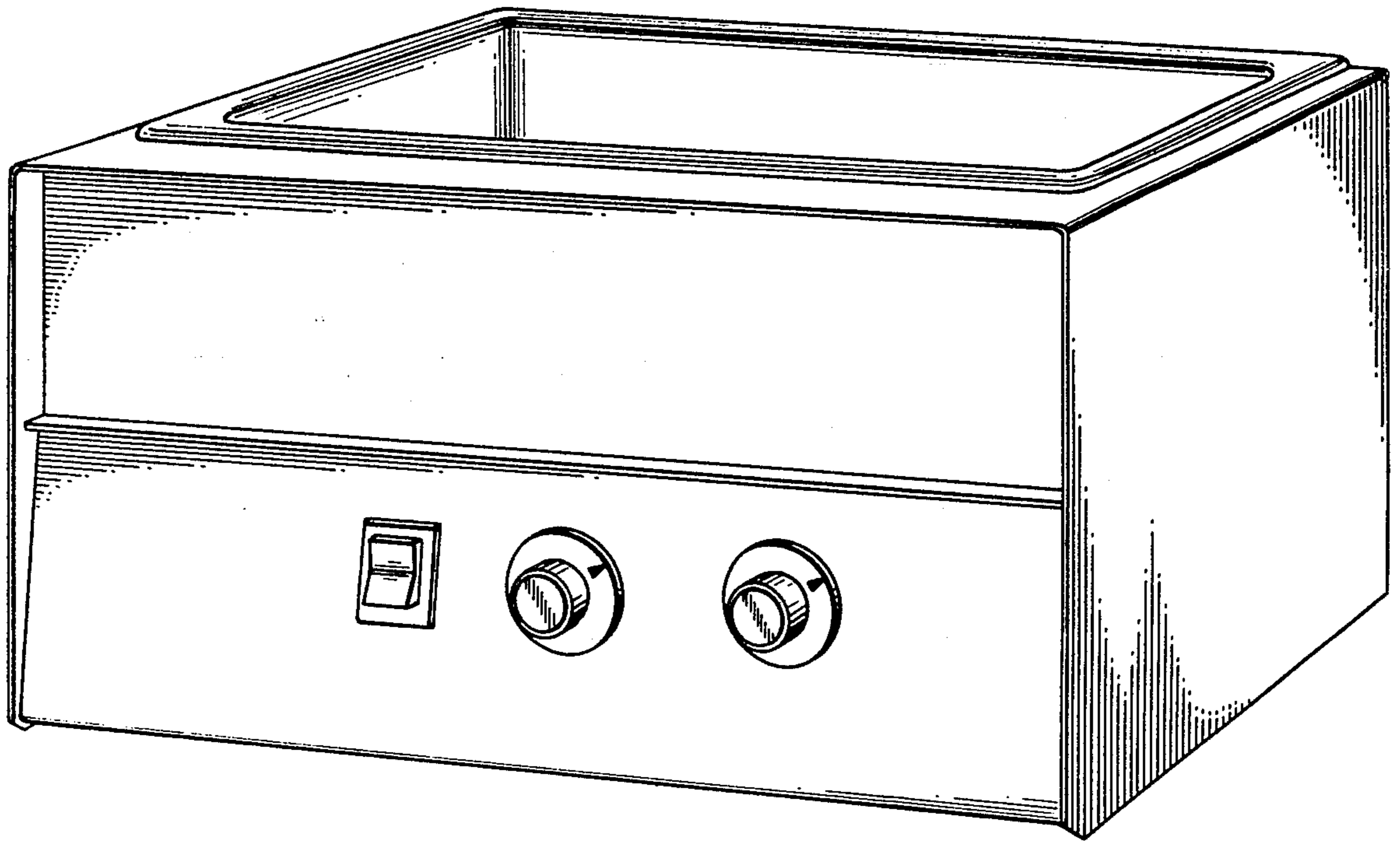

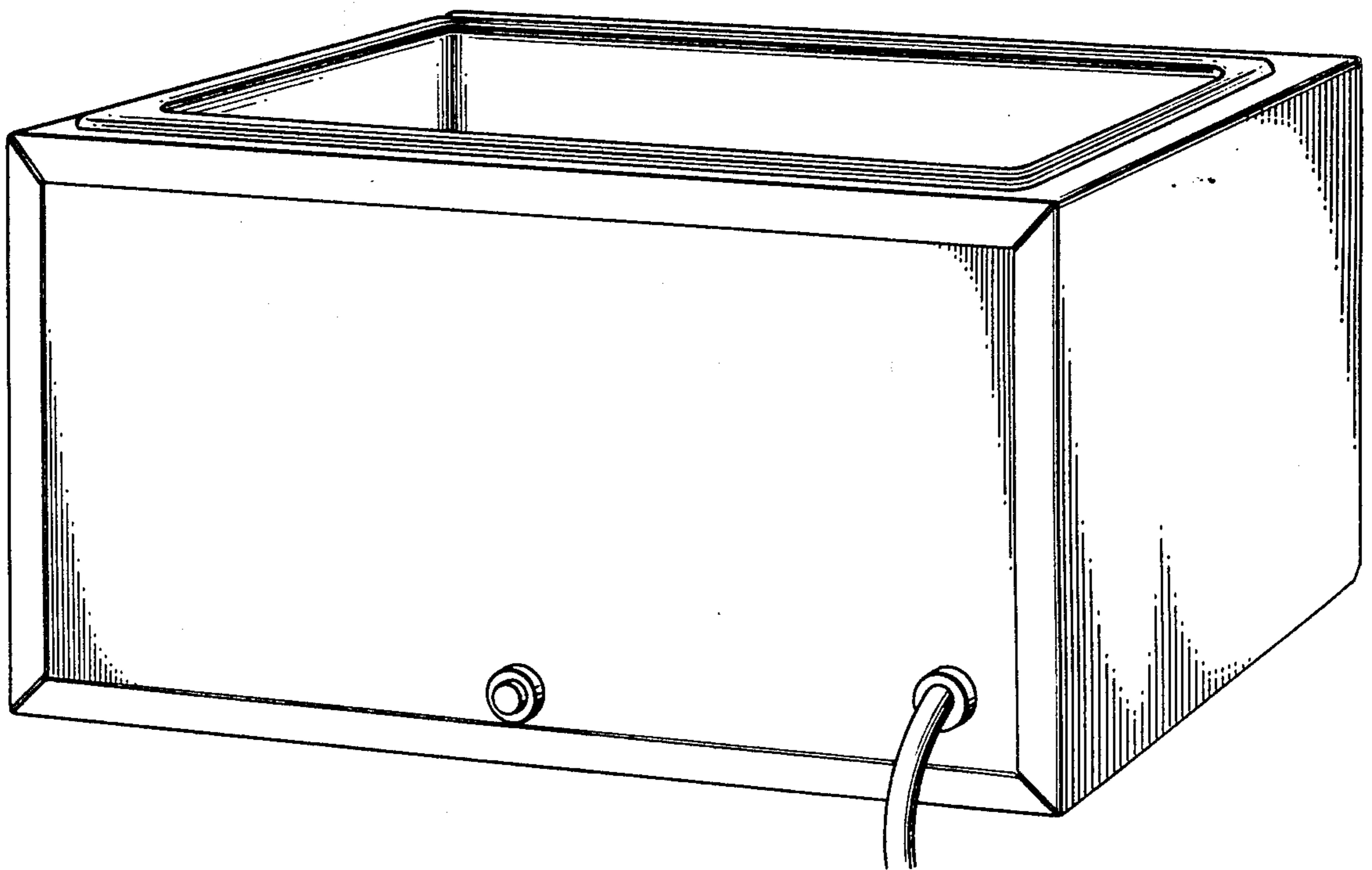

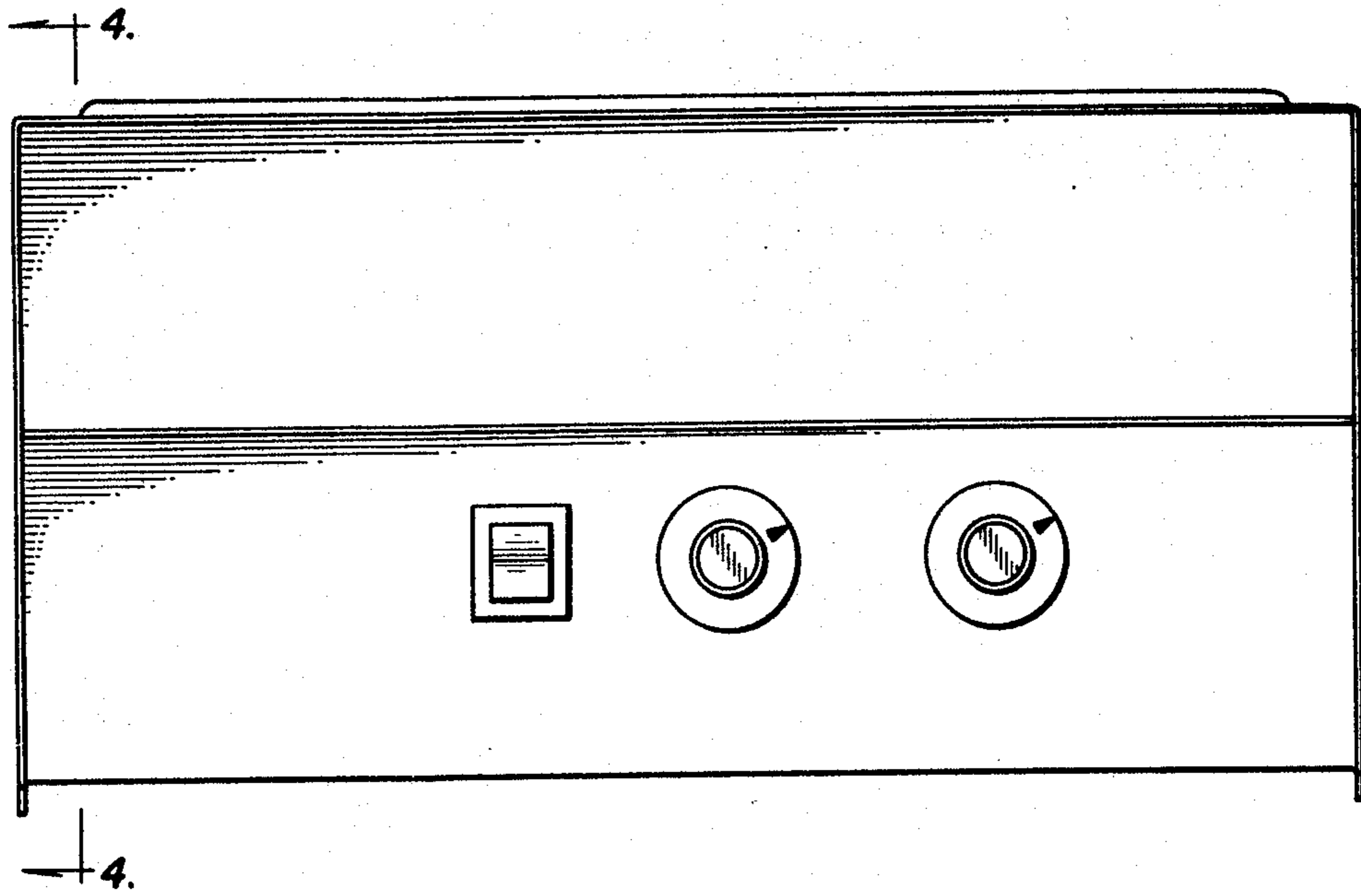
