The ornamental design for a trip lever for a water closet, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view taken from the top, front and right side of a trip lever for a water closet embodying my new design;
 FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof, the bottom being a mirror image of the top shown;
 FIG. 3 is a rear elevational view thereof;
 FIG. 4 is a front elevational view thereof;
 FIG. 5 is a left side elevational view thereof; and
 FIG. 6 is a right side elevational view thereof.

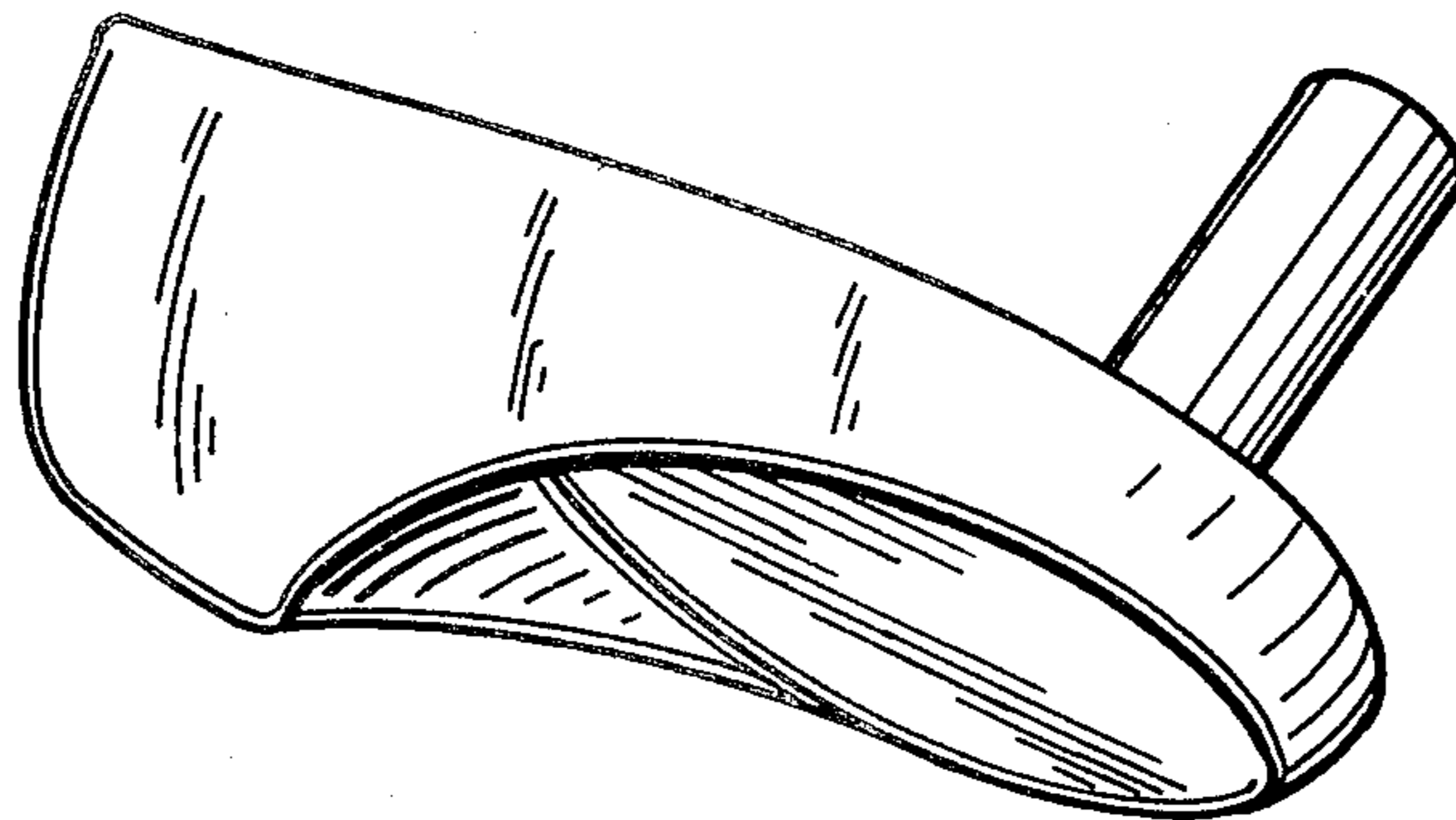

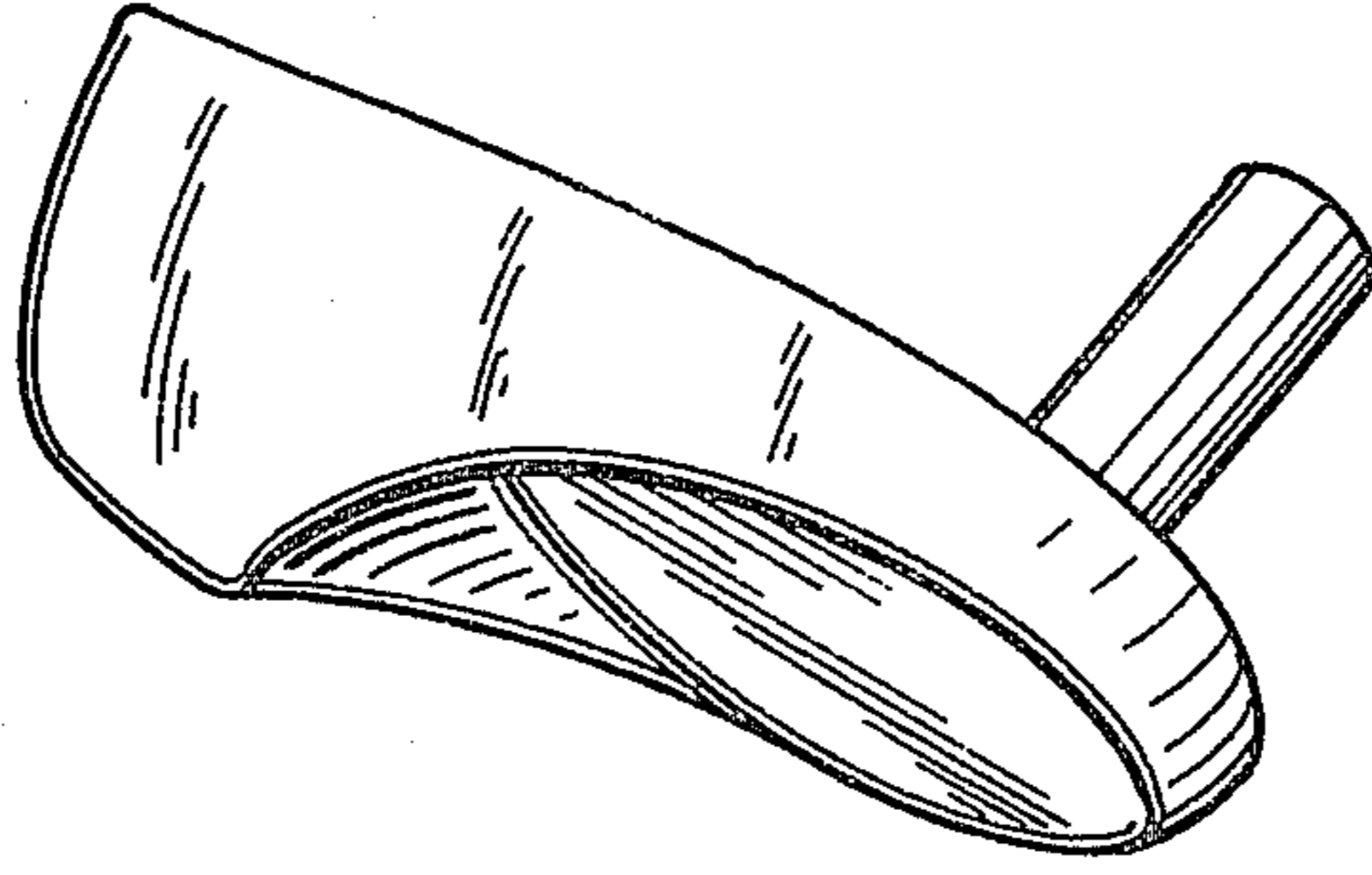

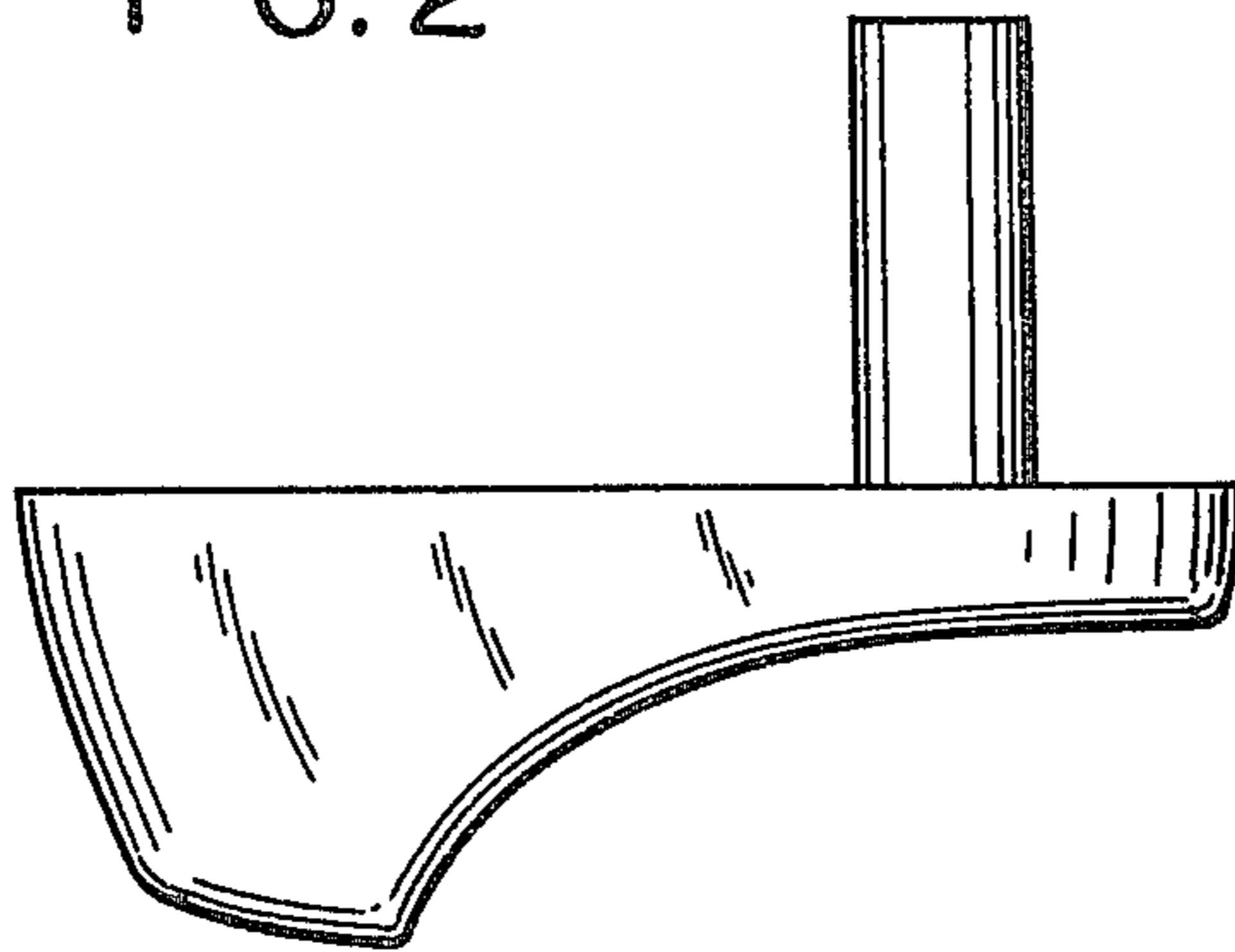

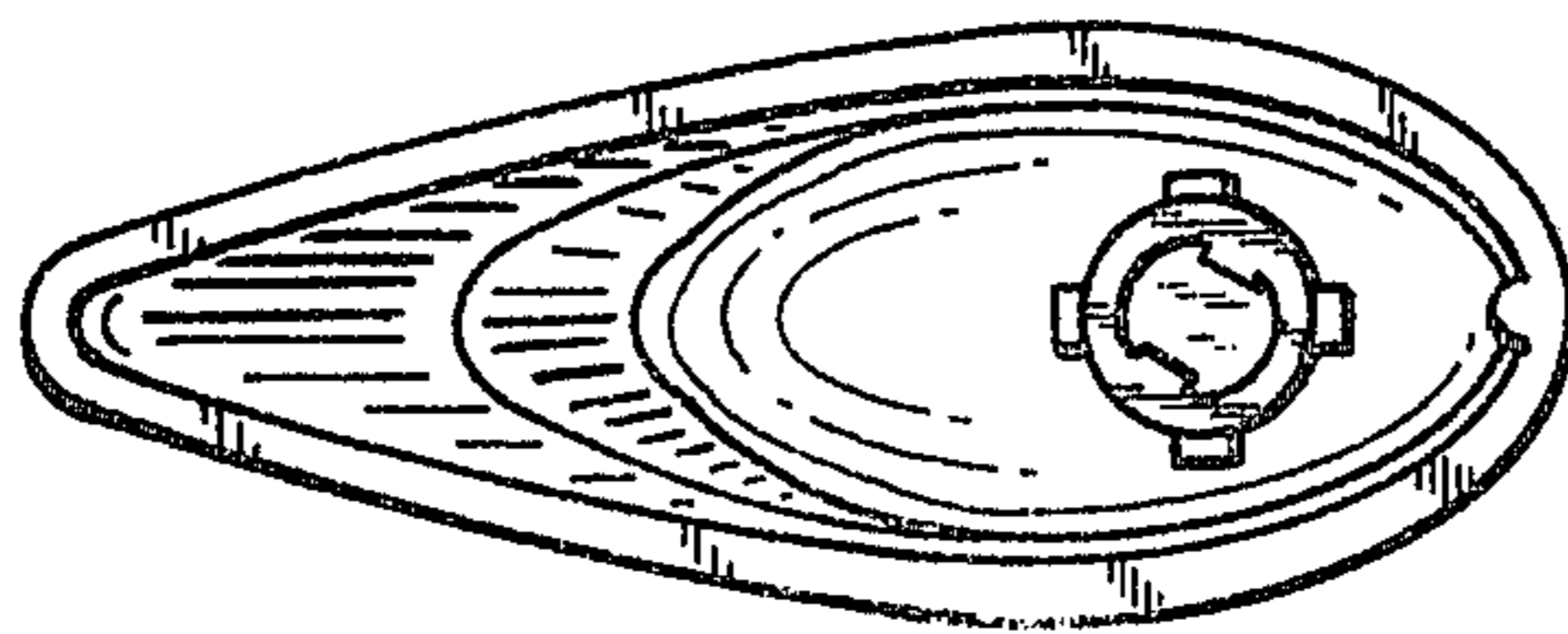

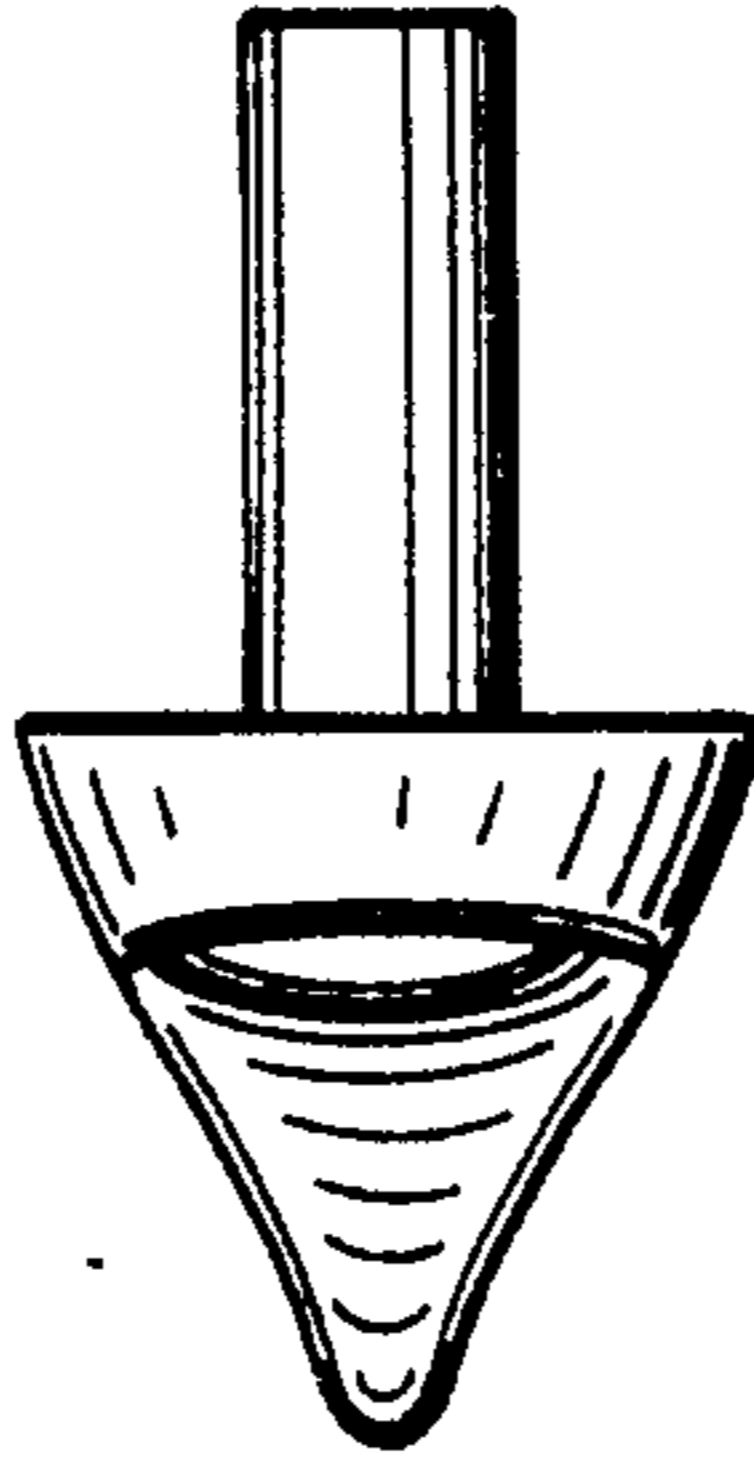

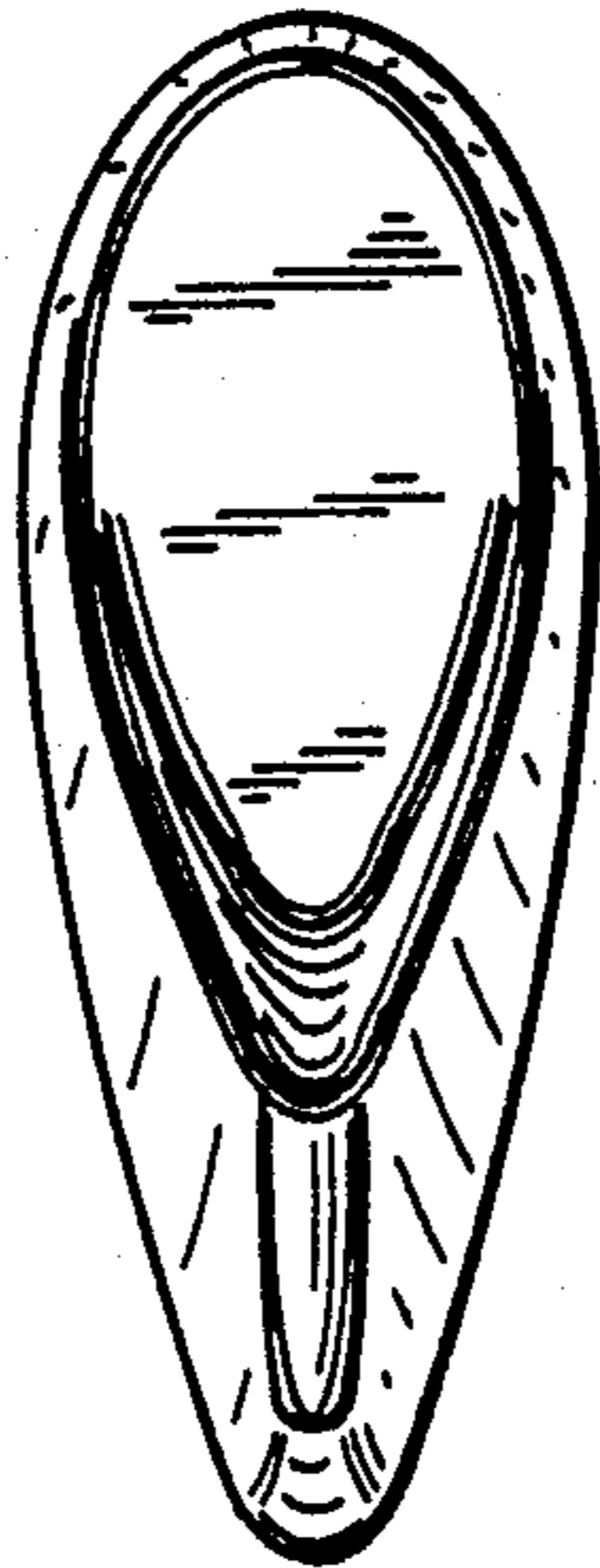
