our new design;

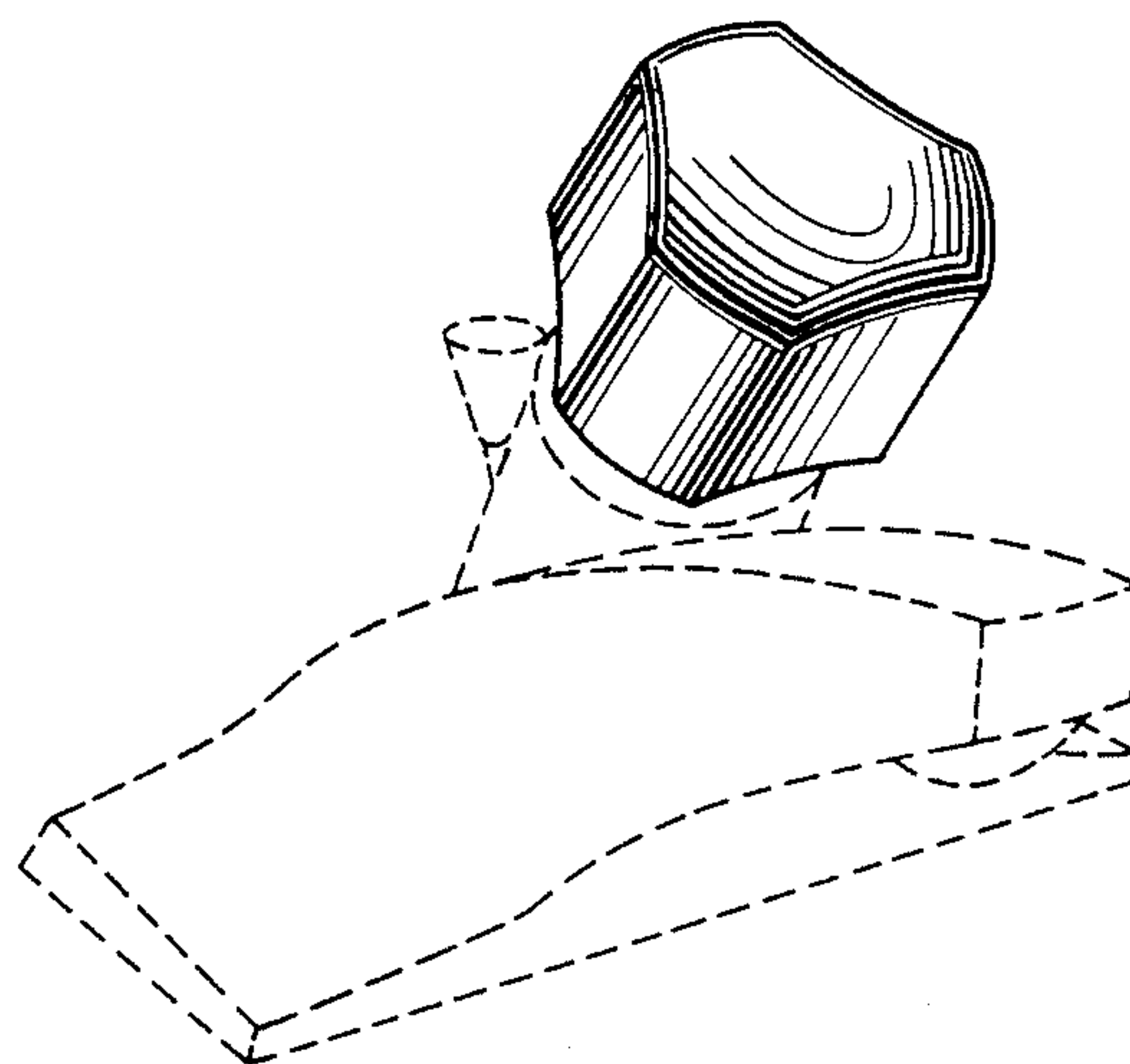
FIG. 2 another perspective view thereof;

illustration only.



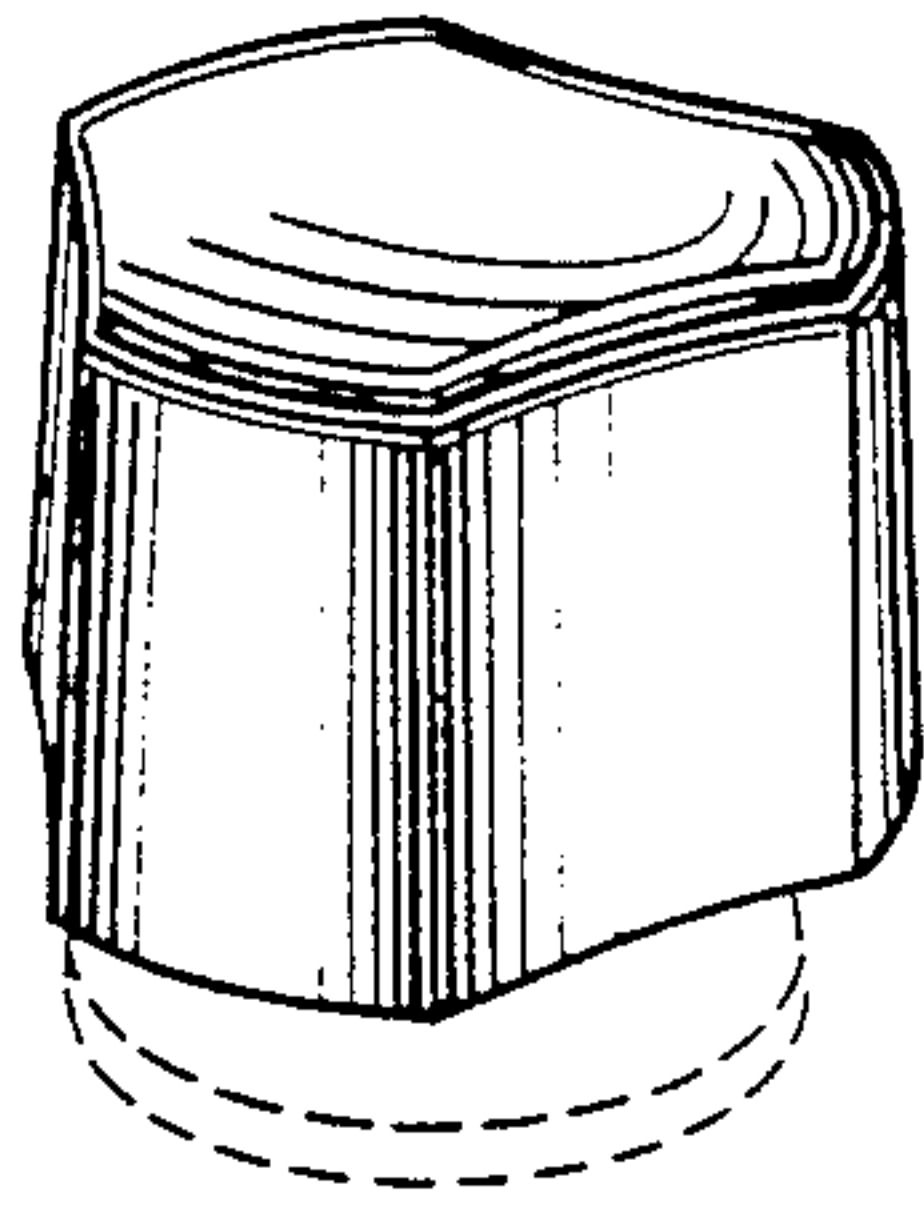

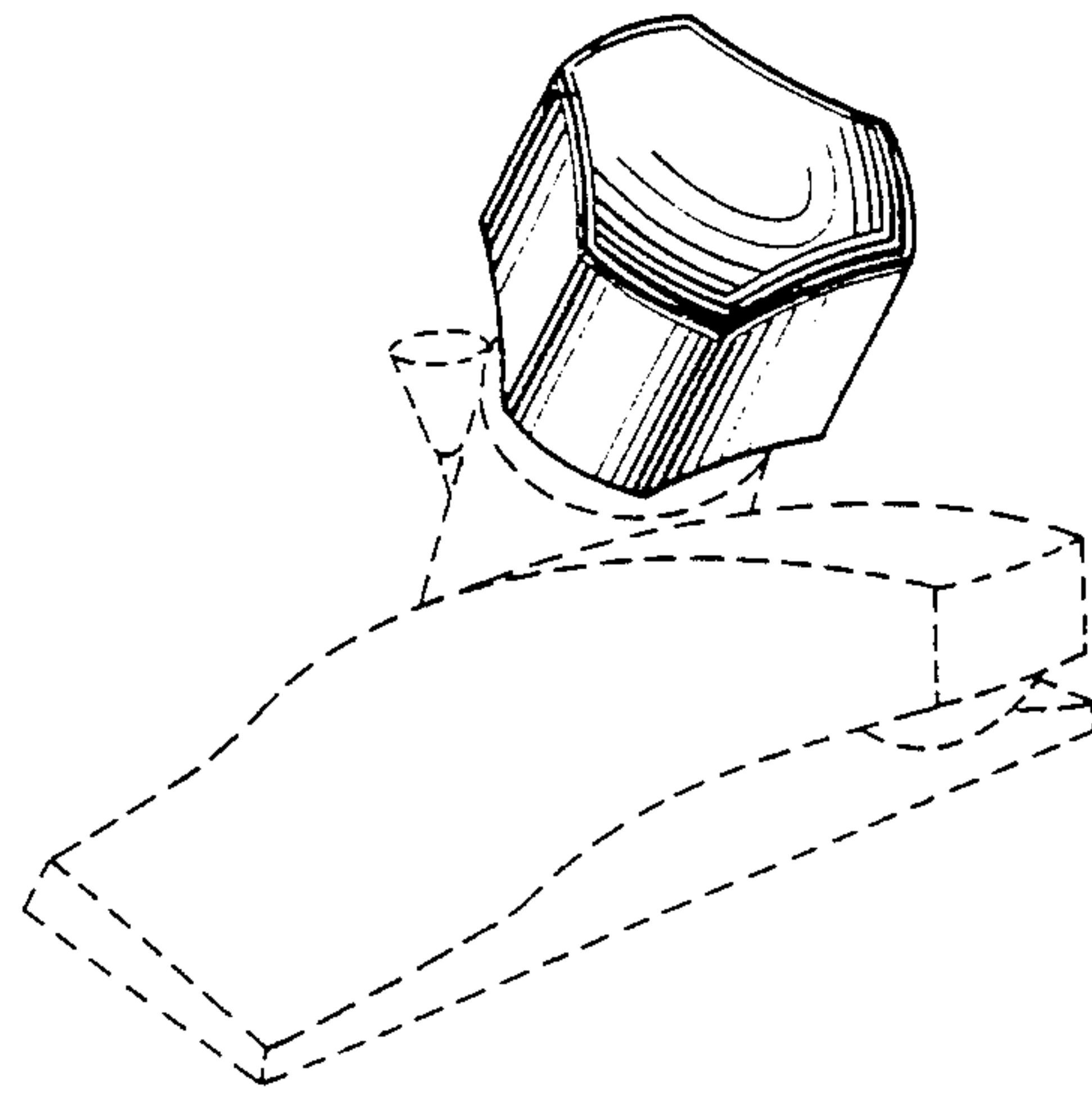

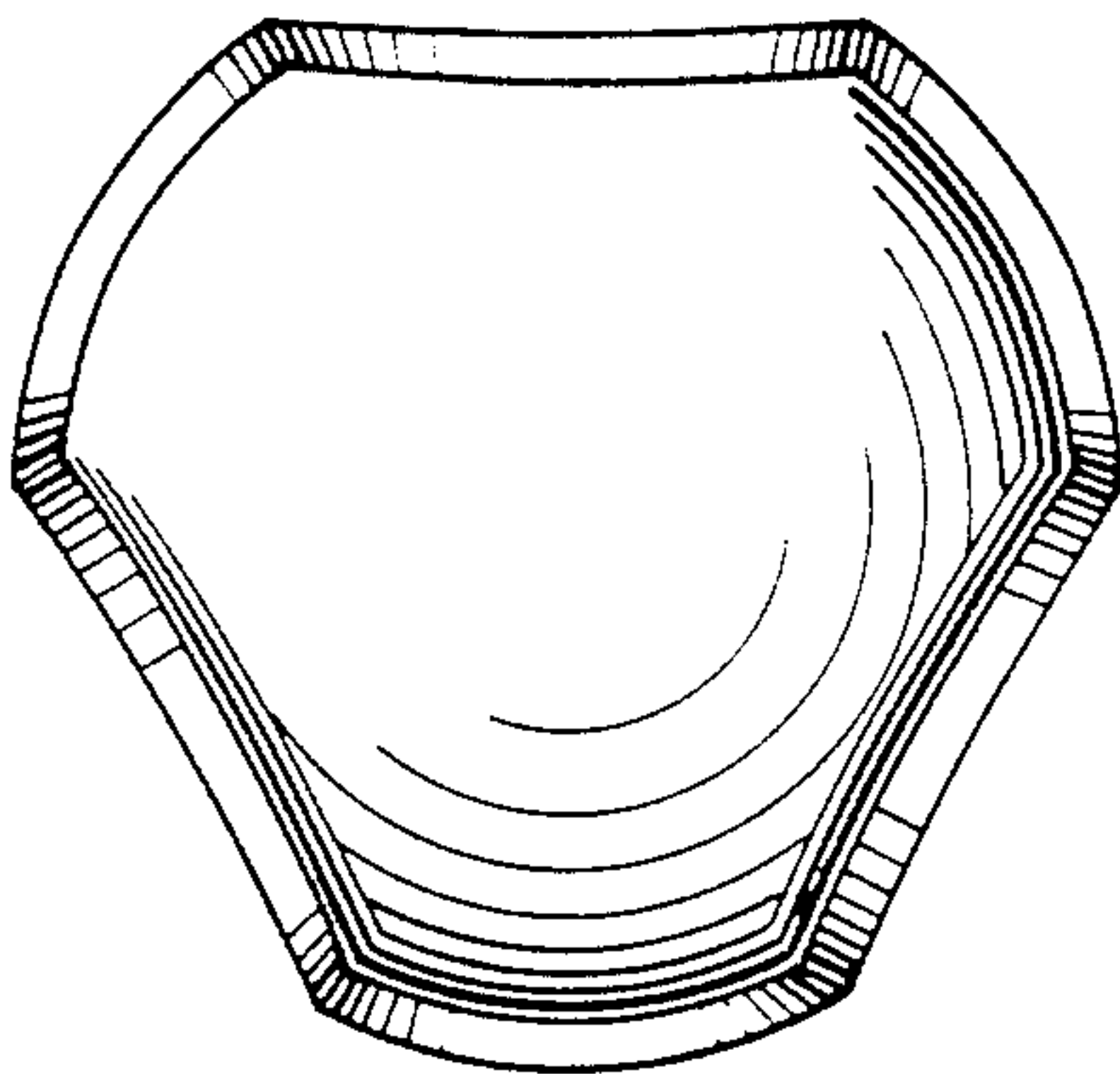

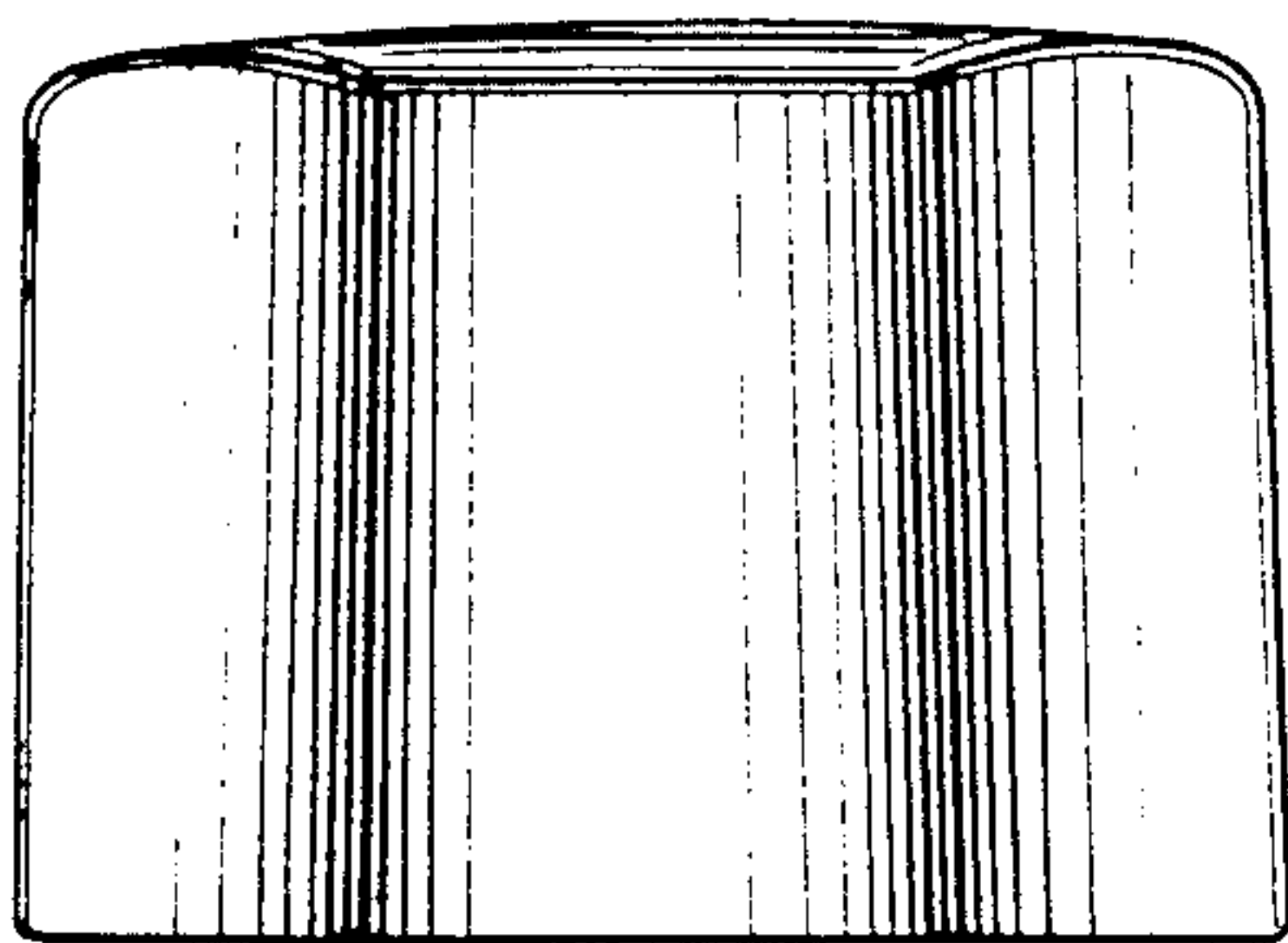

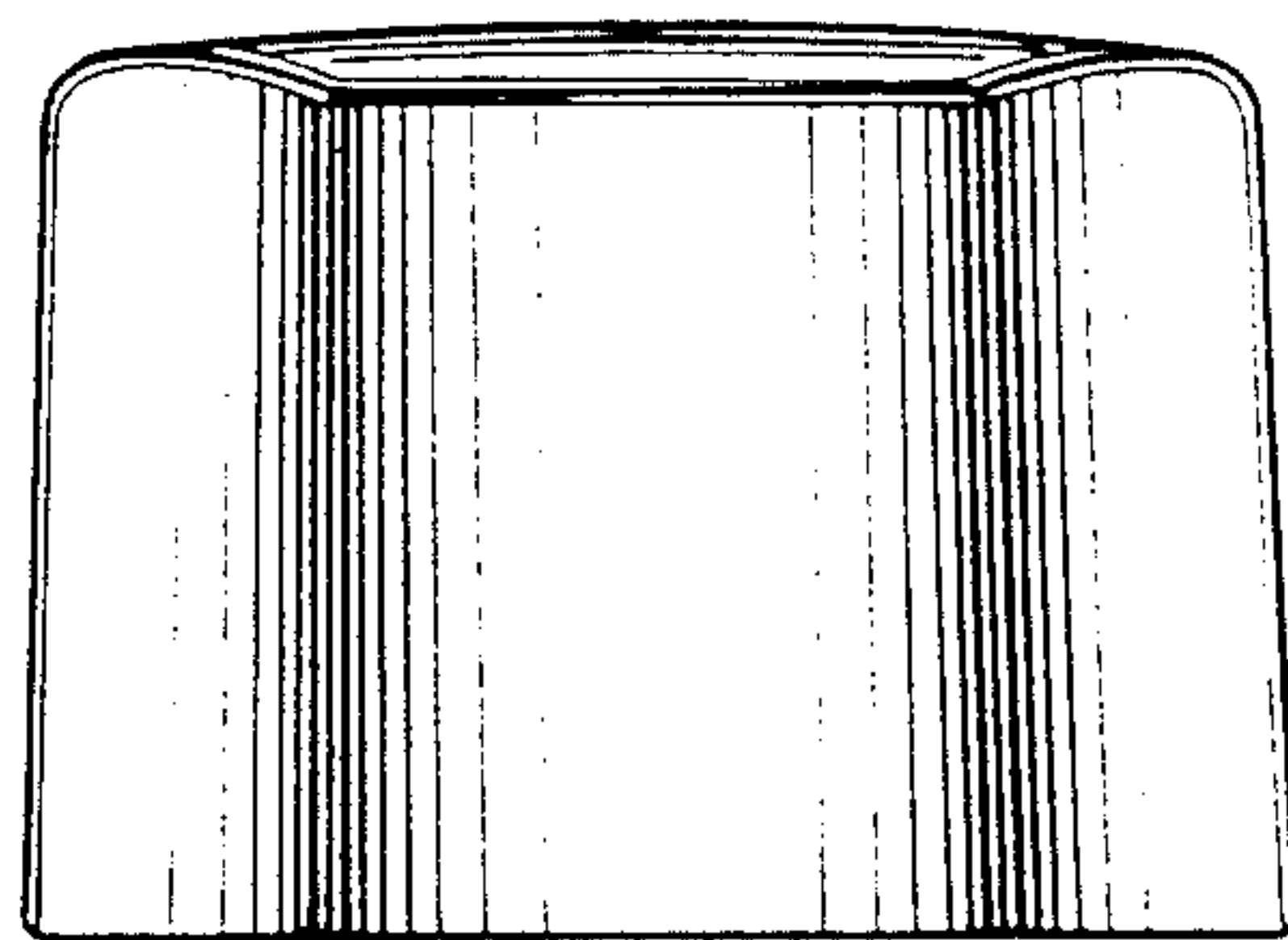
