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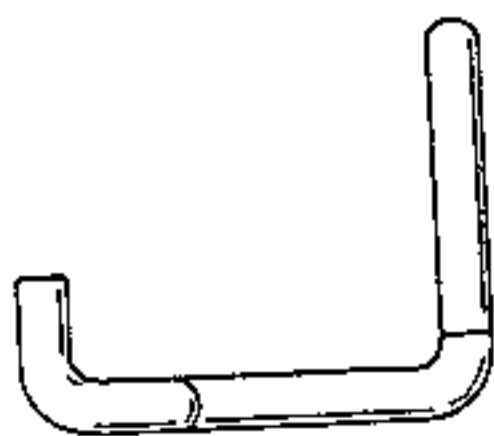
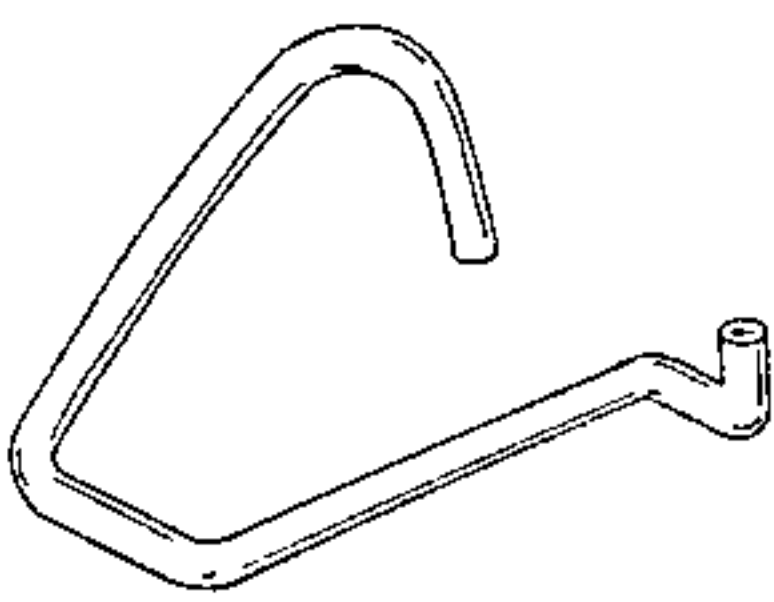

FIG. 4 is a top plan view thereof.



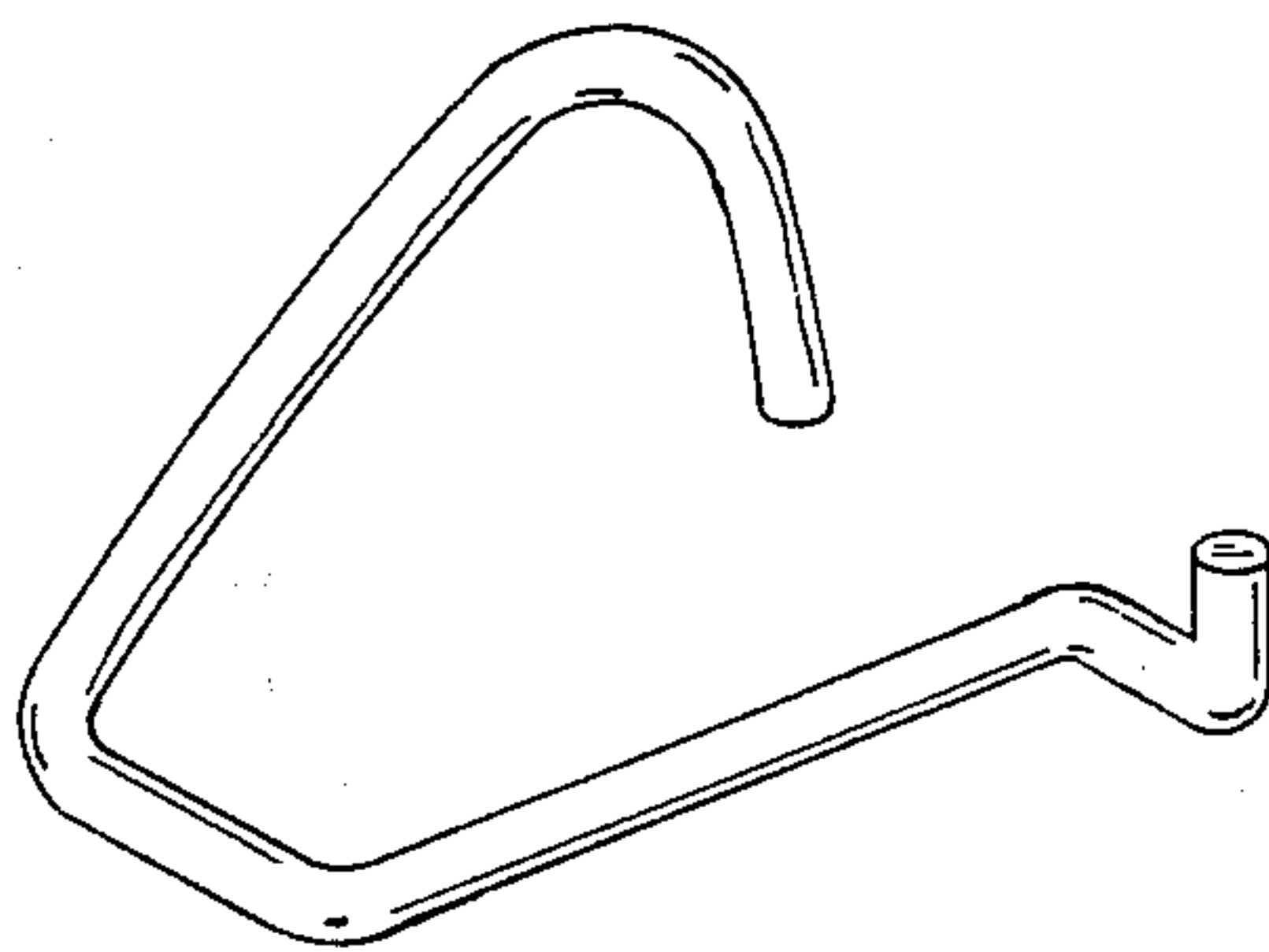

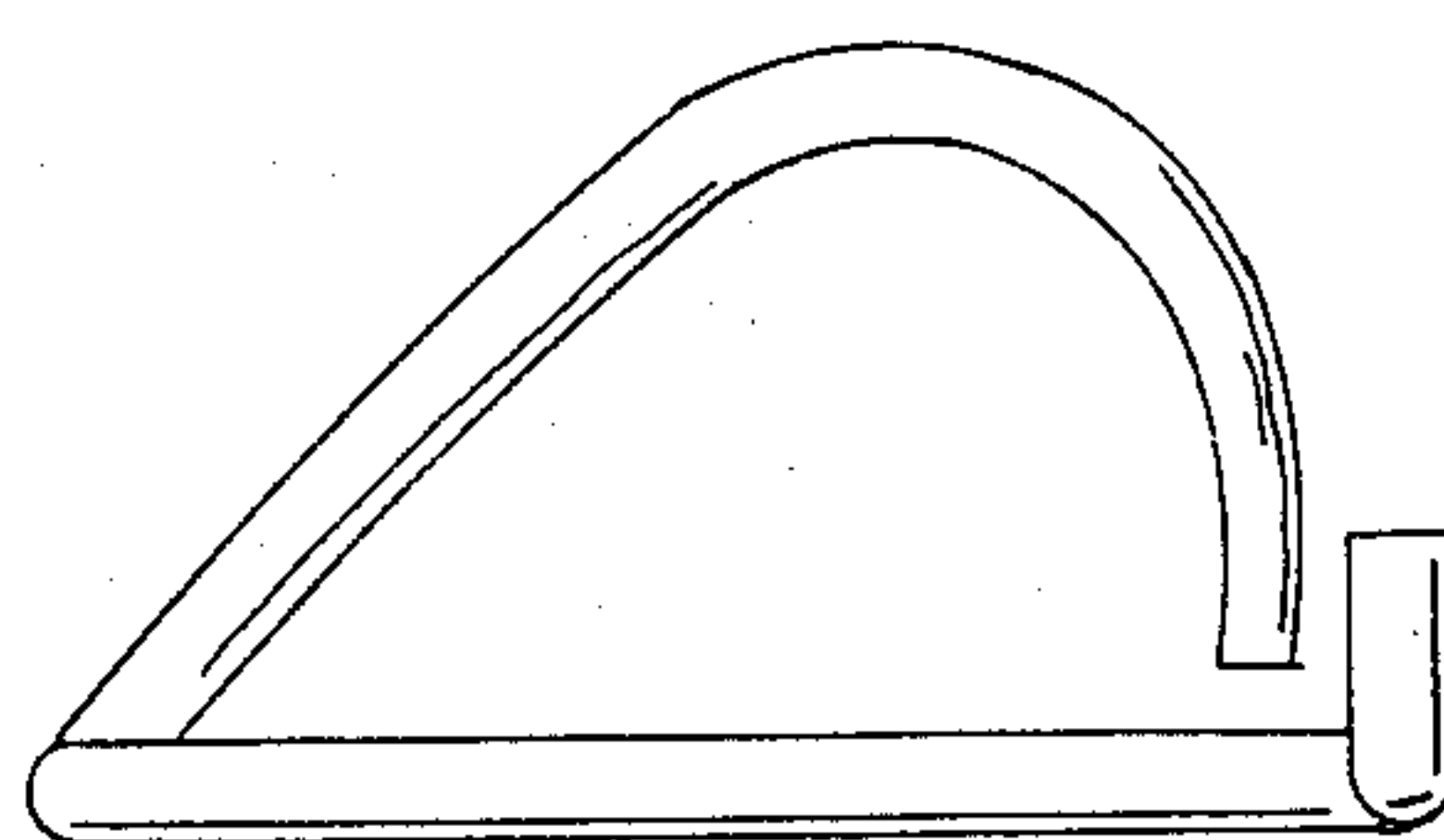

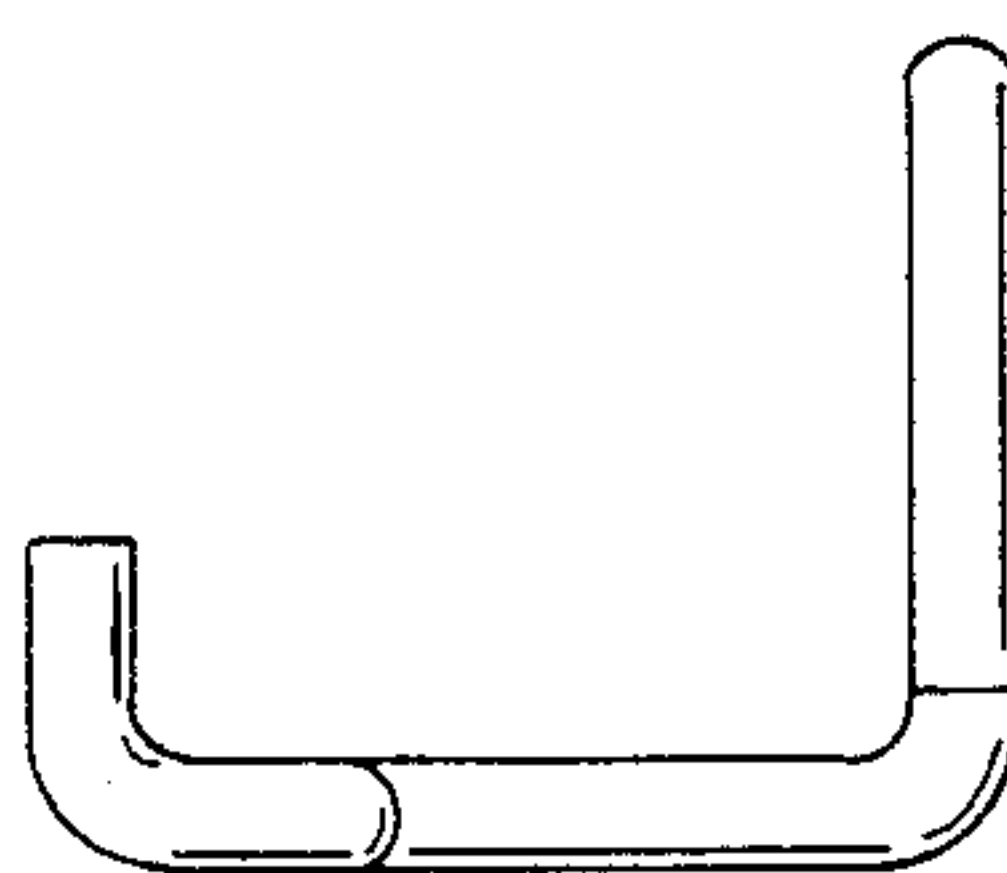

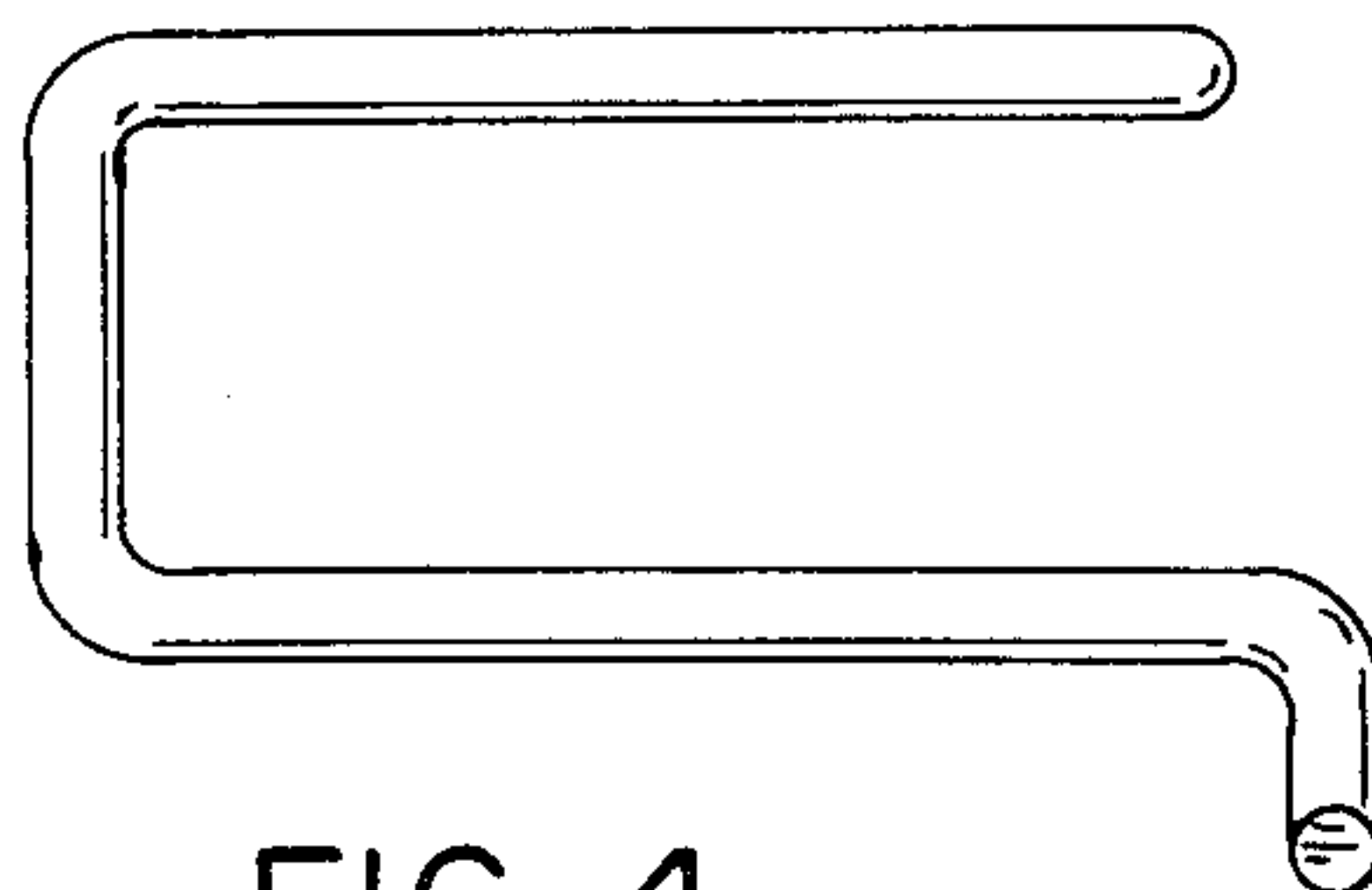
