[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a screen door, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of the screen door, with the foldable screen door sections lying in a common plane; FIG. 2 is an elevational view of the screen door as viewed from the exterior, depicting the screen door sections in a closed condition; FIG. 3 is a top plan view of the screen door in a closed condition; FIG. 4 is a bottom view of the screen door in a closed condition; FIG. 5 is an end edge view of the screen door, such view being identical as viewed from either end; and FIG. 6 is an elevational view of the screen door, as viewed from the interior, depicting the screen door sections in a partially folded-up condition.

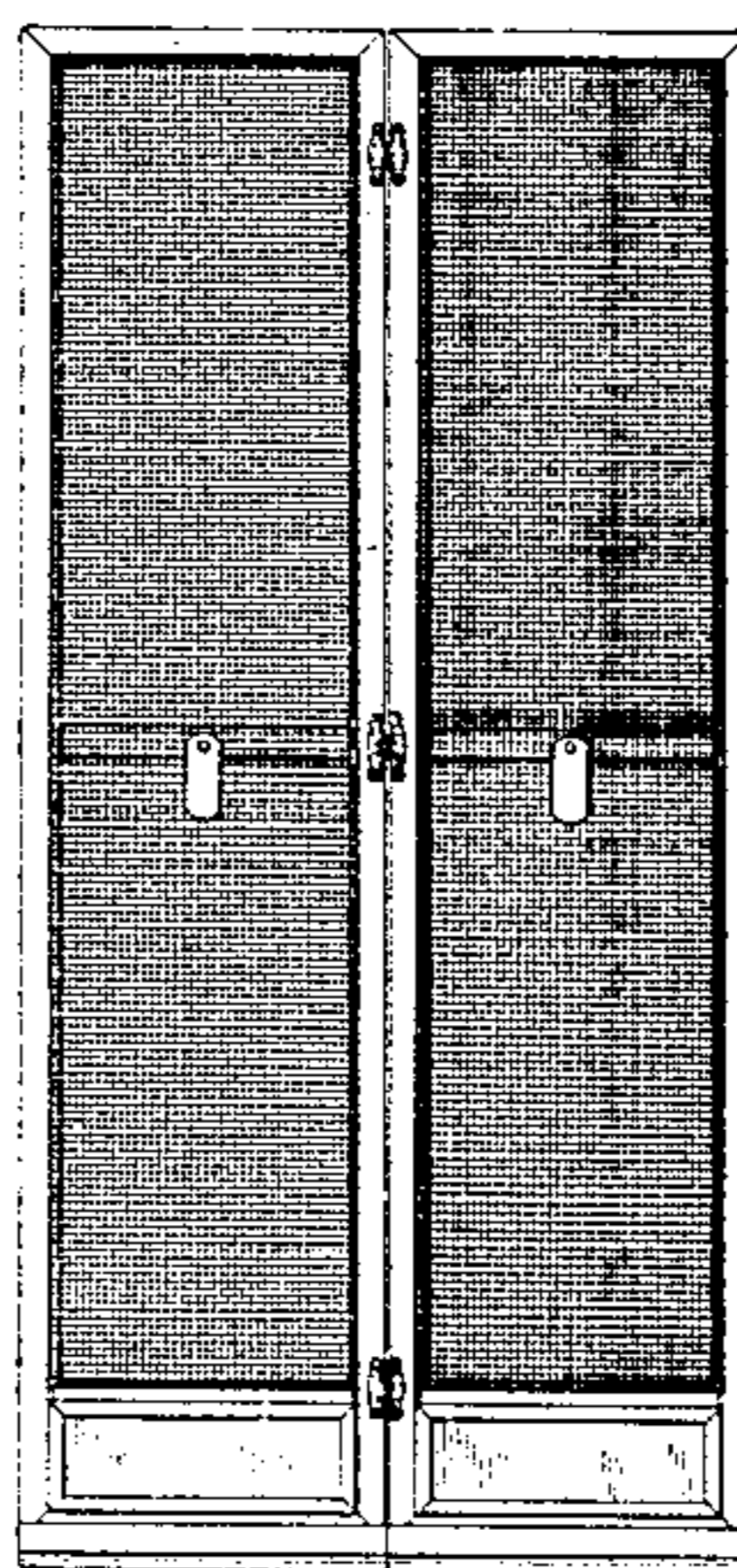

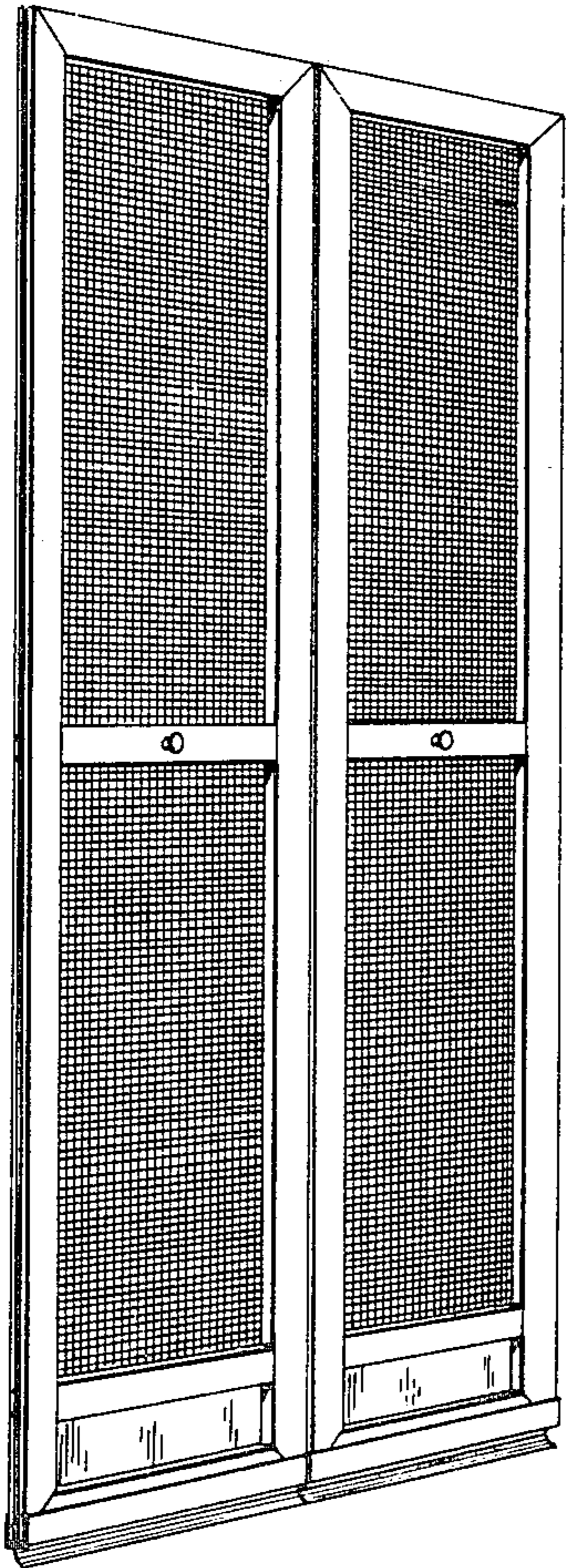

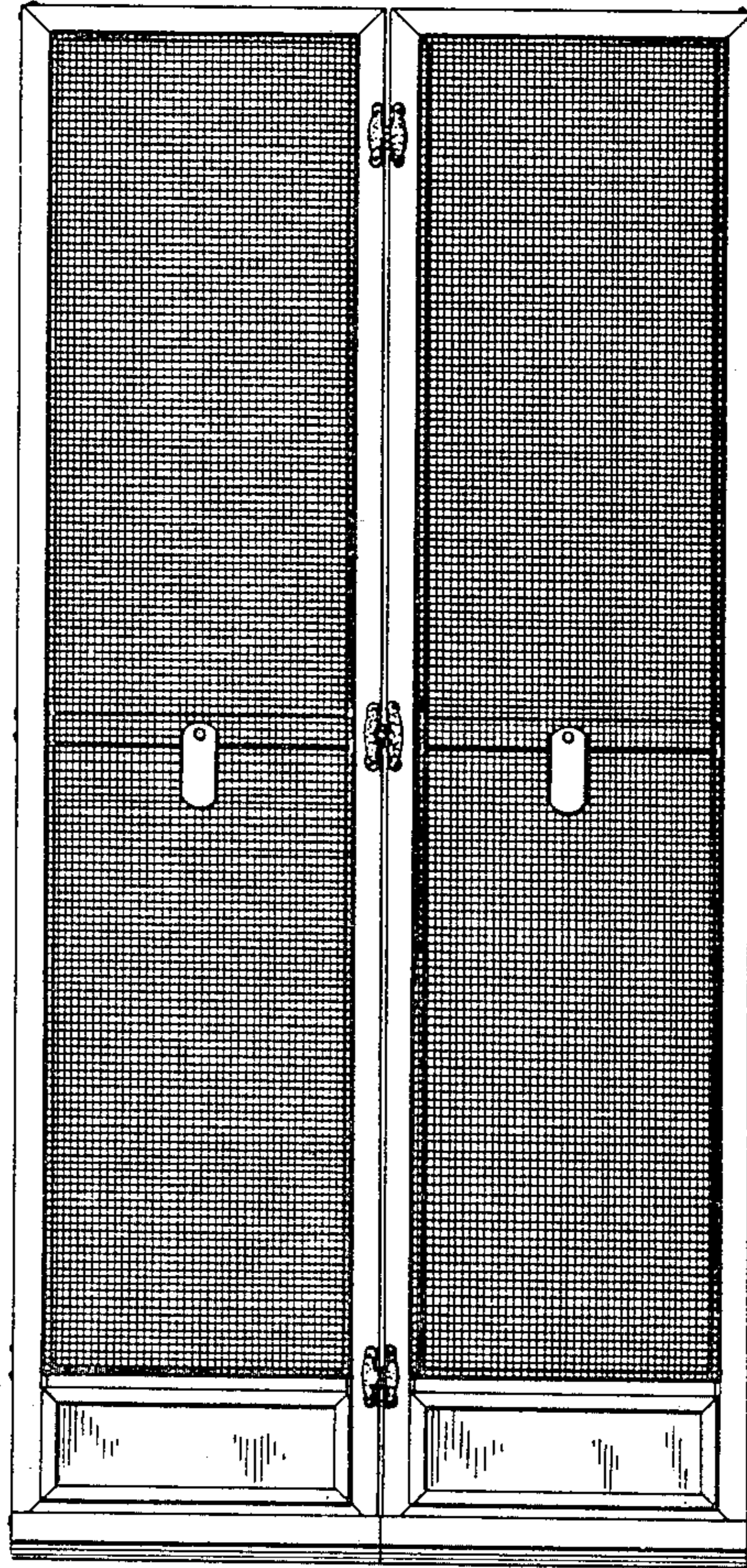

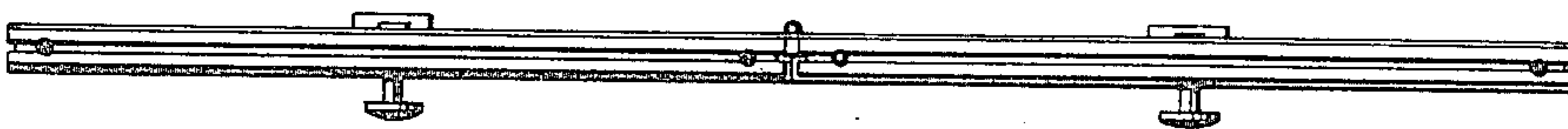
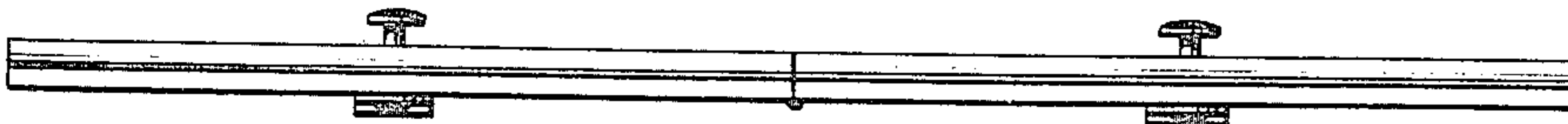

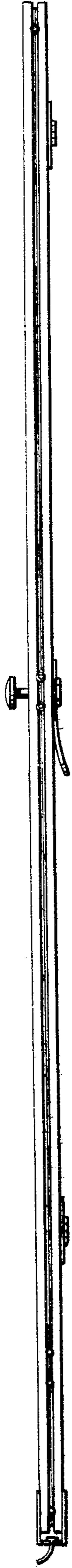
