FIG. 2 is a front elevational view;


FIG. 3 is a rear elevational view;


FIG. 4 is a top plan view;


FIG. 5 is a right elevational view;


FIG. 6 is a fragmentary sectional view taken along section line 6—6 of FIG. 5; and














