[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a drinking glass or the like, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a drinking glass or the like showing our new design.

FIG. 2 is a back elevational view.

FIG. 3 is a top plan view.

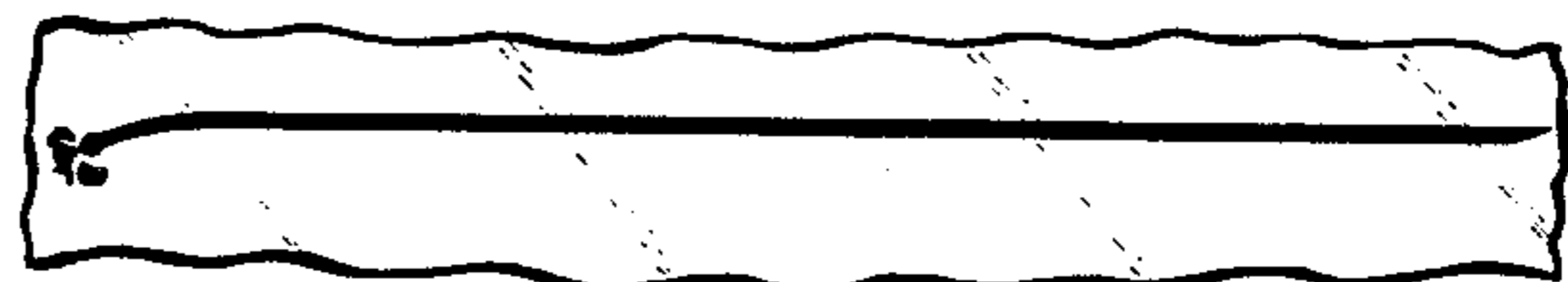
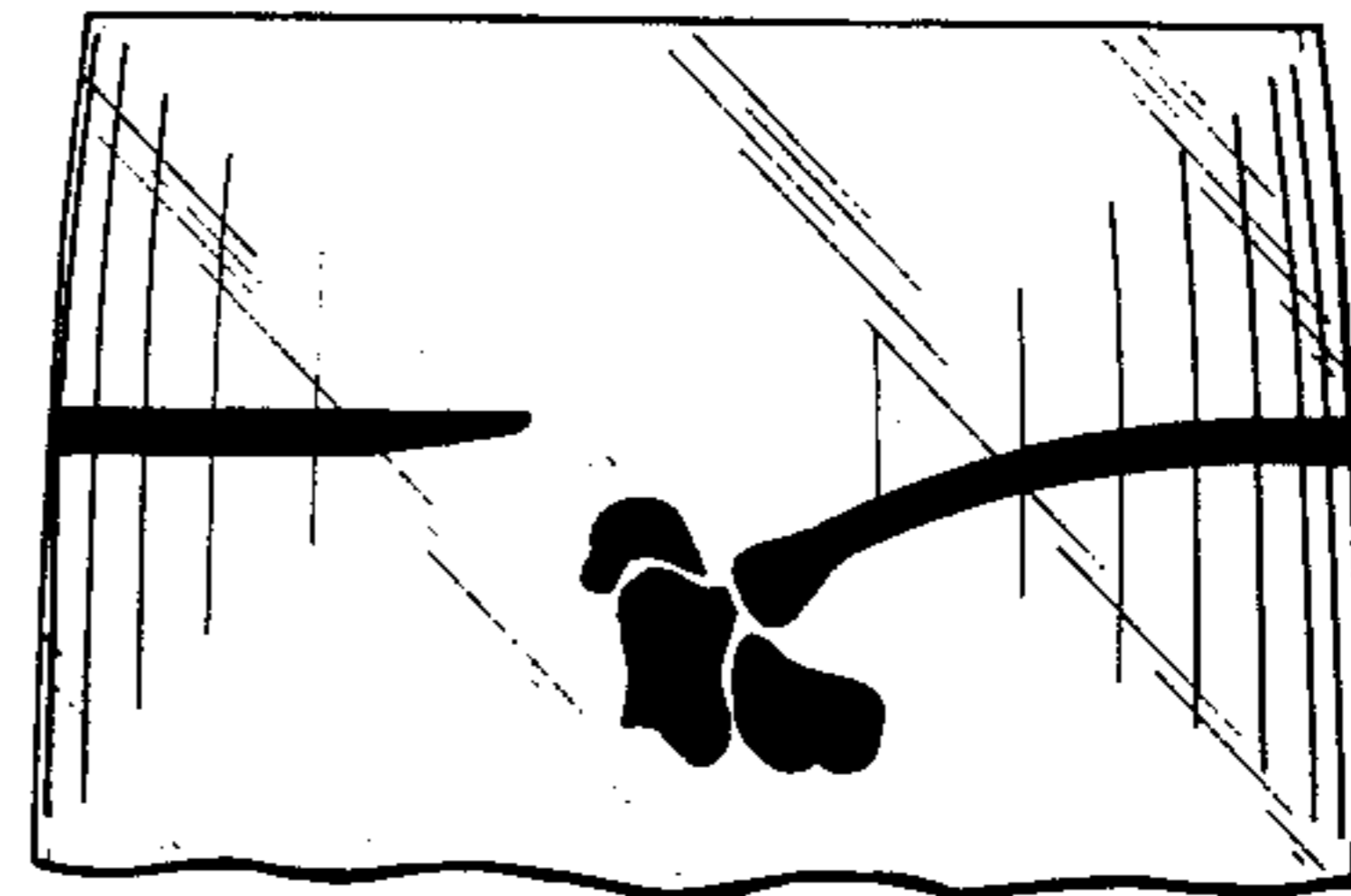
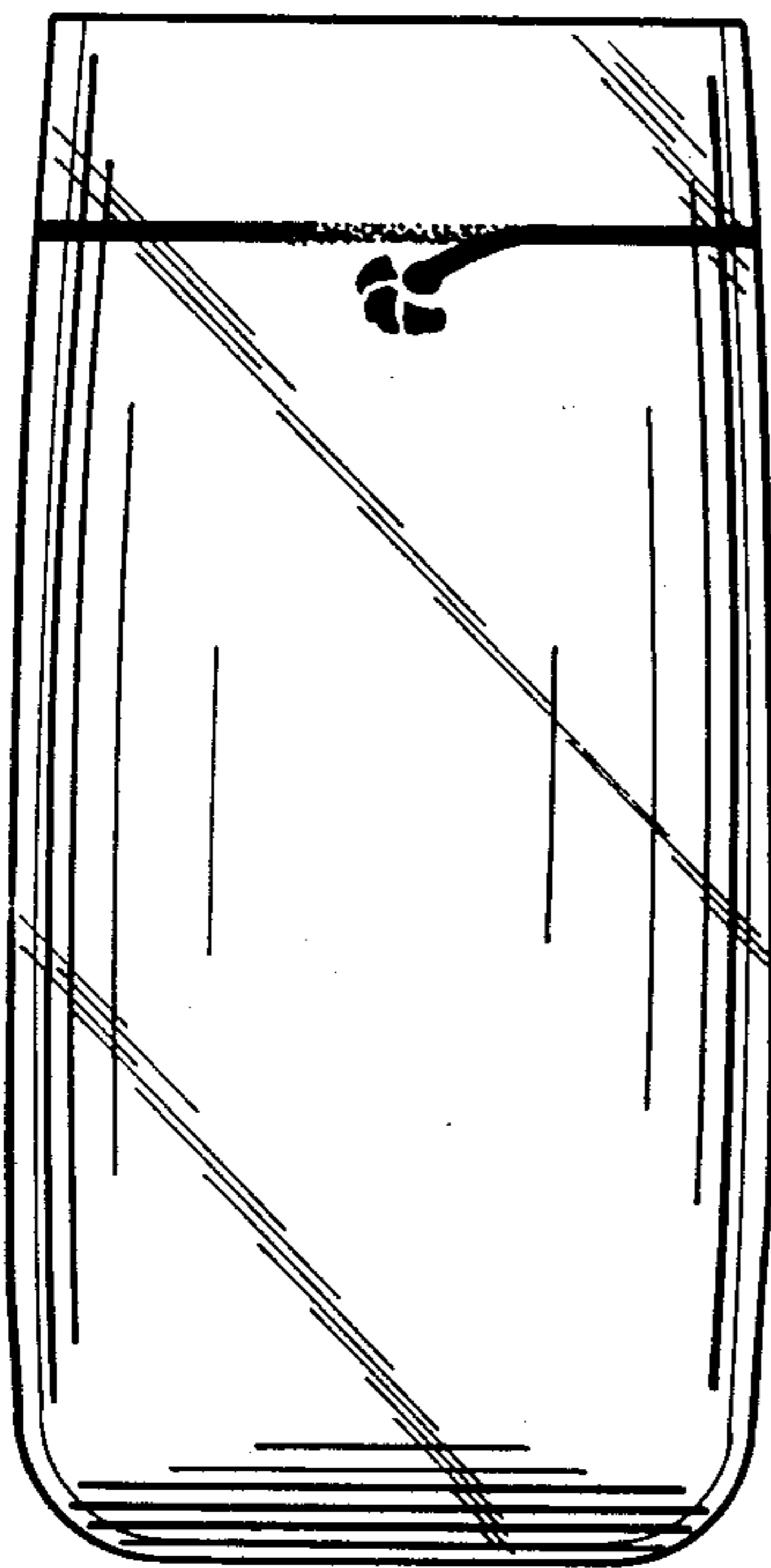
FIG. 4 is a bottom plan view.

FIG. 5 is an enlarged fragmentary view of the upper front portion of the drinking glass or the like.

FIG. 6 is an enlarged fragmentary view of a back portion of the drinking glass or the like.

FIG. 7 is a fragmentary developed view of the ornamentation of FIG. 1.

The characteristic feature of the design resides in the particular ornamentation applied to the outer wall, as shown.



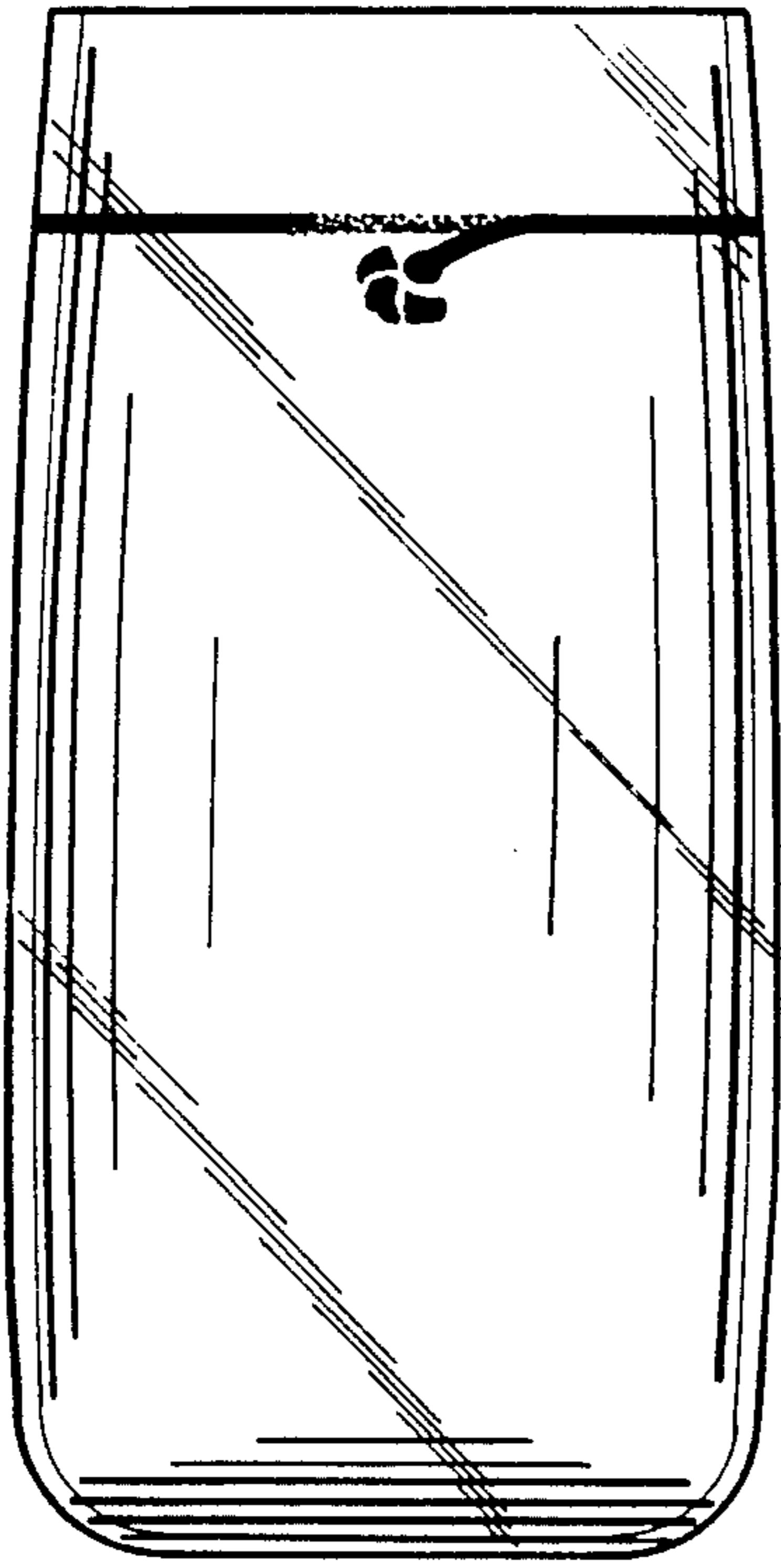

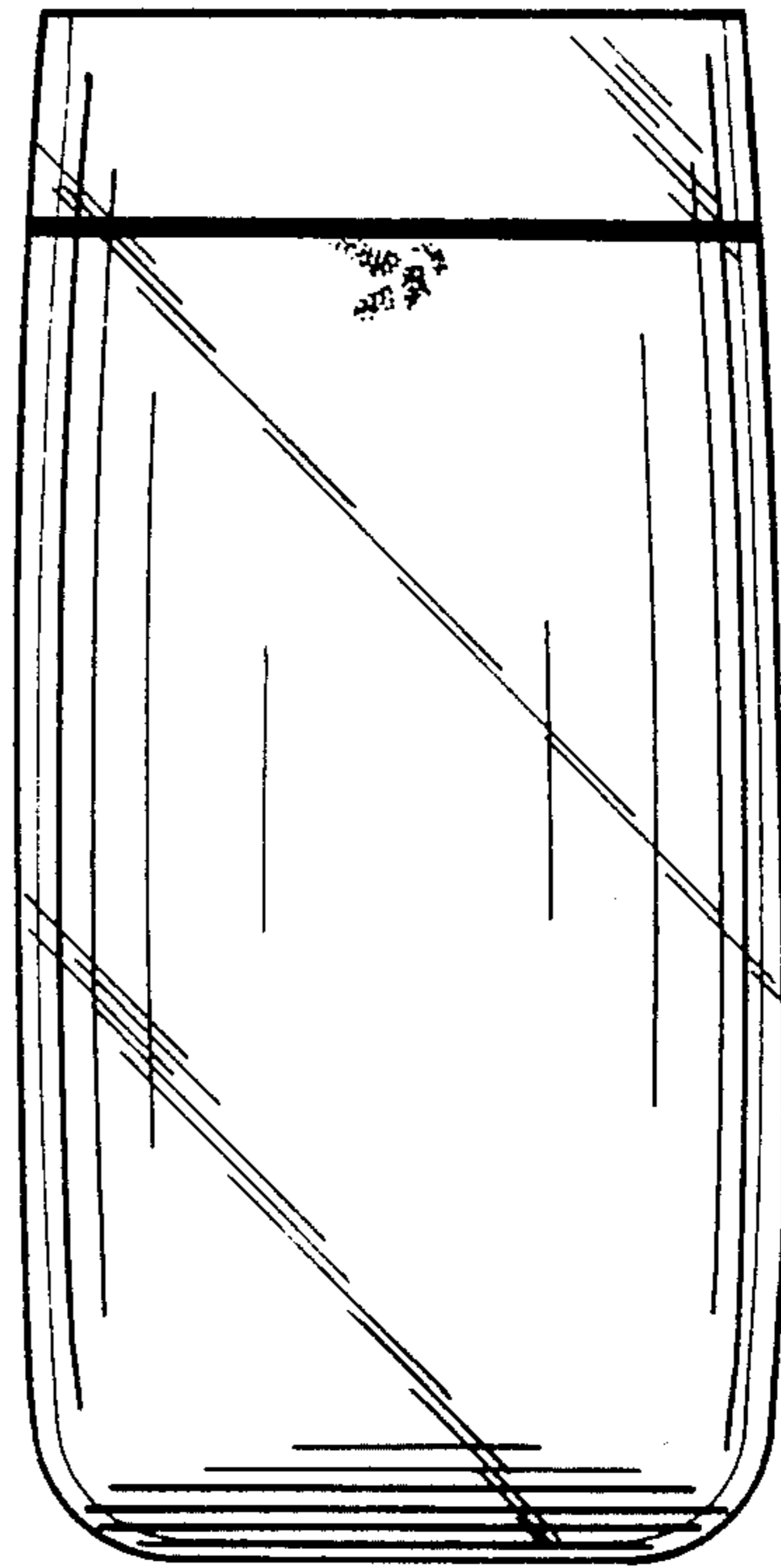

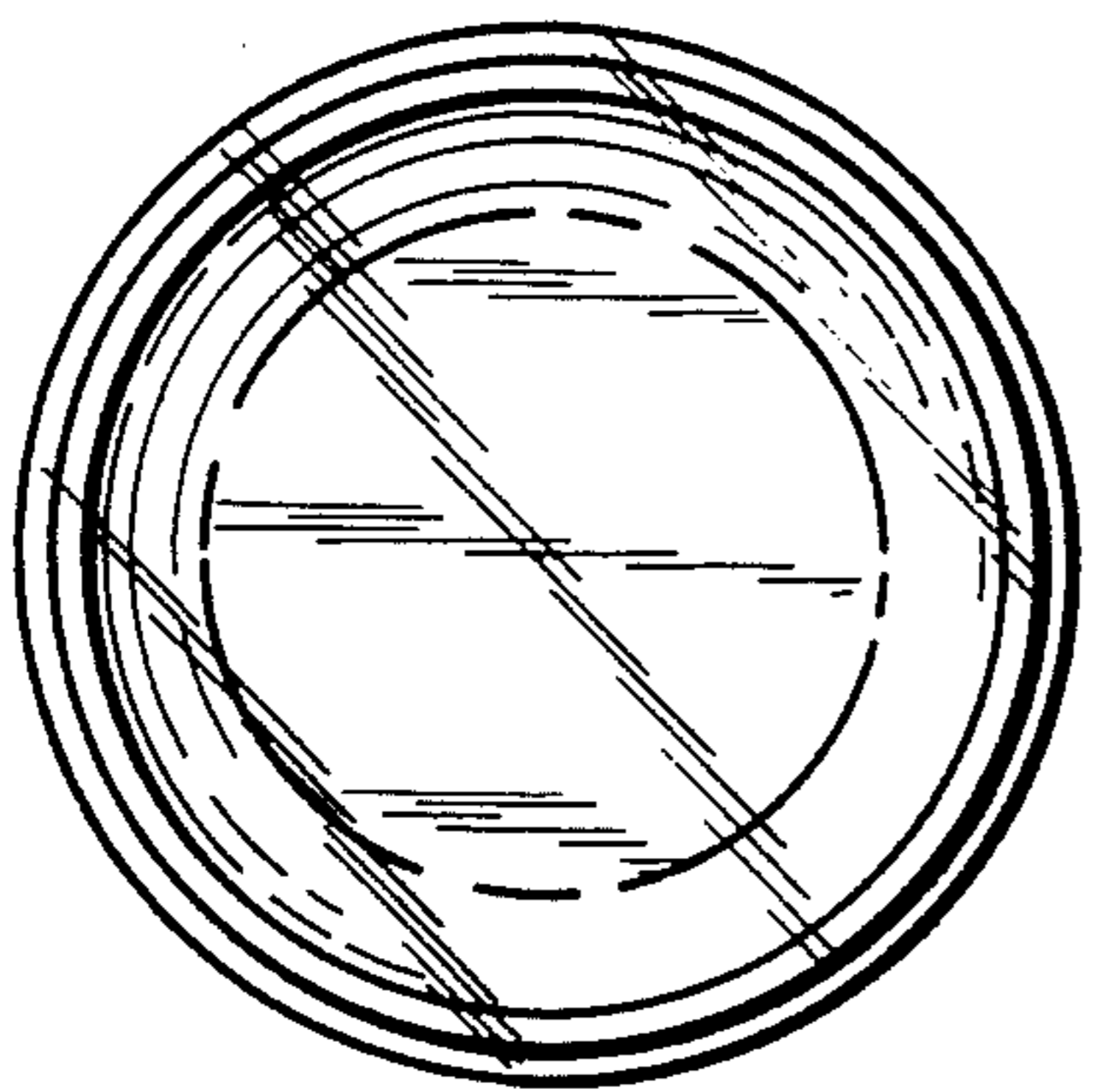

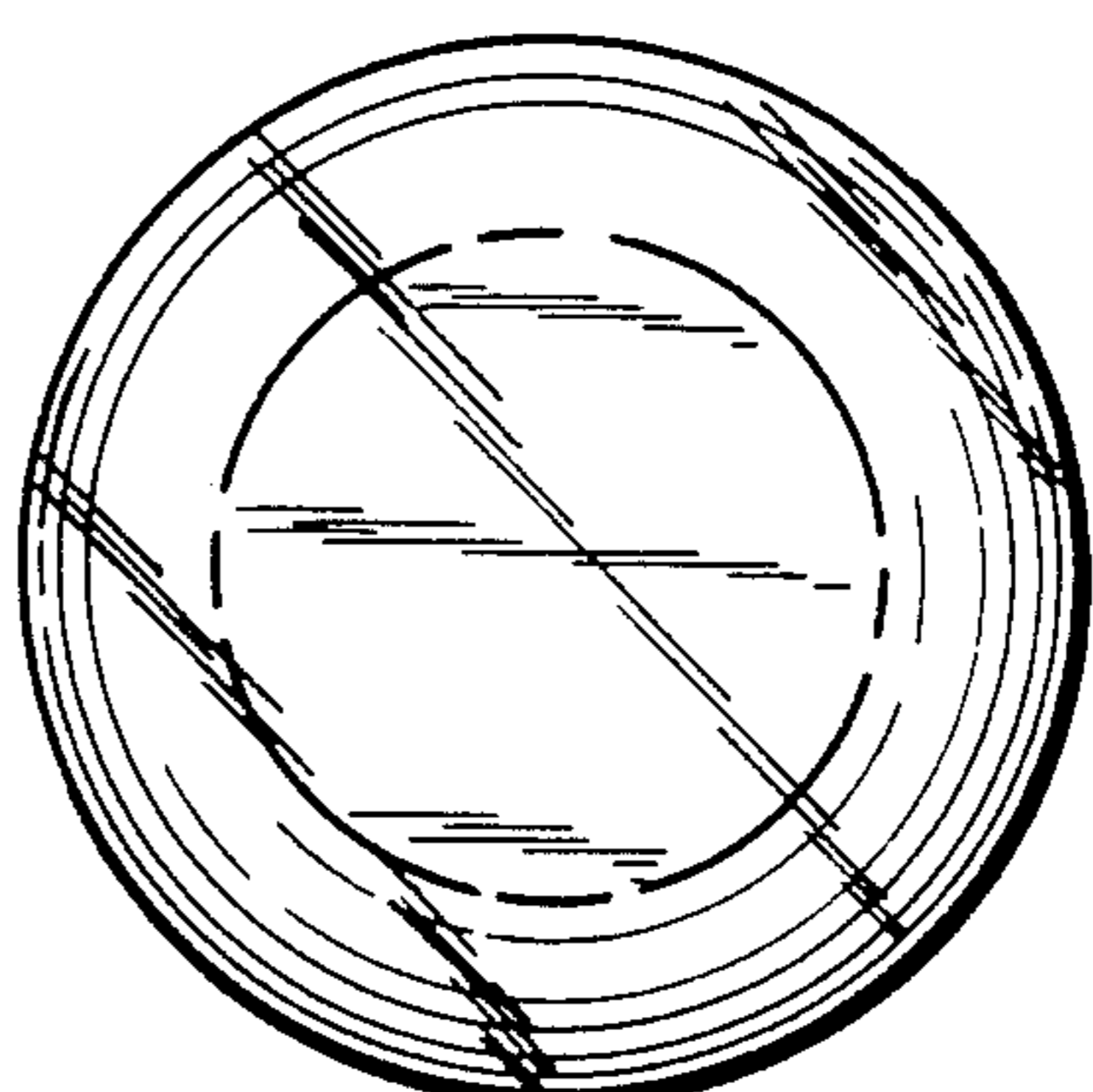

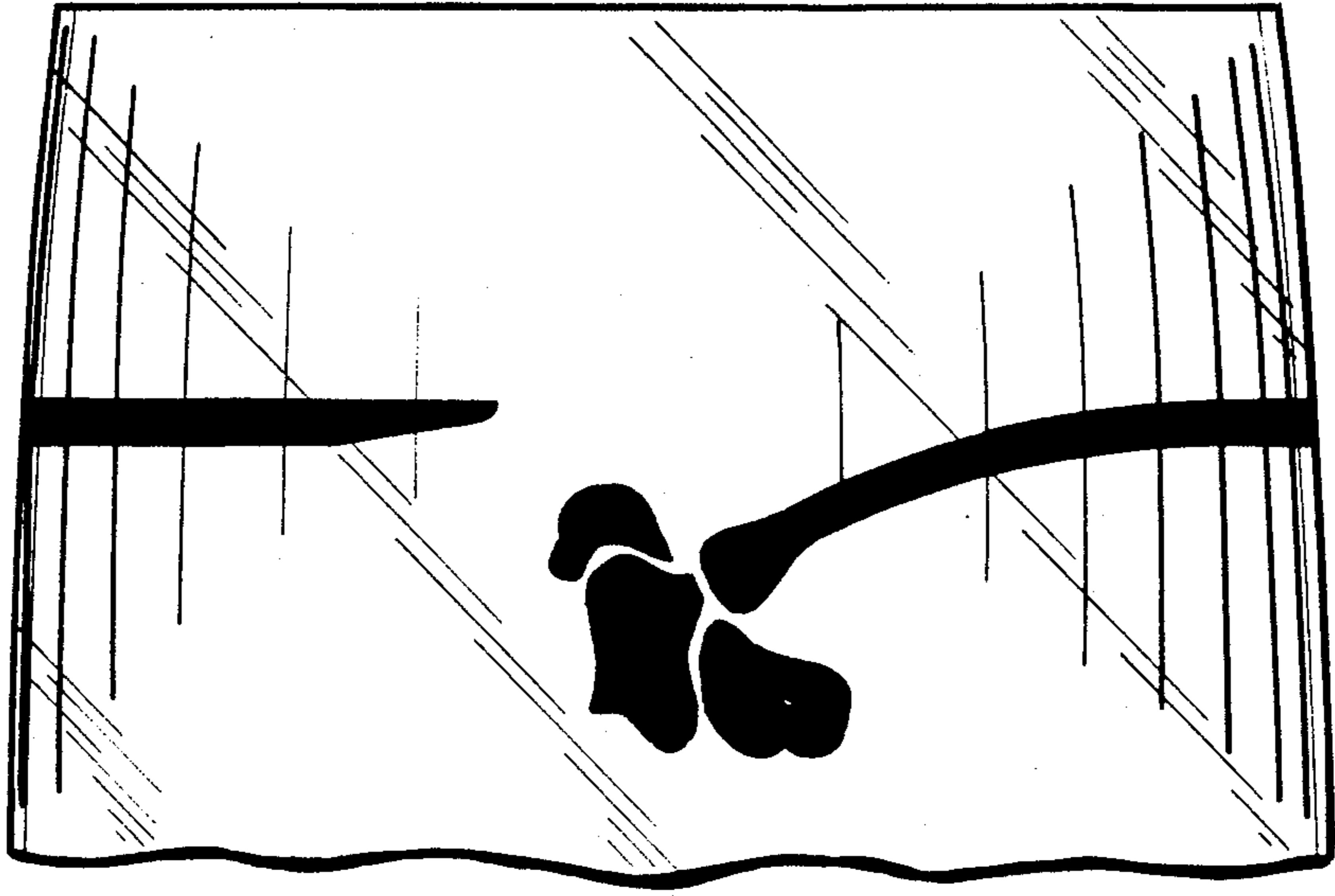

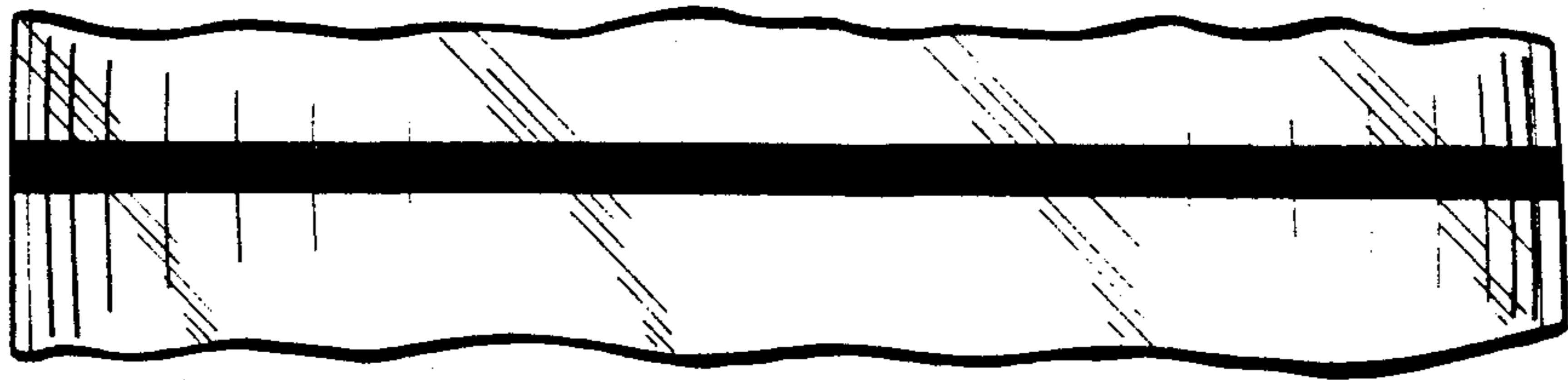

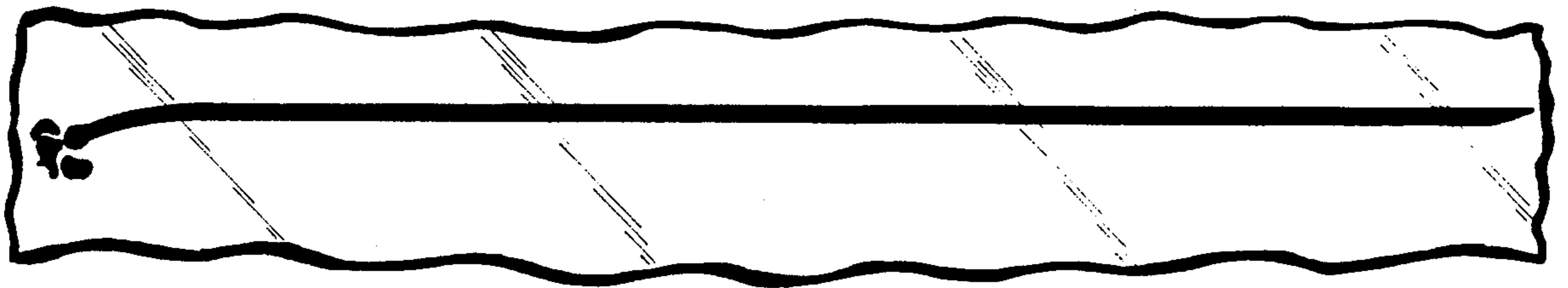
