[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a combined mailbag and holder for an umbrella and dog repellent cannister, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a combined mailbag and holder for an umbrella and dog repellent cannister showing our new design;

FIG. 2 is a side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 3 is an end view of the end shown in FIG. 1;

FIG. 4 is an end view of the end opposite that shown in FIG. 3;

FIG. 5 is a top plan view thereof, with the shoulder strap being deleted in the interest of clarity;

FIG. 6 is a bottom view thereof;

FIG. 7 is a side elevational view of the side opposite that shown in FIG. 2, with the shoulder strap being deleted in the interest of clarity;

FIG. 8 is a side elevational view of a second form of mailbag showing our new design, having a dog-repelling umbrella-receiving pocket on one side of the bag, with the shoulder strap being deleted in the interest of clarity;

FIG. 9 is a side elevational view of the side opposite that shown in FIG. 8, with the shoulder strap being deleted in the interest of clarity;

FIG. 10 is an end view of the mailbag shown in FIGS. 8 and 9, with the shoulder strap deleted in the interest of clarity;

FIG. 11 is an end view of the end opposite that shown in FIG. 10, with the shoulder strap being deleted in the interest of clarity;

FIG. 12 is a top plan view of a third form of mailbag showing our new design formed with a pair of folding top flaps between which is received a dog-repelling umbrella, with such mailbag also being provided with a dog repellent holder, and with the shoulder strap being deleted in the interest of clarity;


FIG. 13 is a bottom view of the mailbag of FIG. 12;


FIG. 14 is a front perspective view of the mailbag of FIGS. 12 and 13, with the top flaps open, and with the shoulder strap being deleted in the interest of clarity;


FIG. 15 is an end view of the mailbag of FIGS. 12, 13, and 14, with the flaps open, and with the shoulder strap being deleted in the interest of clarity;

FIG. 16 is a side elevational view corresponding to FIGS. 14 and 15, with the shoulder strap being deleted in the interest of clarity; and


FIG. 17 is a cross-sectional view taken along line 17—17 of FIG. 14.











