The ornamental design for a sanitary faucet, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view taken from the top, rear and left side of a lavatory faucet showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a perspective view taken from the bottom, front and right side thereof; and

FIG. 3 is a top plan view thereof.

The broken line representation of faucet handles in FIGS. 1, 2 and 3 is for purposes of illustration only.

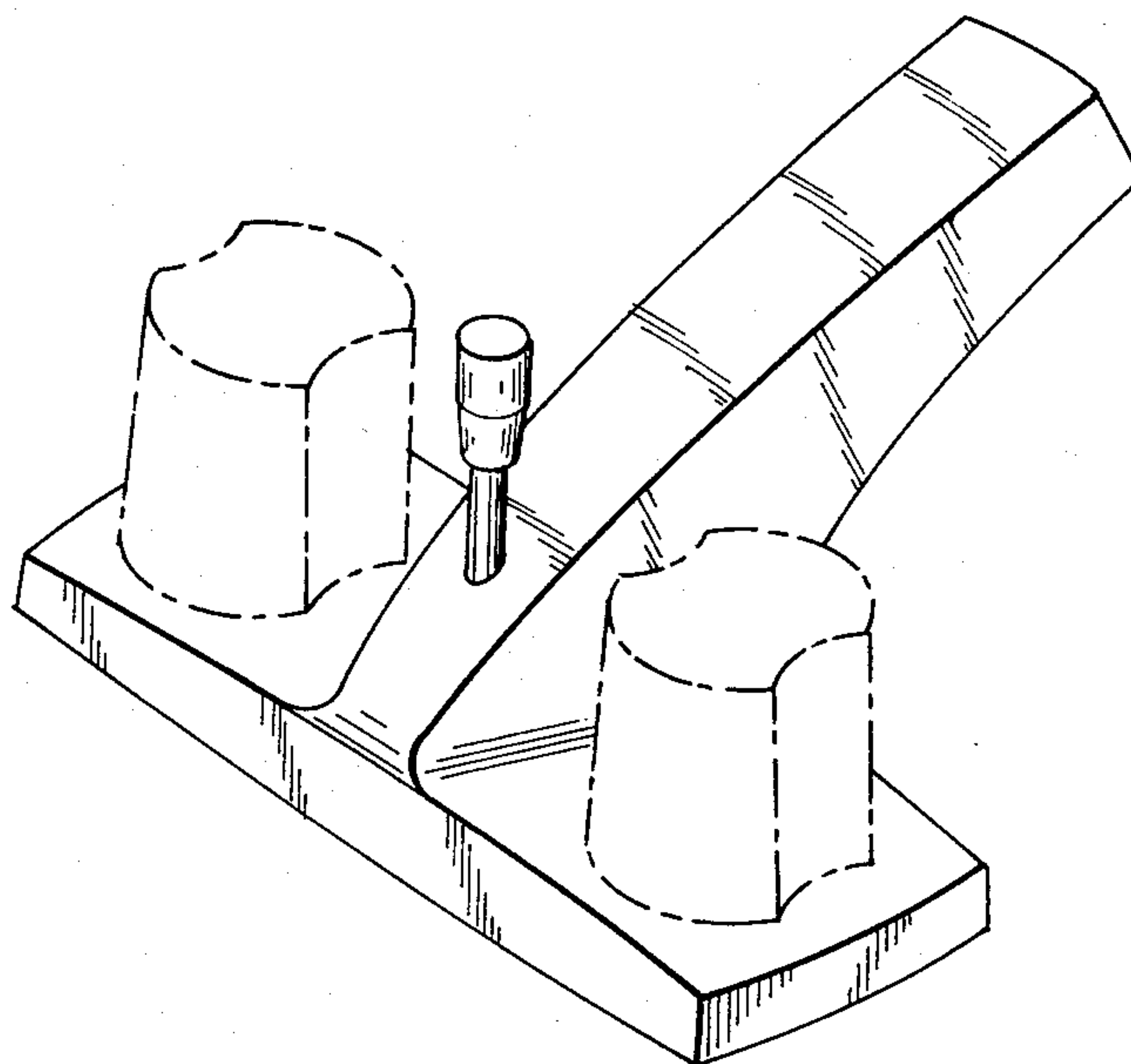

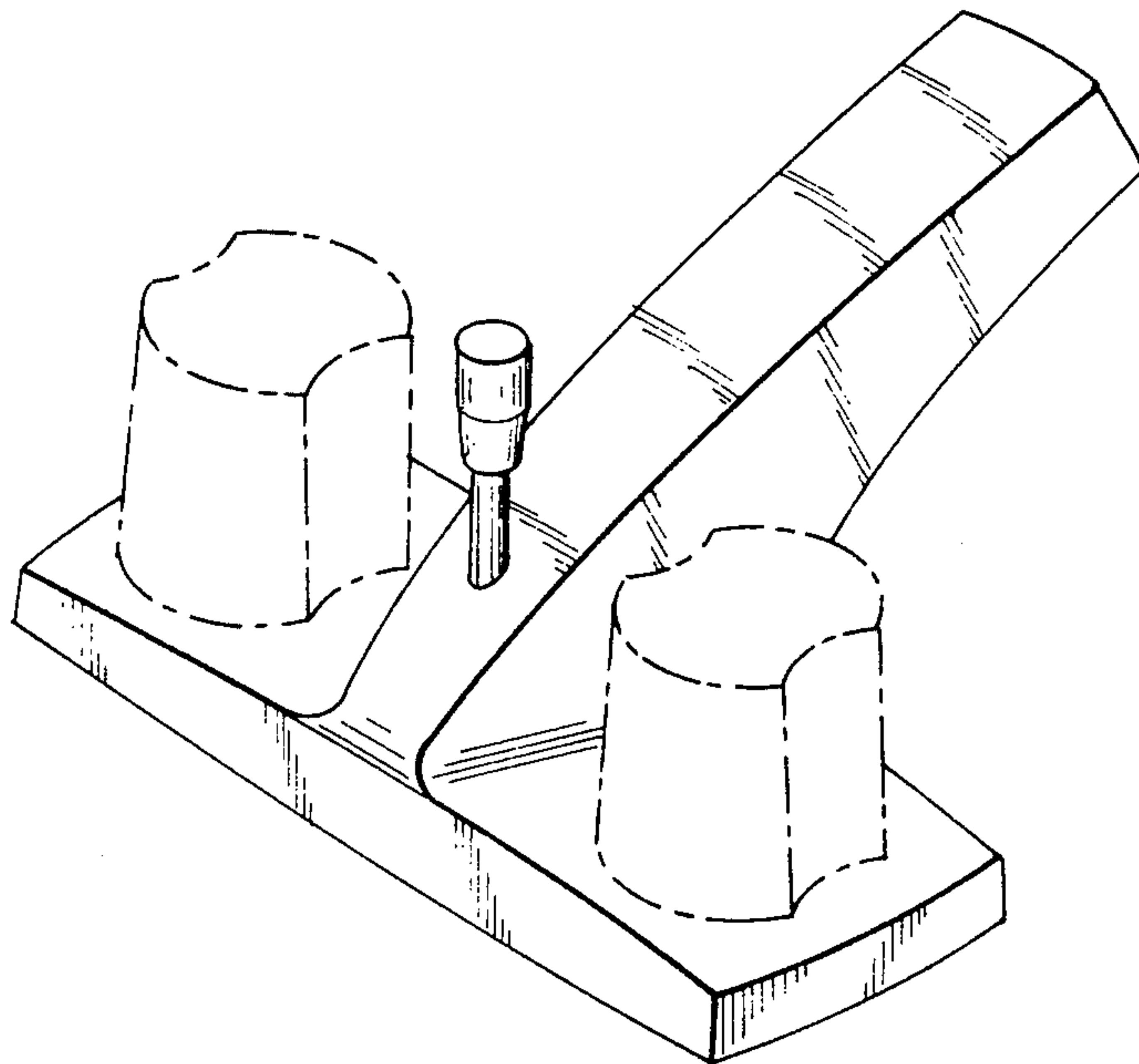

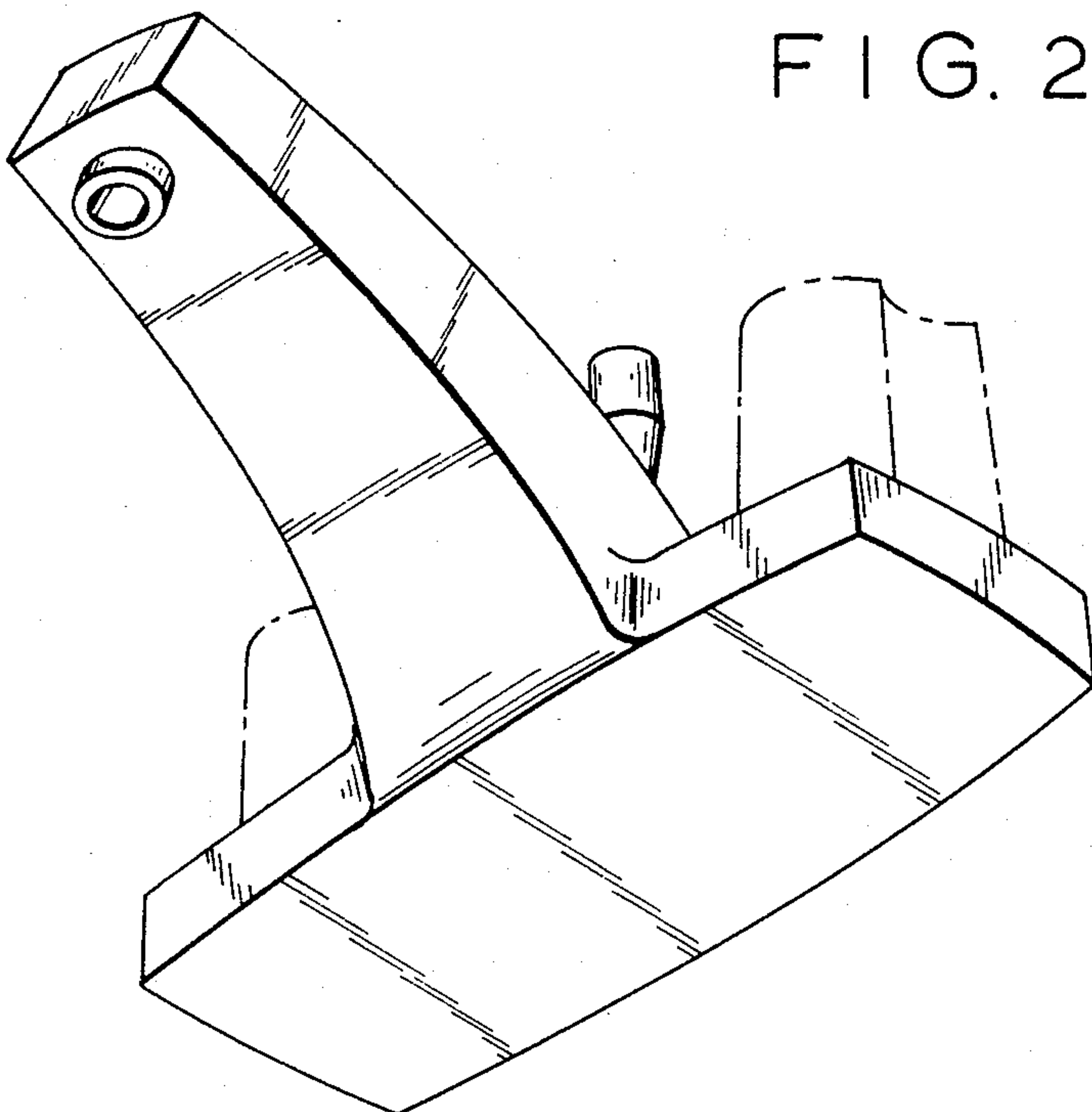
