The ornamental design of the guy wire marker, substan-

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a fragmentary perspective view of a guy wire
marker showing our new design with the guy wire and
wire ties shown in broken lines for illustrative purposes
only;

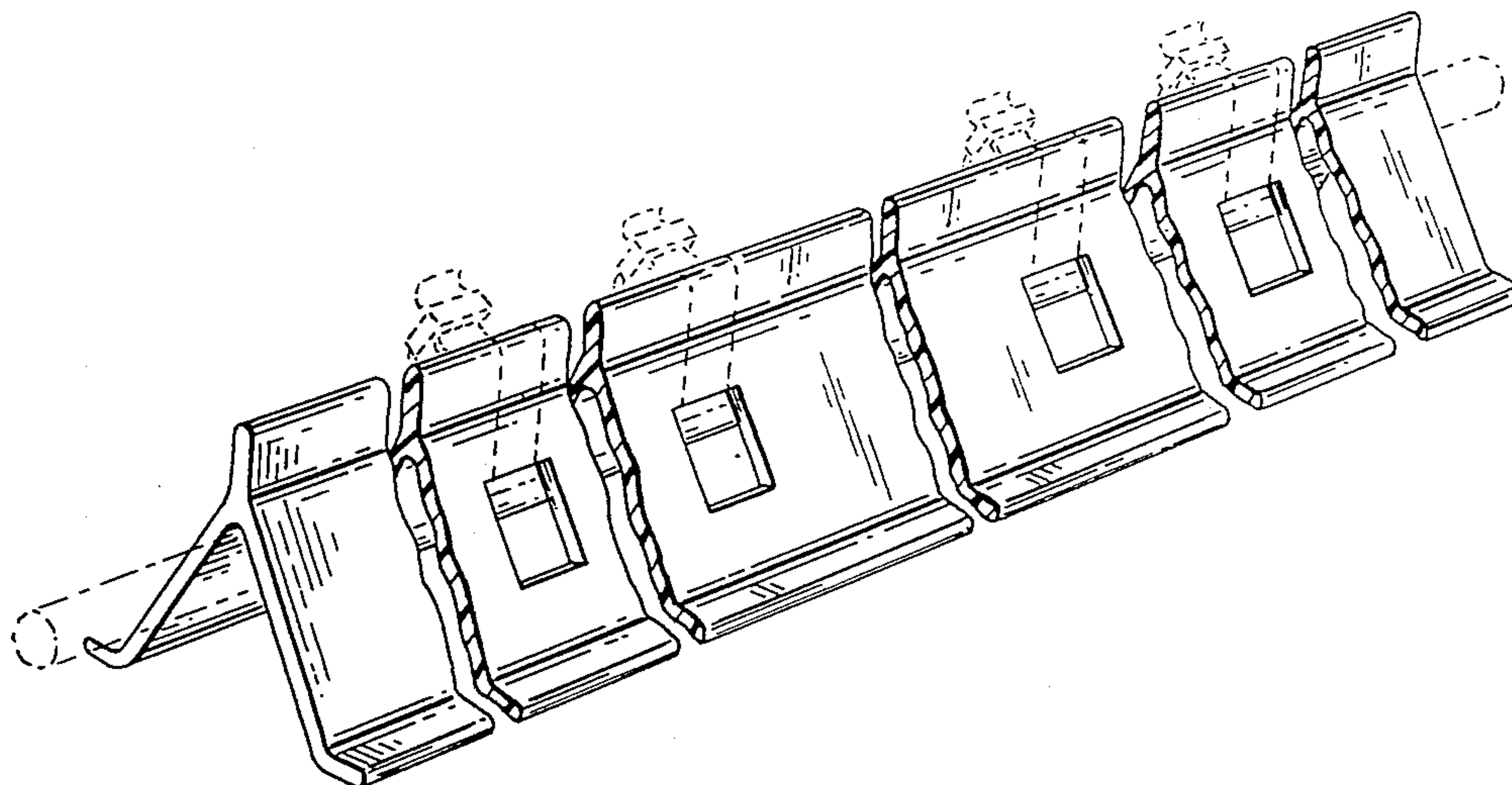
FIG. 2 is an end elevational view thereof, the opposite
end being identical;

FIG. 3 is a fragmentary side elevational view thereof,
the opposite side being identical;

FIG. 4 is a fragmentary top plan view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a fragmentary bottom plan view thereof.

The FIGS. 1, 3, 4 and 5 are fragmentarily shown to
indicate indeterminate length.



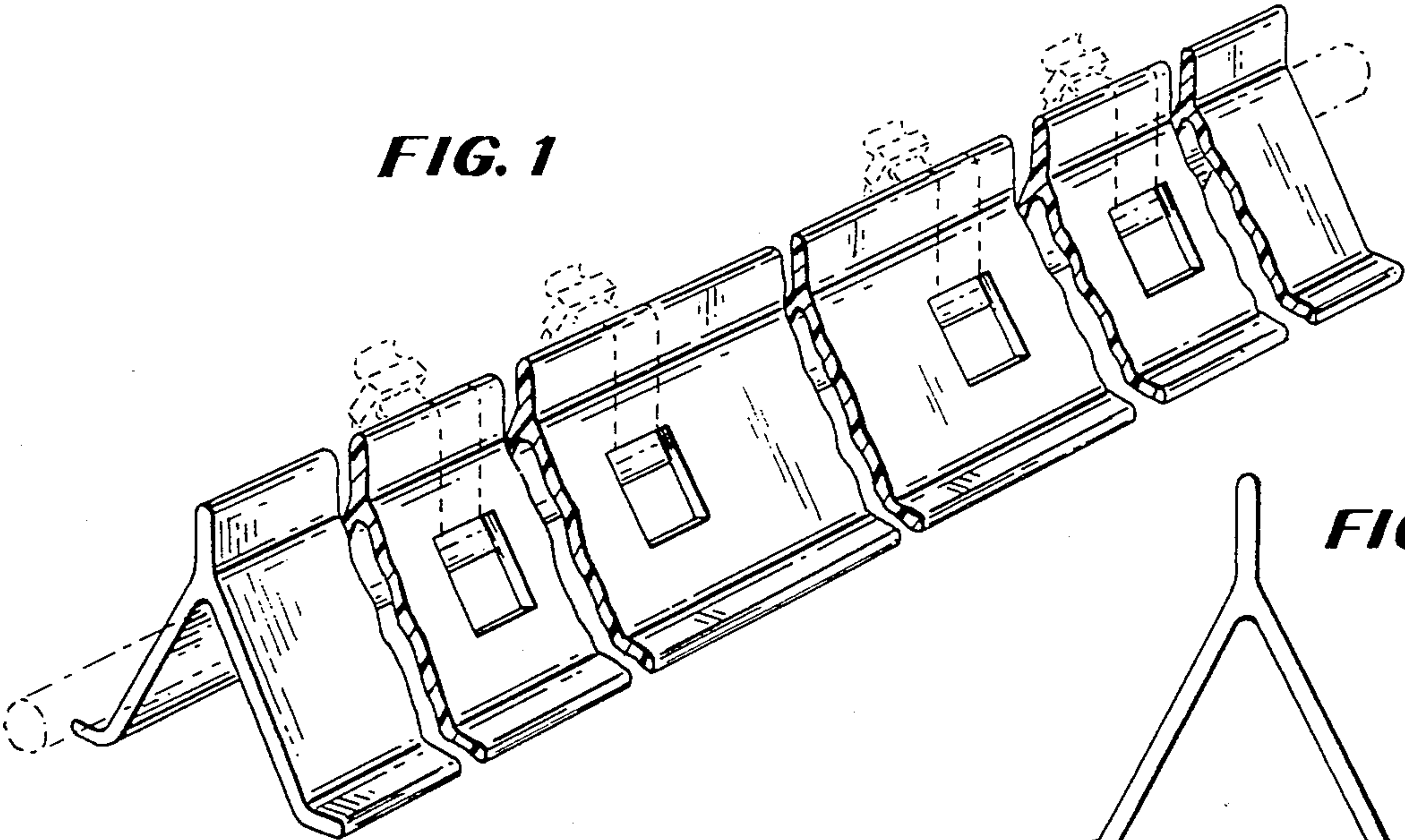

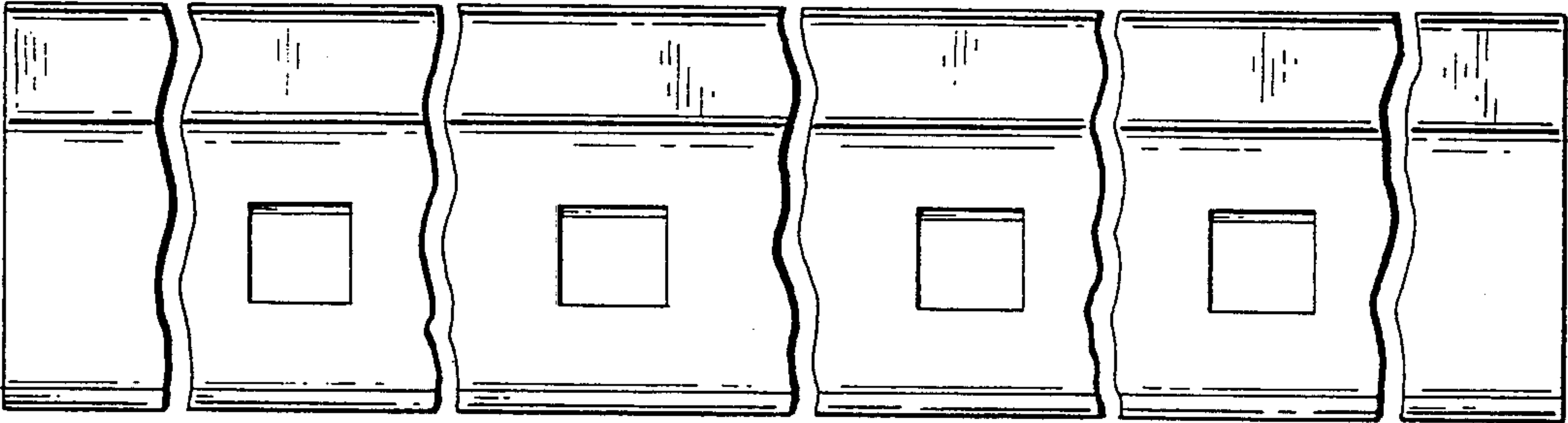

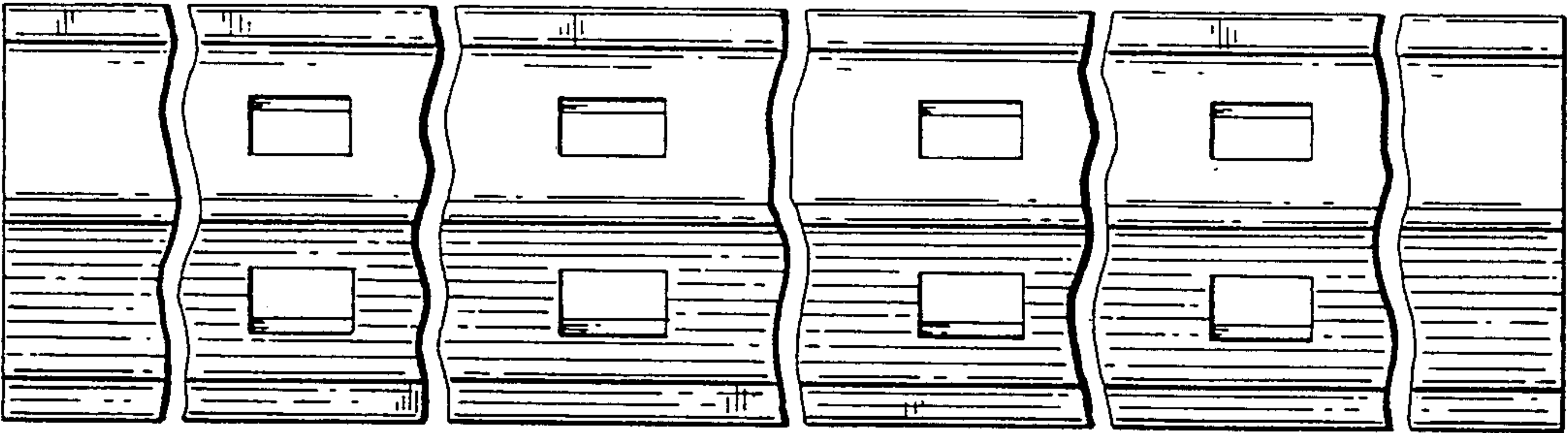
