[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a storage rack for food processor blades, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a storage rack for food processor blades showing my new design; FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof; FIG. 3 is a back elevational view thereof; FIG. 4 is a bottom plan view thereof; FIG. 5 is a left side elevational view, the right side being a mirror image thereof.

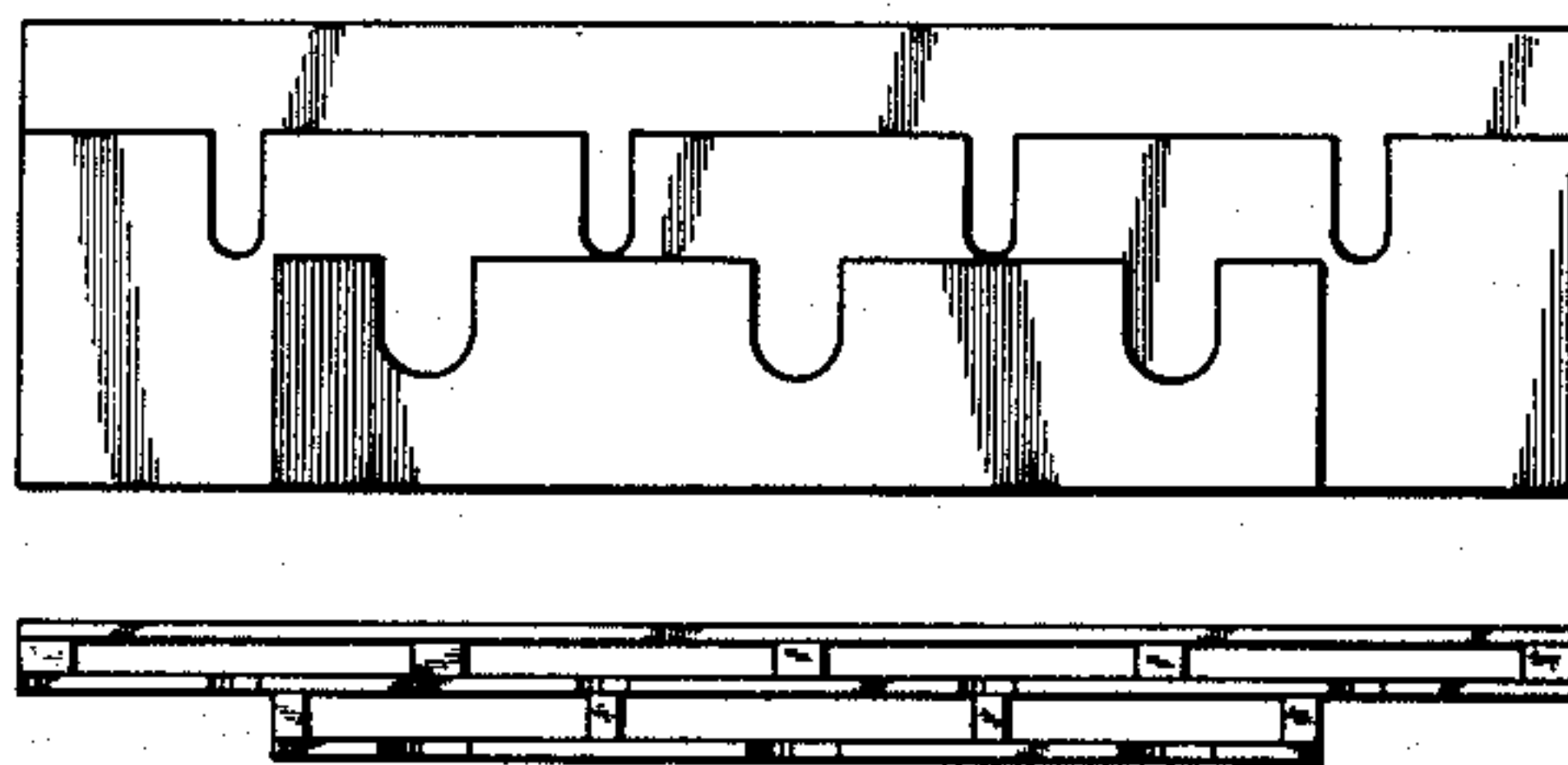

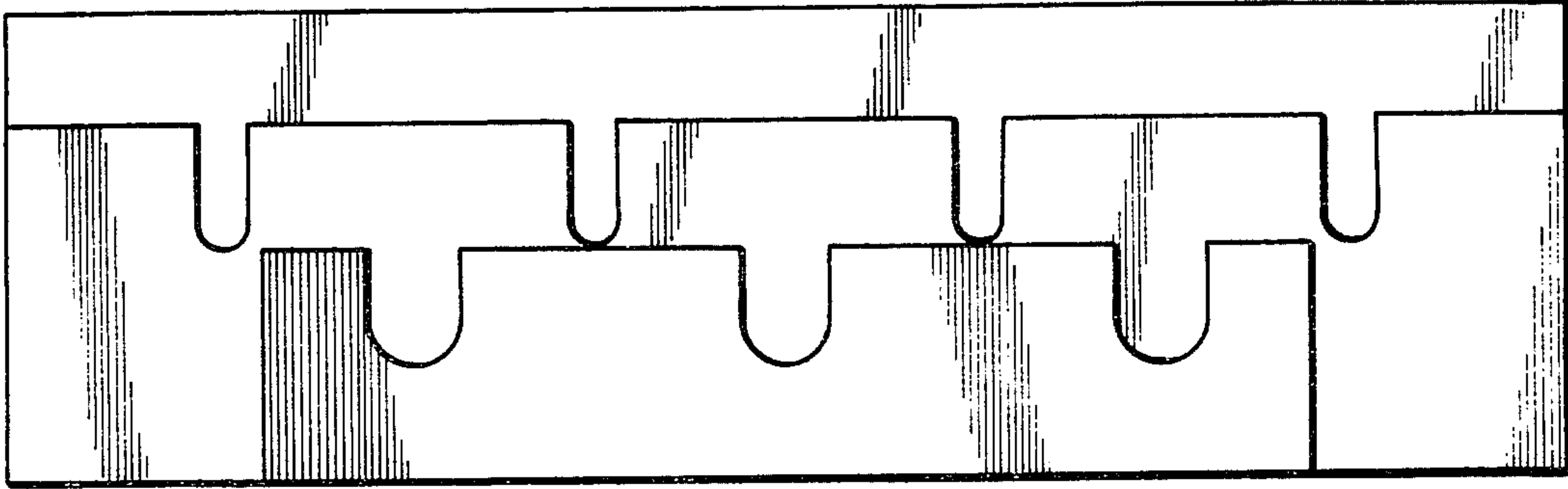

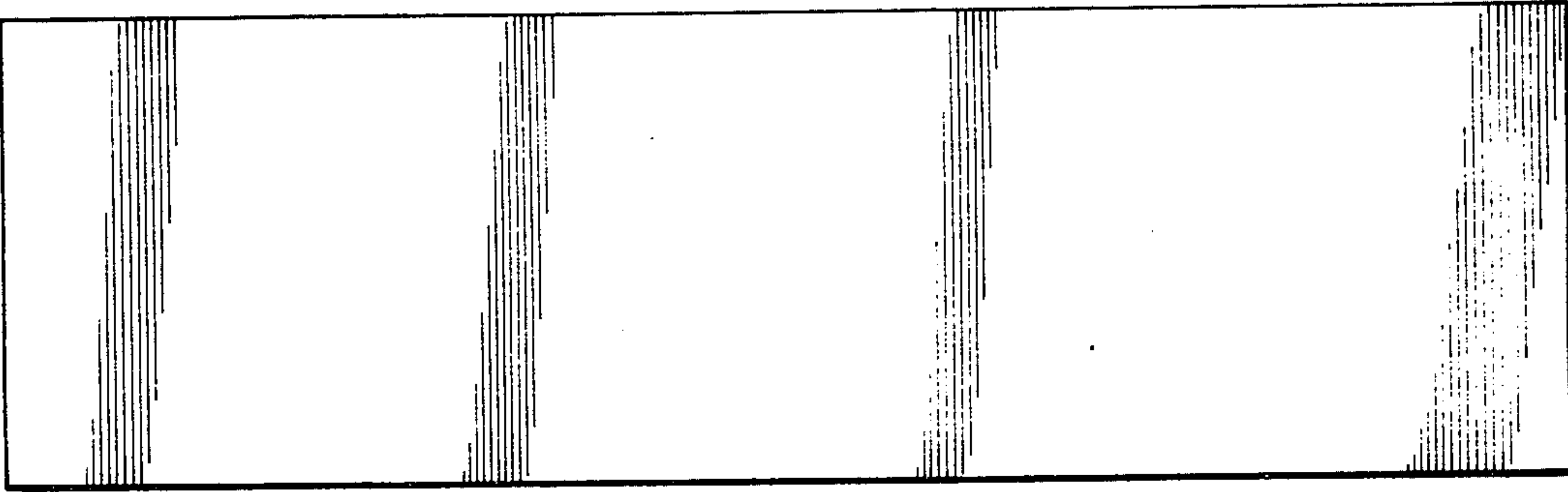

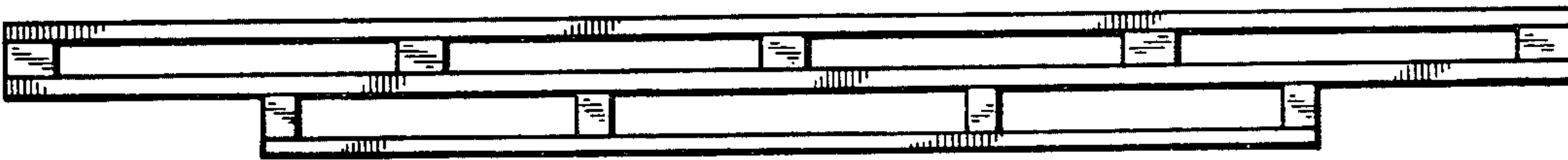
