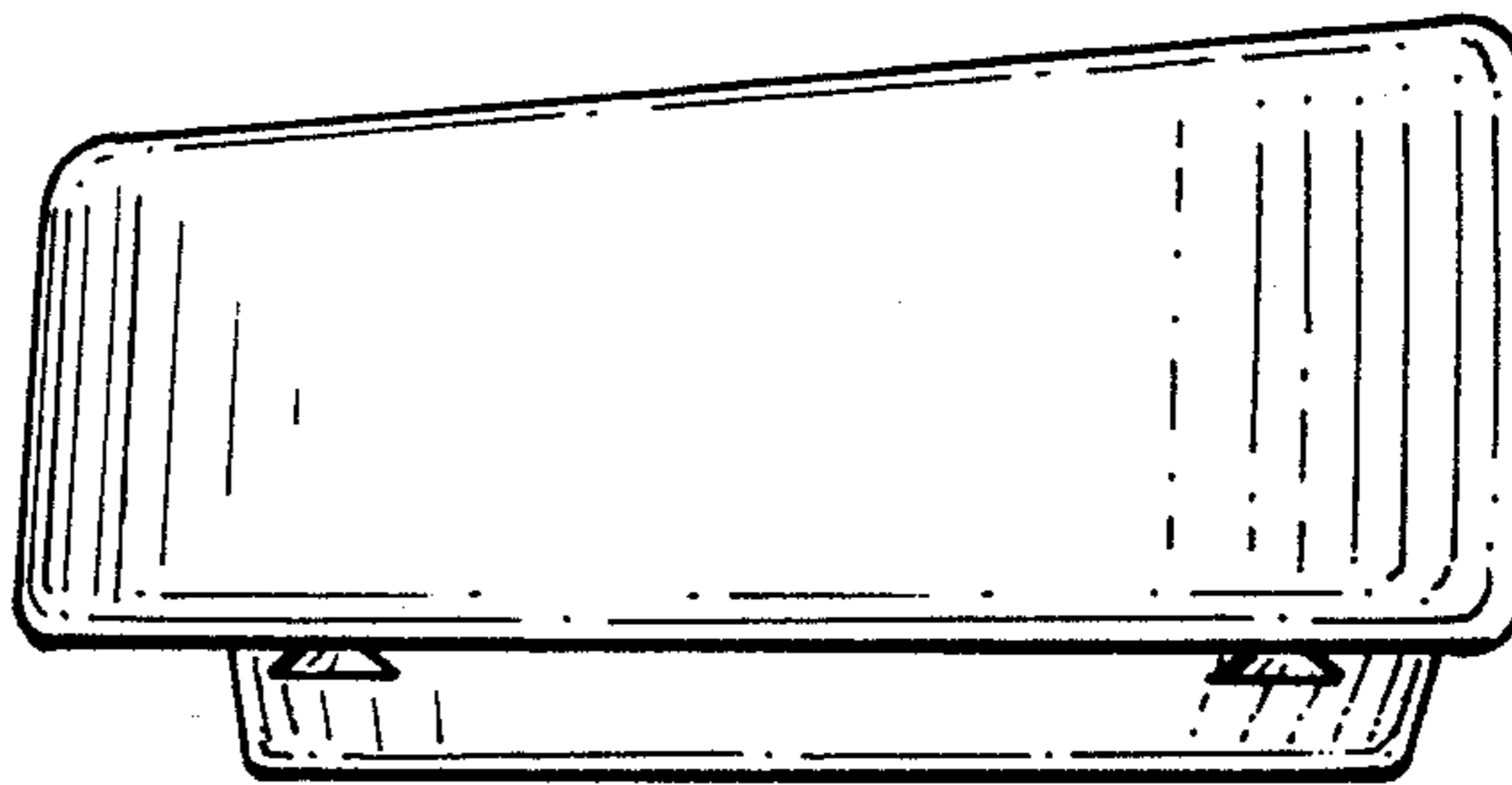
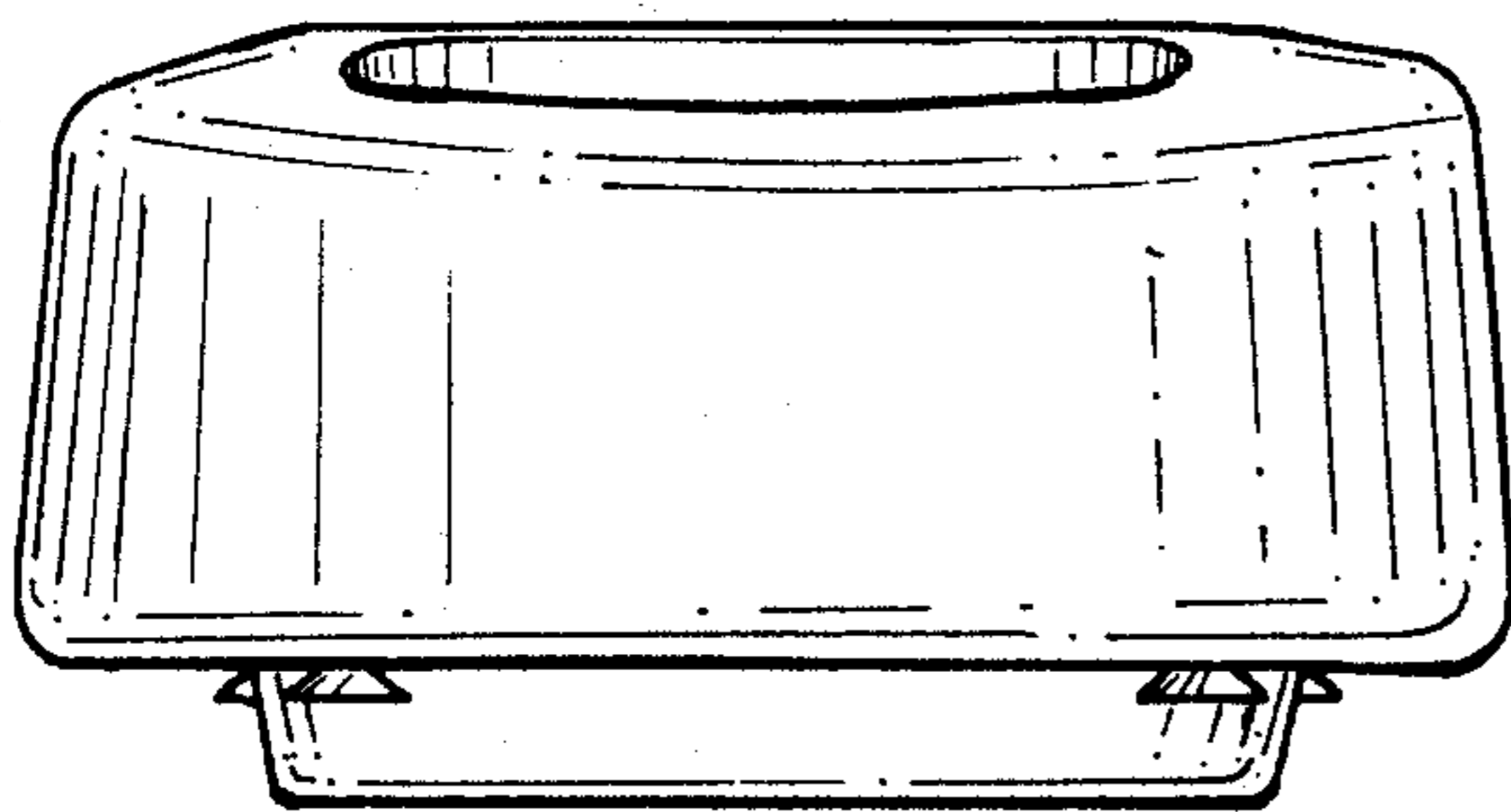

FIG. 6 is a cross sectional view taken on line 6—6 of FIG. 2.



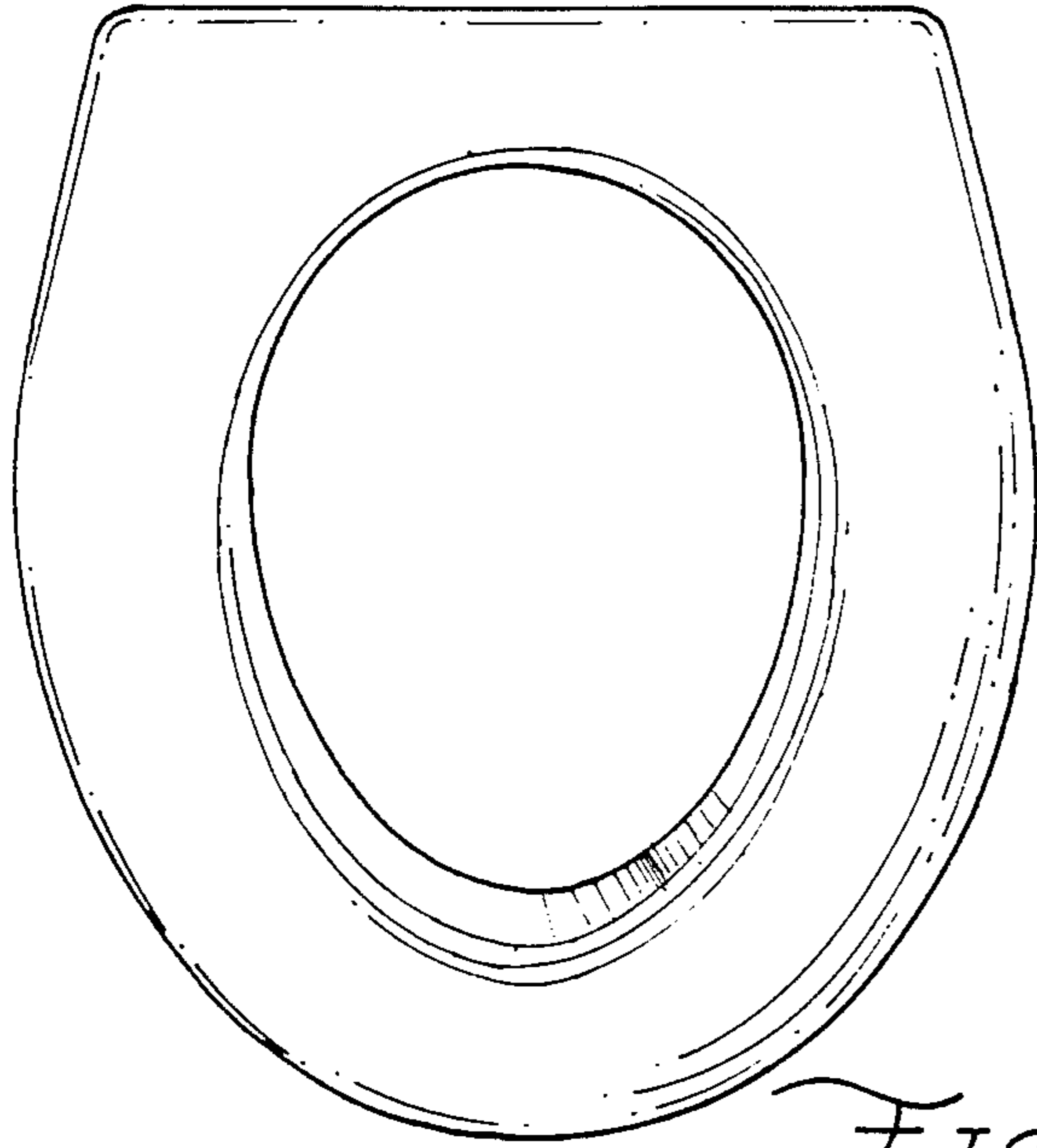

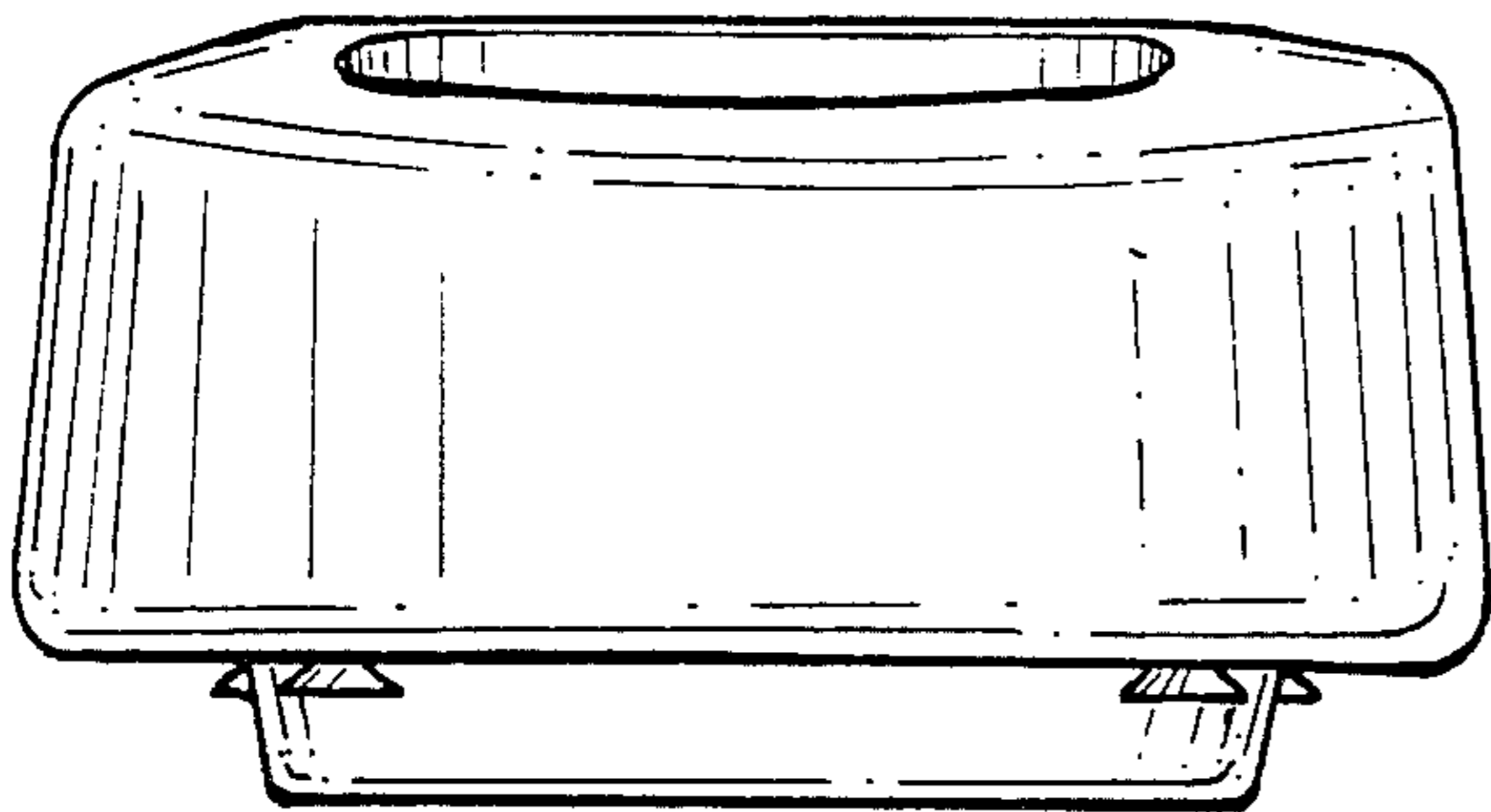

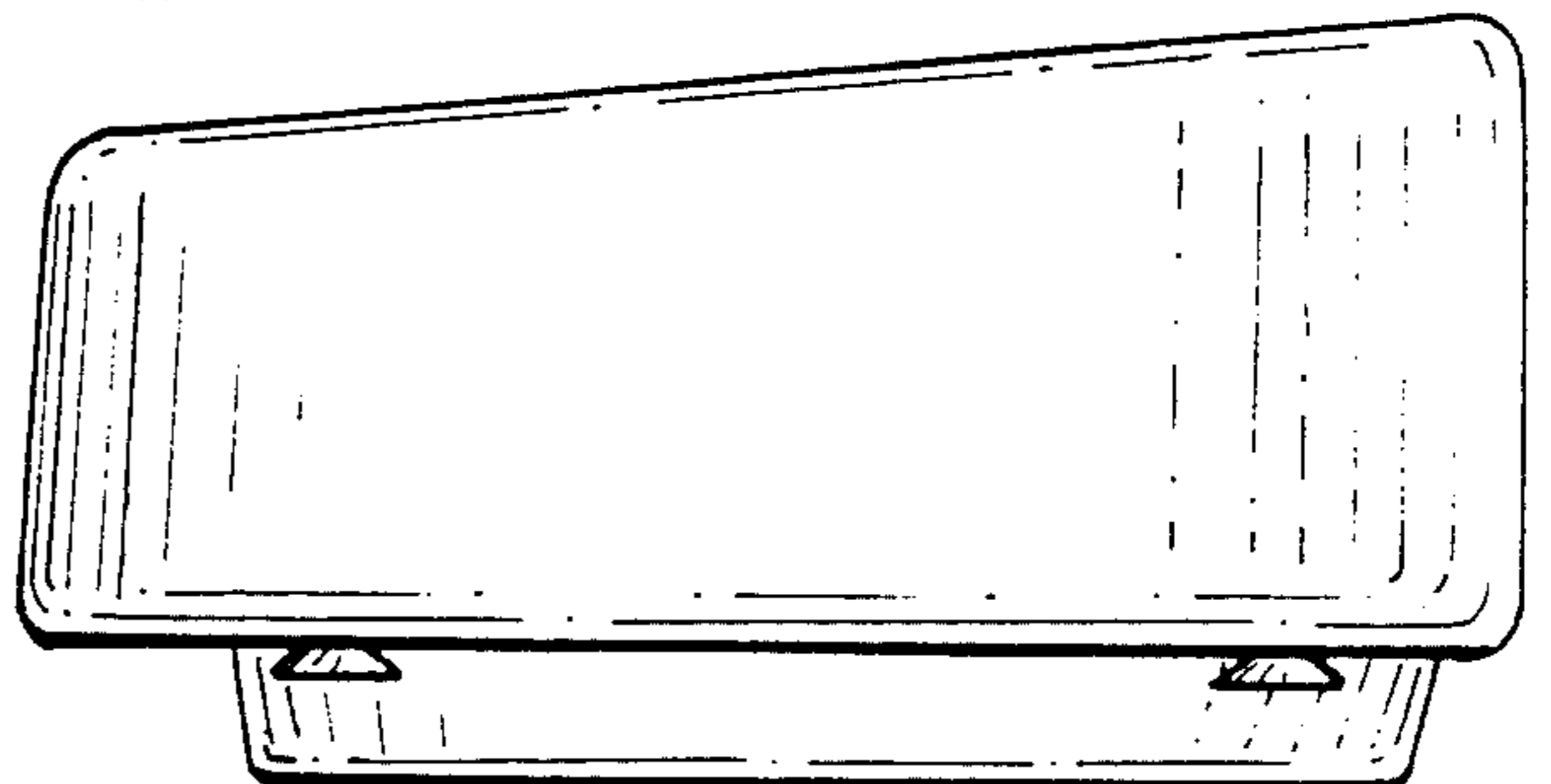

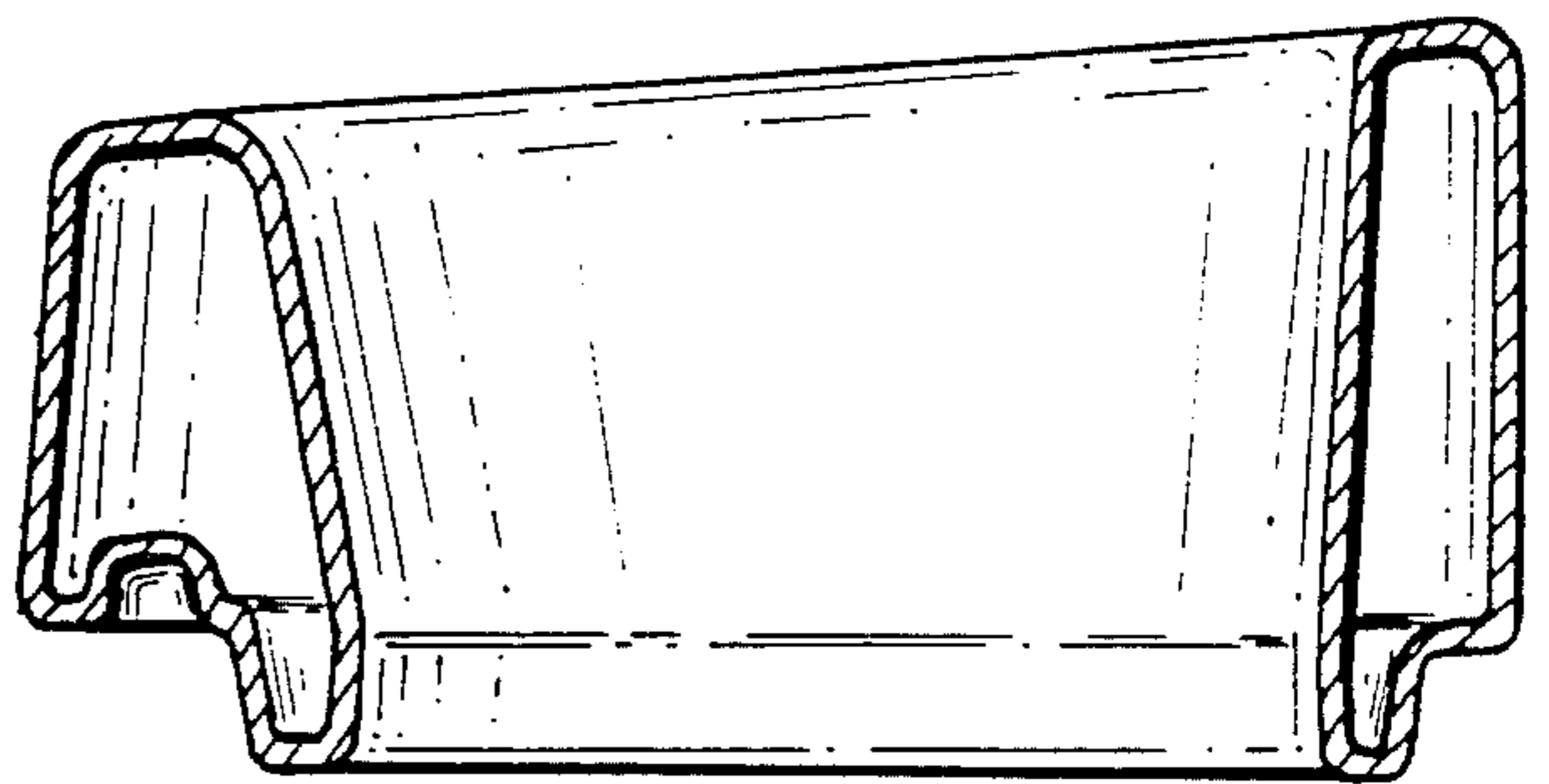
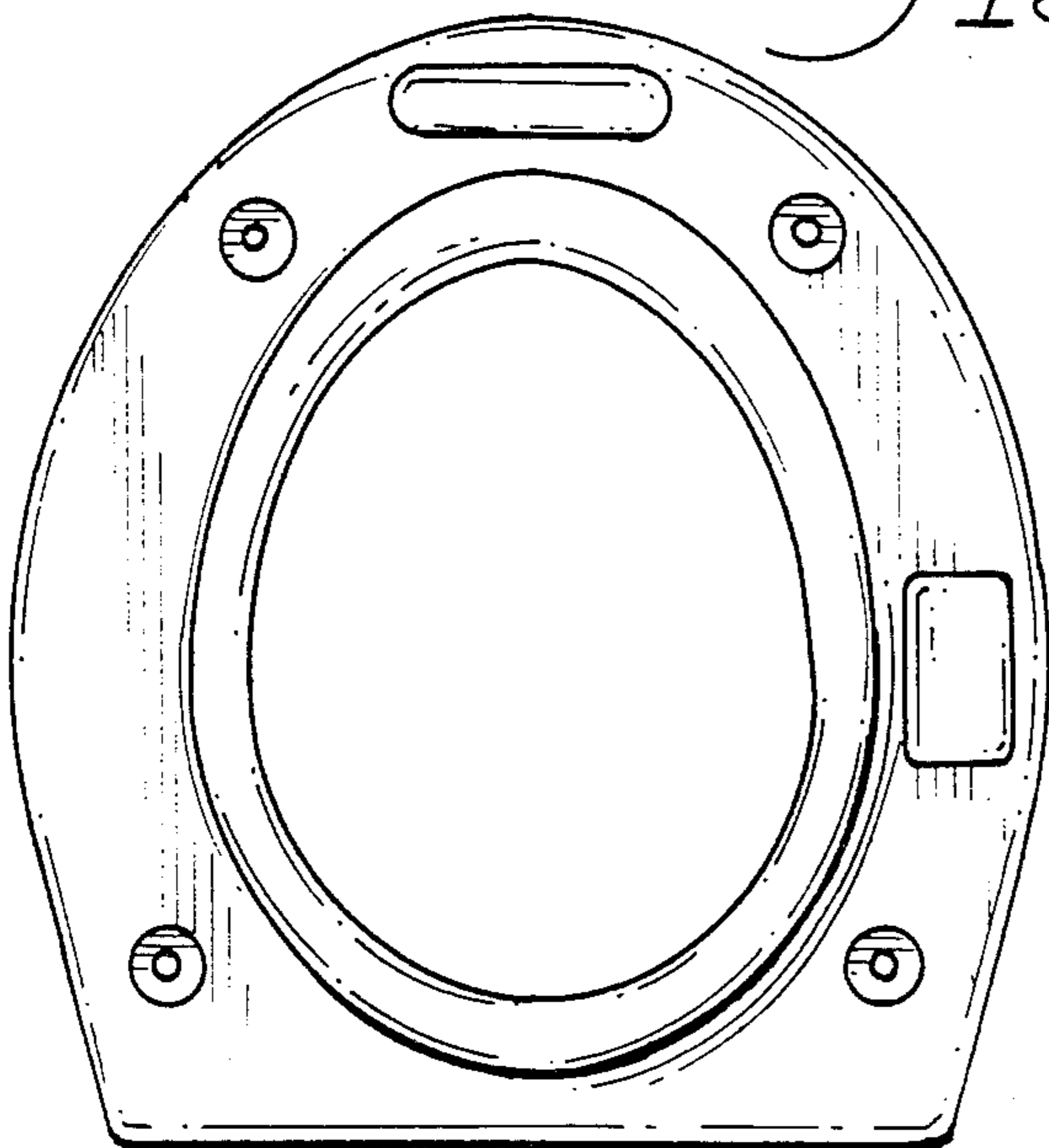
