[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a foldable hook unit to support a medical container or similar article, as shown and described.

**DESCRIPTION**

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a foldable hook unit to support a medical container or similar article showing our new design; and

FIG. 2 is a top plan view of the unit shown in FIG. 1 with the unit being presented in unfolded condition;

FIG. 3 is an elevational view of the side of the unit shown in FIG. 2 as viewed from the right.

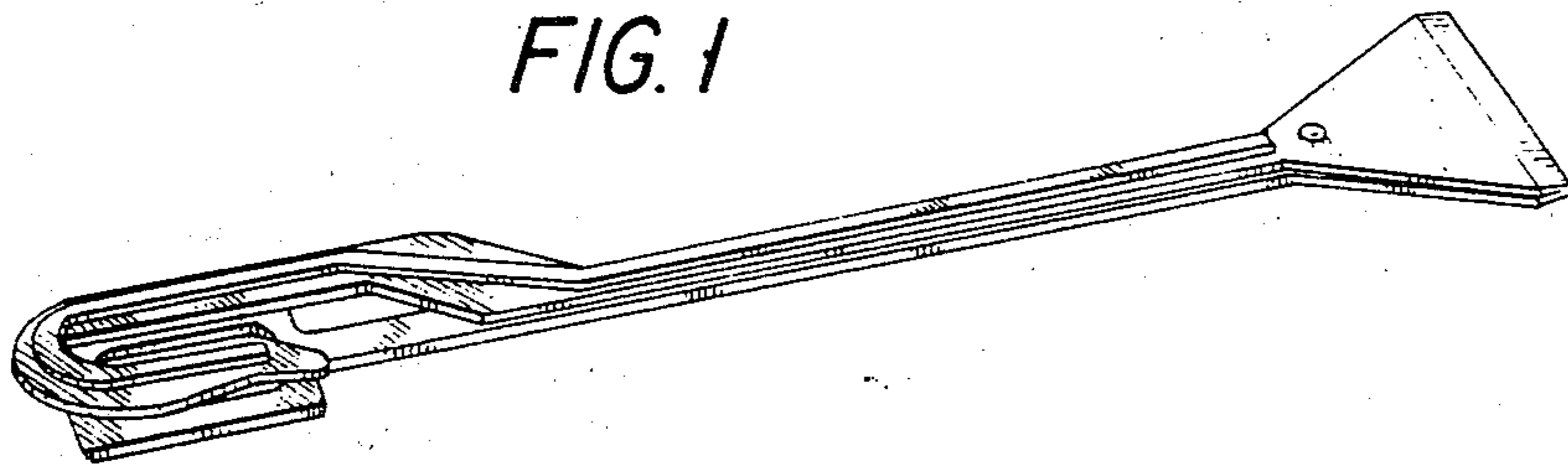

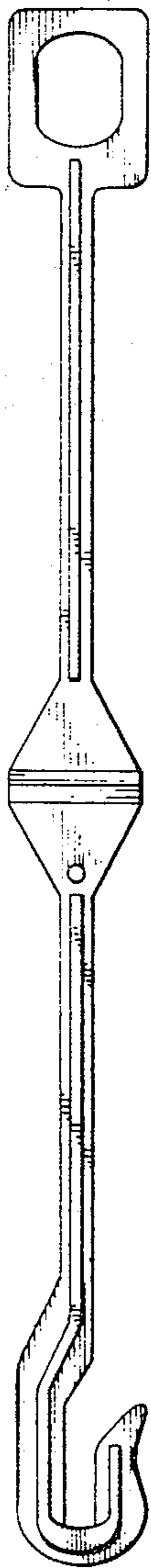
