of the claimed design.

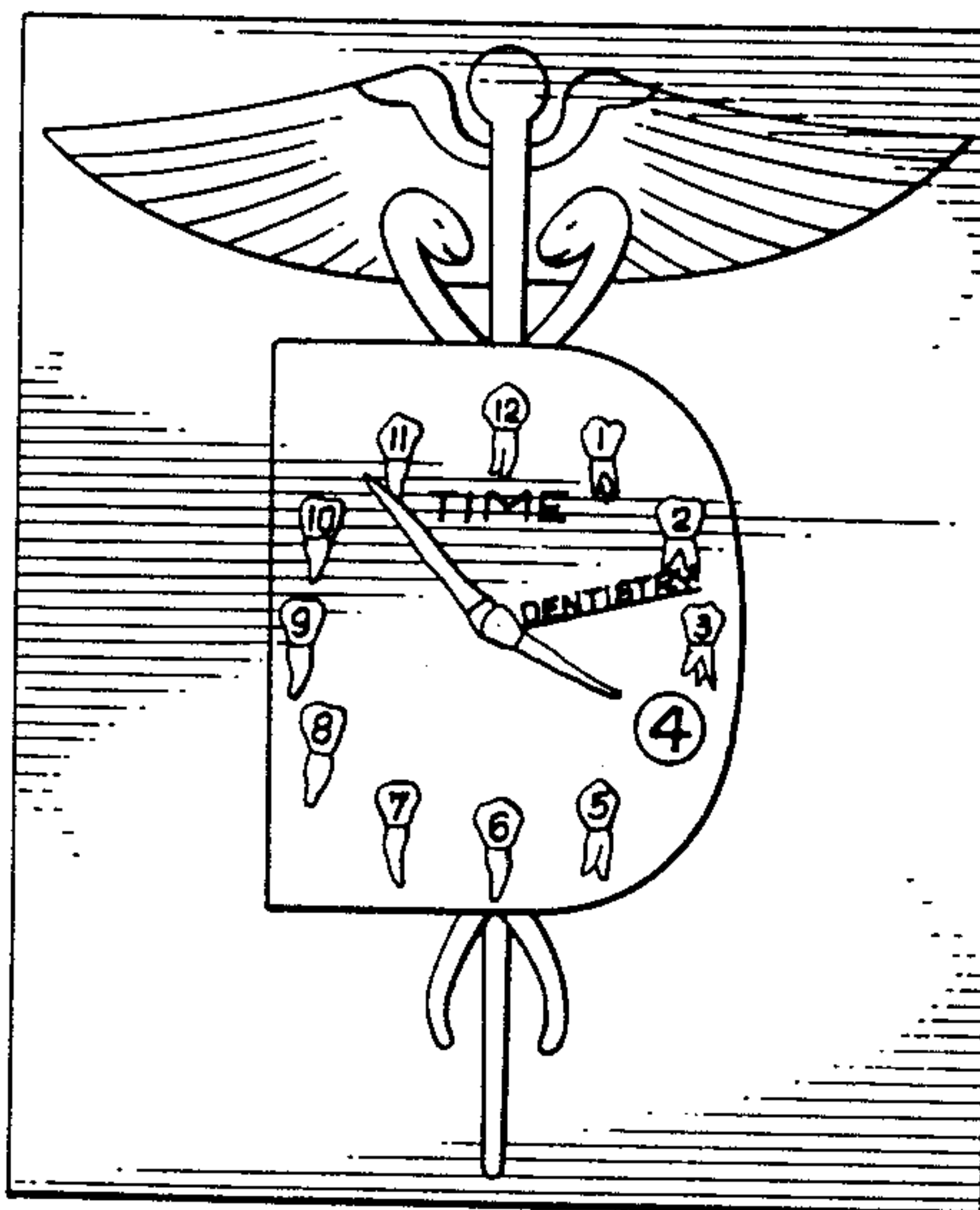

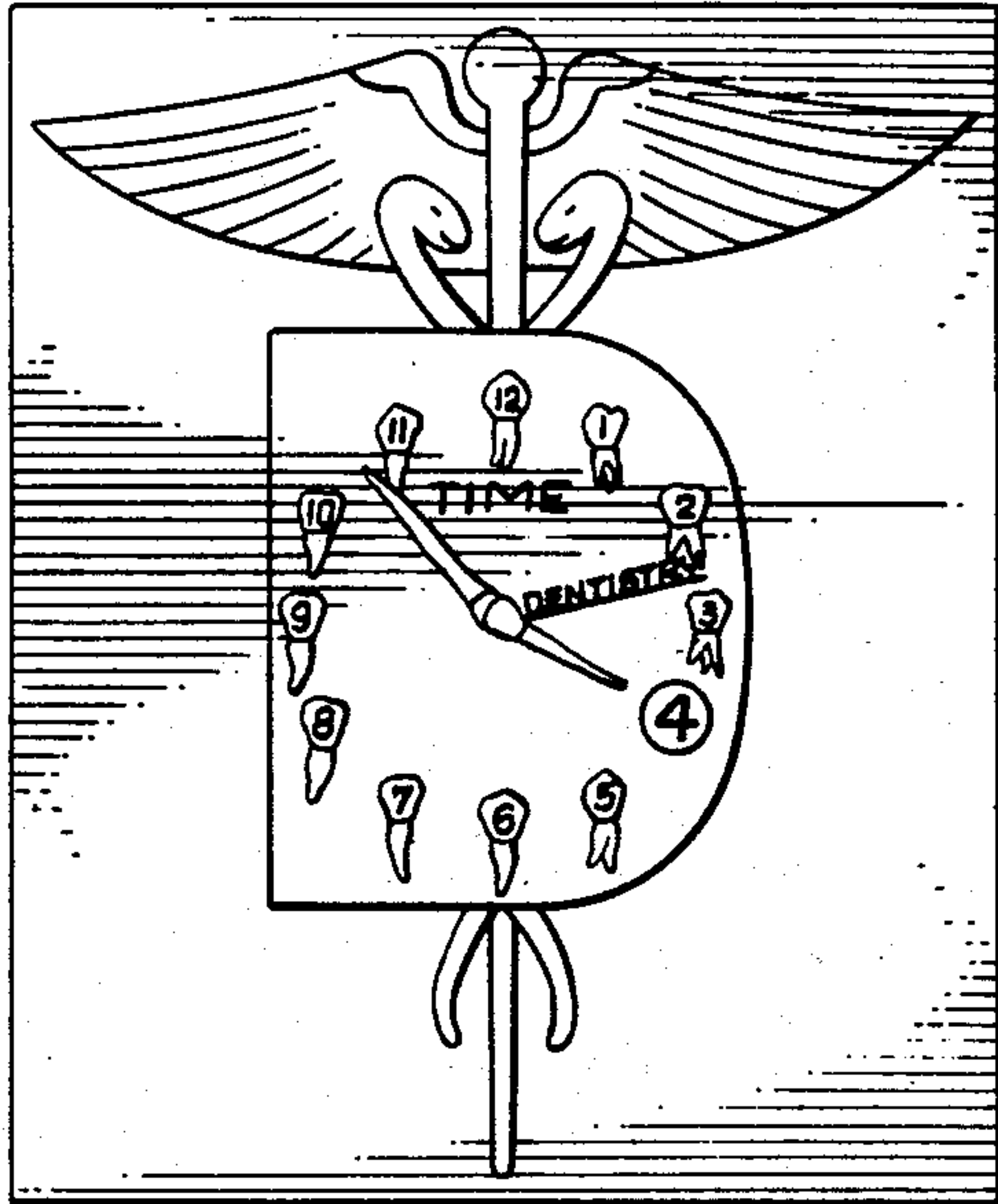

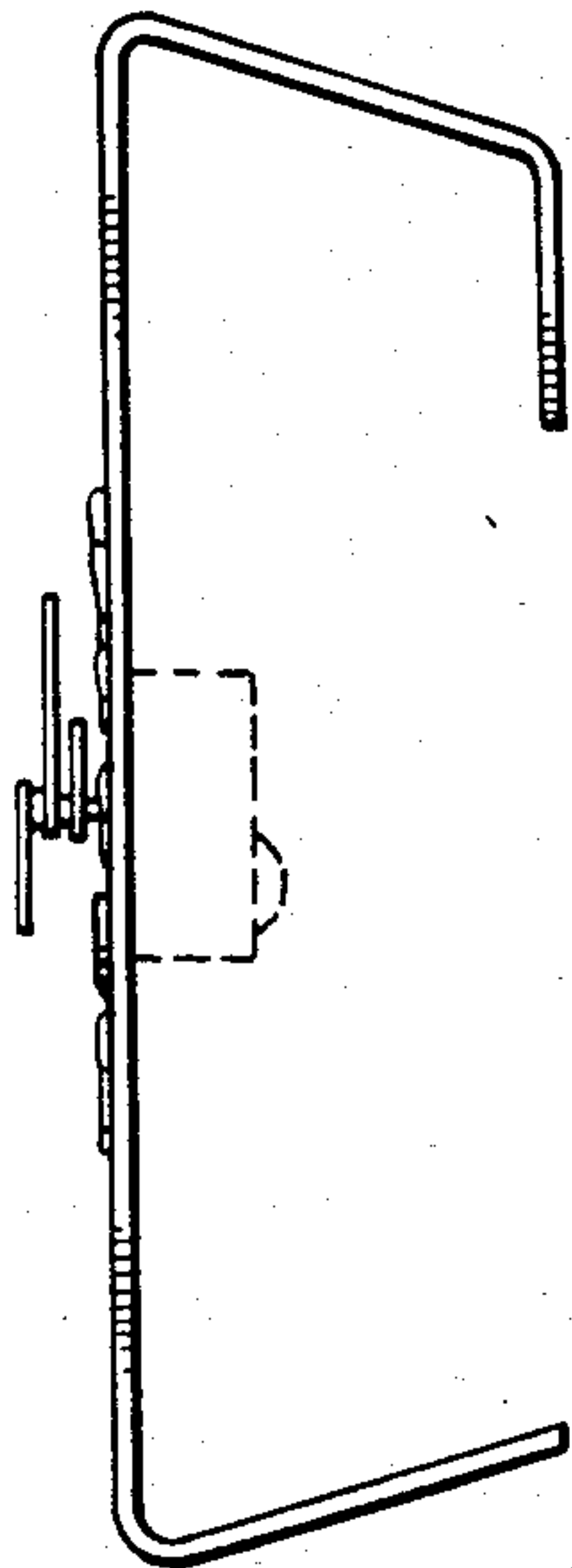

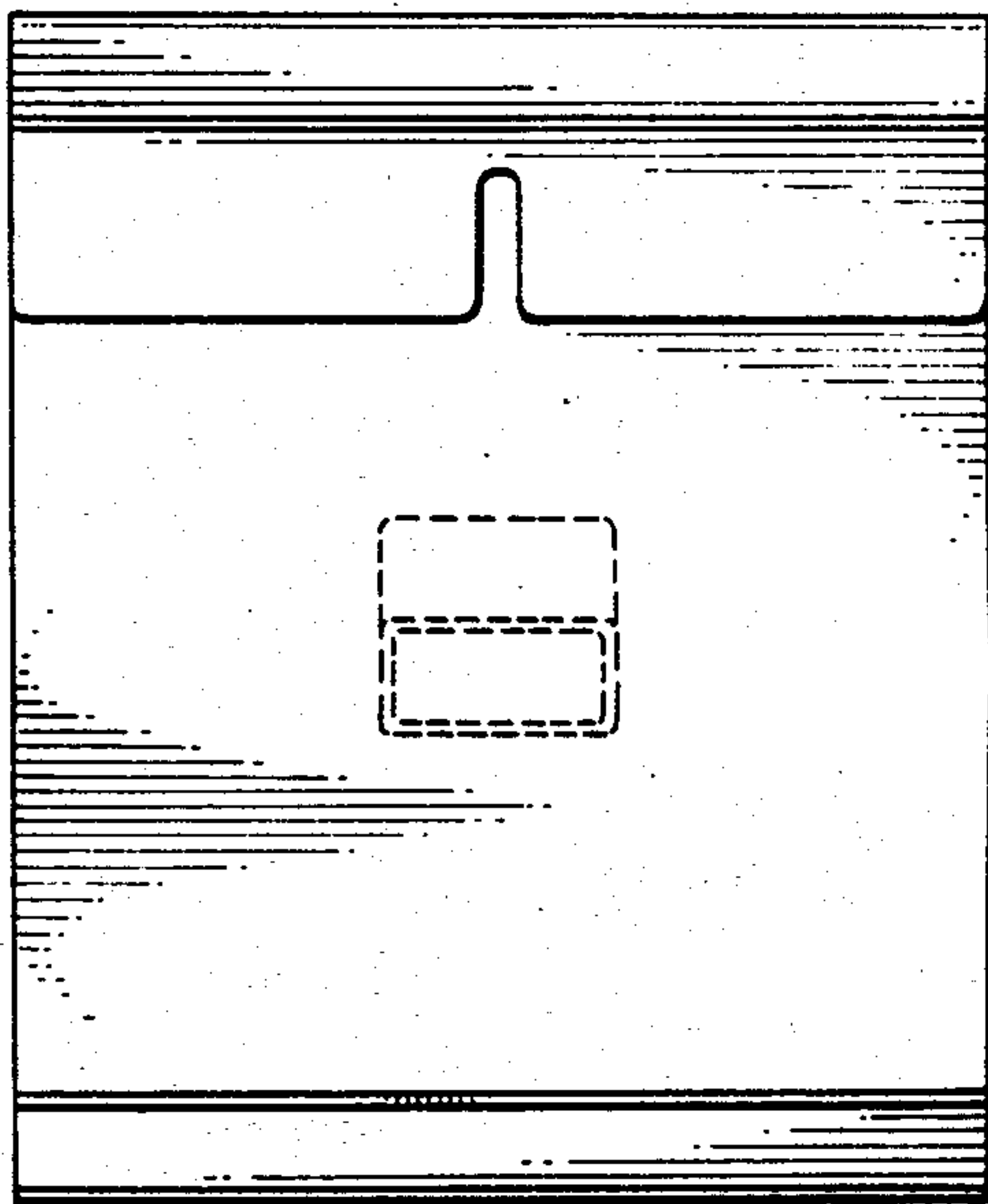

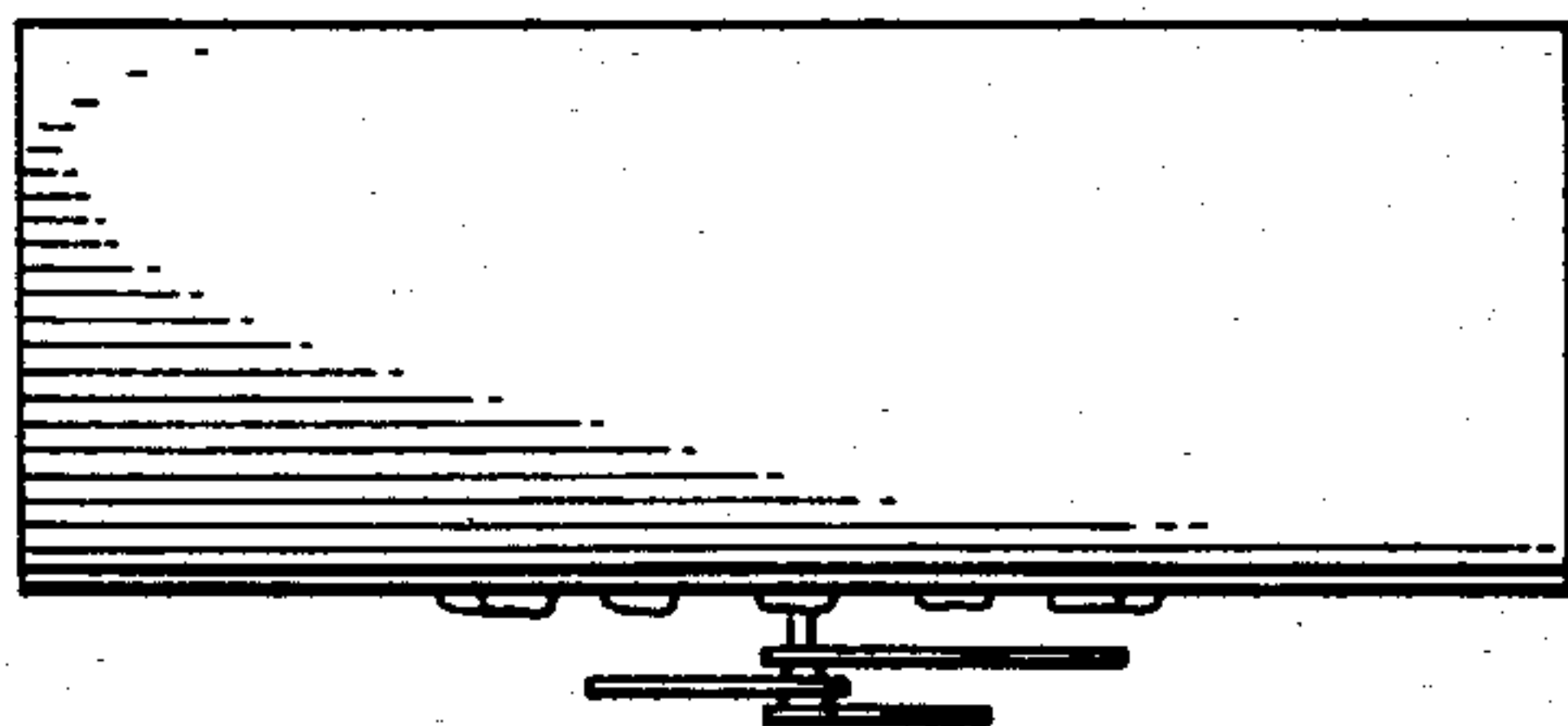
