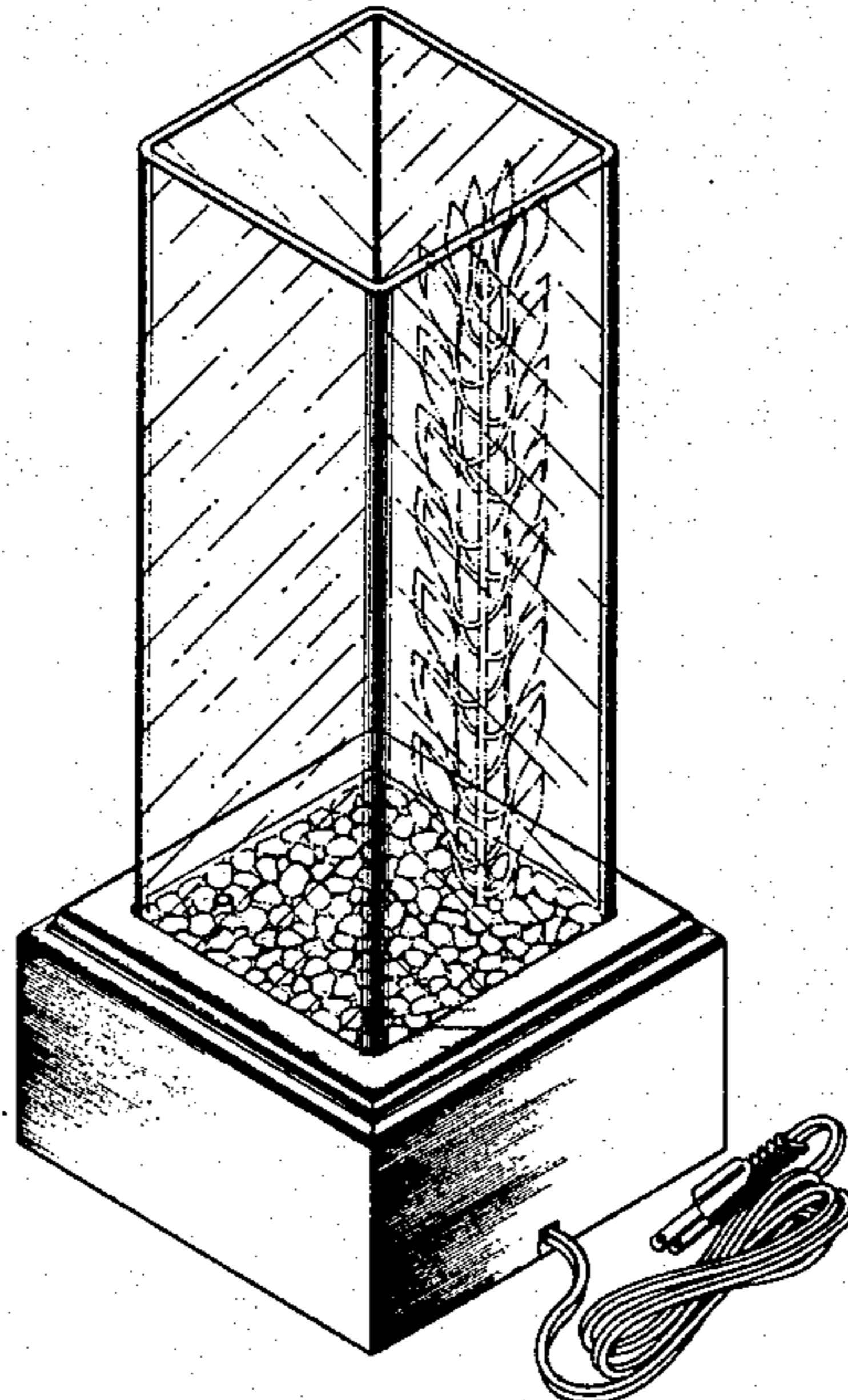
The ornamental design for an aquarium, as shown and described.

FIG. 1 is an isometric view taken from the top, front and right side of an aquarium showing my new design; and

The broken line representation of gravel and a plant in FIG. 1 is for purposes of illustration only.



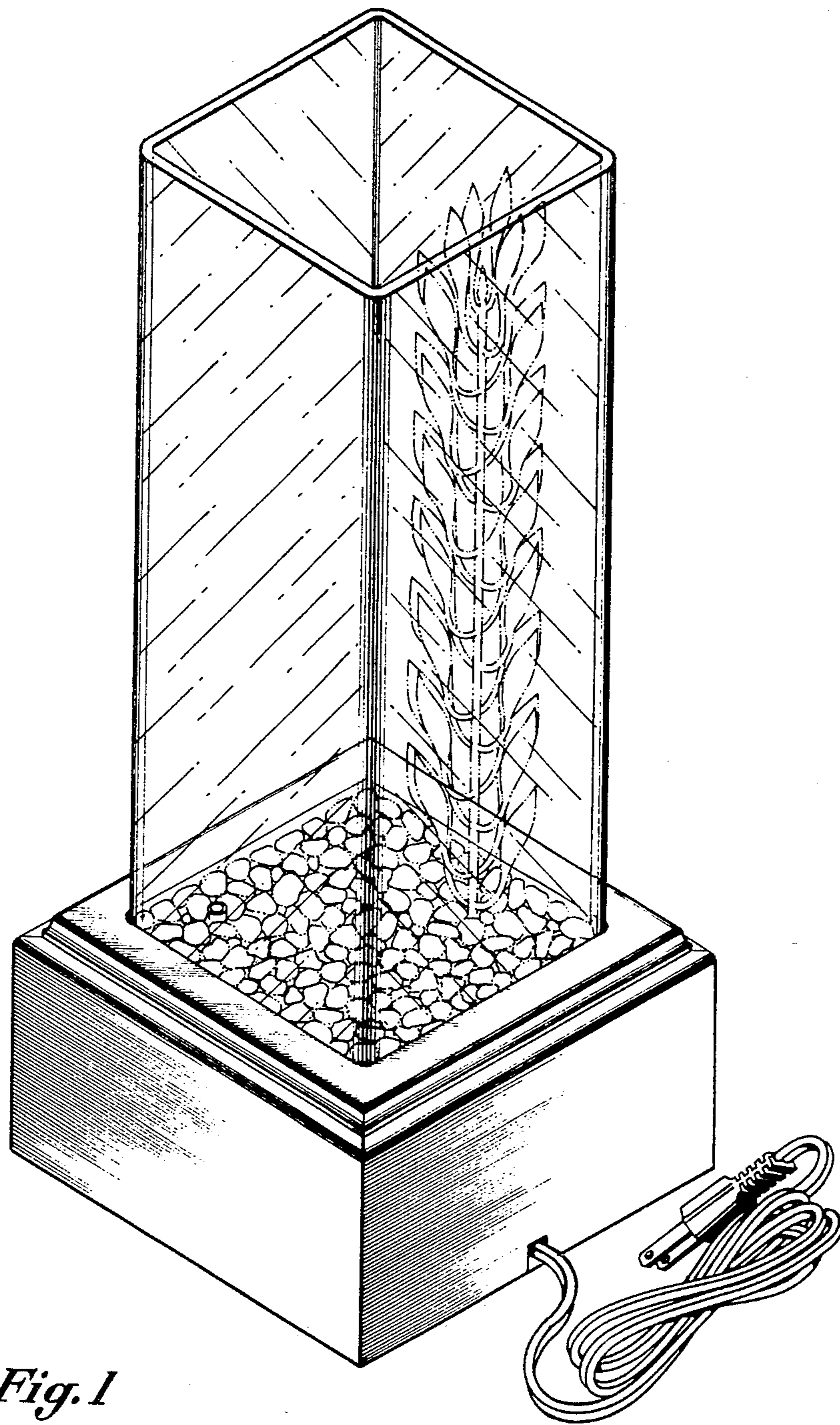

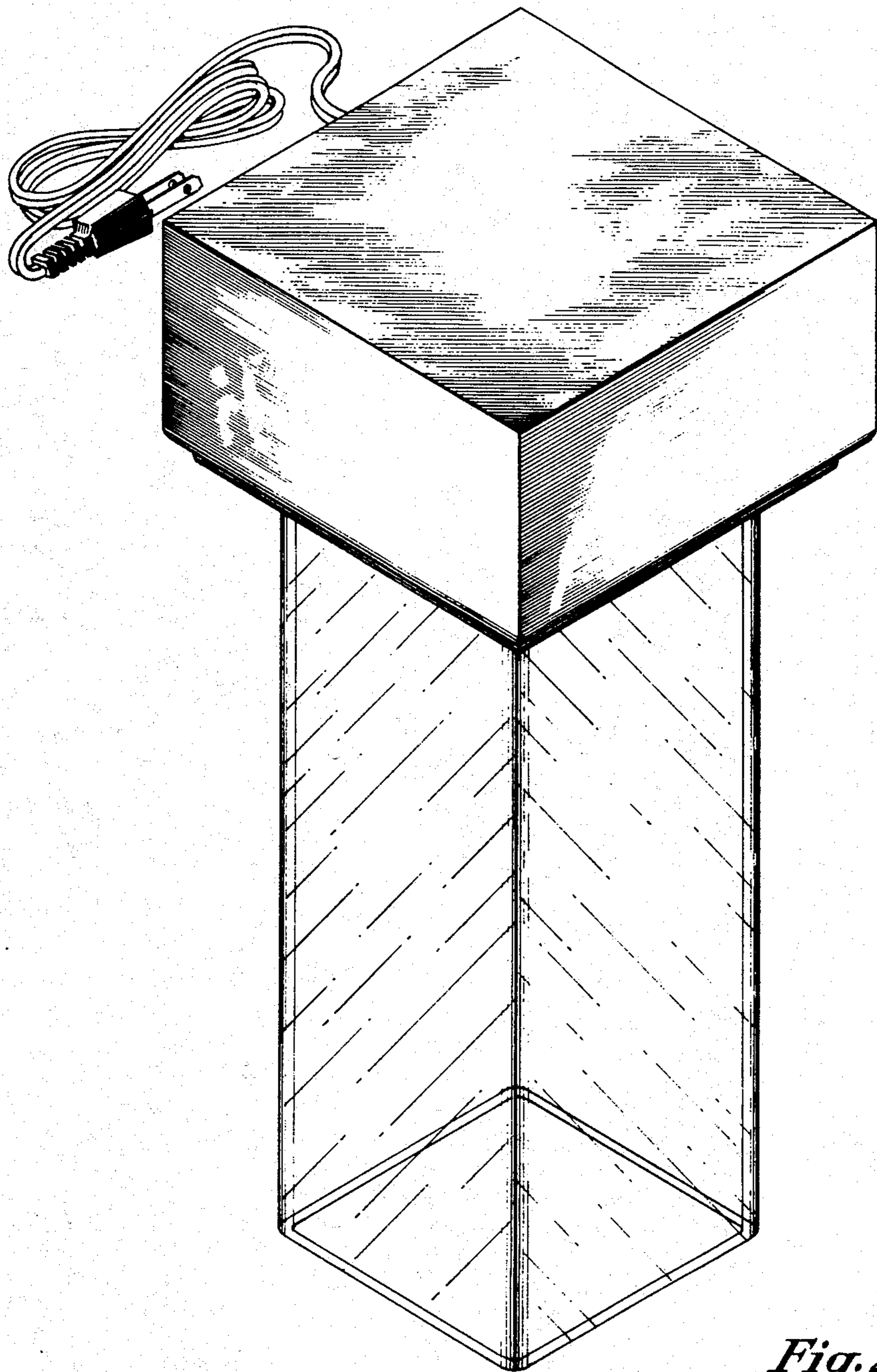
