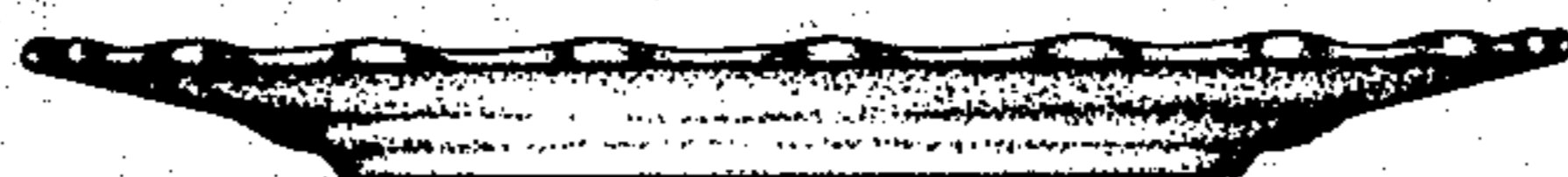
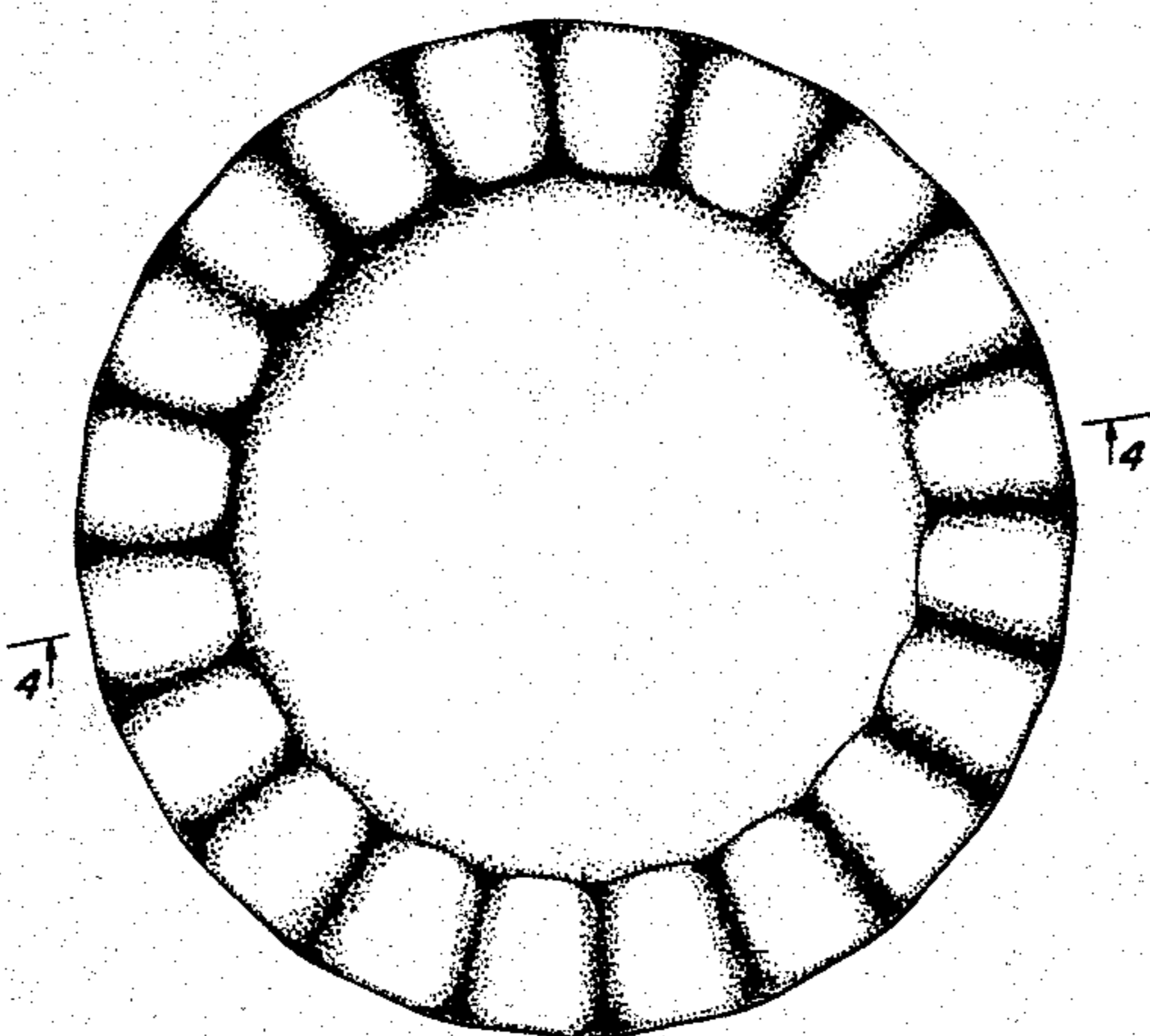
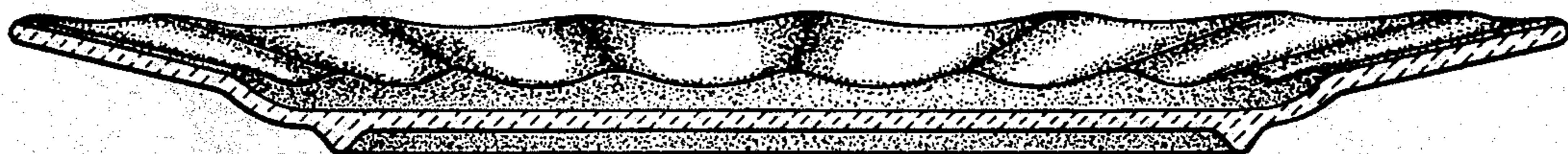

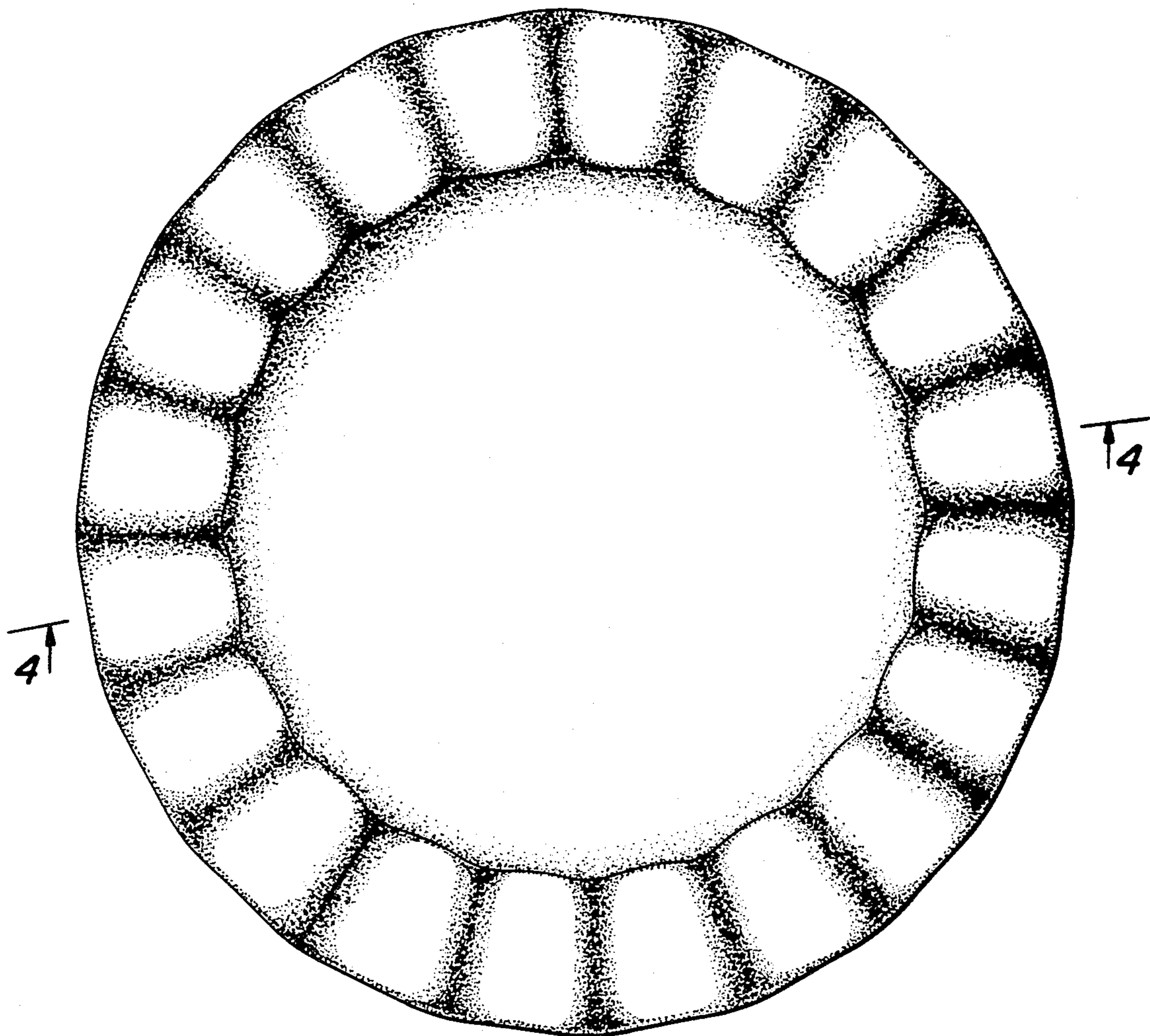
[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a dinner plate, as shown and described.

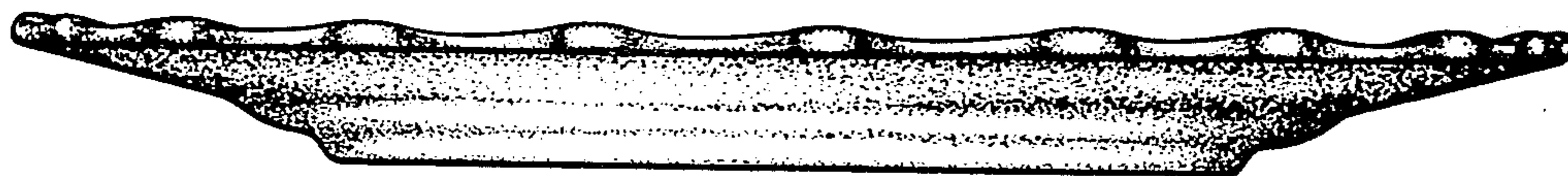
DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of a dinner plate showing my new design;  
 FIG. 2 is a bottom plan view thereof;

 FIG. 4 is a sectional view as taken along the line 4—4 in FIG. 1.

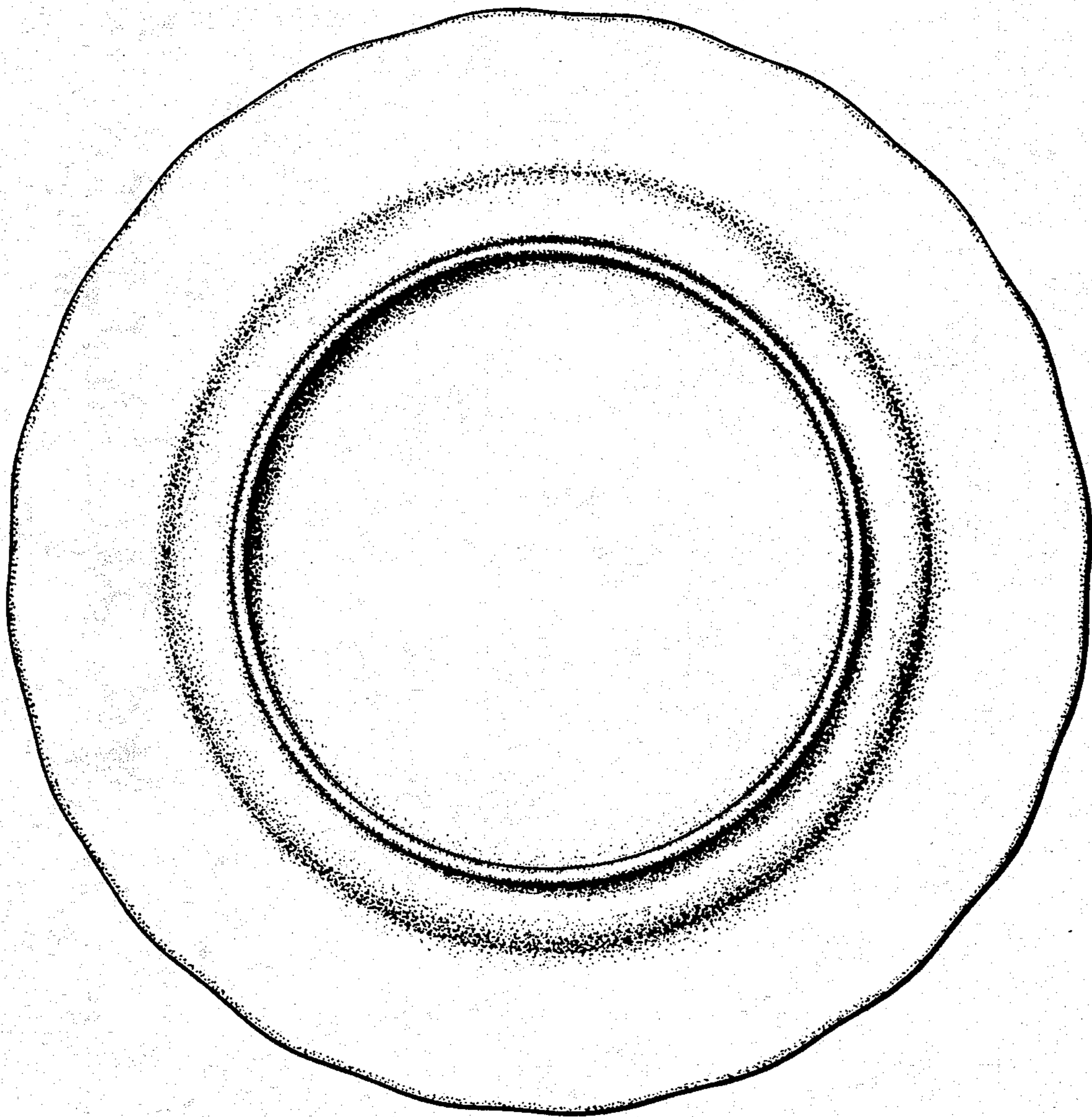




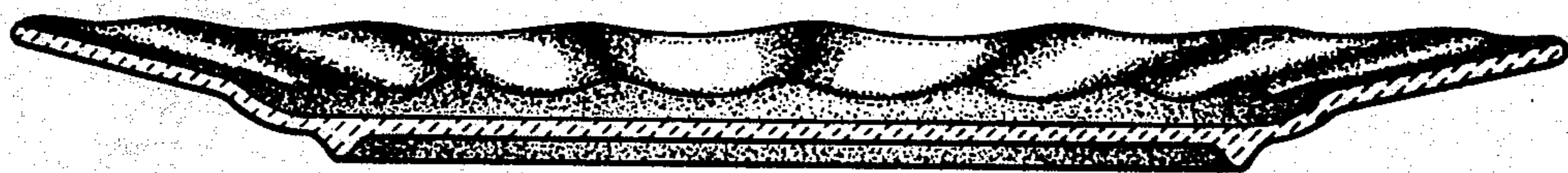
