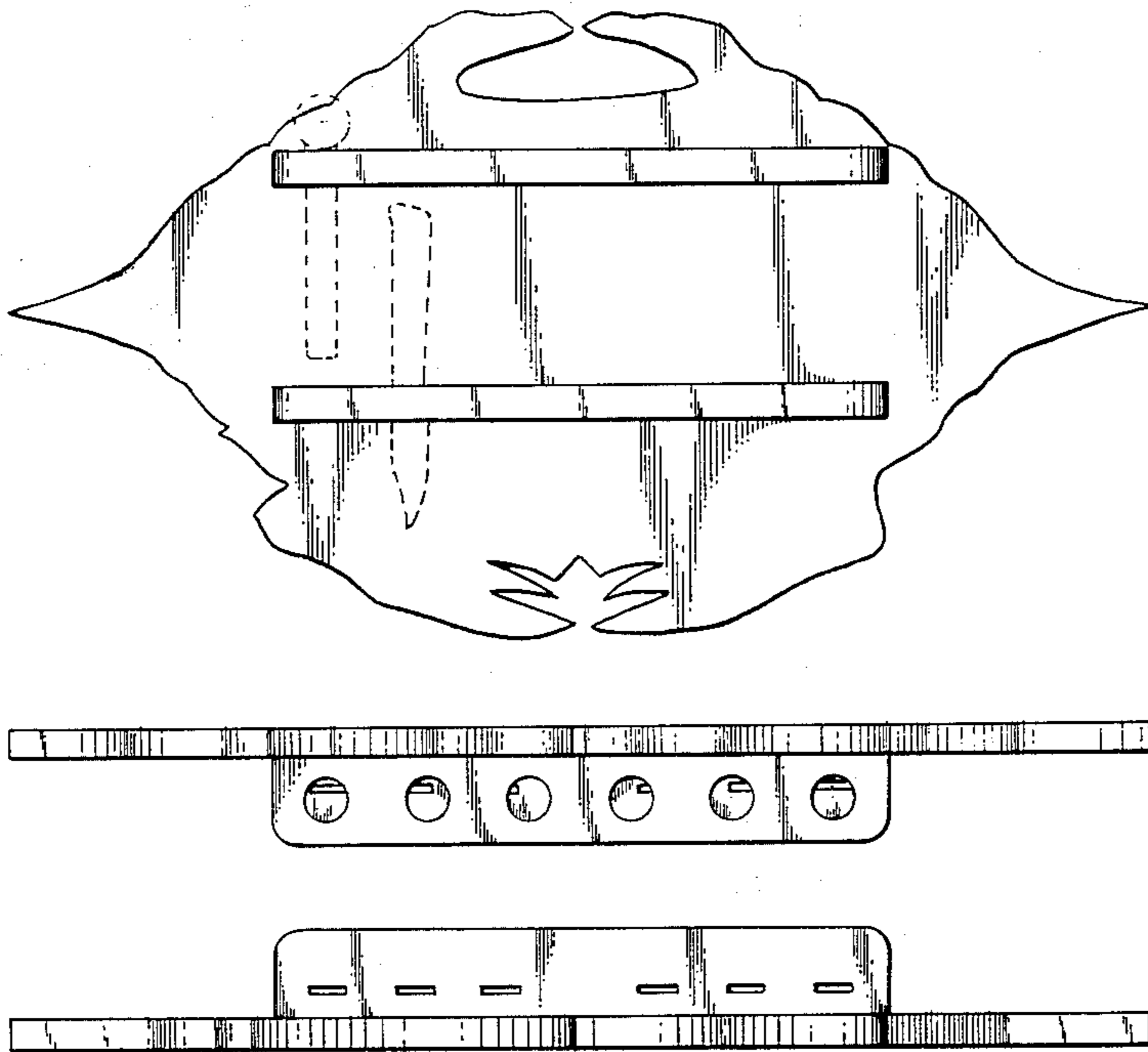

The undisclosed rear view is plane and unornamented.



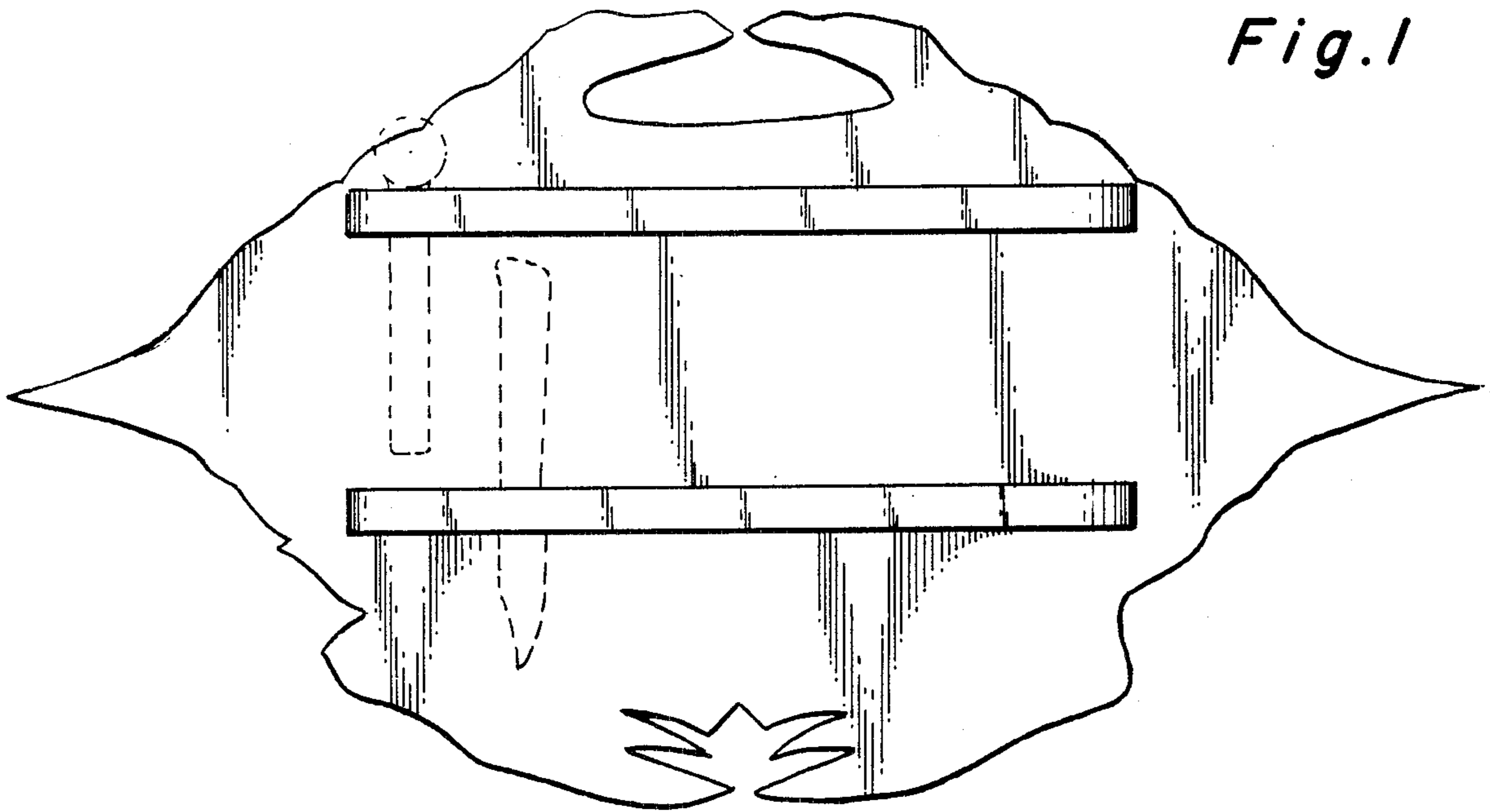

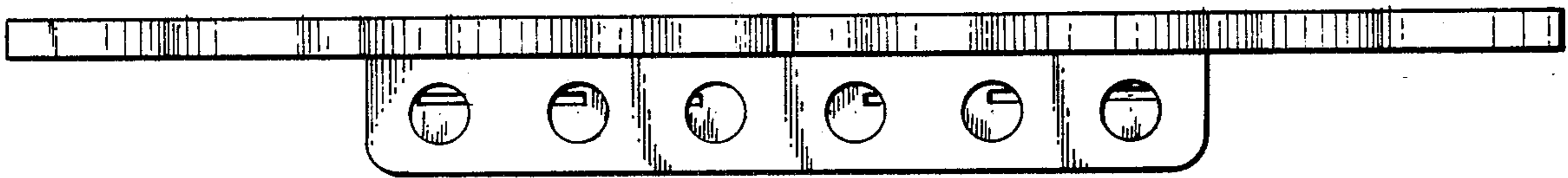

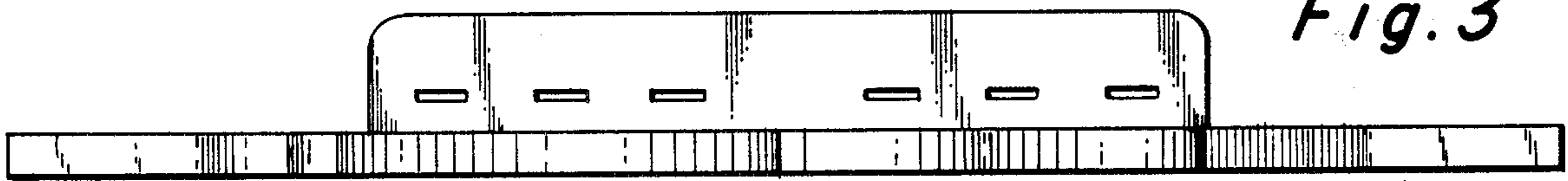
