The ornamental design for a champagne flute, as shown and described.

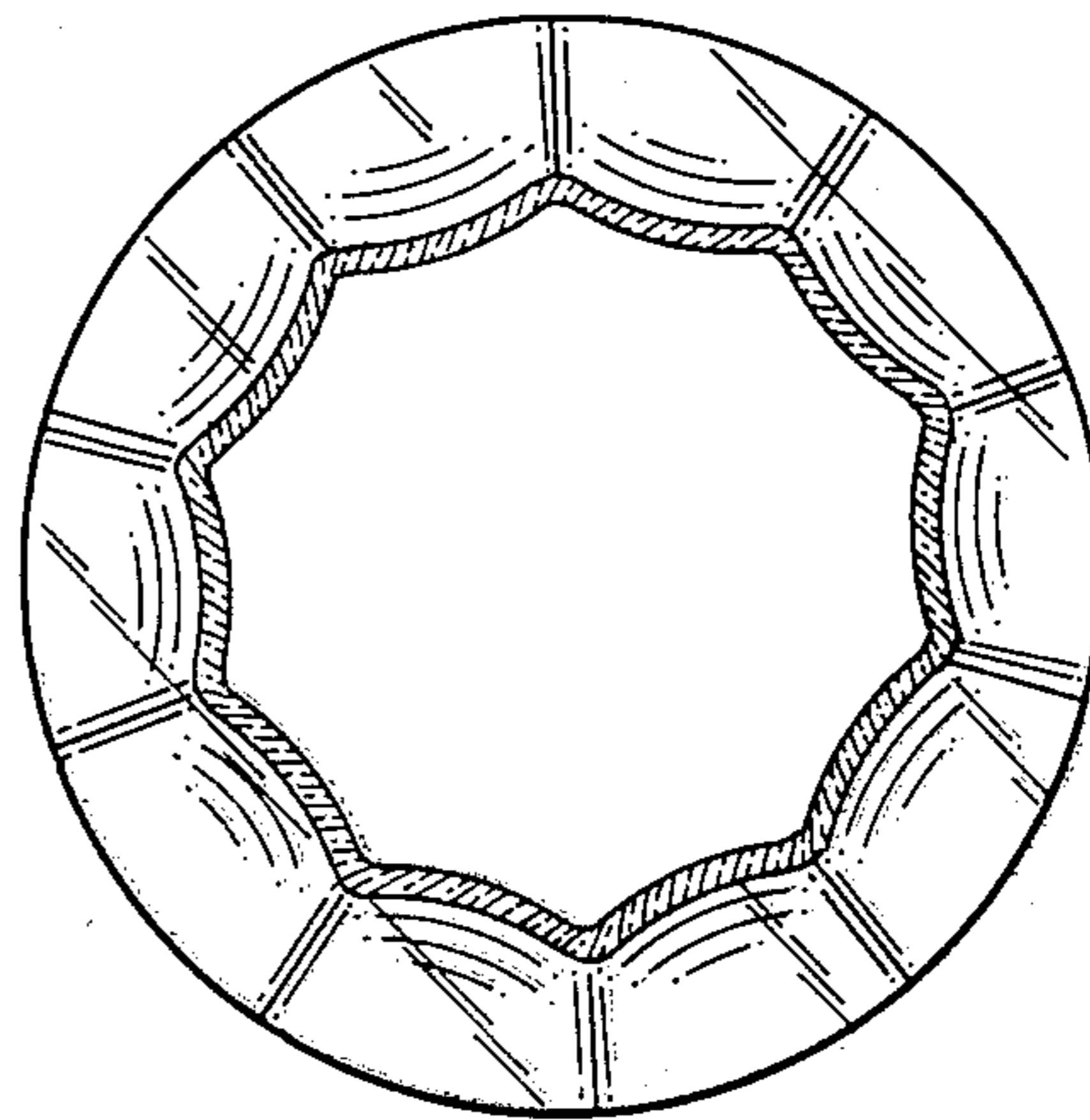
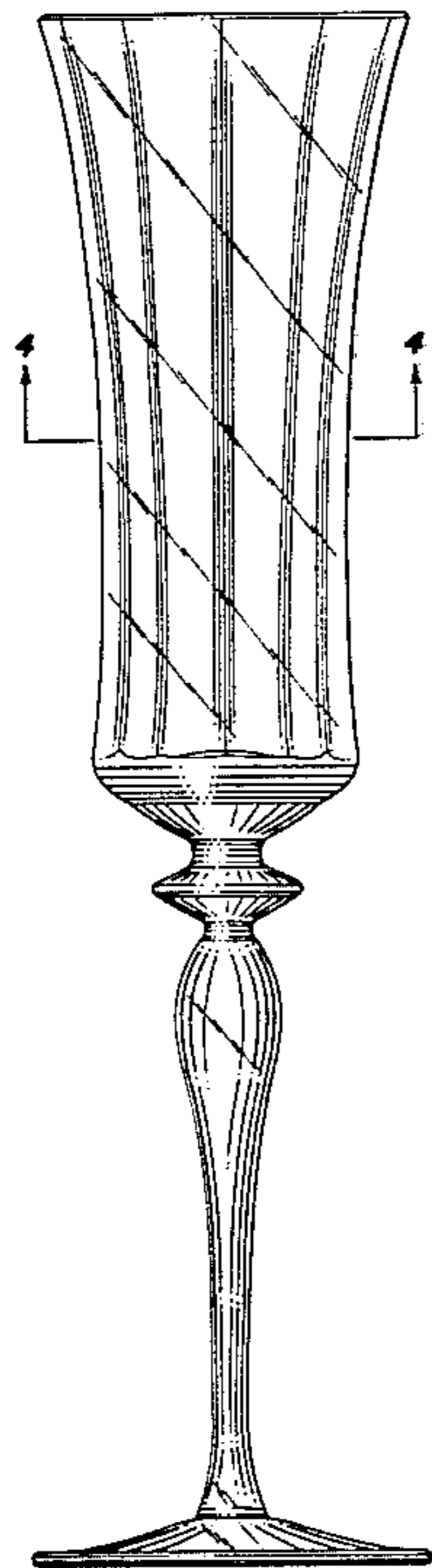
DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front side elevational view of a champagne flute showing my new design, the rear side and right and left side views being substantially identical therewith;

FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a bottom plan view thereof; and

FIG. 4 is a sectional view as taken along the line 4—4 in FIG. 1.



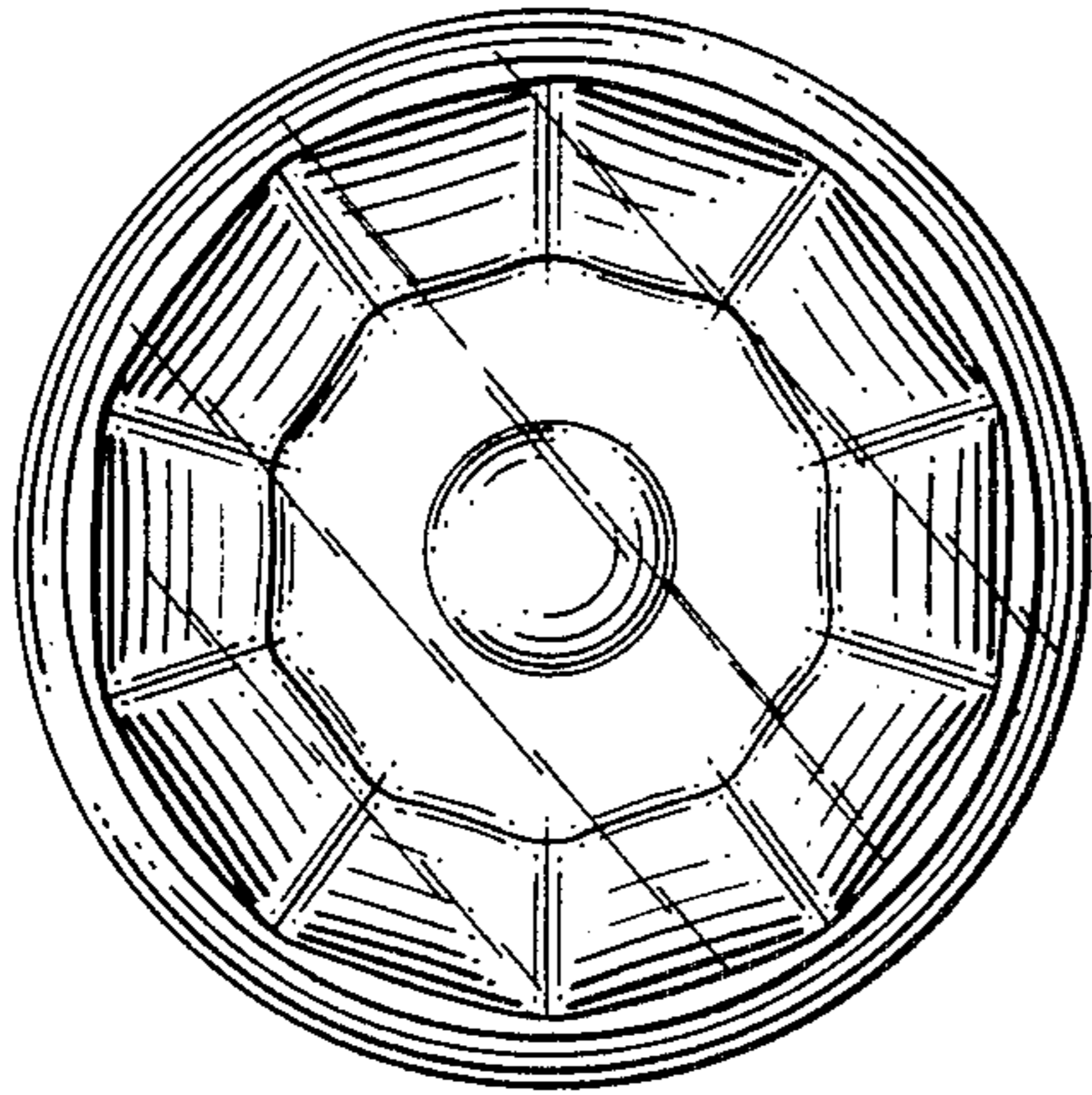

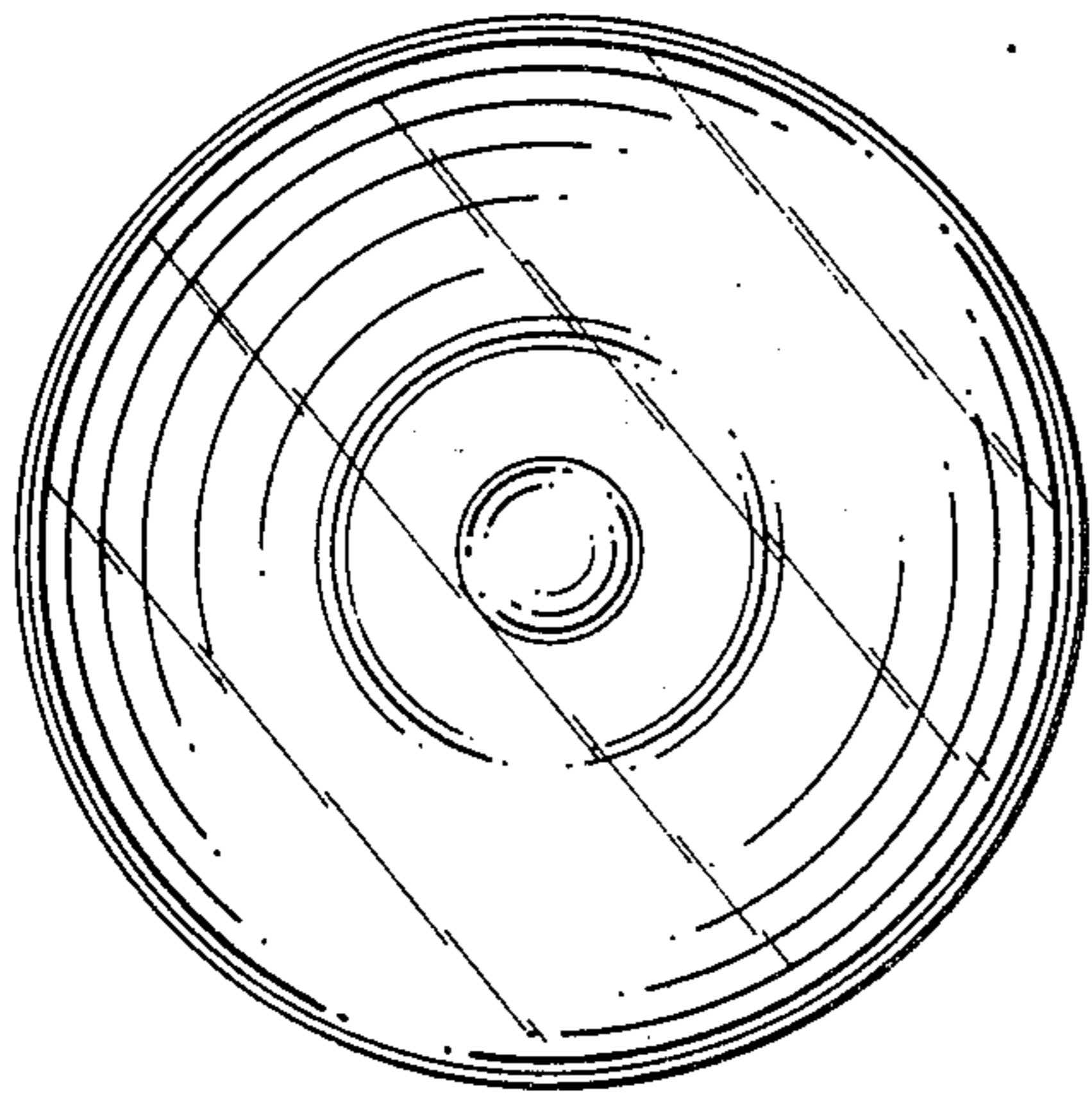

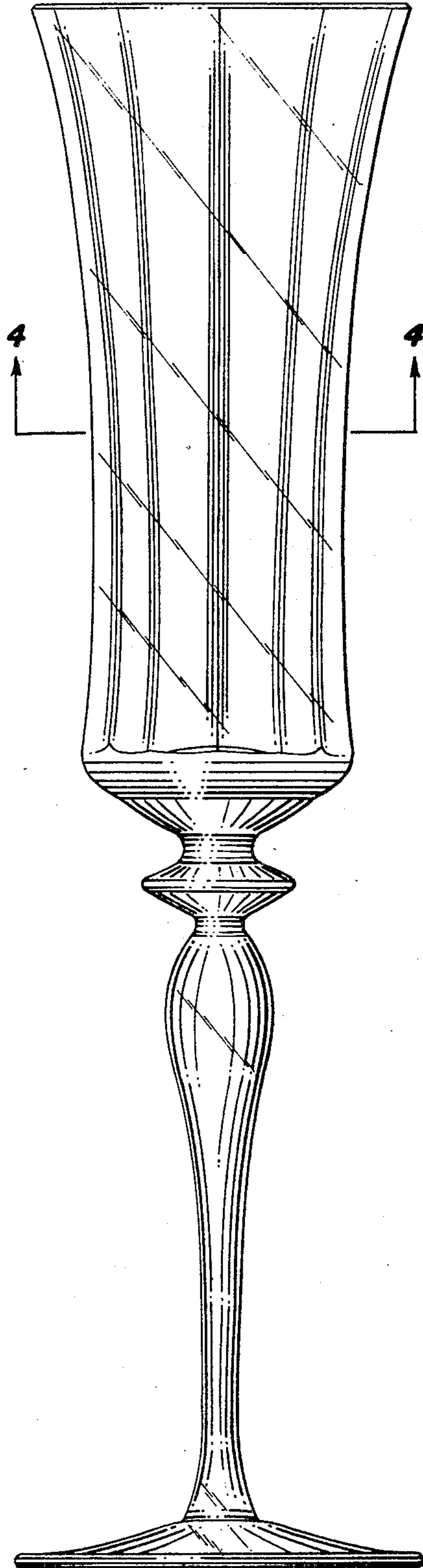

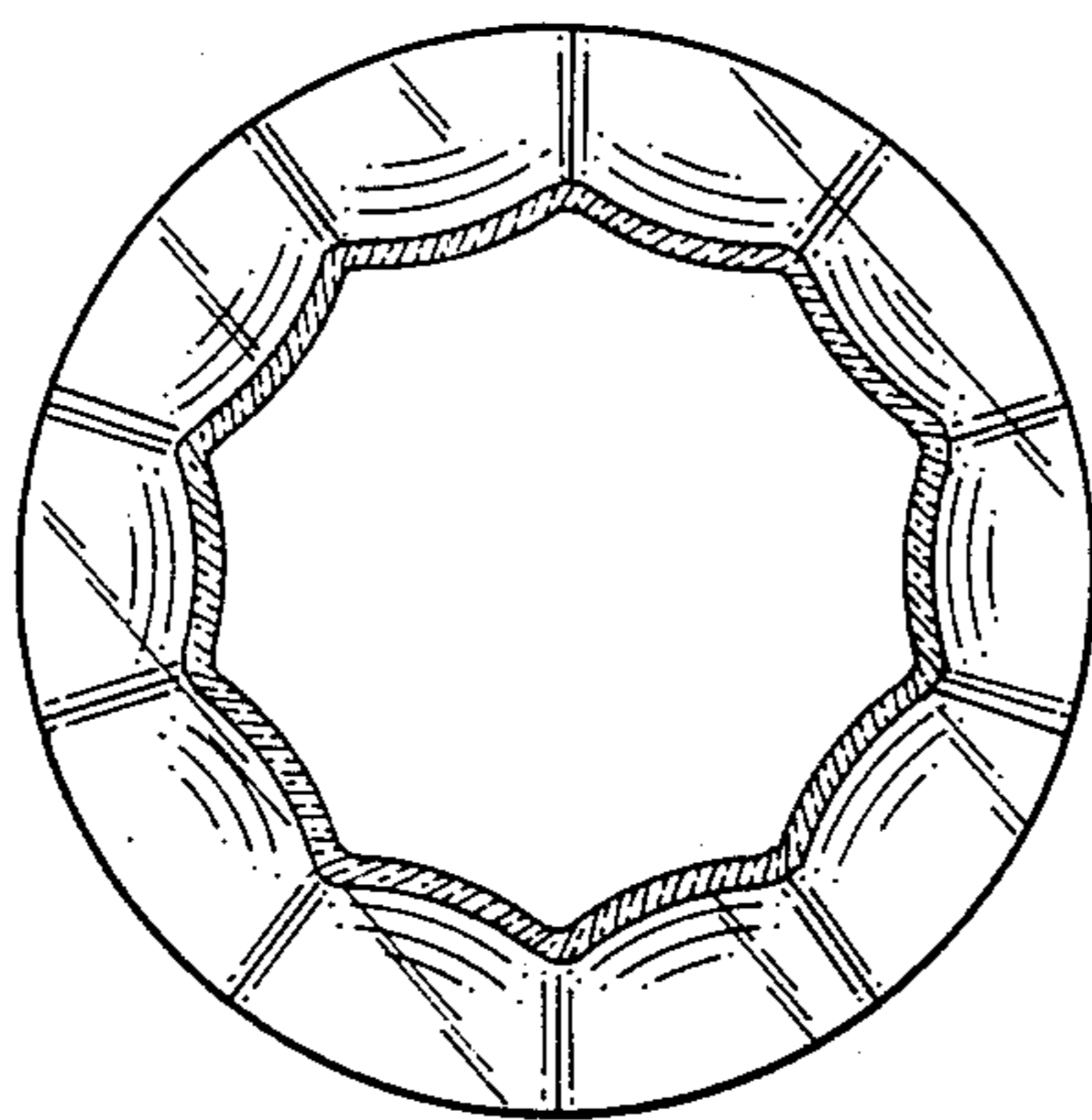
