DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a luggage case showing our new design;
 FIG. 2 is a front elevational view thereof, the rear elevational view being a mirror image thereof;
 FIG. 3 is a side elevational view thereof, showing the side opposite that shown in FIG. 1;
 FIG. 4 is a top plan view thereof; and
 FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view thereof.

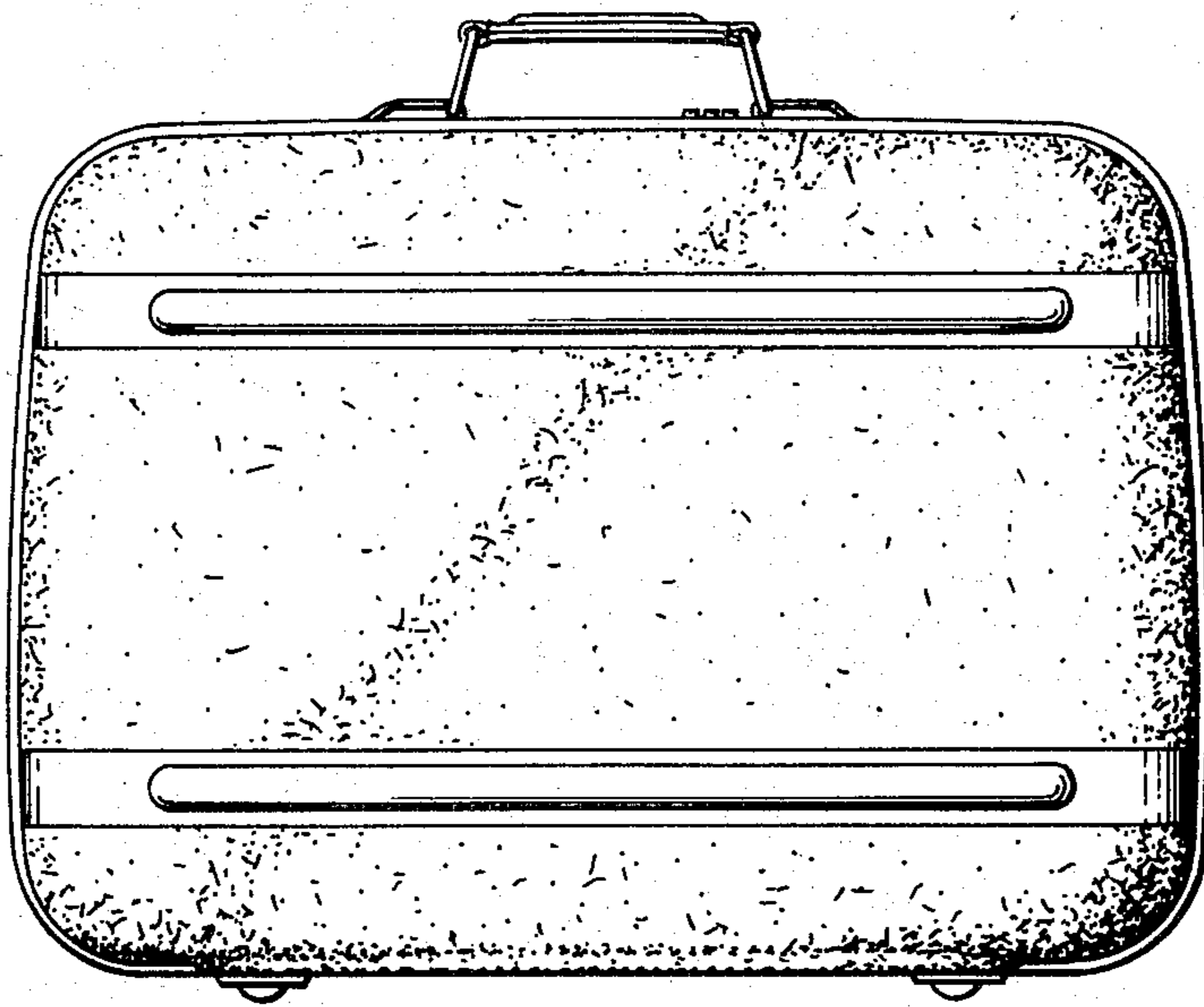

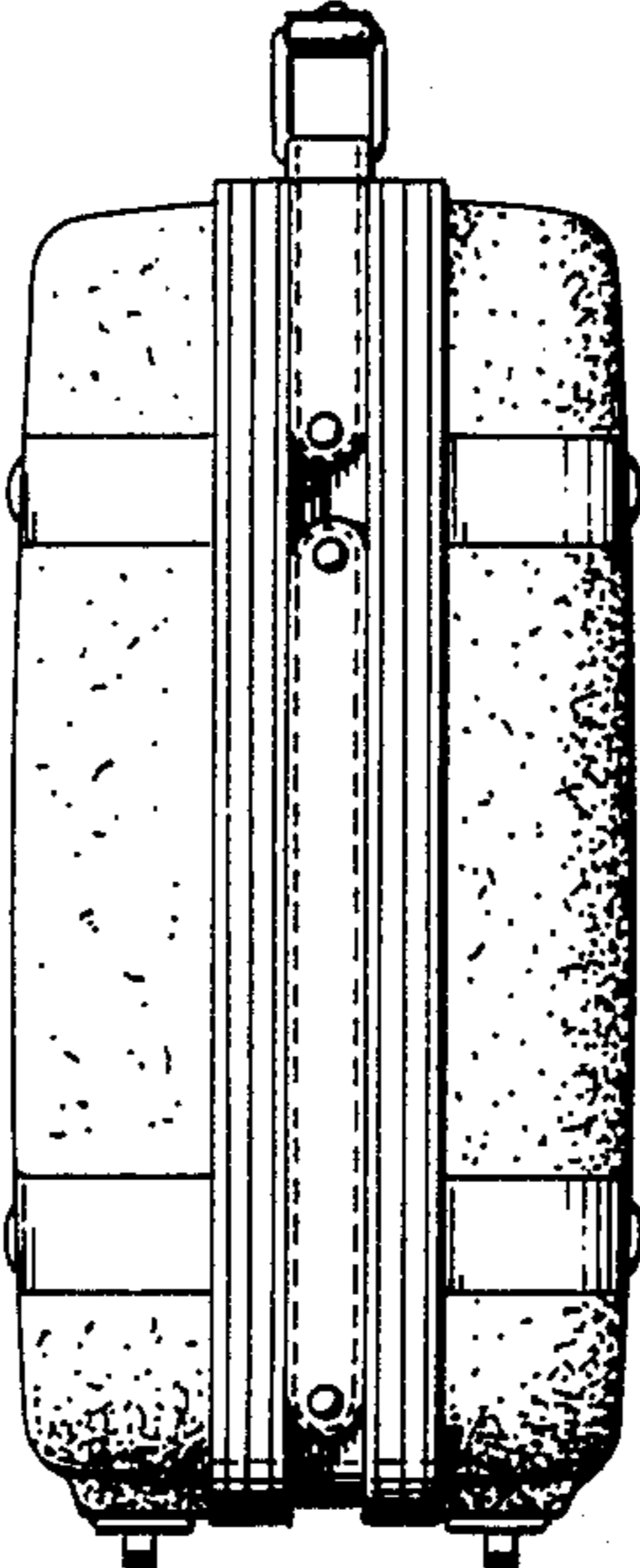

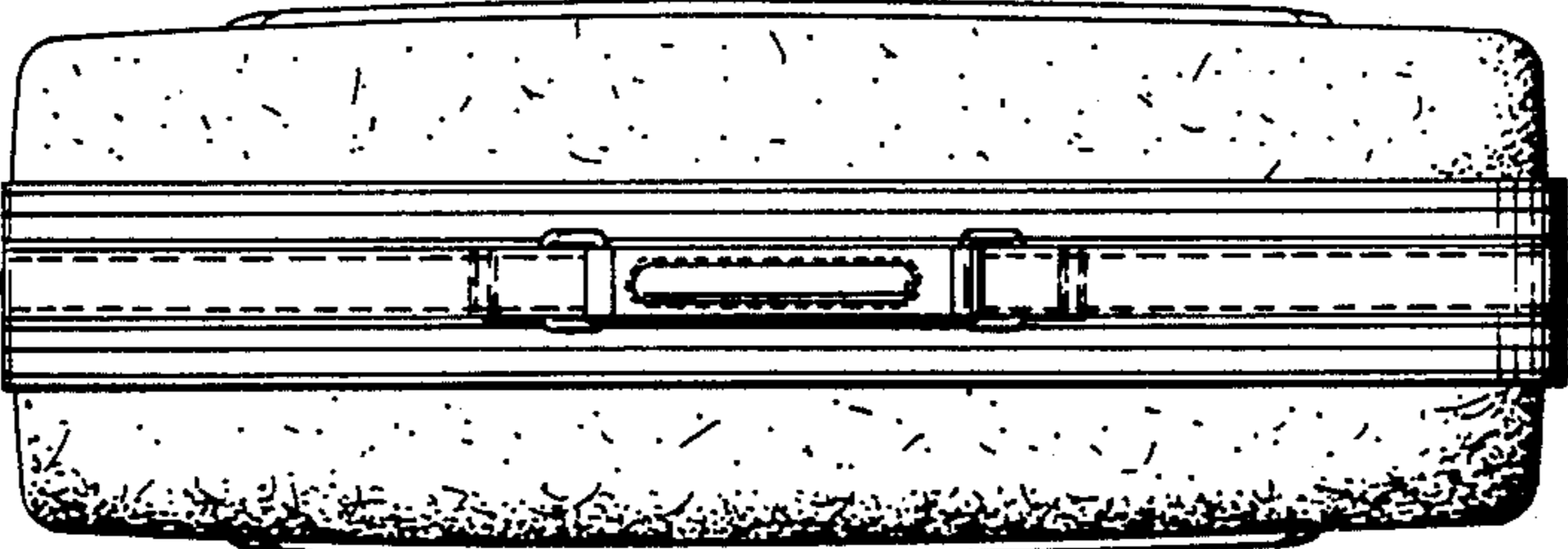

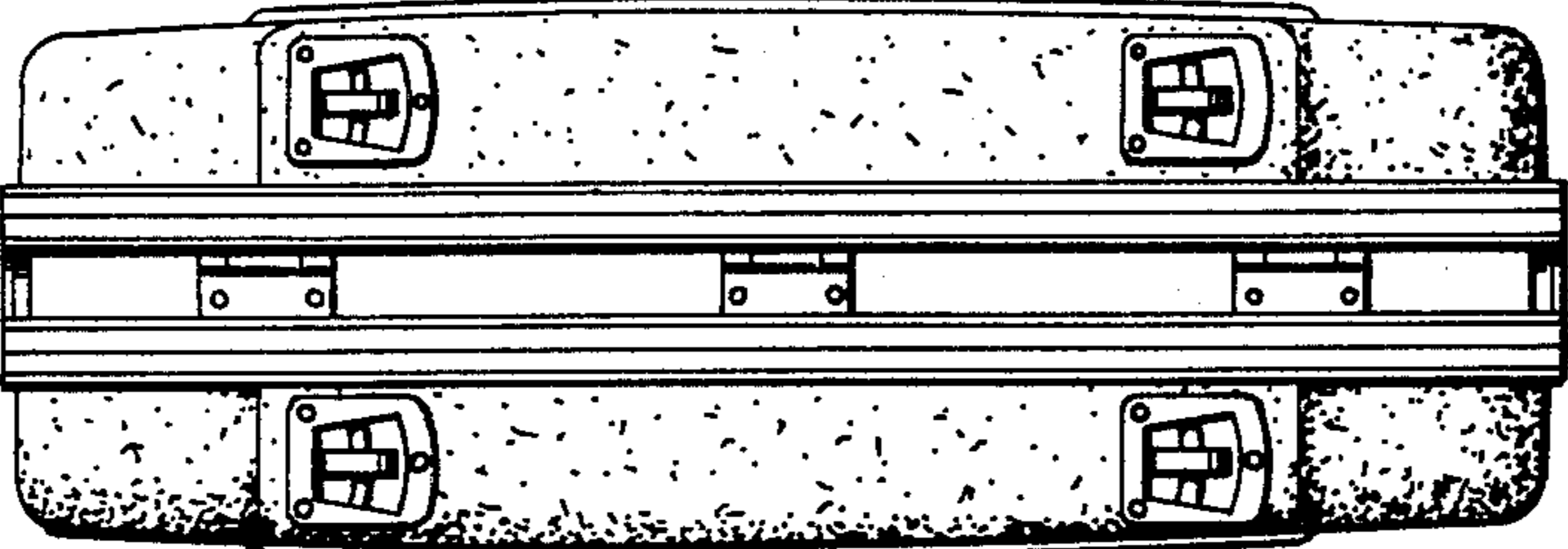
