[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a tumbler or the like, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top perspective view of a tumbler or the like showing my new design in the size and proportions of a cocktail tumbler;

FIG. 2 is a side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a top plan view thereof, with the facets on the exterior surface not shown for greater clarity of illustration;

FIG. 4 is a bottom plan view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a sectional view thereof taken on line 5—5 of FIG. 2, with the facets on the exterior surface not shown for greater clarity of illustration;

FIG. 6 is a sectional view thereof taken on line 6—6 of FIG. 2, with the facets on the exterior surface not shown for greater clarity of illustration;

FIG. 7 is a top perspective view of a tumbler or the like showing my new design in the size and proportions of a water tumbler;

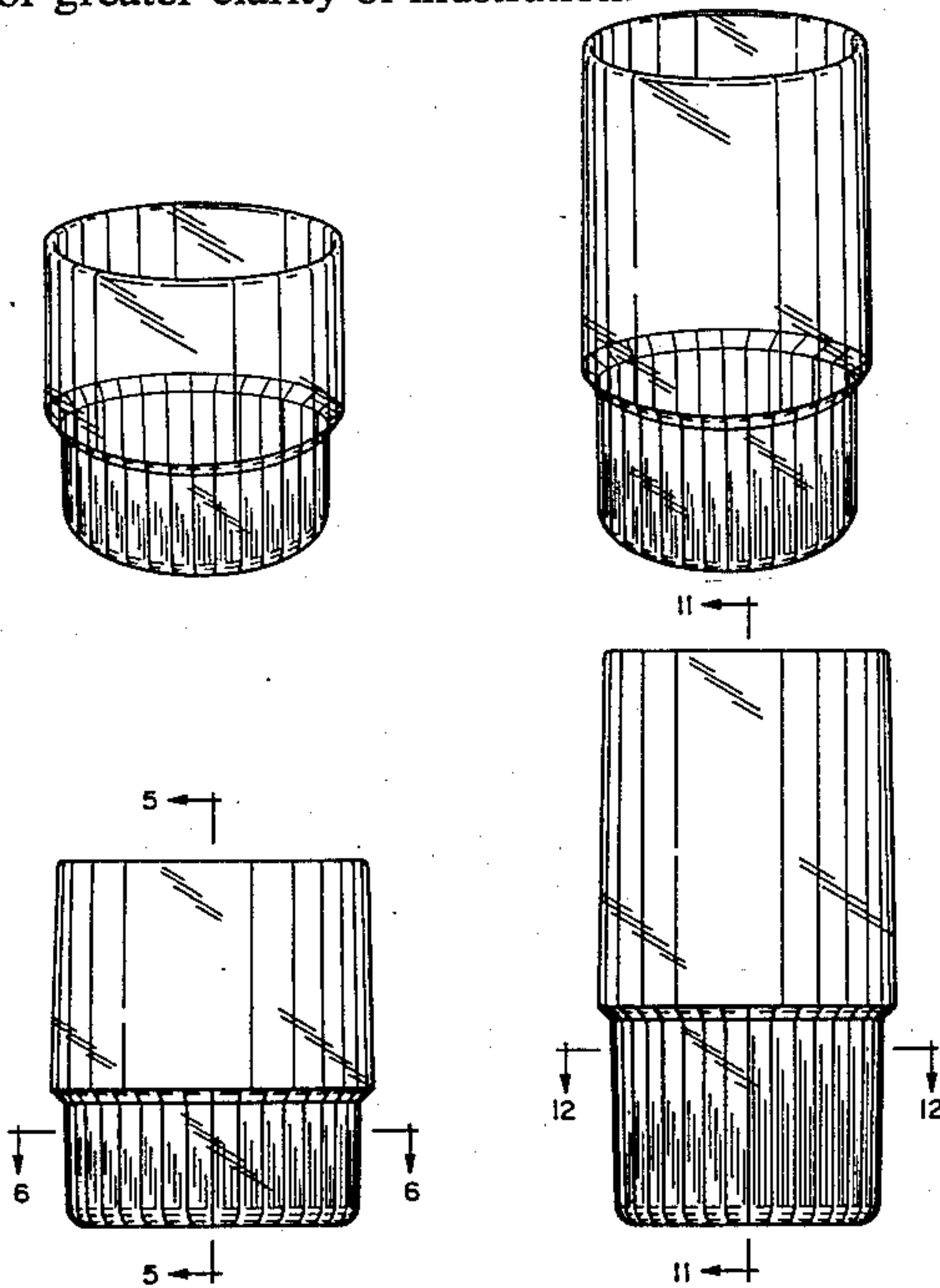
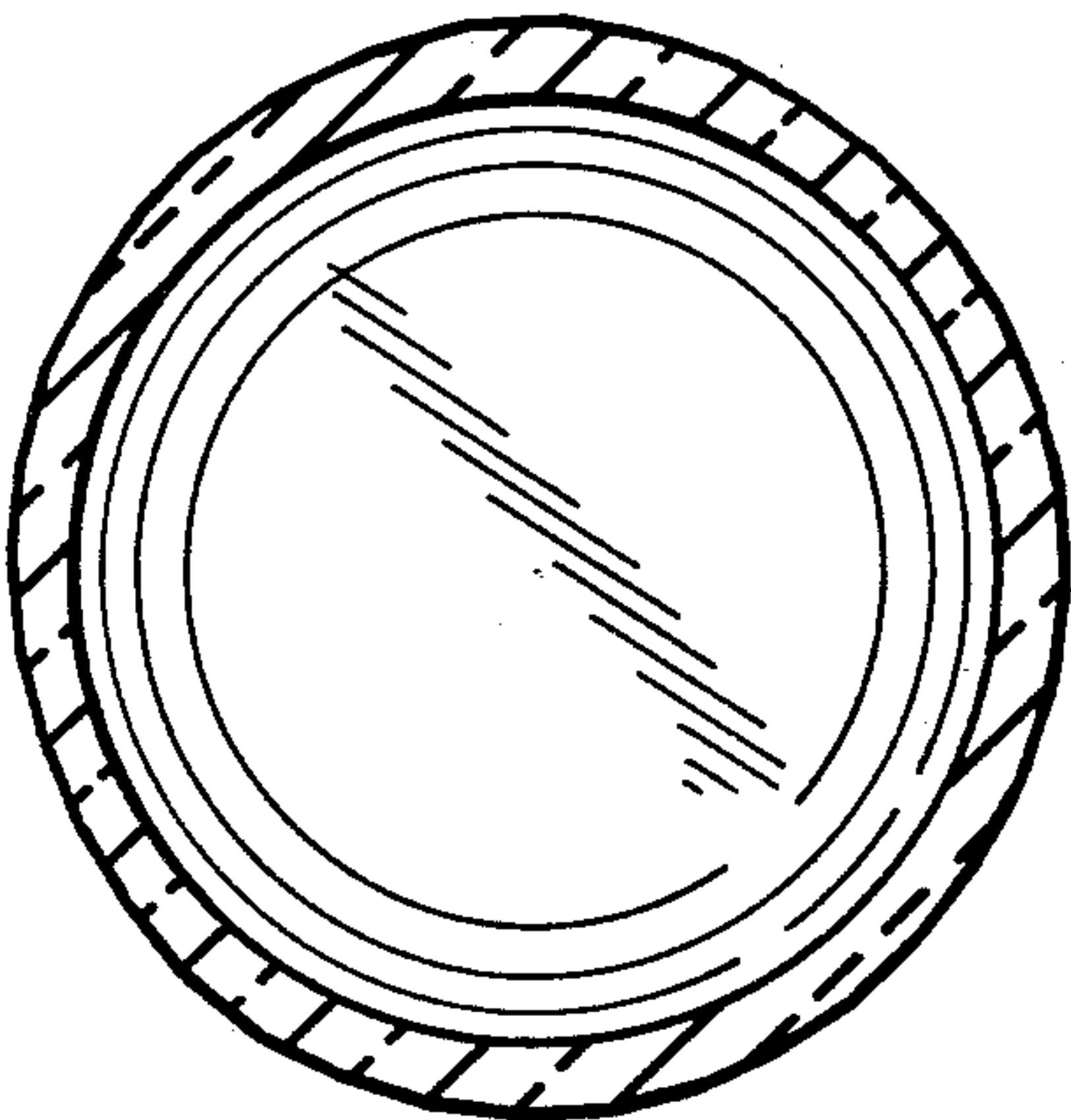
FIG. 8 is a side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 12 is a sectional view thereof taken on line 12—12 of FIG. 8, with the facets on the exterior surface not shown for greater clarity of illustration.



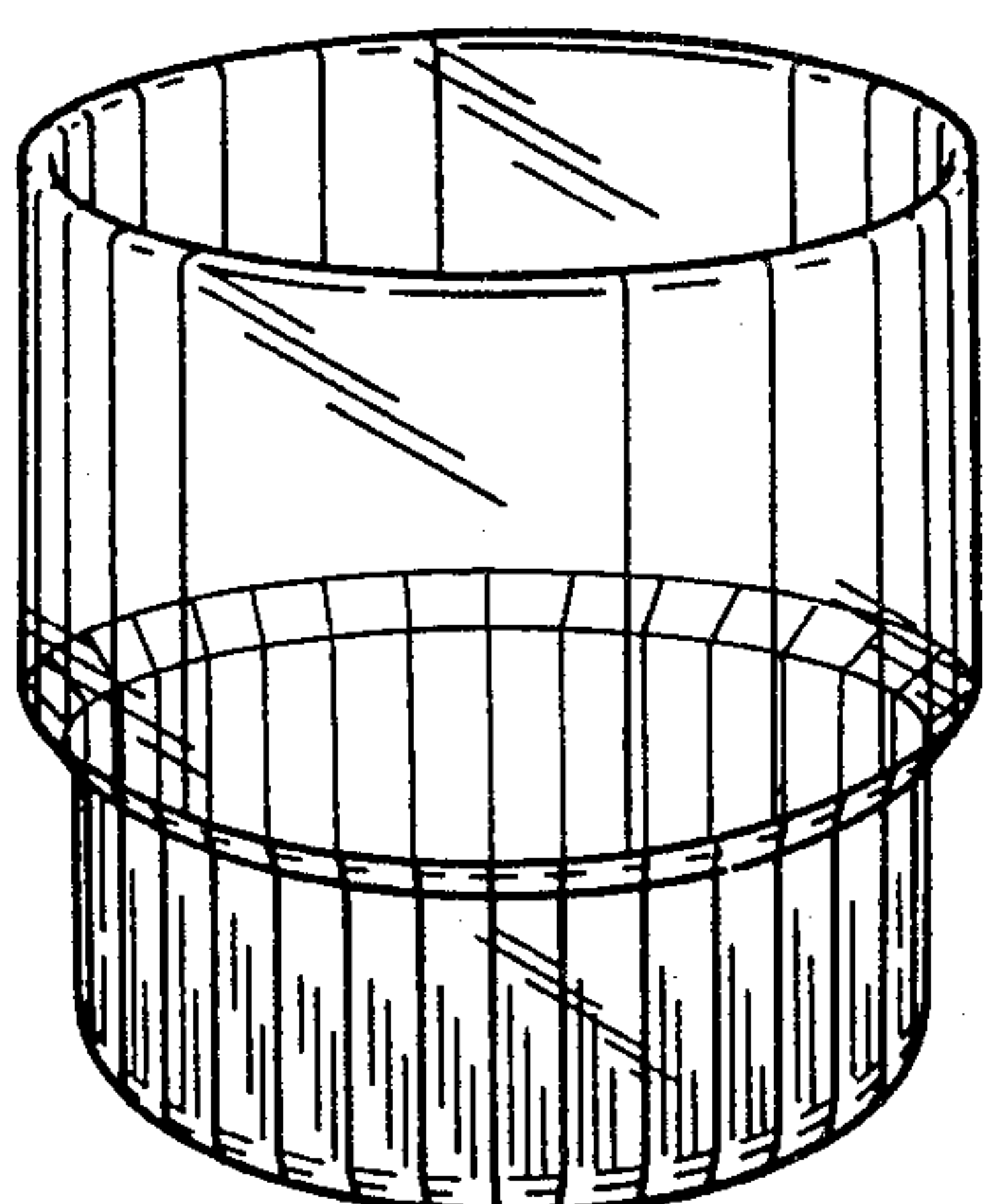

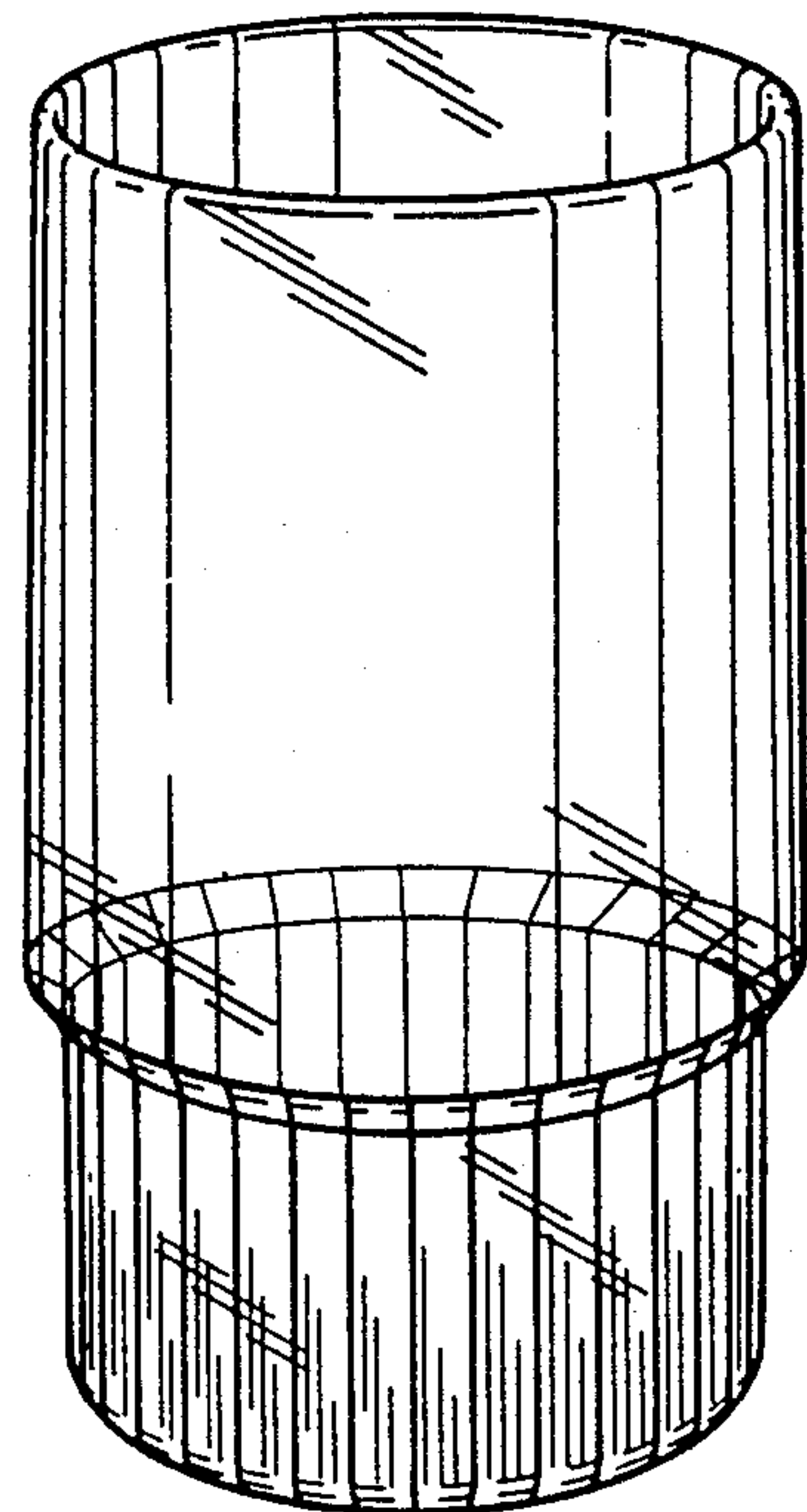

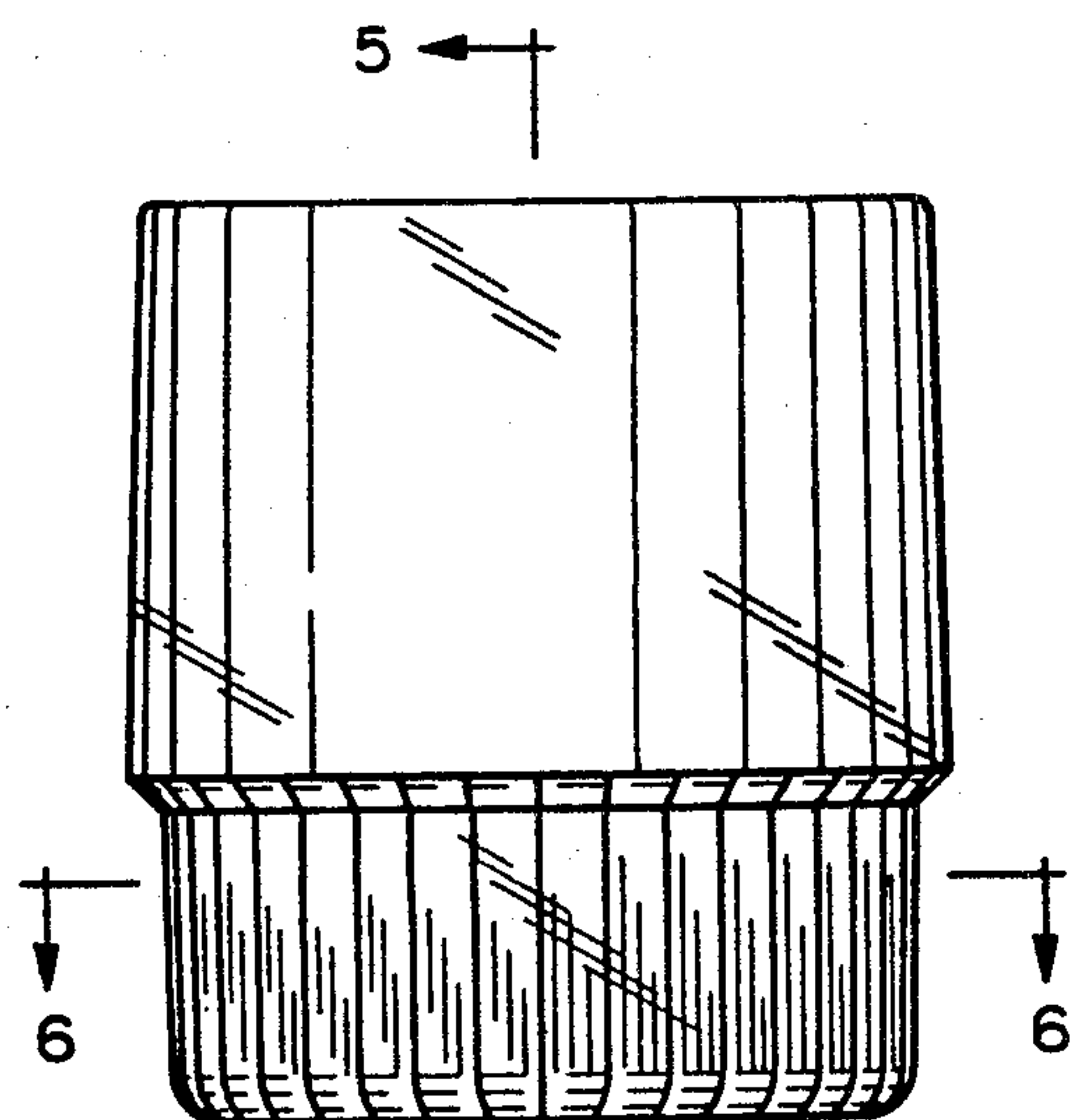

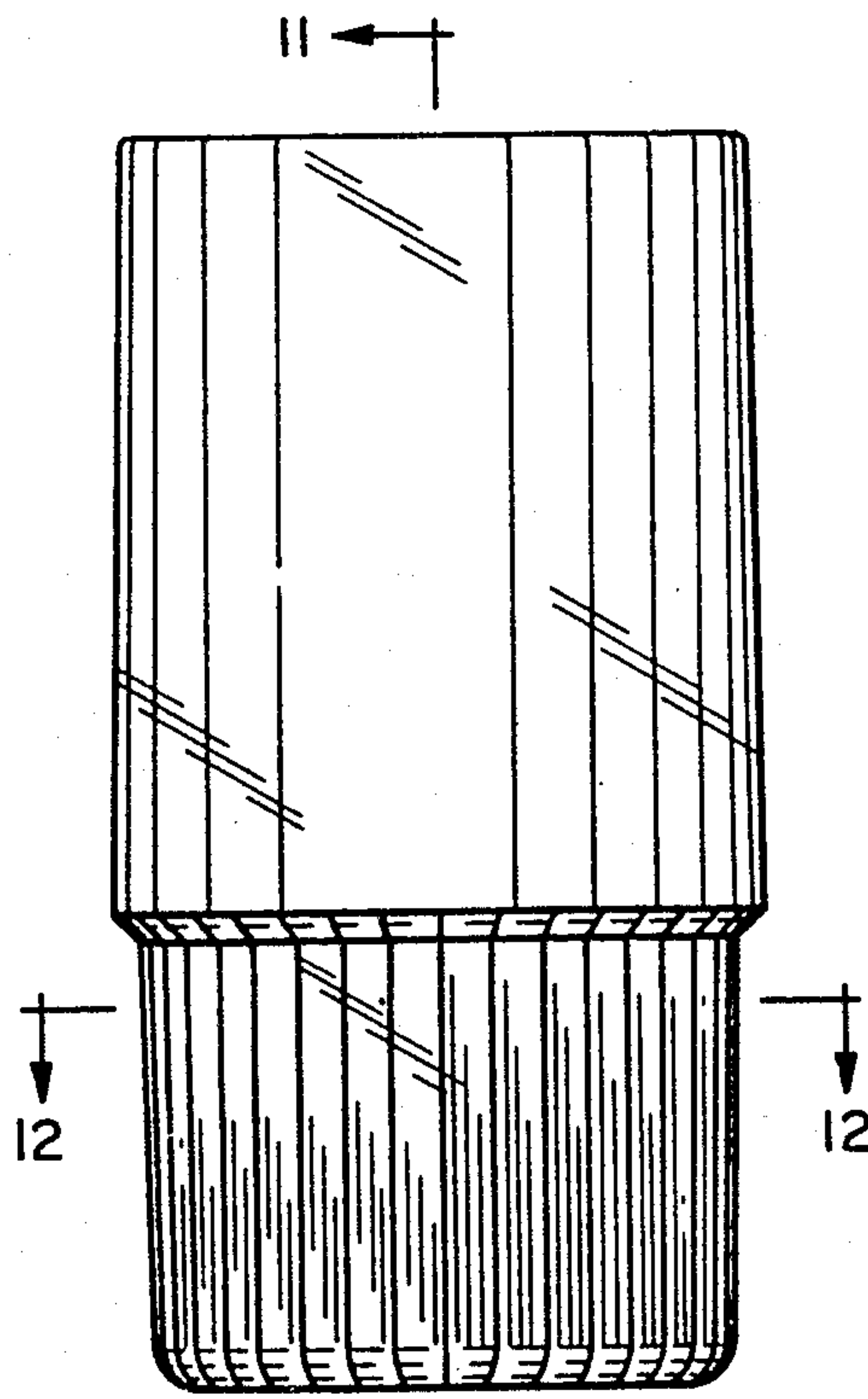

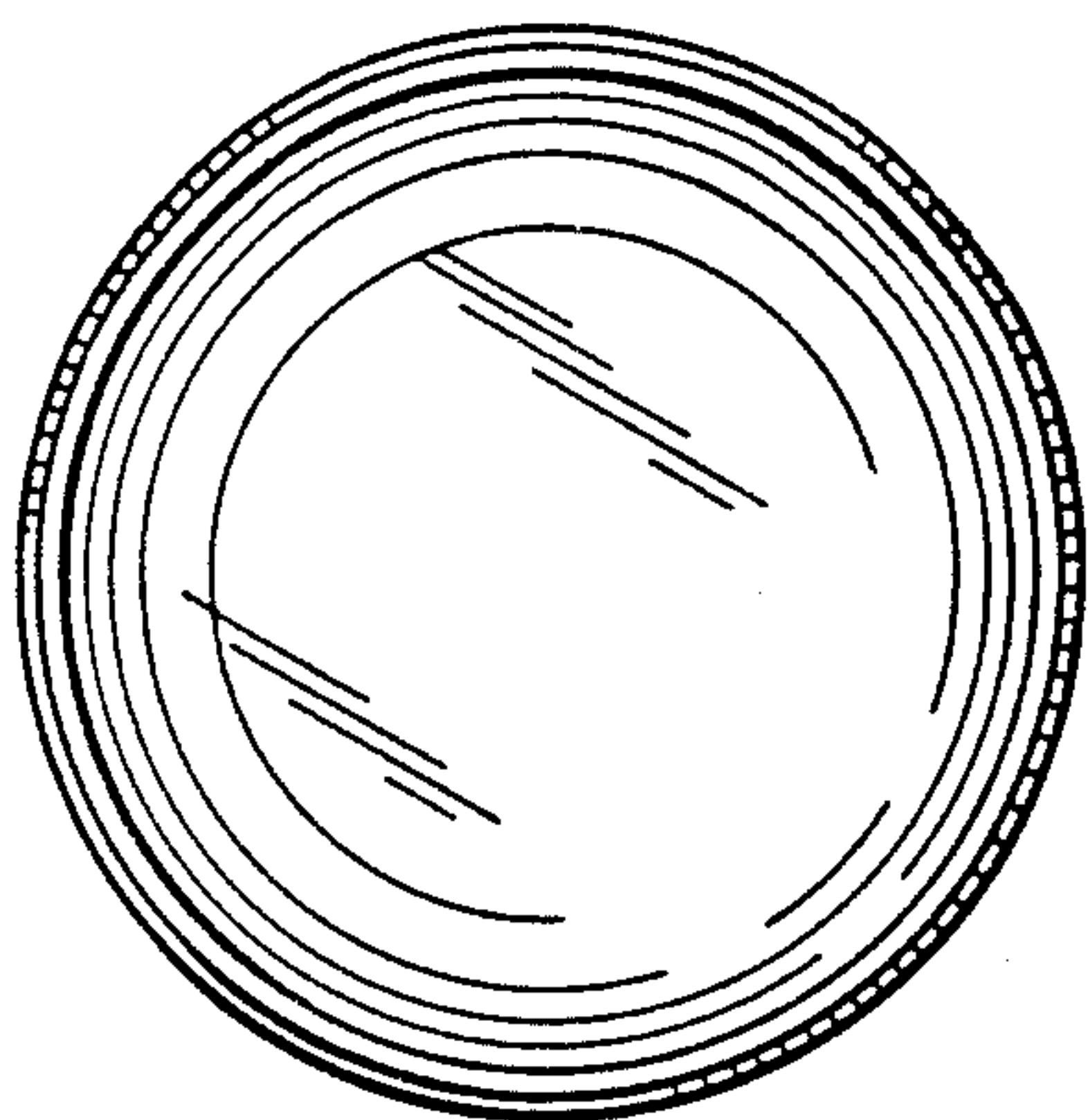

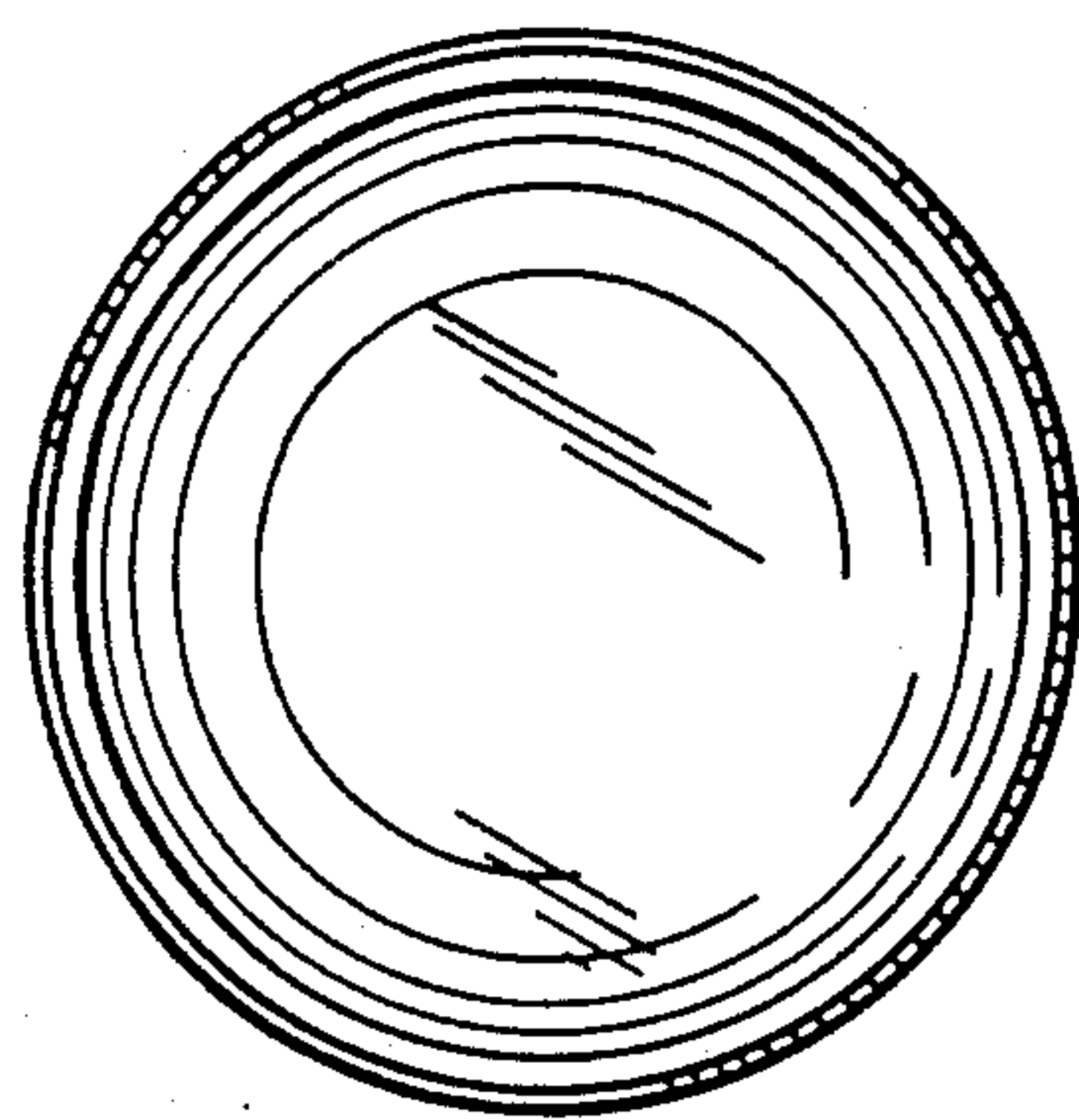

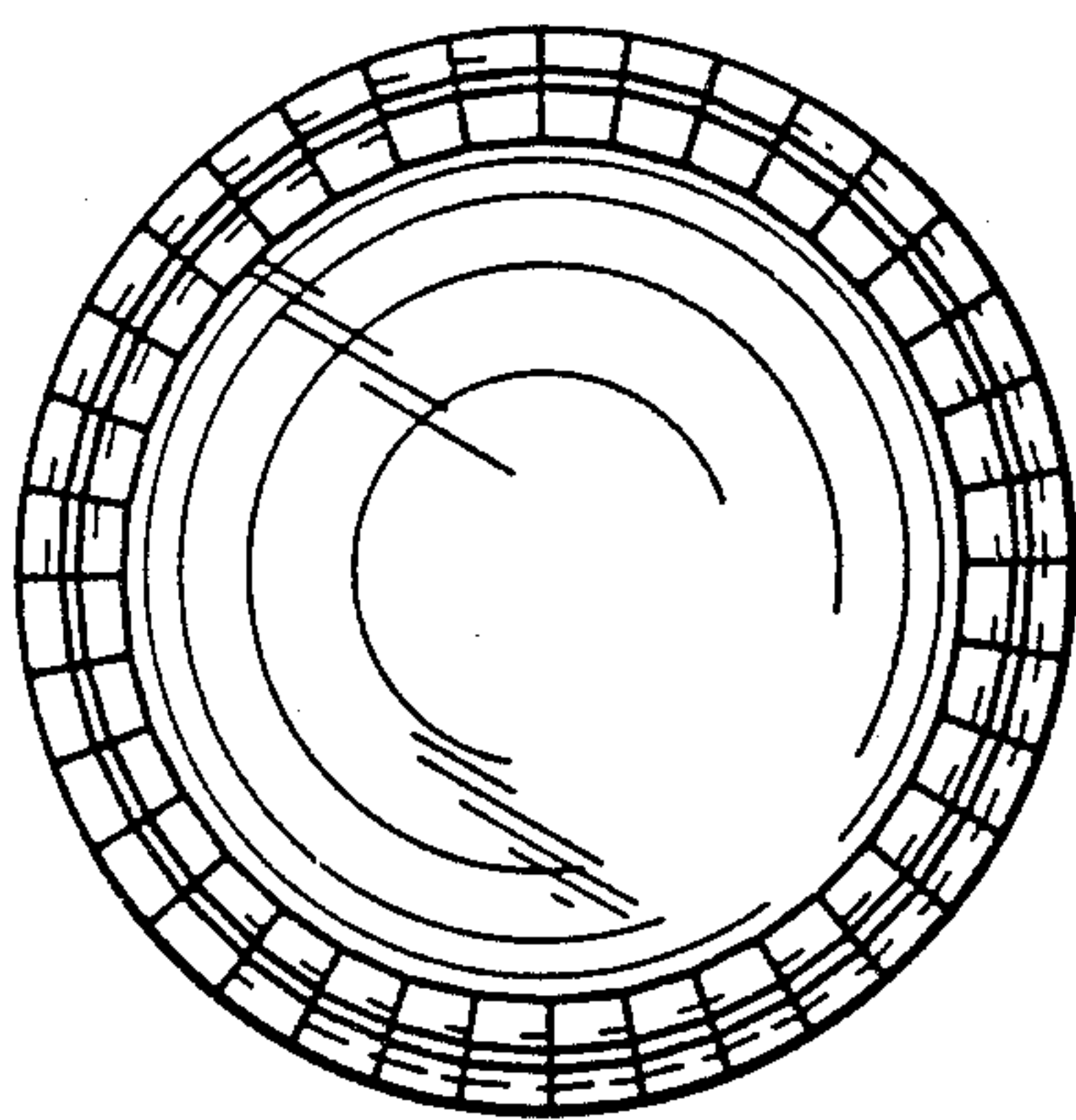

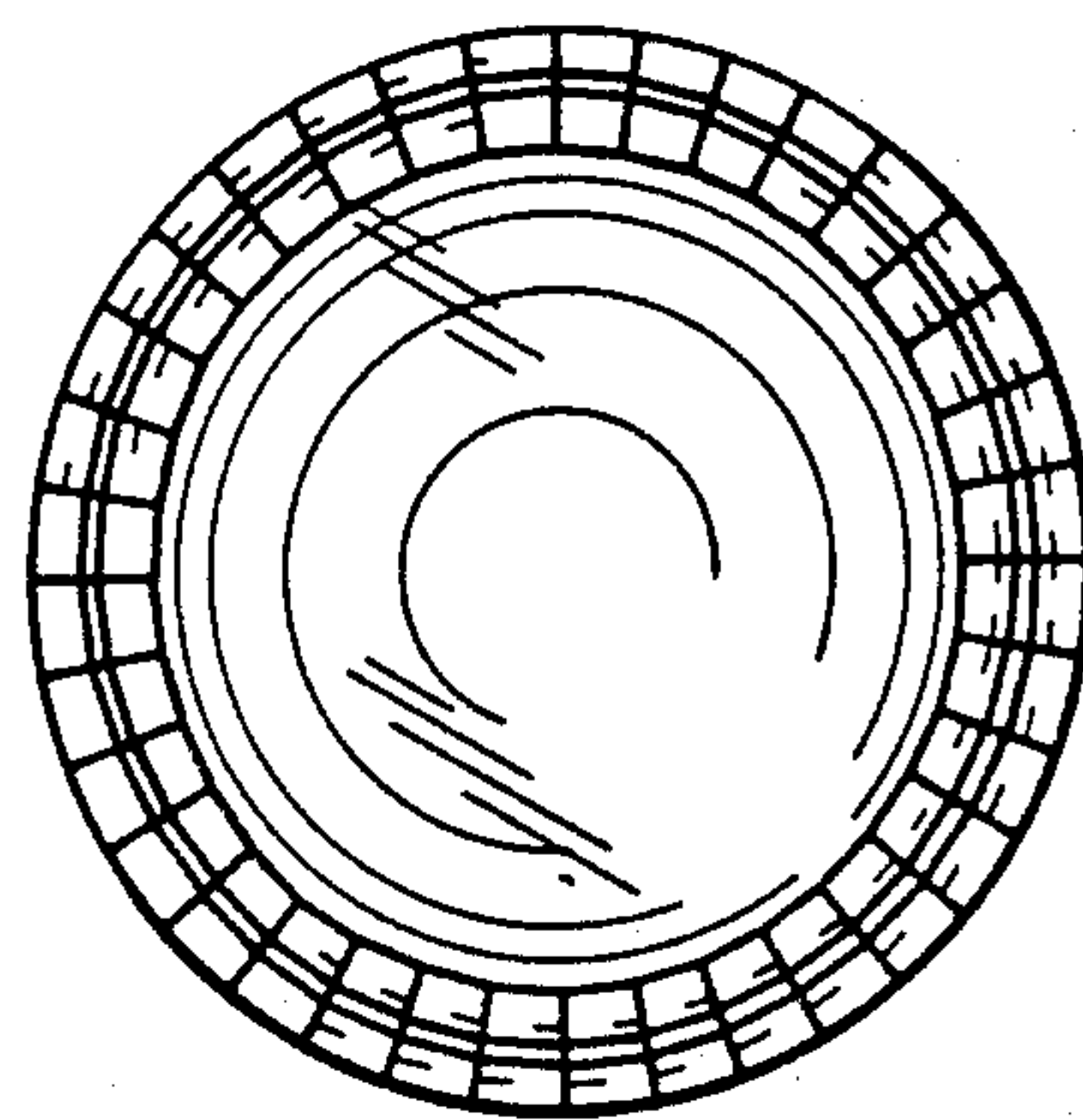

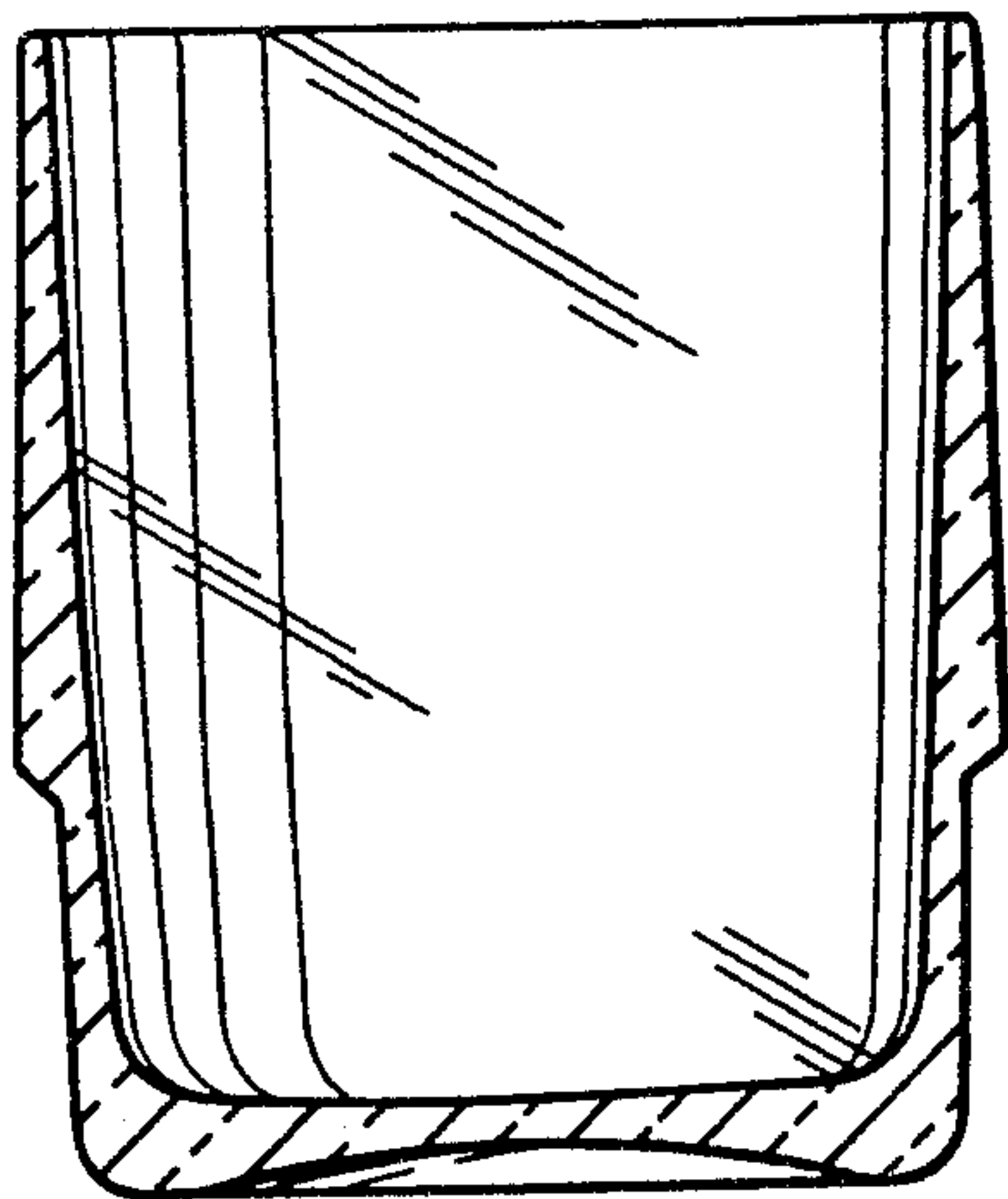

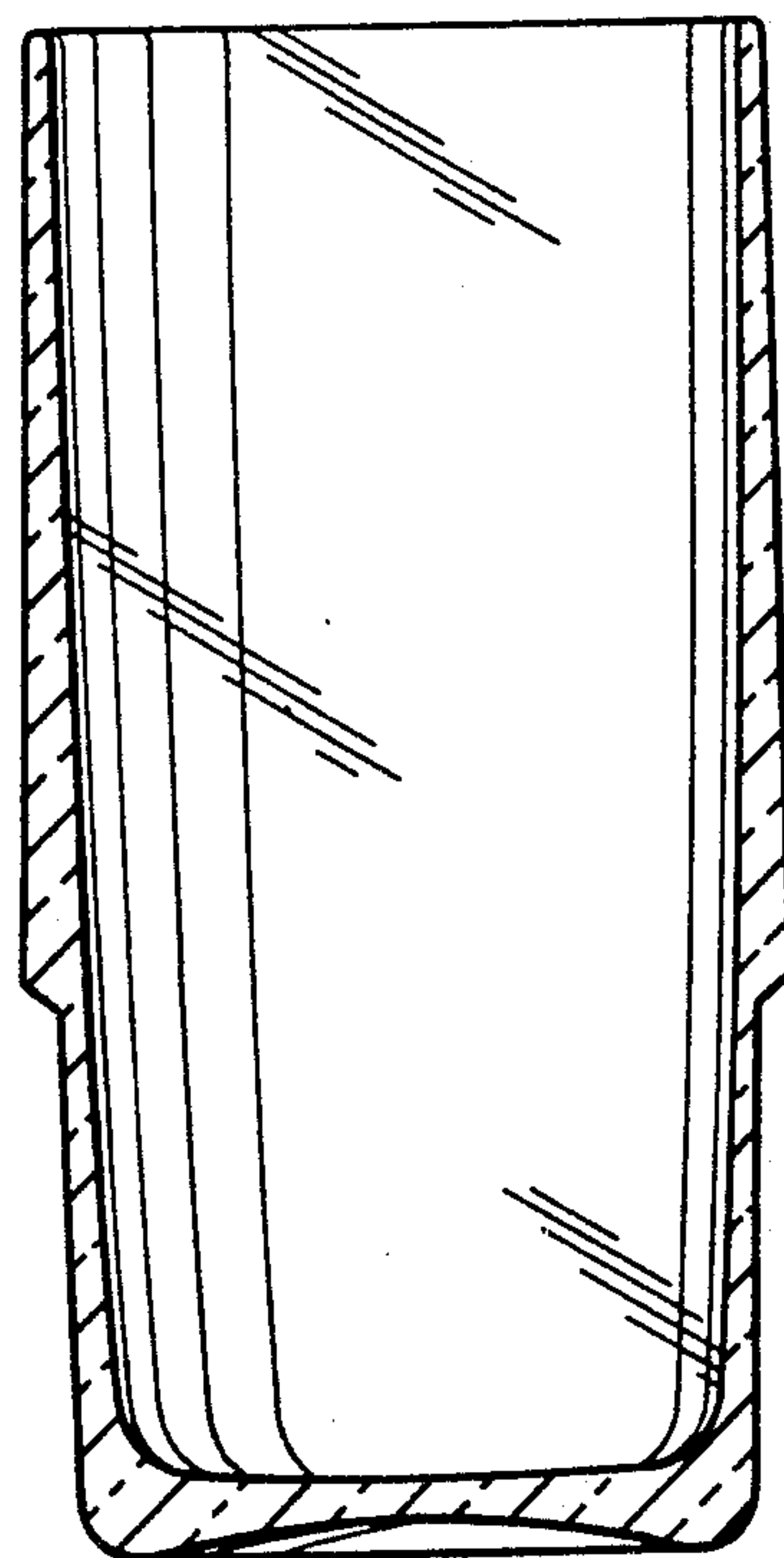

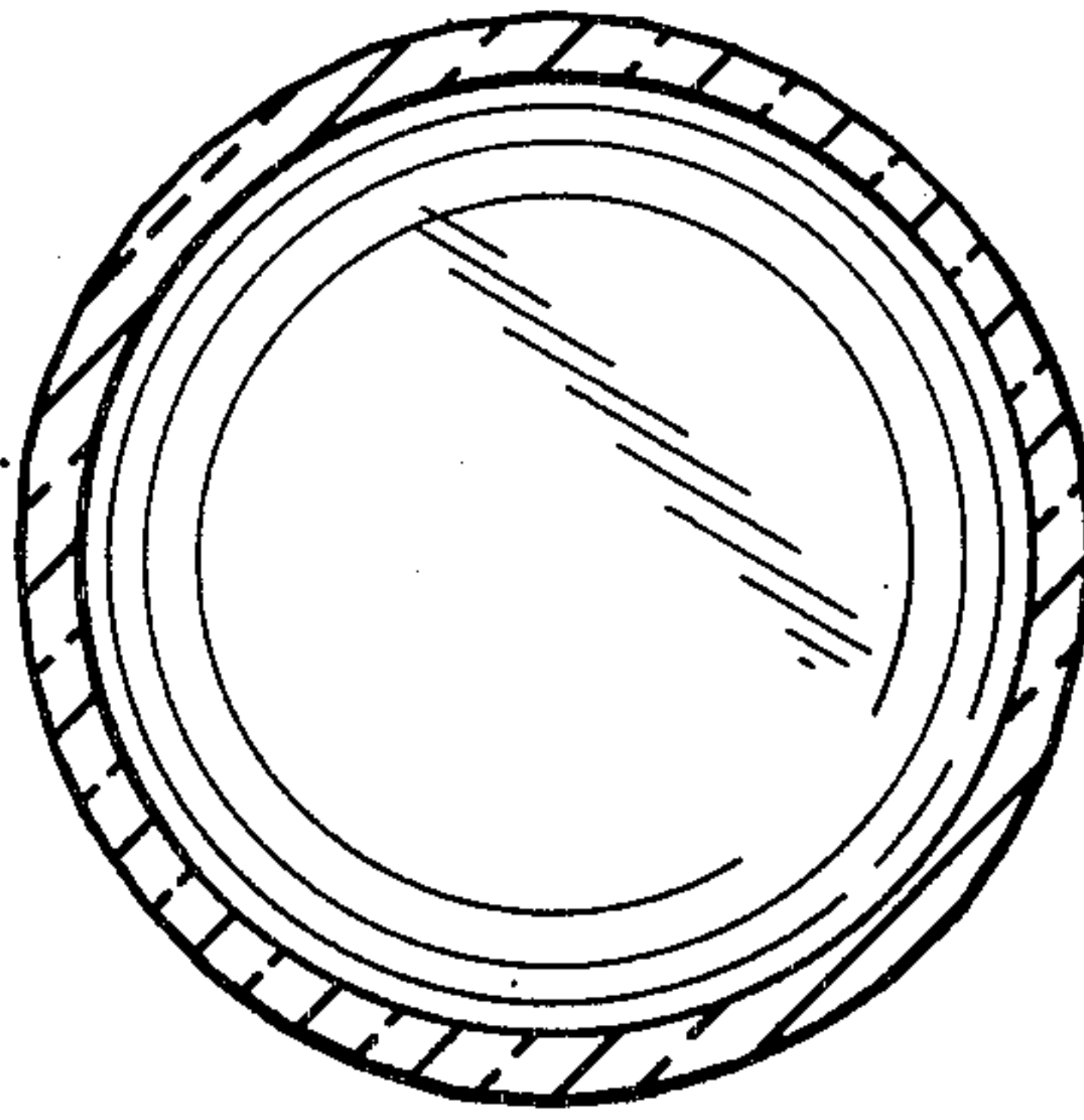

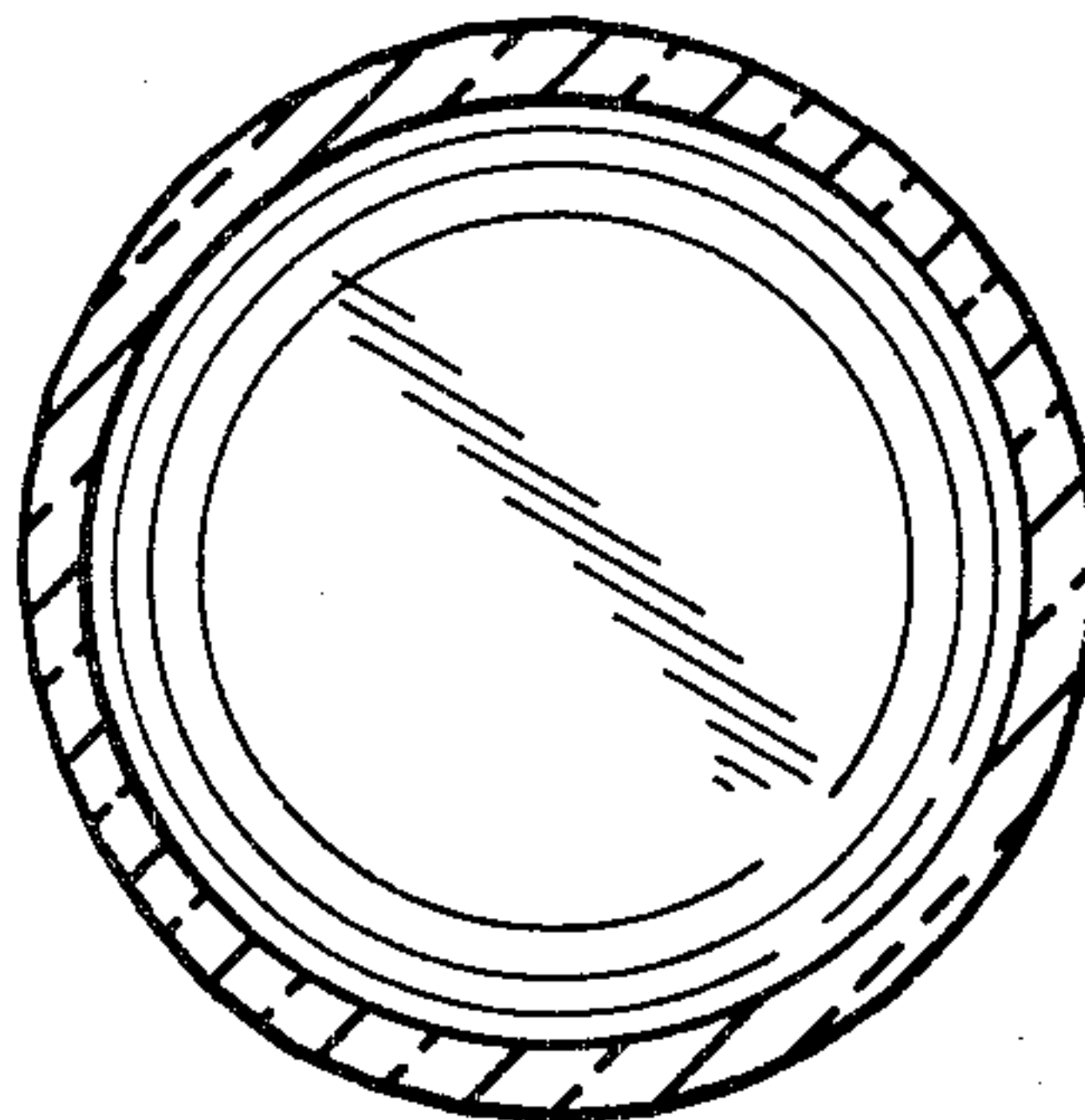
